A Summary of the Worldwide Church of God's Traditional Teachings on the Nature of God

Calvin Lashway January 1995

The following is a summary of the Worldwide Church of God's teachings about the Nature of God. As taught under the leadership of Herbert W. Armstrong, who died in 1986. Church literature is directly quoted in most cases. In a few places a paraphrase of what is published is provided. Whether a direct quote or paraphrase, all references are documented, allowing the reader to check the original. In a few places words or scripture references have been inserted into the text for clarification. Where this has been done, the inserted text is found between brackets []. During Armstrong's leadership, the Worldwide Church of God quoted the King James translation in its literature, unless otherwise stated. A bibliography can be found at the end of this paper.

The Word

Mystery of the Ages Herbert W. Armstrong New York: Dodd, Mead & Co., 1985. Page 41

"'The Word' in the this passage [John 1:1-4] is translated from the Greek *logos*, which means 'spokesman,' 'word,' or 'revelatory thought.' It is the name there used for an individual Personage."

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"The Word, then, is a Personage who was make flesh - begotten by God, who through this later begettal became his Father. Yet at that prehistoric time of the first verse of John 1, the Word was not (yet) the Son of God. He divested himself of his glory as a Spirit divinity to be begotten as a human person. He was made God's Son, through being begotten or sired by God and born of the virgin Mary."

Page 41-42

"So here we find revealed originally *two Personages*. One is God. And with God in that prehistoric time was another Personage who also was God - one who later was begotten and born as Jesus Christ. But these two Personages were spirit, which is invisible to human eyes unless supernaturally manifested. Yet at the time described in verse one [of John 1] Jesus was *not* the Son of God and God was not his Father."

"These passages [John 1:1-4,14; 4:24; Hebrews 7:3] show that the Word, in the beginning - before ANYTHING had been created - was with God, and he, also was God."

"The Greek word translated into English as 'Word' in John 1:1 is *Logos*. It can also mean spokesman, or one who speaks. It was actually the *Logos*, the 'Spokesman' - the 'Word' of the God Family - who *said*, 'Let US make man in OUR image' (Gen. 1:26), thus executing His awesome office as the executive of the God Kingdom. And so everything was created and made by the divine being who later became the human Jesus Christ!"

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"Before Christ (the *Logos*) was conceived in Mary, He was not the 'Son of God.' He was one

of the two original members of the God Kingdom. He, like the one who became the 'Father,' had existed eternally. But He is nowhere in God's Word referred to as a SON of God prior to His conception in Mary. His *human* birth was His *first* birth. He gave up the glory he had shared with the other divine being, who became His 'Father,' in order to be born into the world as a human being, live a perfect life, and then give His life to pay the penalty of all the sins of mankind."

"The 'Word' in verse one [John 1:1] is translated from the Greek *logos* which means 'spokesman.' It is the *name* for a divine Personage."

Page 5

"The 'Word,' then, is a divine Personage who was made flesh nearly 2000 years ago. He was begotten by God who, through this very begettal, became His 'Father.' Yet, at that prehistoric time of the first verse of John 1, the Word was not (yet) the Son of God. He was *made* God's son later, through being begotten or sired by God and born of the virgin Mary as a human being."

"So in the beginning verses of John 1, we find revealed originally *two divine Personages*. One is God. And with God at that prehistoric time was another Personage who *also* is God - one who was later begotten and born as Jesus Christ. Yet, at the time described in verse one, Jesus was *not* the 'Son' of God and God was *not* His 'Father.'"

Is Jesus God? (Reprint Article) Herbert W. Armstrong Pasadena: Ambassador College, 1958, 1972. Page 4

"First, if Jesus had been *only* human, His death could have paid the penalty for but *one* other human who had incurred that penalty by transgression of God's spiritual Law (Roman 6:23). Since God the Father created all things, *by* Jesus Christ (Eph. 3:9), and since *all* things, including man, were made *by* Jesus Christ, He is our Maker therefore God, and His life which He gave was of *greater value* than the sum total of all human beings." See John 1:1-3,10,14; 1 Corinthians 8:6; Colossians 1:12-19.

Page 4

"Since eternal life is the GIFT of God (John 3:16), only a God *possessing* immortality could give it. If Jesus were only human, we could not receive eternal life through Him and He could not be our Savior. Man does not have eternal life inherit in himself. But as God 'the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself.' And 'God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son hath not life' (John 5:26 and 1 John 5:11-12)."

Page 4

"Jesus, in nature, is equal with God." See Philippians 2:6.

Page 4

"He is *called* God in Titus 2:10,13. Therefore He *is* God."

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"As the Son of God and as the Creator of the entire universe and of all mankind, Christ's life was worth more then all other human lives put together! Therefore, He could pay the death penalty of sin for the *entire* human race, so that others could be born into the Family of God and

become His younger brothers (Rom. 8:29; Heb. 2:11)."

"Two different Lords are mentioned here [Psalms 110:1]. One is God the Father and the other is the One who became Jesus Christ. Paul quoted this passage to the Jewish Christians - applying it directly to Jesus Christ...(Heb. 1:13)."

Elohim

Page 50

"Now once again to Genesis 1:1: 'In the beginning God...' This originally was written by Moses as God inspired him. Moses wrote in Hebrew. The Hebrew word translated 'God' is *Elohim* - a noun or name, plural in form, but normally singular in grammatical usage. It is the same sort of word as *family*, *church*, *group* - one family consisting of two or more members - one church composed of many members - one group of several persons.

"It [Elohim] is referring to precisely the same persons, making up or composing the one God, as we found in John 1:1 - the Word and God - and each of these TWO Persons is God."

"The original Hebrew word for 'God' here [Genesis 1:1] and throughout the account of creation is *Elohim*, which actually means *more then one*. It is the plural form of Hebrew *Eloah*, which in English means 'Mighty One.' So *Elohim* means 'Mighty Ones' - *more* then just one person.

"Elohim is a uniplural or collective noun, such as 'church,' or 'family,' or 'kingdom.' In other words, *Elohim* stands for a SINGLE CLASS composed of TWO or MORE individuals. *Elohim*, then, is the 'God KINGDOM' or 'God FAMILY.' (In actual usage the word was also applied to any single member of the God Family or, by analogy, even to a heathen idol.)"

"The English word 'God' [Genesis 1:1] is translated from the Hebrew word *Elohim* - a uniplural noun. It is uniplural in the same sense as the words 'family' or 'church - denoting more than one component forming one whole."

"The Hebrew word for 'God' used in Genesis 1:1 and 26 is *Elohim*. *Elohim* is plural in form. Though this word taken by itself does not prove that there are two beings in the Godhead, it does allow for the plurality that is clearly indicated in other parts of the Bible."

Is Iesus God?

Page 5

"A church or a family consists of more than one person, yet is *one* church, or *one* family. In this sense *Elohim* - The God kingdom - includes both God the Father and YHVH who was the *Logos* or the WORD of God, and also their Spirit emanating from them, the Holy Spirit, the LIFE, CHARACTER and POWER of God. Jesus, in praying for the welfare of the Church, prayed that its many members might 'be ONE as we are one' (John 17:11, 21, Moffatt). The Church is ONE body, yet composed of many members (1 Cor. 12:12). A husband and wife are ONE FLESH, yet two persons.

"The word 'God' has two meanings - the God kingdom or the family of God, AND the persons composing that kingdom or family. Christ and the Father are ONE God, not two Gods -

one Elohim. That is why Elohim said, 'Let us make man in OUR image' (Gen. 1:26)."

"God is not merely one Person. God is a divine Family - only one Family - but more than one divine Person. Jesus Christ spoke of His divine Father as God. Jesus said He was the Son of God (Matt. 27:43; John 10:36). Jesus is called God in Hebrews 1:8 and elsewhere. All the holv angles are commanded to worship Jesus (Heb.1:6) - and none but God many be worshipped."

"The Father and Son are one *in purpose and attitude*. But the Father is greater in authority since Christ - the "Word' or Logos - made all things by His authority. The Father has always been in supreme command in the Family or Kingdom of God - long before the Word became a human being."

Page 7

Referring to the word Elohim. "Just as there is the animal kingdom and the human kingdom or family, Genesis 1 shows that there is also a God Kingdom or Family!

"There is one God, but God is a Family composed of more than one member. Elohim, which means 'Mighty Ones,' is the name of the God Family."

"The New Testament speaks of 'God the Father' and 'God the Son,' the One who became Jesus. They are two distinct beings, but both are God. Both of them have been together since eternity."

Page 25

"Thus the Bible reveals that there were actually two spirit beings - two distinct personalities who united their efforts in the creation."

"By what we can understand from the rest of the Bible, this word *Elohim* can act like our English words 'family,' 'group,' 'church,' or 'crowd.' These words are often regarded as singular and take a singular verb form, but they all contain more than one member.

"The Apostle Paul exemplifies this for us in 1 Corinthians 12:20. Speaking about the Church he says: 'But now are they many members, yet but one body.'"

"There might be a man named John. And John might be with the man named Smith, and John might also be Smith because John is the son of Smith, and Smith is the family name. Yet they are two separate persons.

"The only point of difference in that analogy is that the Word, at the time of Jh. 1:1, was not, yet the Son of God. But he was with God, and he also was God.

"They were not yet Father and Son - but they were the GOD KINGDOM!

"That family is composed, now, of God the Father, and Jesus Christ his Son, and many begotten humans who already, NOW, are begotten SONS OF GOD (Rom. 8:14,16; 1 John 3:2), forming the Church of God."

Pages 50-51

"IN OTHER WORDS, GOD IS NOW A FAMILY of Persons, composed so far of only the TWO - God the Father and Christ the Son. But IF the Holy Spirit of God dwells in someone, and he is being led by God's Spirit, then (Rom. 8:14) he is a begotten son of God, But, at the time of Christ's return to earth ... all being filled and led by God's Spirit shall become BORN sons of God. The GOD FAMILY will then RULE ALL NATIONS with the GOVERNMENT OF GOD RESTORED!"

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"Finally, in briefest summary: God is a FAMILY composed at present of the TWO Persons of John 1:1-4, but with many thousands, already begotten by God's Spirit, in God's true Church, soon to be born into the divine family at Christ's return to earth. Jesus Christ, by his resurrection, was BORN a divine Son of God (Rom. 1:4) - the first so born into the God Family (Rom. 8:29)."

"When we understand that God is a family - that God is reproducing after His kind - we are no longer confronted with the problems inherent in the Trinity doctrine, nor are we faced with the problem of worshiping many gods.

"There is only one God family, yet there are presently two members, and in the future there will be many more. Jesus was called 'the firstborn of many brethren' (Rom. 8:29)."

Page 42

"It was God who created man and put him on the earth. He created marriage and the family relationship as a type of His divine family."

Page 42

"God is a family. There presently are two members in that God family, God the Father the Head of the family, the Lawgiver - and Jesus Christ the Son - the Spokesman, the Creator. But the word *Elohim* is not just dual. There is a a dual number in Hebrew, but this would have to be Elohaim. The God family, however, is destined to be truly plural - to have many members. And this is what the word *Elohim* describes and allows for."

"Look at the creation account in Genesis 1: God created the fish after the fish kind, birds after the bird kind, and animals after the animal kind. But in verse 26 God made man - not after any of the animal kinds, but after the God kind - in God's image and God's likeness. 'And God (Hebrew, Elohim) said, let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepth upon the earth.""

"So God is presently a Family of two Persons - God the Father and Jesus Christ the Son. And the wonderful truth is that human beings may be born into this same ONE God Family as distinct, separate Personalities by a resurrection from the dead."

Page 8

"God, as we learned in Lesson 8 and as this lesson explains, is NOT a 'trinity,' but is a family composed at present of the TWO Persons mentioned in John 1:1. However, the God Family will not be limited to *only* two persons.

"God is in the process of expanding His Family. Already many thousands have been begotten by God's Holy Spirit, and will soon be born into that divine Family by a resurrection at the return of Jesus Christ. Still later, millions - even billions - will eventually be born into the Family of God!"

"God the Father is the divine Father of the God Family, and when we who are now the begotten sons of God are BORN into His Family at Christ's imminent return, we shall be like God (1 John 3:2) for we shall then be the born-again Sons of God!"

"Thus far we have learned that two all-knowing, all-powerful, all perfect Superbeings have existed from eternity. Each possesses supreme mind and creative power. These two Divine Beings composing the nucleus of the God Family, created the entire universe, including man."

"In the same manner, God the Father is Creator. But he 'created all things by Jesus Christ.' Jesus is the Word. It is written, 'He spake, and it was done' (Ps. 33:9). God tells Christ what to do (John 8:28-29). Jesus then speaks, as the workman, and the Holy Spirit is the POWER that responds and does what Jesus commands."

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"John 1:1 and Genesis 1:1 are two accounts of the same event - the original creation of the universe. They both reveal that these two Supreme Beings of the God Family created all things." See 1 Corinthians 8:6.

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"God created all things through Jesus Christ." See Ephesians 3:9; Colossians 1:15-17.

Page 8

"Christ at all times does what His Father tells Him to do. He then speaks as the workman, and the Holy Spirit is the *power* that responds and does what Jesus commands." See Genesis 1:2-3; Psalms 33:6-9; 104:30; John 8:28-29.

Page 8

"...God the Father is Creator. He 'created all things *by* Jesus Christ,' the Word, who utilized the *power* of the Holy Spirit to accomplish the task!"

Page 7

"John 1:1 and Genesis 1:1 takes us back to the same time in prehistory - to the original creation of the universe. Both verses reveal that the two supreme Beings composing the God Family created all things."

"Since Melchisedec was 'like unto the Son of God,' and abides as High Priest forever continually, and Jesus Christ is now High Priest, Melchisedec and Jesus Christ are one and the same Person."

Page 42

In reference to Hebrews 7:1-3, "God also had existed *eternally* with the Word. Jesus, when he was 'The Word' was an immortal being who had existed ALWAYS - there never was a time when he did not exist - with out beginning of days. He was, then, 'like' the Son of God - but he was not yet the Son of God. He also was God, along *with* God."

In reference to Hebrews 7:3, 25-27, "Since Melchisedec was without descent, was 'like unto the Son of God,' and abides as High Priest for ever, and since Jesus Christ is now our eternal High Priest, Melchisedec and Christ (the Word) are one and the same Person!

"Christ, when He was 'the Word,' was an immortal being who had always existed - there had never been a time when He did not exist - He was literally without 'beginning of days.' He was then 'like' the Son of God, but He was not yet the Son of God. He also was God, *along* with God who became the Father."

In reference to Hebrews 5:6-7; Genesis 14:18; Hebrews 7:23, 26; 8:1, Jesus Christ is Melchisedec. He was Melchisedec in the Old Testament, the Priest of God. He is now the High Priest of God. Melchisedec was divine, no beginning, no creation.

"As a fragment of the evidence, compare Isaiah 8:13-14 with 1 Peter 2:7-8. Isaiah said, 'The LORD of hosts' - YHVH - shall be 'a stone of stumbling and a rock of offense.' Peter said, in *quoting* this text in reference to *Christ*, He is 'a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense.' Jesus Christ is the LORD - the Eternal of the Old Testament."

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Page 6

"Thus the Bible [1 Cor. 10:4] identifies the 'Rock' as *Christ*! How surprising to those who have *assumed* that the God of the Old Testament was the one the New Testament calls 'The Father'!

"And so the 'LORD' who spoke and was seen of men was always the one who became Jesus Christ. For no *mortal man* has ever seen or heard the Father! (John 1:18; 5:37.)"

"There can be no denying the fact that Jesus Christ was the God of the Old Testament, the Stone over which many people stumbled." See Isaiah 8:12-14; 1 Peter 2:6-8; Luke 2:34.

Jesus Christ Came to Reveal God the Father

No one has seen God John 1:18, 5:37. God has appeared to human beings Genesis 17:1; 18:1, 22; 32:30; Exodus 24:9-11; 33:18, 20-23. "Clearly, then, the God of the Old Testament could not have been the 'Father'."

"So we see that even in the first book of the Bible the plurality of God is shown, although clear understanding of this truth could not be known until Jesus came to reveal it in the New Testament...(Luke 10:22).

"A clear distinction is made in the New Testament between Christ and the Father. The God that Moses saw and heard was not God the Father, again proving that Christ was the God of the Old Testament. 'No man has seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him' (John 1:18). Christ came to earth to, among other things, reveal the Father and to show a family relationship that exists in the Godhead."

How You Can Be Imbued With The Power Of God Page 4

"In the Old Testament, men did not pray to the Father. But we pray to the Father. No one addressed God as Father in Old Testament times. Christ came to declare who the Father is - to declare that we may be begotten of Him." See 1 John 1:18.

Jesus is the "Yhvh" or "Yhwh" of the Old Testament

Is Jesus God?

Page 5

"It is commonly supposed that YHVH [Also spelled YHWH], or, as commonly called, 'Jehovah,' or, as in the Authorized Version, "The LORD,' of the Old Testament was God the FATHER of Jesus Christ. *This is a flagrant error*!

"YHVH was the God of Israel, the only One of the Godhead known to ancient Israel - When He came in human flesh they did not recognize him...(John 1:10). Neither did they know God the Father." See Matthew 11:27; Luke 10:22.

Page 5

"Jesus Christ calls Himself the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End, the First and the Last." See Revelation 1:8, 17; 22:13.

Page 5

In reference to Isaiah 41:4; 44:6; 48:11-12, "All of these scriptures show that YHVH is the First and Last. Christ is the YHVH of the Old Testament."

Page 5

"The person of the Godhead who is our REDEEMER [or Savior] is Jesus Christ." See John 4:42; Philippians 3:20; Titus 2:10-14; Luke 1:68-69.

Page 5

"That Jesus, the Savior, is YHVH. See Isaiah 49:7 and Isaiah 60:16, where He - YHVH - is also 'the [M]mighty One of Jacob' - to be OF Jacob means a son, or descendant of Jacob - the Mighty One of all Jacob's children. Also in Isaiah 48:17, YHVH is called the *Redeemer*, and the Holy One of *Israel* - the One of Israel who is Holy! The same is expressed in Isaiah 43:14, Thus says the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel...' Also note the next verse (15), YHVH is Israel's Holy One, Creator of Israel, Israel's King. Now notice in Acts 3:14-15 that the Christ who was denied was the same 'HOLY ONE'- YHVH! 'But ye denied the Holy and Righteous One... the Prince of Life' (Panin)." See also Acts 2:27 and Mark 1:24.

Pages 5-6

YHVH is the Sheppard of the Old Testament, Psalms 23:1. Jesus Christ is the Sheppard of the New Testament, John 10:11; Hebrews 13:20; 1 Peter 2:24-25; 5:2-4.

Page 6

"The Great Shepherd who is coming to RULE as King over all kings is YHVH." See Revelation 19:13,15; 17:14; Ezekiel 34:11, 30-31.

"Most scholars believe *YHWH* to be some form of the verb 'to be' or 'to exist.' Hence *YHWH* signifies 'the self-existent-One,' One who '*lives*' - from eternity, and to eternity. Revelation 1:8 clarifies the meaning of this name, speaking of Christ, 'the beginning and the ending...which is, and which *was*, and which *is to come...*'"

"The Hebrew word for 'Lord' in Exodus 20 [Exodus 20:1-2] is YHWH. So here again it was the *Logos*, the 'Spokesmen' - who later became Christ - who actually spoke the Ten Commandments."

"Putting them all together, YHVH actually means the 'Was - Is - Will Continue to Be'

Being. Even Hebrew linguistic scholars agree that YHVH must be derived from some form of the verb 'to be' (was, is, will be).

"By His very name, then, God quite literally encompasses all aspects of time - past, present, and future. This is in complete accord with Malachi 3:6...; Hebrews 13:8...; and Revelation 1:8..."

"Now compare Isaiah 40:3 with Matt. 3:3 and Mark 1:3. John prepared the way before YHVH (Isaiah 40:3) who was CHRIST (Mark 1:14-15)."

"In almost every Old Testament passage, the LORD YHVH - The Eternal - is Jesus Christ. Clearly, Jesus is the God of the Old Testament."

Pages 6-7

"But what difference does this revelation [that Jesus is the God of the Old Testament] make? It makes all the difference.

"Understanding the true identity of the God of the Old Testament is vital to becoming reborn with the spiritual nature of God. For the God of the Old Testament, commonly assumed to have been harsh and stern, was really our SAVIOR - loving, kind, merciful *and* just (Ex. 34:5-7)."

"If we read no further in the New Testament than this [Jh. 1:1-3,14], we would be able to know beyond a shadow of a doubt that Jesus Christ was God and that He is the One who created man in Genesis 2:7. Because John clearly states that the Word - the One who became Christ - created all things."

"Paul clearly tells us [1 Corinthians 10:1-4] that Jesus Christ was the God of the Old Testament - the One who spoke to Moses and led the Israelites out of Egypt. This clearly shows us that the One who became the Son was the God of the Old Testament, not God the Father."

How You Can Be Imbued With The Power Of God

"How did they [the prophets and patriarchs in the Old Testament] have access to the Spirit of God? Through the One who was to become *Christ* (1 Peter 1:11). *Christ*, one of the members of the God-Kingdom, was the One who administered the Spirit to Moses, to Abel and to all the faithful of old. He sent the Holy Spirit of the Father to be in them, to give them *faith and* POWER."

"To seem real, the mind naturally wants to visualize a definite form and shape. But even though God is composed of spirit and not of visible matter, God never the less does have definite form and shape.

"What is God's form and shape?

"In Genesis 1:26, 'God said, let us make man in our image, after our likeness.' We know the form and shape of man. That is the image, likeness, form, and shape of God.

"In various parts of the Bible, it is revealed that God has a face, eyes, a nose, mouth and ears. He has hair on his head. It is revealed God has arms and legs. And God has hands and fingers."

"God has feet and toes and a body. God has a mind. Animals have brains, but no mind power like man's.

"If you know what a man looks like, you know what is the form and shape of GOD, for he made man in his image, after his very likeness!"

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"So now we know God has the same form and shape as a man. We also know he is composed of spirit, not of matter as is man. Spirit is invisible to human eyes, unless manifested by special process.

"And *if* so manifested we would see both the Father and Christ now glorified in heaven with faces, though formed and shaped like human faces, as bright as the sun full strength! Their eyes flames of fire, feet like burnished brass and hair white as snow (Rev. 1:14-16)."

"To be glorified means to have GREAT POWER and BRIGHTNESS! The power of the Father and Christ is *so great* that it makes their spirit bodies shine as BRIGHT AS THE SUN IN FULL STRENGTH!"

"6. Is the Holy Spirit referred to in the Bible simply as 'it' - not a person? John 1:32; Rom. 8:16, 26; I Peter 1:11.

"COMMENT: In Greek, as in English, the word 'spirit' is *neuter*. It naturally requires a neuter pronoun which is rightly translated into English as 'it,' and is usually so translated. However, in some cases the translators have used a masculine pronoun where the original Greek uses 'it.' John 14:17 is such a case. The pronouns 'he' and 'him' should have been rendered 'it.' No doubt the translators erred because they themselves *assumed* the Holy Spirit to be a person.

"In John 14:26; 16:7-8, 13-14 the Holy Spirit is personified as the 'Comforter' (Greek parakletos, which is grammatically masculine), hence the pronoun 'he' (ekeinos) was used in the original Greek to agree with 'Comforter,' but should also be translated 'it' in an English version."

Page 9

"And so Jesus was begotten within His human mother Mary. But unlike all other men, He was *miraculously* begotten by the One who became the Father, through the agency and power of the *Spirit* of God (Matt. 1:20; John 1:14 - here is further proof the Spirit of God is not another person). Christ thus became the 'Son' of God and He called the other person of the God Kingdom His 'Father.' And so began the 'Father - Son' relationship, which is a FAMILY relationship!"

Is God A Trinity?

Page 32-33

"'The OT(Old Testament) clearly does not envisage God's spirit as a person, neither in the strictly philosophical sense, nor in the Semitic sense. God's spirit is simply God's Power. If it is sometimes represented as being distinct from God, it is because the breath of Yahweh acts exteriorly (Isa. 48:16; 63:11; 32:15).' So say the authors of the *New Catholic Encyclopedia* [Vol. XIII, p. 574]. But let them continue:

""Very rarely do the OT writers attribute to God's Spirit emotions or intellectual activity (Isa. 63:10; Wis. 1:3-7). When such expressions are used, *they are mere figures of speech* that are explained by the fact that the *ruah* was regarded also as the seat of intellectual acts and feeling (Gen 41:8)"...New Catholic Encyclopedia Vol. XIII p. 574.

"In the Old Testament, God's Spirit is pictured as His power. The power by which the one who became Jesus Christ, as Executive for the Father, created the entirety of the universe. These theologians also recognize that when the Spirit is spoken of as a person or in a personal way, the Bible writer is merely *personifying* the Spirit, as he would wisdom or any other attribute."

Pages 33, 35

"'When a quasi-personal activity is ascribed God's spirit, e.g., speaking, hindering, desiring, dwelling (Acts 8:29; 16:7; Rom. 8:9), one is not justified in concluding immediately that in these passages God's spirit is regarded as a Person; The same expressions are used in regard to rhetorically personified things or abstract ideas (see Rom. 6:6; 7:17). Thus the context of the phrase 'blasphemy against the spirit' (Mt. 12:31; cf. Mt. 12:28; Lk. 11:20) shows that reference is being made to the power of God.' (New Catholic Encyclopedia, Vol. XIII, p. 575)."

Page 35

"In the Greek language, like the Romance languages (Italian, Spanish, French and others), every noun has what is called gender; that is, it is either masculine, feminine or neuter. The gender of a word has nothing to do with whether it is really masculine or feminine - it is more of a grammatical tool."

Page 35

In John 14, 15, and 16 "The pronoun 'he' is used in connection with the word 'comforter' - parakletos - however, the reason for the use of the personal pronoun 'he' is for grammatical, not theological, or spiritual reasons."

Pneuma "...is the Greek equivalent of *ruah*, the Hebrew word for 'spirit' used in the Old Testament. *Pneuma* is a grammatically neuter word and is always represented by the pronoun 'it.'"

Pages 35, 38

"John's use of the *parakletos* [comforter] is no proof the Spirit is a person. For if the simple gender of a noun were the basis for the personality of the Spirit, then the Spirit changed gender from the Old to the New Testament, The Hebrew word for 'spirit' in the Old Testament being in the feminine gender in a majority of cases and in a masculine sense less often."

"Here [Matthew 1:20] we read that Christ was conceived by the Holy Spirit. Yet Christ calls *God* His Father, not the Holy Spirit (John 14:16). "Only in II Corinthians 13:14 is the Holy Spirit mentioned with God and Jesus and thereonly in connection with communion or fellowship. The Holy Spirit is not the third member of the Godhead."

How the Worldwide Church of God Traditional Viewed the Trinity Doctrine

Page 51

If the claims of 'this Jesus' were accepted, then in their minds their belief would be no different from that of the polytheistic pagans around them. If He were the Son of God, their whole system of monotheism would disintegrated.

"When Jesus plainly told certain Jews of His day that He was the Son of God, some were ready to stone Him for blasphemy (John 10:33).

"To get around the problem of a plurality in the Godhead, the Jewish community simply rejected Jesus. And to this day, Orthodox Jews will not accept Jesus' Messiahship. However, the more liberal Jews will at least admit that He was a great man - maybe even a prophet.

"But the 'new' Christian religion was still faced with the problem. How would proponents explain that there was only one God, not two?

"'The determining impulse to the formulation of the doctrine of the Trinity in the church was the church's profound conviction of the absolute Deity of Christ, on which as on a pivot the whole Christian concept of God from the first origin of Christianity turned' (*International Standard Biblical Encyclopedia*, article 'Trinity,' p. 3021).

"But the Deity of Christ does not mean that a doctrine of the Trinity is necessary, as we shall see in Chapter Two."

Pages 15-19

"Many of the early church fathers were thoroughly educated in Greek philosophy, from which they borrowed, such non-biblical concepts as dualism and the immortality of the soul. However, most theologians, for obvious reasons, are generally careful to point out that they did not borrow the idea of the Trinity from the Triads of Greek philosophy or those of the ancient Egyptians and Babylonians.

"But some are not so careful to make such a distinction. 'Although the notion of a Triad or Trinity is characteristic of the Christian religion, it is by no means peculiar to it. In Indian

religion, e.g., we meet with the trinitarian group of Brahma, Siva, and Visnu; and the Egyptian religion with the trinitarian group of Osiris, Isis, and Horus, constituting a divine family, like the Father, Mother and Son in medieval Christian pictures. Nor is it only in historical religions that we find God viewed as a Trinity. One recalls in particular the Neo-Platonic view of the Supreme or Ultimate Reality, which was suggested by Plato...' (*Hasting's Bible Dictionary*, Vol. 12, p. 458).

"Of course, the fact that someone else had a Trinity does not in itself mean that the

Christians borrowed it. McClintock and Strong make the connection a little clearer.

"Toward the end of the 1st century, and during the 2nd, many learned men came over both from Judaism and paganism to Christianity. These brought with them into the Christian schools of theology their Platonic ideas and phraseology' (article 'Trinity,' Vol. 10, p. 553).

"In his book, A History of Christian Thought, Arthur Cushman McGiffert points out that the main argument against those who believed that there was only one God and that Christ was either an adopted or created being was that their idea did not agree with Platonic philosophy. Such teachings were 'offensive to theologians, particularly to those who felt the influence of the Platonic philosophy' (*ibid*, p. 240).

"In the latter half of the third century, Paul of Samosata tried to revive the adoptionist idea that Jesus was a mere man until the Spirit of God came upon Him at baptism making him the Anointed One, or Christ. In his beliefs about the person of Jesus Christ, he 'rejected the Platonic realism which underlay most of the Christological speculation of the day' (*ibid.*, p. 243).

"At the end of his chapter on the Trinity, McGiffert concludes: '...It has been the boast of orthodox theologians that in the doctrine of the Trinity both religion and philosophy come to highest expression' (Vol. I, p. 247).

"The influence of Platonic philosophy on the Trinity doctrine can hardly be denied.

"However, trinitarian ideas go much further back than Plato. 'Though it is usual to speak of the Semitic tribes as monotheistic; yet it is an undoubted fact that more or less all over the world the deities are in triads. This rule applies to eastern and western hemispheres, to north and south. Further, it is observed that, in some mystical way, the triad of three persons is one.... The definition of Athanasius (a fourth-century Christian) who lived in Egypt, applied to the trinities of all heathen religions' (*Egyptian Belief and Modern Thought*, by James Bonwick, F.R.G.S., p. 396).

"It was Athanasius' formulation for the Trinity which was adopted by the Catholic Church at the Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325. Athanasius was an Egyptian from Alexandria and his philosophy was also deeply rooted in Platonism.

"The Alexandria catechetical school, which revered Clement of Alexandria and Origen, the greatest theologians of the Greek Church, as its heads, applied the allegorical method to the explanation of Scripture. *Its thought was influenced by Plato*: its strong point was theological speculation. Athanasius and the tree Cappadocians had been included among its members...' (*Ecumenical Councils of the Catholic Church*, by Hubert Jedin, p. 29).

"In order to explain the relationship of Christ to God the Father, the church fathers felt that it was necessary to use the philosophy of the day. They obviously thought that their religion would be more palatable if they made it sound like the pagan philosophy that was extant at the time. These men were versed in philosophy, and that philosophy colored their understanding of the Bible.

"It was the doctrine of the Trinity - colored by the philosophy of the time - that was accepted by the Church in the early part of the fourth century - over three hundred years after Christ's death.

"Even theologians recognize that the Trinity is a creation of the fourth century, not the first!

"There is recognition on the part of exegetist and Biblical theologians, including a constantly growing number of Roman Catholics, that one should not speak of Trinitarianism in the New Testament without serious qualification. There is also the closely parallel recognition - that when one does speak of unqualified Trinitarianism, one has moved from the period of Christian origins to say, the last quadrant of the 4th century. It was only then that what might be called the definitive Trinitarian dogma 'one god in three persons' became thoroughly assimilated into Christian life and thought' (New Catholic Encyclopedia, article "Trinity." Vol. 14, p. 295)."

Pages 19-20

"It was at the Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325 that two members of the Alexandrian congregation, Arius, a priest, who believed that Christ was not a God, but a created being; and

Athanasius, a deacon who believed that the Father, Son and Spirit are the same being living in a threefold form (or in three relationships, as a man may be at the same time a father, a son and a brother), presented their cases.

"The Council of Nicaea was not called by the church leaders, as one might suppose. It was called by the Emperor Constantine. And he had a far-from-spiritual reason for wanting to solve

the dispute that had arisen.
"'In 325 the Emperor Constantine called an ecclesiastical council to meet at Nicaea in Bithynia. In the hope of securing for his throne the support of the growing body of Christians he had show them considerable favor and it was to his interest to have the church vigorous and united. The Arian controversy was threatening its unity and menacing its strength. He therefore undertook to put an end to the trouble. It was suggested to him, perhaps by the Spanish bishop Hosius who was influential at court, that if a synod were to meet representing the whole church both east and west, it might be possible to restore harmony. Constantine himself of course neither know or cared anything about the matter in dispute but he was eager to bring the controversy to a close, and Hosius' advice appealed to him as sound' (A History of Christian Thought, Vol. I, p. 258).

"The decision as to which of the two men the church was to follow was a more or less arbitrary one. Constantine really didn't care which choice was made - all he wanted was a united church. (Arius was banished, but later recalled by Constantine, examined and found to be

without heresy).

"The majority of those present at the council were not ready to take either side in the controversy. 'A Clearly defined standpoint with regard to this problem - the relationship of Christ to God - was held only by the attenuated group of Arians and a far from numerous section of delegates, who adhered with unshaken conviction to the Alexandrian (Athanasius') view. The bulk of the members occupied a position between these two extremes. They rejected the formulae of Arius, and declined to accept those of his opponents...the voting was no criterion of the inward conviction of the council' (Encyclopedia Britannica, 11th ed., "Nicaea, Council of," p.

"The council rejected Arius' views, and rightly so, but they had nothing with which to replace it. Thus the ideas of Athanasius - also a minority view - prevailed. The rejection of Arianism was not blanket acceptance of Athanasius. Yet the church in all the ensuing centuries has be 'stuck,' so to speak with the job of upholding - right or wrong - the decision made at Nicaea.

"After the council the Trinity became official dogma in the church, but the controversy did not end. In the next few years more Christians were killed by other Christians over that doctrine than were killed by all the pagan emperors of Rome. Yet, for all the fighting and killing, neither of the two parties had a biblical leg to stand on."

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"Belief in a Trinity clouds the real purpose that God has in store for mankind. If we are taught that God is a closed Trinity of three persons, we lose sight of the fact that God's real purpose is to create many more members of the God Family."

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"Why has Satan palmed off the doctrine of the Trinity on the world? Because he doesn't want you to rule in his place! Satan was originally created to carry out God's rule on earth. But, he refused to serve the Creator and even fomented a rebellion to dislodge God from His position as Ruler over the whole universe (Ezek. 28:11-19; Isa. 14:12-14). A third of the angles united with Lucifer in that rebellion and were cast back down to this earth with him (Rev. 12:3-4) - having forever disqualified themselves and Satan from ruling in the government of God. However, Satan and his demonic cohorts remain in office until Christ actually returns.

"Yet being disqualified, they do not want anyone else ever to take their place. For that reason, during nearly 6000 years of man, they have tried to hide from all the world the breathtaking truth of God. If they can make you believe in the Trinity, you will be deceived into thinking that the Godhead consists of only three persons. You would then never in your wildest dreams ever imagine that you were created to be born into the God family - to actually have a part in ruling this earth!

"Satan wants you to think that God is a limited Trinity - not a growing family or Kingdom

into which we may, through the grace of God, enter.

"There you have it. That is the truth about the Trinity. God's family isn't closed to mankind as Satan would have you believe.

"It's wide open to you, your family and all mankind. You can be made in the exact likeness of God at Christ's return!"
