

BERRY BURGESS



ROY EVERETT



HERMAN FICKEWIRTH



GARY HARVEY



If you haven't met Anita yet, ask our College Barber, Mr. Hoffmann, to





DAGMAR KREUZER





GARY LOCK



NICOLA MEADOWS



JANET MILLMAN



ROSEMARY NICKSON



KAREN SILVERNAIL






Pat, Melvin and Karen

PETER TENTY



MELVA MICHELSON




the possibility of transfer here. And, of course, Jim took the invitation. So here he is from the green hills of Tennessee to Ambassador's "Green Campus."

MARCIA KEITH


