



1 Hall of Administration

Ambassador College and the Worldwide Church of God share offices in the Hall of Administration (shown on the cover of this brochure). Until the completion of the building in 1969, the College and the Church were administered from what is now the Library building.

The Hall of Administration features an open-air design with light wells rising through all four floors. Indoor gardens and a campus model highlight the building's lobby. You may want to use the model as an orientation before beginning the tour.

2 Academic Center

Ambassador Hall: Steel magnate Hulett C. Merritt completed his 36-room mansion, Villa Merritt-Olivier, in 1908. Mr. Merritt spared no cost designing Ambassador Hall, combining the rarest woods and the most exquisite fixtures with the finest craftsmanship, to produce a mansion long held to be the most beautiful in Pasadena.

When he died in 1956, leaving no direct heirs, the College purchased the mansion at public auction. Renamed Ambassador Hall, it served the College as the
