



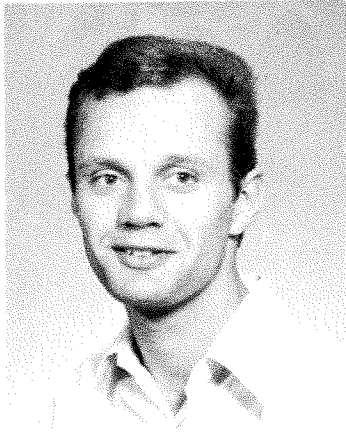

CARL AAS

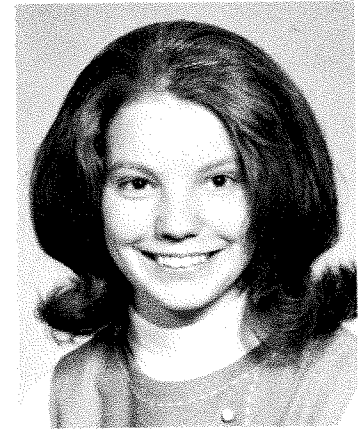

ROSS BEATH

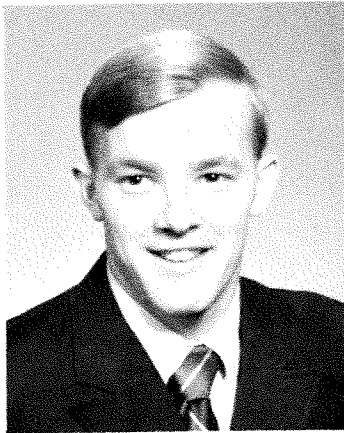

Ross also plays the guitar—maybe a Sing-A-Long prospect!



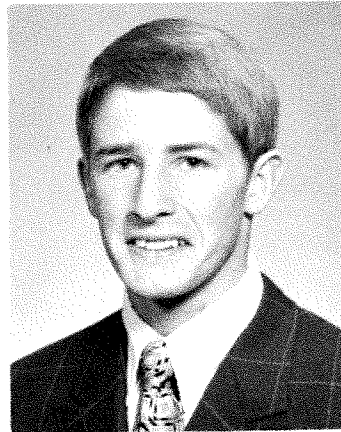
CAROLE BEESTON

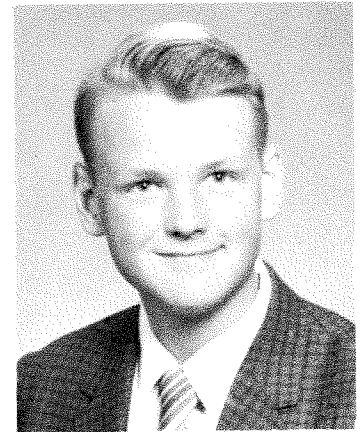
LINDSAY ANDERSON

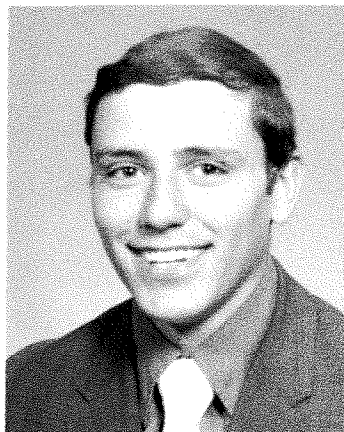
WAYNE BECKER

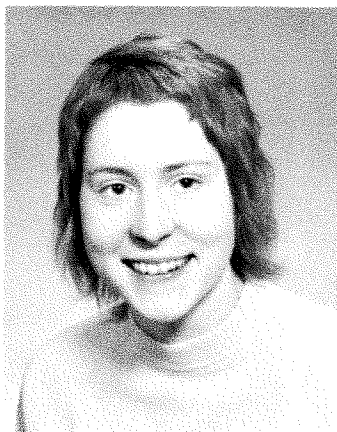
DANIEL BIRKENHEUER

At College now, she is settling down to her new job in the Dutch Department.



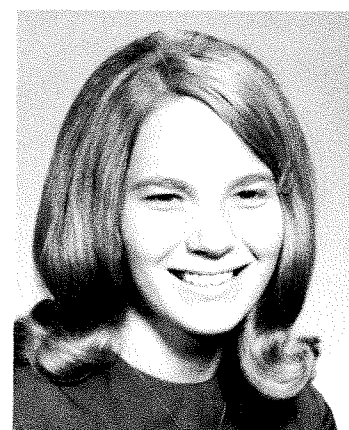
LYNN BRADSHAW

MICKIE COE

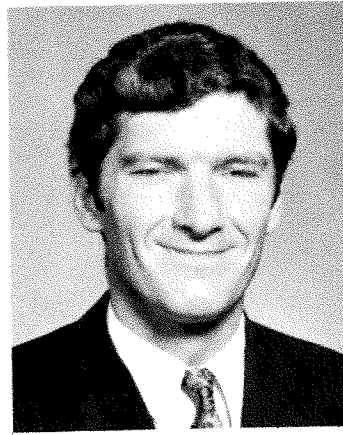

EDUARDO CREPINSEK

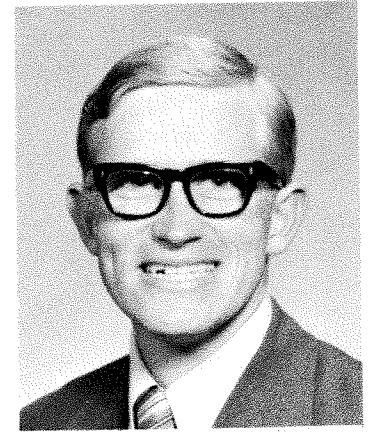

If you pass a janitor singing Austrian songs in a Venezuelan accent, it's probably Eduardo!



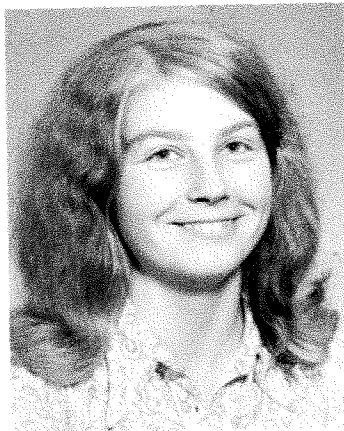
RICHARD DAVIES

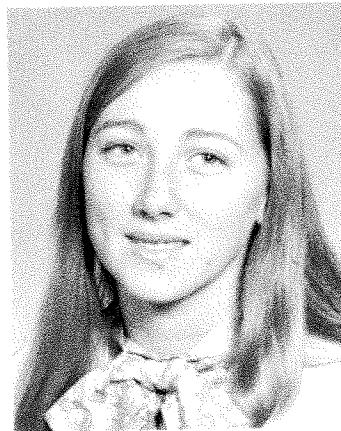
BRUCE DEAN

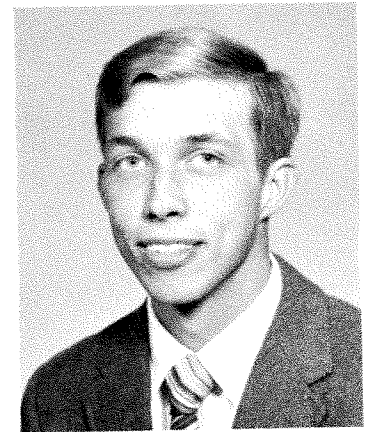
DAWN DAVIES

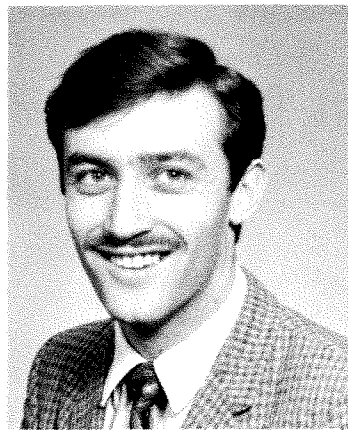


DANIEL DEININGER

He likes music, track and basketball. And he says he likes to watch people. So if you ever feel you're being watched it could be Dairyman Dan Deininger!

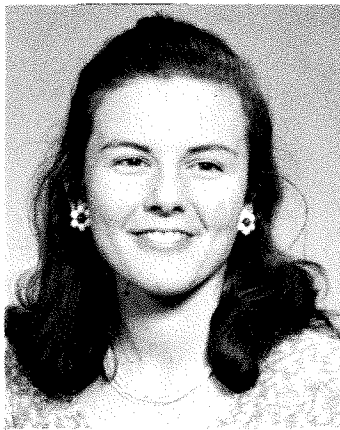


WAYNE GARRATT

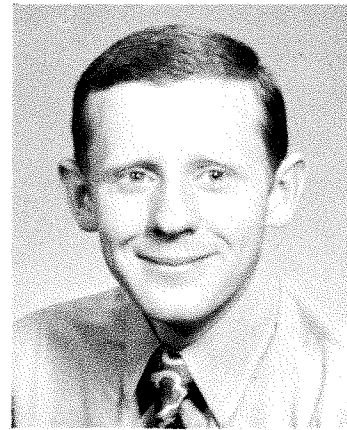
Basketball, squash, athletics, swimming and pistol shooting are some of his long list of sporting interests.

But for now, Wayne is concentrating on his new job as a janitor in the Dining Hall.



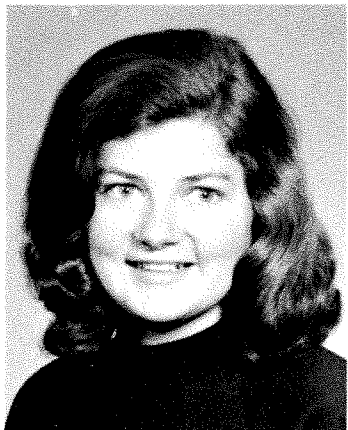
MARIE GRAND

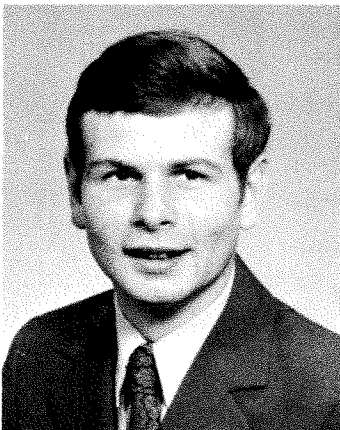
ALLAN HAMBLETON

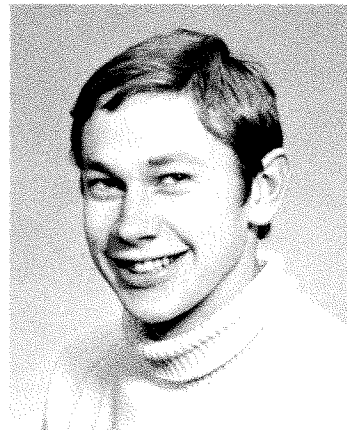
PAMELA GODWIN

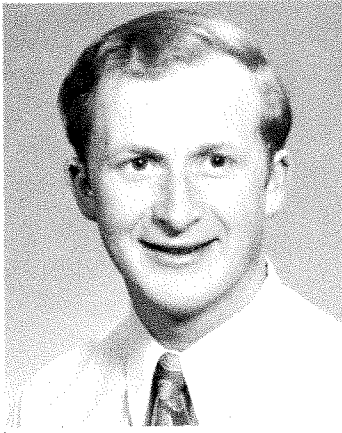
BRUCE GREENAWAY

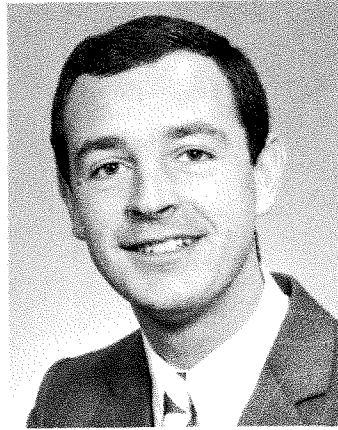
TREVOR HAMES

KENNETH HARPER

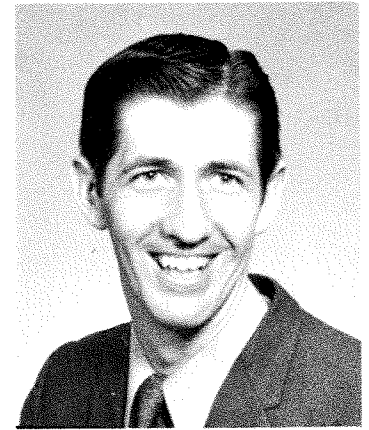

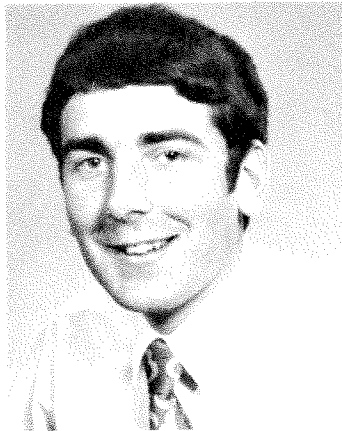

IAN HUFTON

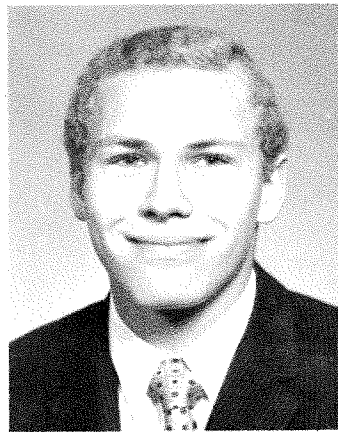

Now Ian is working as a draftsman for the College architect, Mr. Herb Jones.



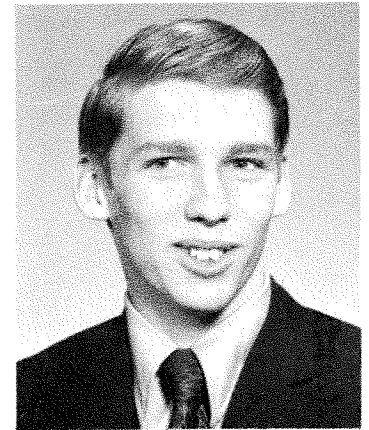
GRAEME HENDERSON

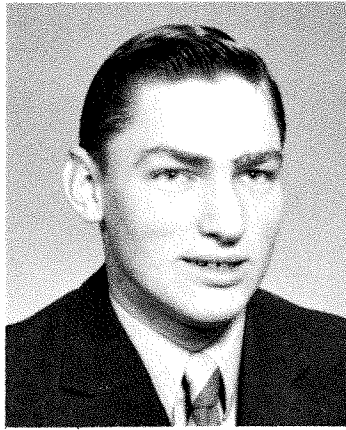


ROBIN JACKSON

18-year-old Robin Jackson is an English-born Australian. Since completing high school last year he has been working as a clerk for the Australian Forestry Commission.

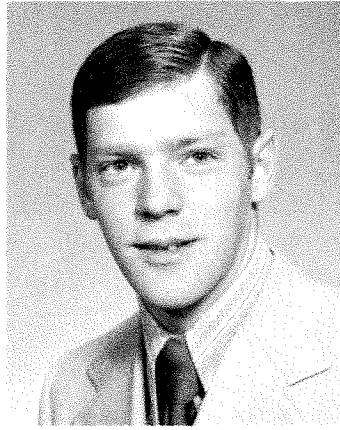
Robin has travelled widely, from New Zealand to Cairo, Bangkok to French Somaliland. In his free time he enjoys hunting, swimming and football.

Robin's ambition is to successfully complete college. This year he's laying the groundwork by working in the Grounds Department.



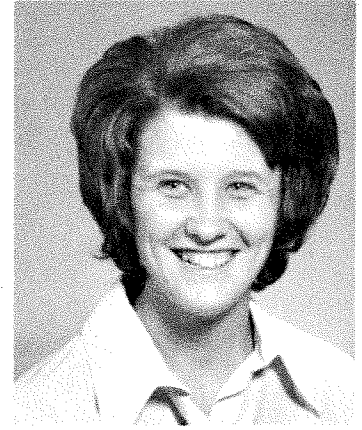
ROSS JUTSUM

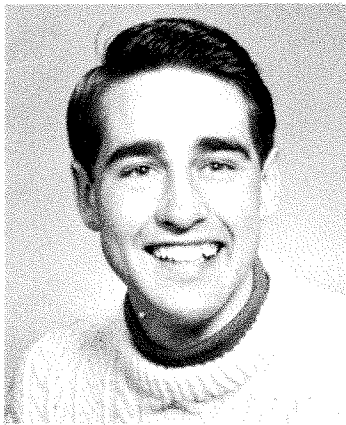
JAMES KOLLER

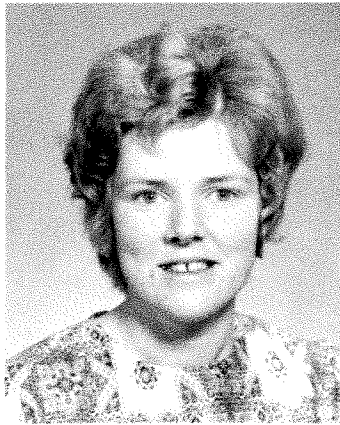
JANET LESKE

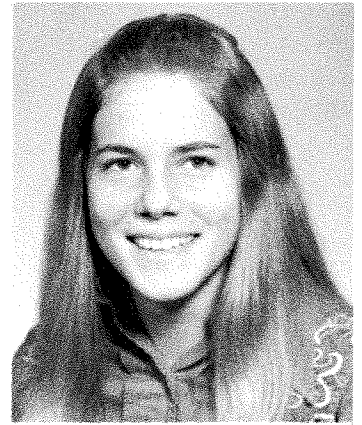
COLIN KELLY

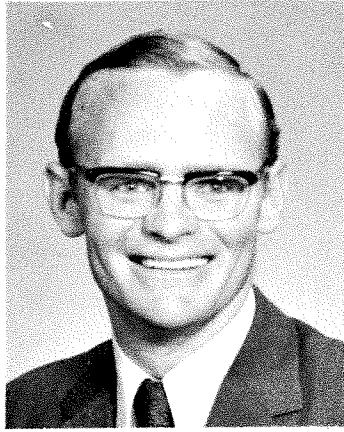
LINDA LARKIN

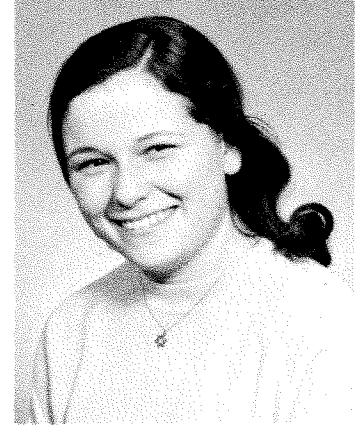
PETER JAMES LONGLEY

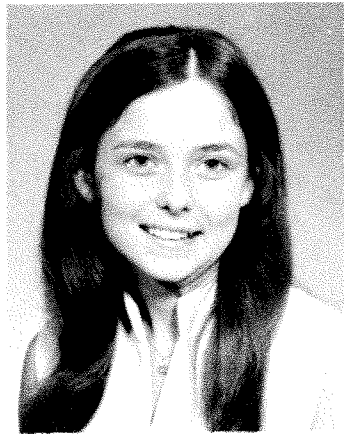
CATHY LOYLE

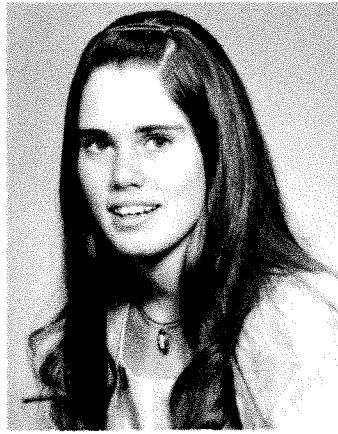
TALLY MAZAR

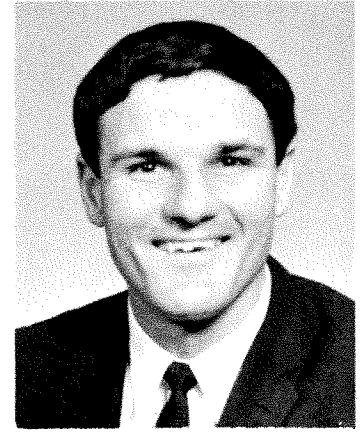
TERRI LOWDER

MERRIE McCANN

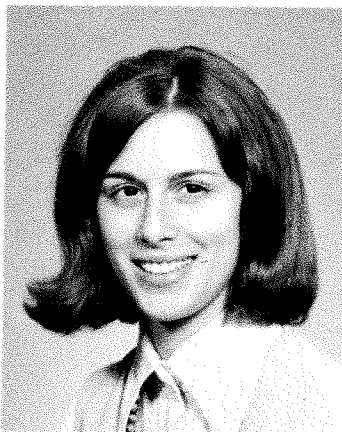

So this year the farm is richer - it has, at least, one penny to its name!



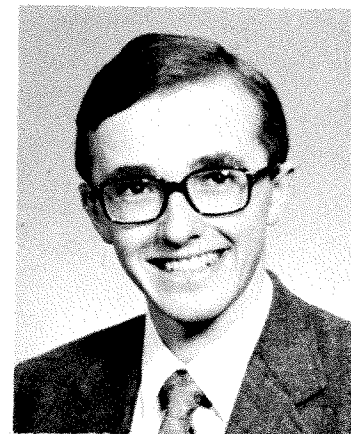
JENNIFER OSBORN

TOM ROOT

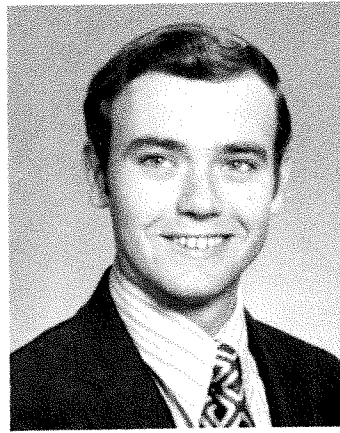

DAVID ROSE

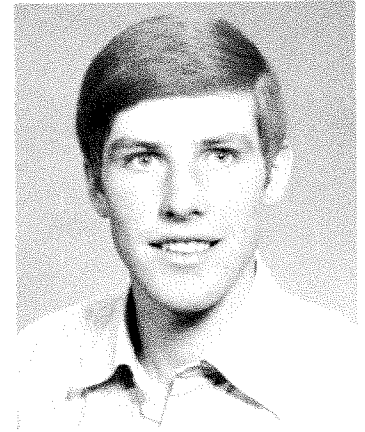

He combines photography and music with his liking for travel. Now as an employee of the travel department, he's making use of his experience in motoring.



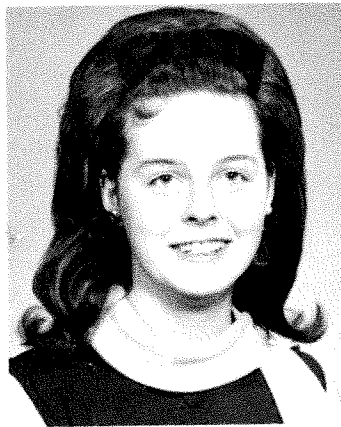
PHILIP SHIELDS

BYRON SMYTHE

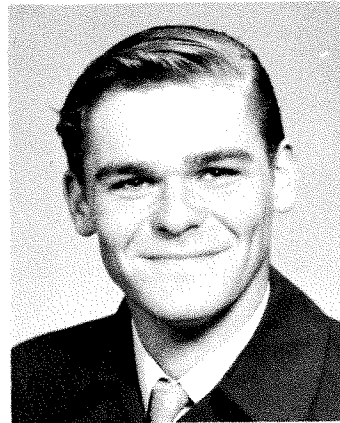

LORRAINE SEATON

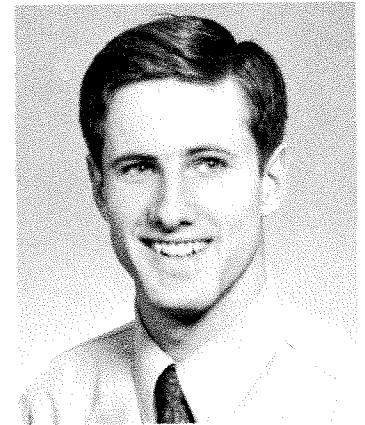

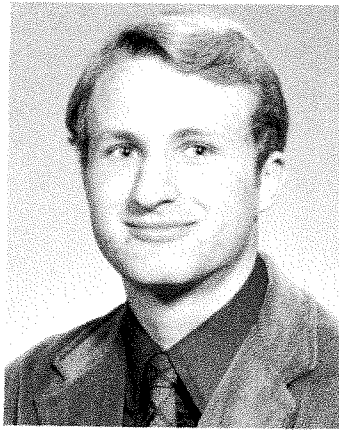
DOUG STAPLETON

And Doug's record proves it. This 17-year-old "Sydney-sider" came tenth in NSW University Maths Competition this past year.

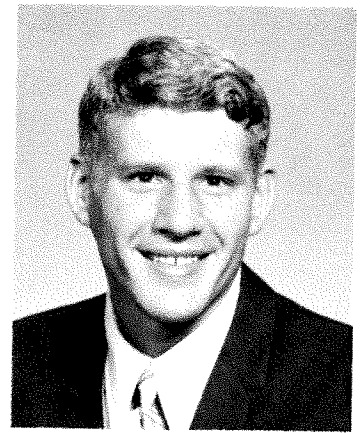
He spent three months in Mexico in 1969, has seen New York, was in Minehead last year and stopped over in Bangkok on his way to College.

But travel (and dating!) are not his only interests. He claims water-skiing, music, basketball, swimming, and eventually hopes to work in the computer department.



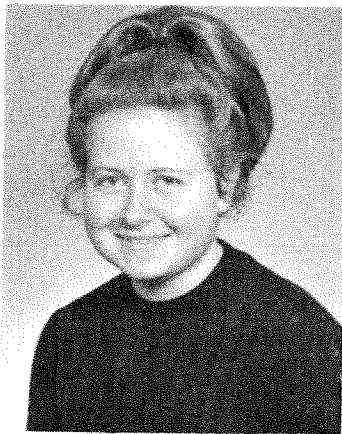
GEOFFREY SYKES

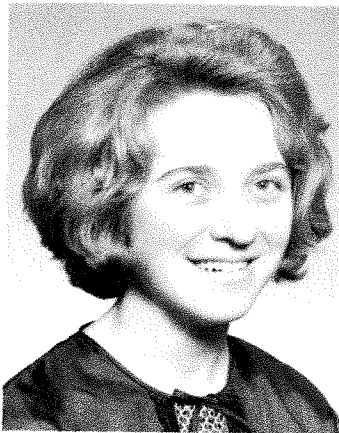
CLAYBORN UMBERFIELD

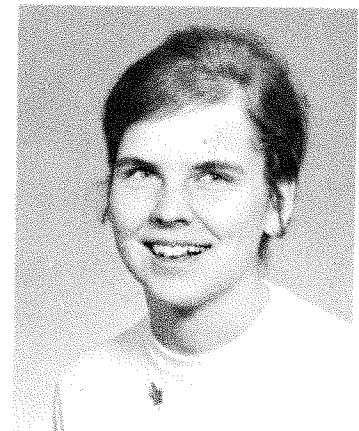
CHRISTIANE STOBBE

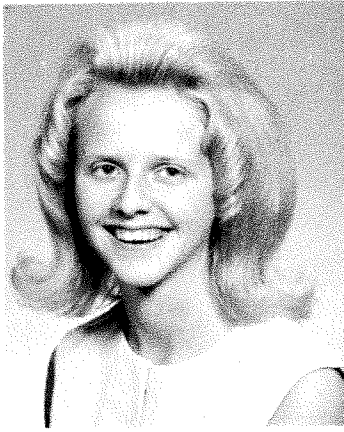
BEVERLY TINWORTH

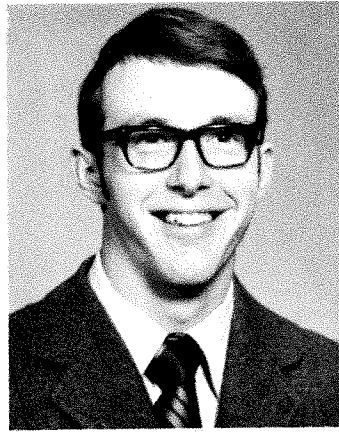
JEANNETTE VAN PELT

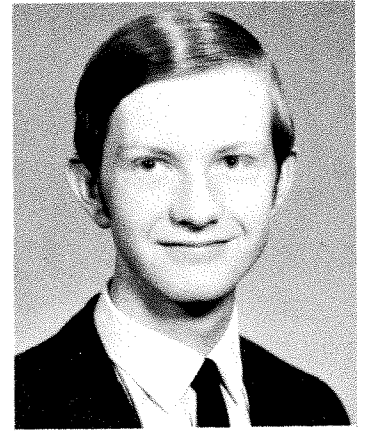
TINA VAN DE POLDER

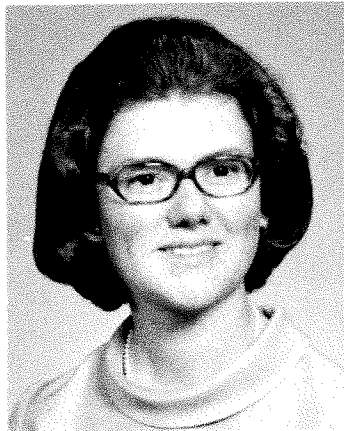
DANA VINSON

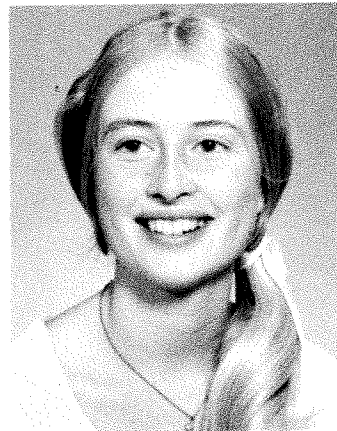
RICHARD WILKINSON

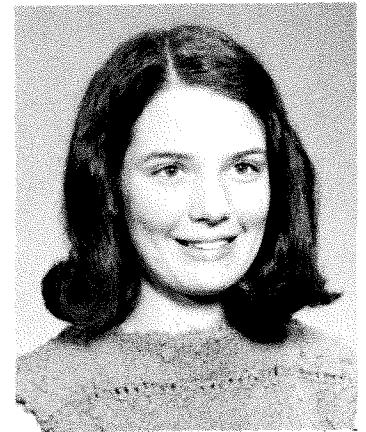
MATTHEA VAN DER WENDE

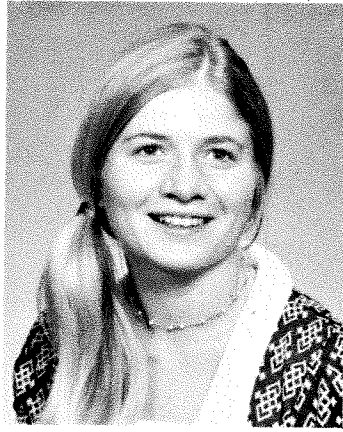
ANITA WICKHAM

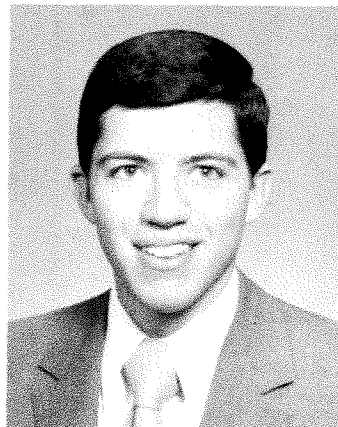
SUZI ZIMMERMAN

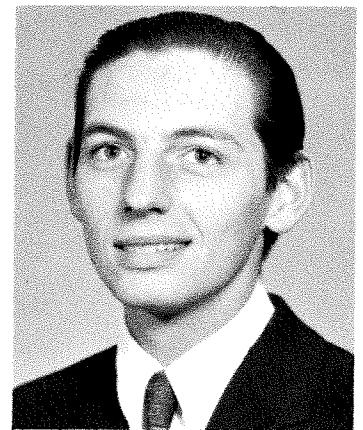
MR. AND MRS. JOHN

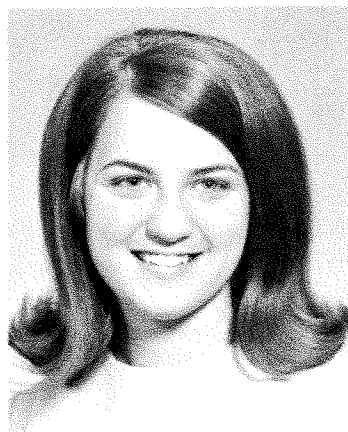
LARRY BOYTS

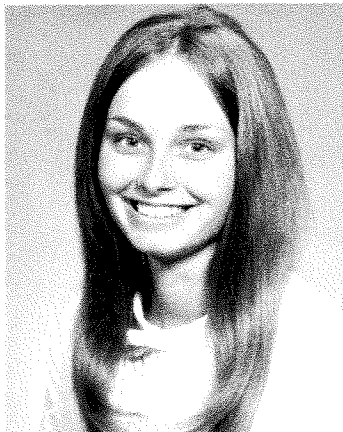
DONALD CHANDONNET

CHARLA DENNY

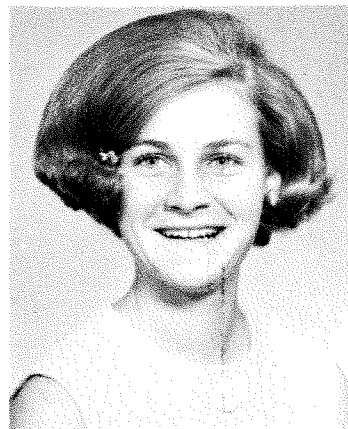

CHUCK GERRINGER

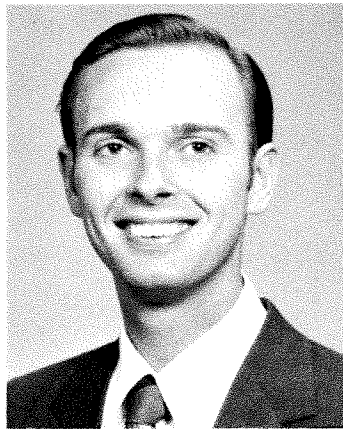
"I thought you graduated? – Oh, sorry!"

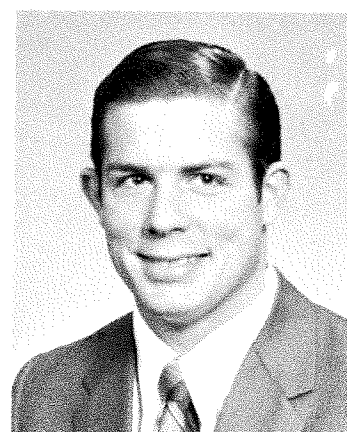
SHIRLEY HEGVOLD
