

# Frosh Topple Juniors in 74-72 Thriller!








### Faculty Rolls Over Sophs 89-68

The Sophomores were close at times, but right from the first it was obvious who was in control of the game. The Faculty, playing its calm, cool, deliberate type of game, chalked up another victory Saturday night by overcoming a hot-shooting Sophomore team. The Sophs stayed close in the first half as they hit at a torrid pace but the steady play of the Faculty finally took its toll in the final half.

Eric Williams opened the game with two for the Faculty, and Gary Koerner came back for the Sophs with a shot that would have been worth three points in the ABA. Each team traded baskets for a while and then the Faculty threw up a press which stymied the perplexed Sophomores who couldn't believe what was happening in the first few minutes of the game. Before the Sophs could get things straightened out, the score was 22-8 and rising. Gary Koerner was hitting off the backboard and narrowed the margin to eight points. Mike Portune was twisting and turning and flipping in shots from the hip to help the Sophomore cause, but the Faculty held tenaciously to a steady 10-point lead. In the last few minutes of the half, Koerner ricocheted in a few more and narrowed the Faculty

lead to 44-38 at the end of the first half, scoring 15 points.

Steve Voelmer opened the second half with two and the Sophs were close 44-40. When things get close for the Faculty, Mr. Petty gets the ball. Before the Sophs knew what had happened the Faculty had moved out to a 63-44 lead in four easy plays and the Sophomores never again saw the light of day. The Sophomores stayed closer



## Seniors Edge Freshmen 67-61 in Near Upset



The Seniors took a big chance Wednesday night and took on the Freshmen with only three regulars in the game at a time. In the opening minutes and throughout the first half, it looked like the Seniors would coast b another easy victory, but they almost met disaster from a charged-up Freshmen team in the final minutes of the contest.

The game opened with a Senior fast break led by Dan Orban who layed the ball in for the first two points. Royer quickly added two more on another long, down-court pass. Mel Inglima countered for the Freshmen with his patented fake-and-turn driving lay-in. Then the action really got going as "Hot-Rod" Carnes really got hot and scored the nets right off the rims, pulling the Seniors to a sizeable lead.

Jack Kost helped the Frosh cause as he slipped pass after pass to his teammates for open shots and rebounded well in spite of a large height deficit. Inglima was the big scorer for the Freshmen and seemed to be the only shooter who could find the range against the Senior zone which forced the long outside shot. The Seniors led by as much as 20 during the first half, but a closing surge by the Freshmen brought the score to a 36-24 margin for the flagging old men.


Things looked real good for the Seniors going into the second half with a 12 point lead. Now Pyle and Barr entered the game for the first time. Surely it would become a runaway. Then all of a sudden things began to go wrong. First Dave Ogwyn blocked Al Barr's jump shot (Dave slew Goliath). Then the Freshmen put on a press against the Senior reserves. Tkach stole the ball and drove in for two, Kost hit a jumper, Inglima tipped one in, Kost hit another jump shot. The Seniors took time out to score two and then the Freshmen came right back with eight straight more points to narrow the Senior lead to only four with about a minute left to play. It was Bill Kelley who saved the day for the Senior reserves with a beautiful over the head sideways shot that swished through as Mr. Derrick, the Freshmen


coach, looked on in disbelief. The Freshmen had almost upset the highly favored Seniors, but they had managed to hang on in the last few minutes for a 67-61 victory which put them  $\frac{1}{2}$  game ahead of the Faculty in first place.

made one mistake. They forgot to lock up Mel Inglima! Mel promptly started the second half by hitting a jump shot to put the Freshmen ahead. Then Mike Garrett hit his first shot of the evening to make it 42-36. The Juniors made a free throw before Inglima worked his way through two men to score again. Moments later, he added two more free throws and suddenly the fired-up Frosh lead by 7 points, 44-37!

Then the game turned completely around. The Juniors went on a tear with Schnippert scoring 8 straight points to take the lead 50-44. The Freshmen, maintaining their fantastic 50% shooting average in this game, kept within about four points with about 10 minutes to go. Then on a jump-ball, Bernie knocked the ball to Dave Pack, waiting right in front of his own basket. Dave missed, but swOSH! Schnippert grabbed the rebound to make it 57-51! In desperation, the Frosh put on a full-court press. Joe Tkach knocked the ball away, threw to Dave Ogwyn who made the basket, was fouled, and promptly made it a 3-point play. The Freshmen were back in the game 57-54! Pack quickly hit a shot and it was 59-54. But the Frosh came right back as Mike Garrett and Dave Ogwyn each threaded the hoop to make it 59-58.

With about 5 minutes to play, Jack Kost made a fantastic underhand layin and was fouled. He missed the free throw, but Mel Inglima grabbed the rebound, missed his first shot, but on a second effort made the basket to put the Freshmen ahead 66-65.

Then the excitement *really* began! It was nip and tuck with the lead changing hands every shot. With 2:25 left in the game, Schnippert was called for goal-tending on Inglima's shot to tie the score at 69-69. Oltmanns hit

for the Juniors and Ogwyn for the Freshmen to make it 71-71. With 47 seconds left, the Freshmen worked for the good shot. Jack Kost banked one in to give underclassmen the lead!

The Juniors came charging downcourt! As Gary Oltmanns had the ball the whistle blew! Foul! Two free throws coming up, 33 seconds left to play! And his team down by 2 points! Before a hushed crowd, the first free throw went up. It bounced on the rim then fell away as the Frosh rooting section breathed a sigh of relief. The second shot went up and in to make it 73-72.

But the game wasn't over yet! With 26 seconds left, and a one-point lead, the Frosh managed to keep ball-control until Dave Ogwyn was fouled with 4 seconds left. He made the charity toss. The second missed and was grabbed by Dave Pack who tried a last-second desperation pass downcourt. It was grabbed by Joe Tkach, as wildly cheering Freshmen rooters flooded on the court to congratulate the winners.
