The Freshmen, who were coming off a loss to the mighty Faculty,


were looking for their first win of the second semester. The only obstacle they ran into was the shields of the Black Knights, better known as the "old men," or Seniors.







FACULTY FRUSTRATES SOPHS 94-72



hand, were missing a considerable amount.






he didn't miss his shot. The Seniors had won! The final score: 101 to 69.




