

Elder A. N. Dugger Dies In Jerusalem

Word has been received here by Tim Youngs, a student of Midwest Bible College, that his grandfather, Elder A. N. Dugger, died in Jerusalem Sunday morning, Nov. 2, at the age of 88.

Andrew Dugger was born on Nov. 19, 1886, and married Effie Carpenter on May 28, 1925, in Bassett, Neb.

After graduating from the University of Chicago, he went back to teach a few years in a public school in the Bassett area.

Upon receiving the call to the ministry, he received his education and entered the field in 1914.

He was editor of the Bible Advocate and was also one time Chairman of the General Conference of the Church of God (7th Day). Andrew Dugger was very well known in the Stanberry area from 1914 to 1932.

He has lived in Jerusalem for about 28 years and was publisher of a magazine there called the "Mount Zion Reporter."

He is survived by his wife, Effie, in Jerusalem, Israel; a brother, Alex Dugger of Denver, Colo.; by four children: Andy Dugger of Jerusalem, Israel, Orabelle Youngs of Walla Walla, Wash., Naomi Fauth of Jerusalem, Israel, and Mary Fauth of Wapato, Wash.
