



## Introduction

We hope you enjoy the campus and invite you to linger as long as you please, enjoying the magnificent architecture and stately gardens.

## History of Ambassador

🖊 🌈 r. Herbert W. Armstrong, chancellor of Ambassador College and pastor general of the Worldwide Church of God, founded the College as an alternative to today's materialistically-

oriented educational system. Ambassador emphasizes not only academic training. but the development of personality and character as well.

The original college campus consisted of today's Library building and the accompanying administrative annex on a two and one-quarter acre parcel. During the first year, 1947, four

students and eight faculty members made up the college "community." Ambassador's main campus now consists of 33 acres, with a student enrollment limited to 500 and a 60-member faculty.

Ambassador is a four-year, coeducational, liberal arts college sponsored by the Worldwide Church of God. The curriculum stresses theological studies within the framework of a liberal arts education.

Note: The Hall of Administration, Student Center and Ambassador Auditorium are open to the public weekdays. Other campus buildings are accessible only through guided tours.
