

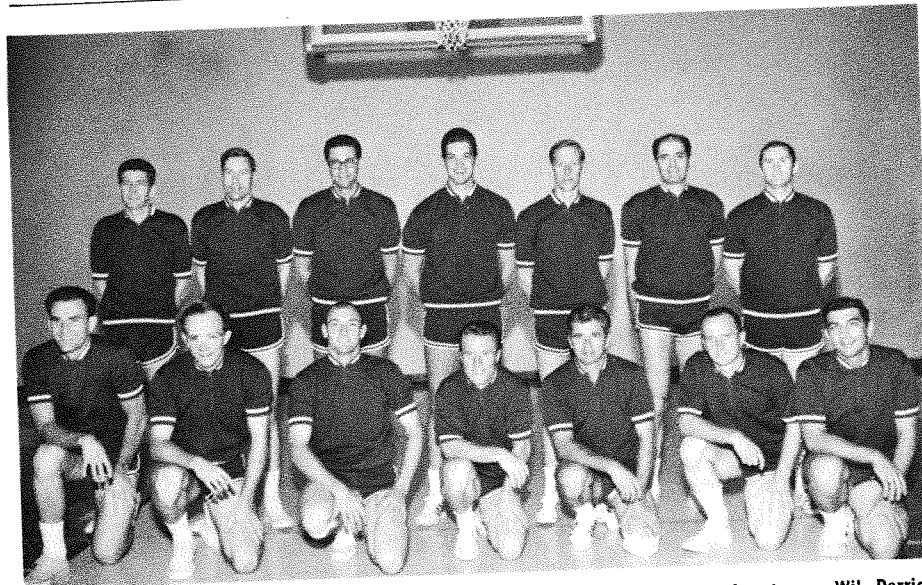

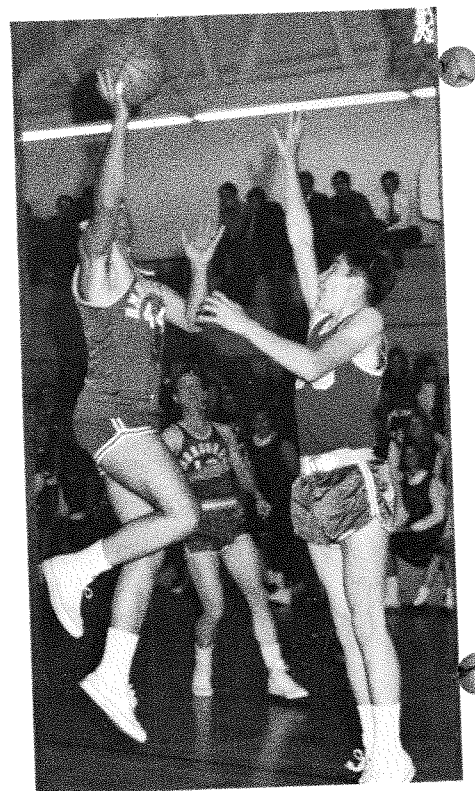

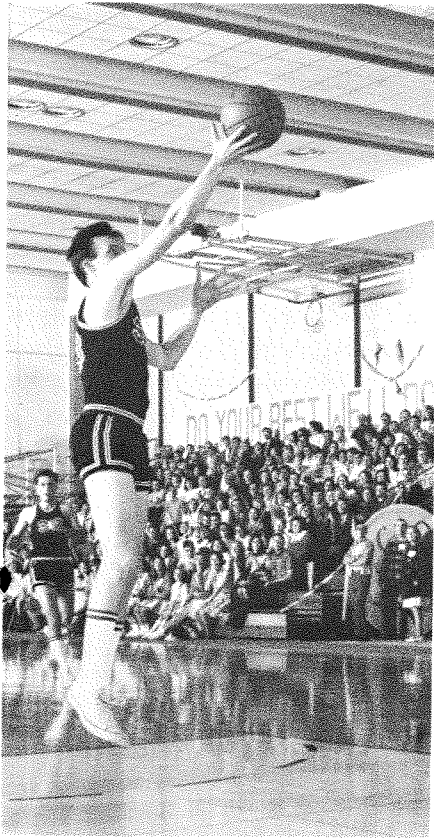

Long, Tall Juniors — Cagey, But Slow

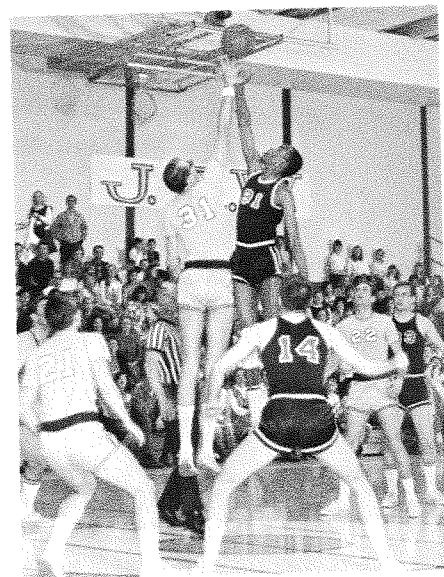
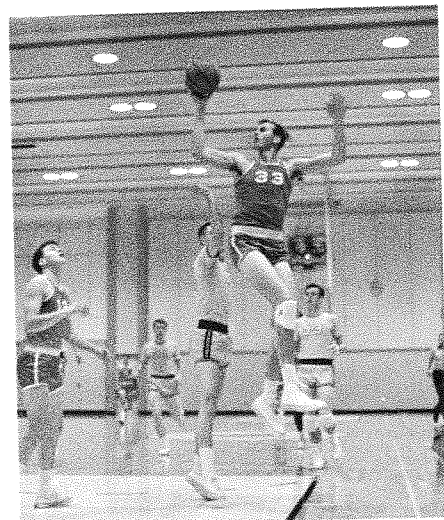

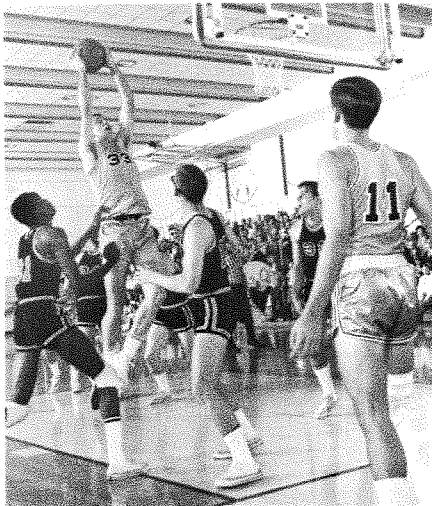
Sophs Lose Height, Retain Their Speed

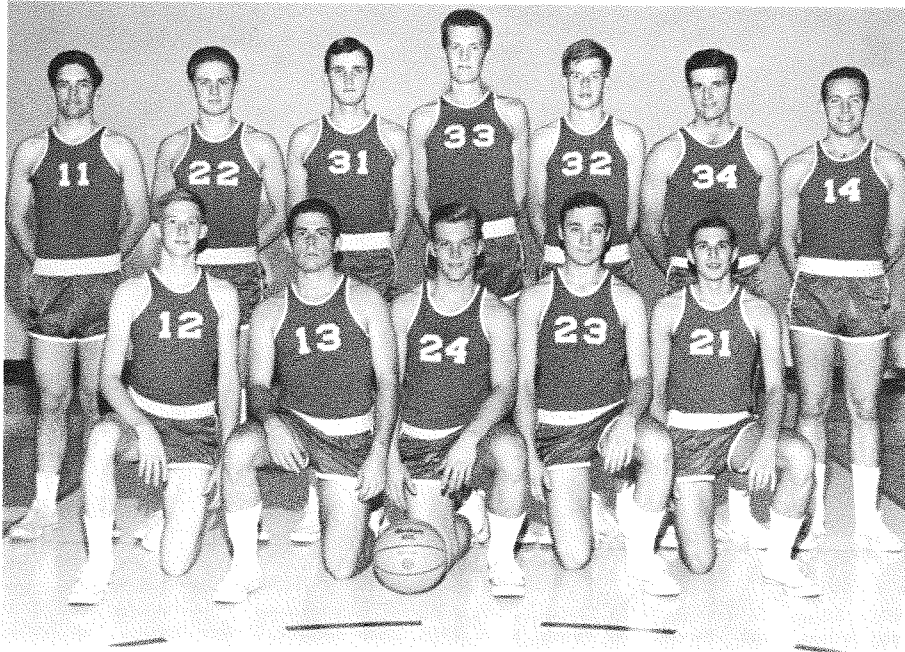

Frosh Placed No. 5

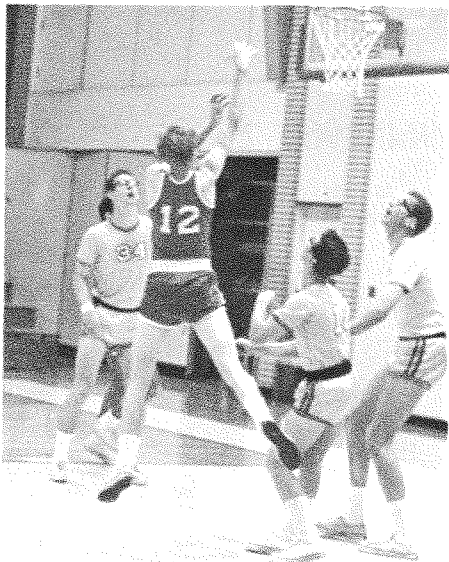
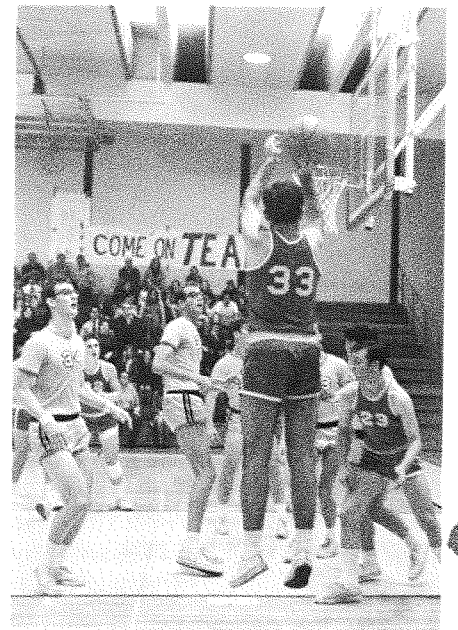

Beware the Night Imperial Gets Hot

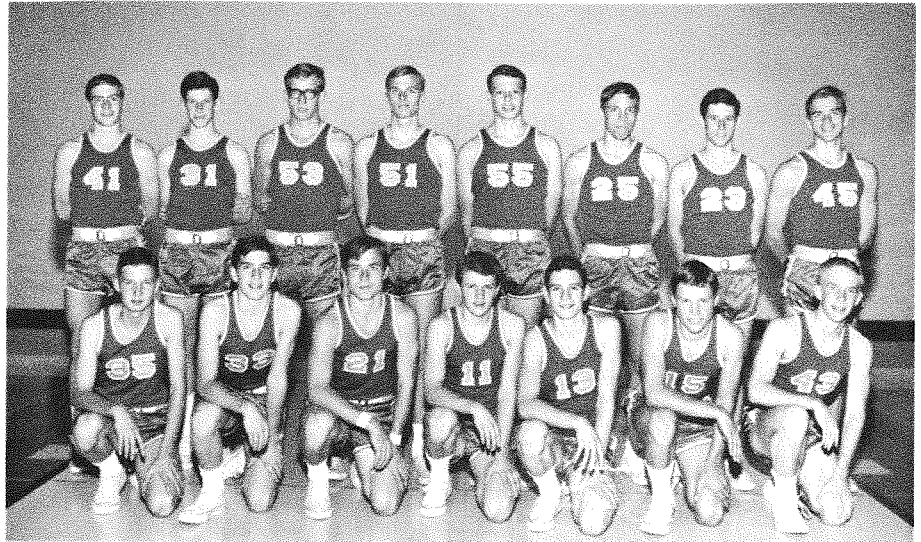
Once again this year Imperial High School faces the roughest schedule of any high school anywhere. After all, where else does any high school team face college teams in its conference play?

Imperial has really looked sharp in its appearances so far. Their coach, Mr. Eric Williams has produced one of the fastest teams around—which can handle the ball smoothly on offense and is tenacious and hustling on defense.

The main problem Imperial has is not its lack of height, surprisingly enough; it is poor shooting from outside. They usually work the ball well and hit the open man, but the open man usually misses his shot. Through fine defense and hustle, Imperial gets almost as many shots attempted as do its opponents, but their shooting percentage, and therefore their scores, are significantly lower. Height too is an important factor. The tallest man on the team is 6' 1" which is about the height of the average college guard.

Quick hands on defence is one of their assets and stealing the ball comes sort of natural for them. Speed is their biggest weapon, and they use it effectively, hustling downcourt and then getting back quickly on defense.

Imperial could hold its own with many high schools, and if their shooting gets hot some night—the college teams had better watch out.
