The Thirds were on the war-path. Their fast break plays were wreaking havoc on the Royals.

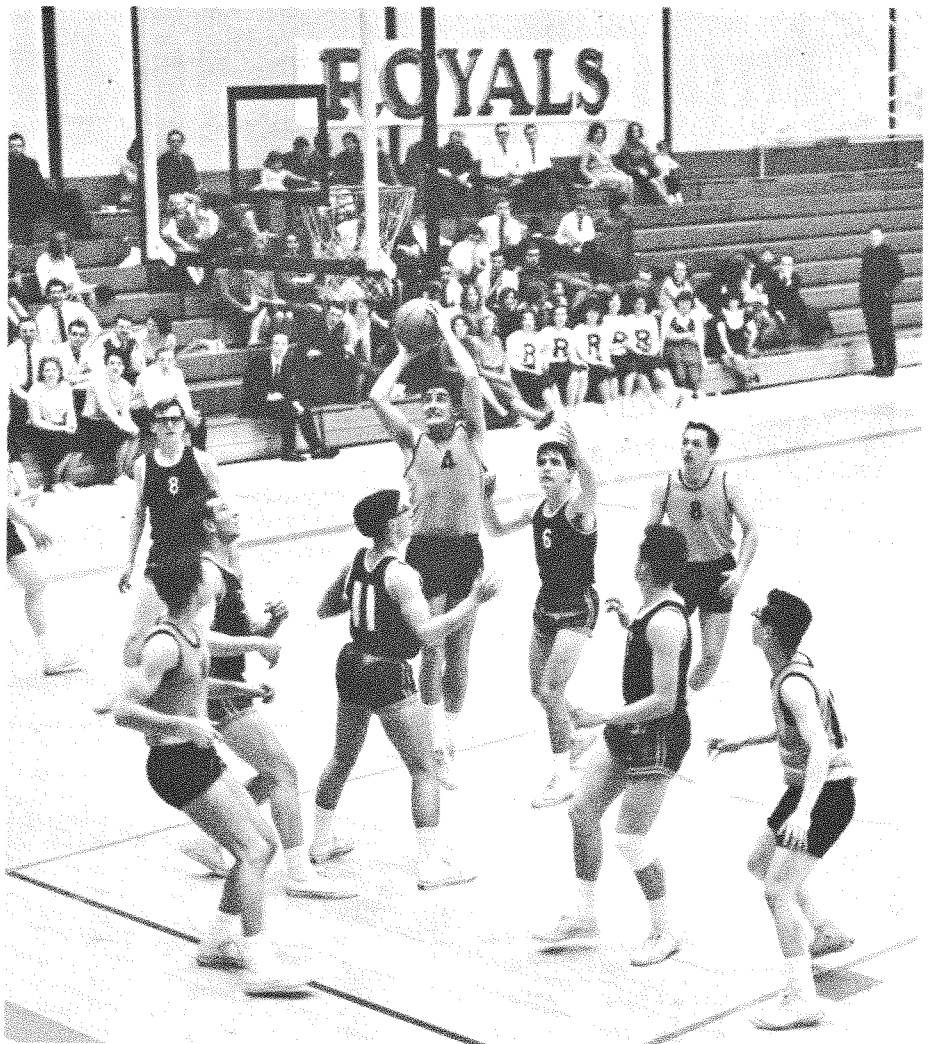
The Golden Boys streaked ahead.

The anxious efforts of the Royals only resulted in erratic passing and shooting. The Juniors capitalized on their errors and with three minutes to go the Royals were 25 behind.

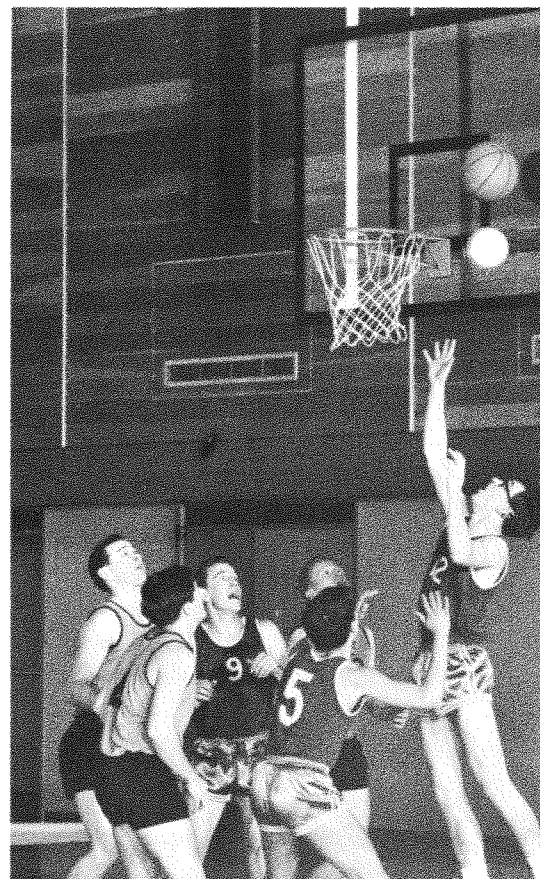
A massive Royal substitution led to the Thirds replacing five of their top men.

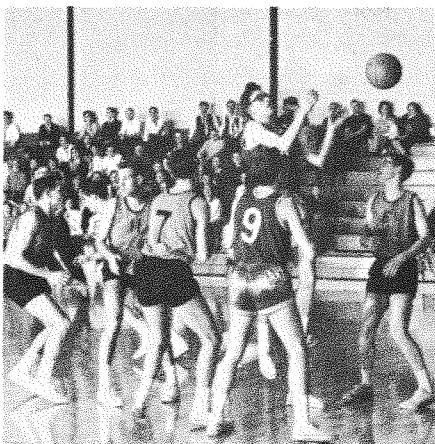

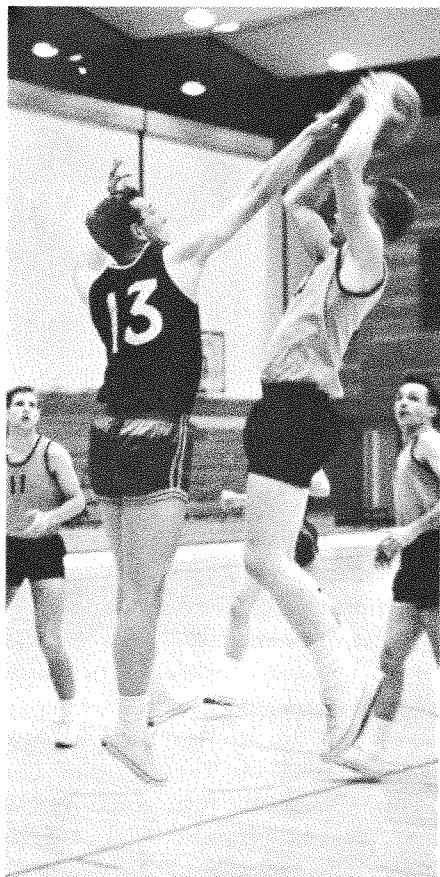
