** LOMA HALL READY FOR FRESHMEN

"This college is not finished with its building programme yet," said Chancellor Herbert W. Armstrong during the dedication of the just-completed women's dormitory. He pointed out that a further building programme with such projects as an Auditorium, a Faculty Building (Administration Building), and a Student Centre is on the drawing boards.

Beginning the dedication Mr. Raymond McNair greeted the assembled throng and introduced the architect of Loma Hall, Mr. Herb Jones. Mr. Jones commented on the notable achievements of the Ambassador College building programme through the years. According to Mr. Jones no more than 10 athletic facilities were chosen to represent England in an athletic facilities' display at the Olympics in Mexico City. A noteworthy achievement of

ERNA BARNARD






Kathi, Andrew and Rita

GAVIN CULLEN



LLOYD DROVER



RON DUNCAN




will be an interesting individual to know.



This year we received another






ROGER HARTOP

BRIAN HICKSON




the truth about medicine and evolution Peter applied to Ambassador College from his home is Berkshire. Playing the piano and folk guitar are Peter's two main pastimes.

HELEN RUTH MATTHEWS





JAMES MUIR



"I'll try anything once!" exclaimed




ant for an insurance firm before he came to Bricket Wood and now works in the Accounts Office at Ambassador College.

JUDY RAEY




the gardens. He first saw the area now known as Ambassador College in 1959. Since then his interests have spread to photography and football. Welcome to College life, Andrew!

SILVIA STADIE



SUEANN WHETSON


