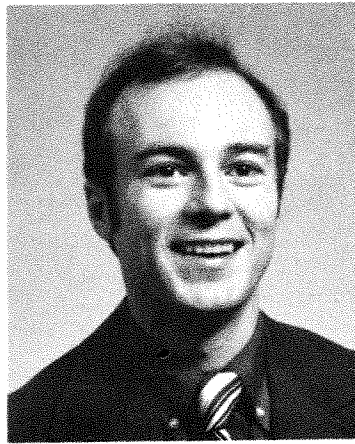


FRESHMAN STUDENT INTERVIEWS

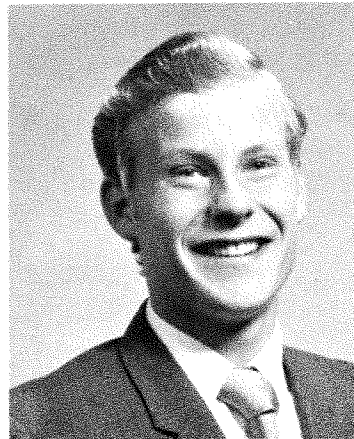
MARIA BONELL

Maria, who is 17, was born in Rhodesia, but has lived most of her life in Australia. Now she has travelled half way around the world to receive an Ambassador education.

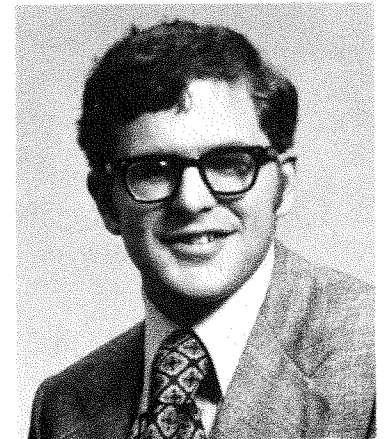
Maria enjoys the "out of doors", and is now an employee of the Agricultural Department.

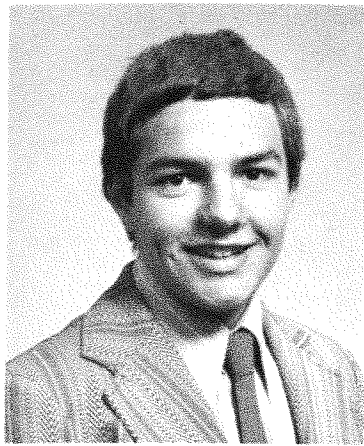
STEVE BUCHANAN

Ambassador College welcomes another all-rounder, Steve, and we wish you the best "all round".



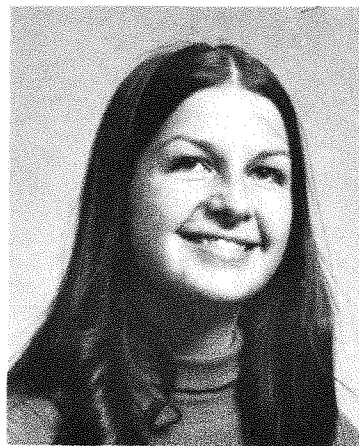
NICK BUTLER

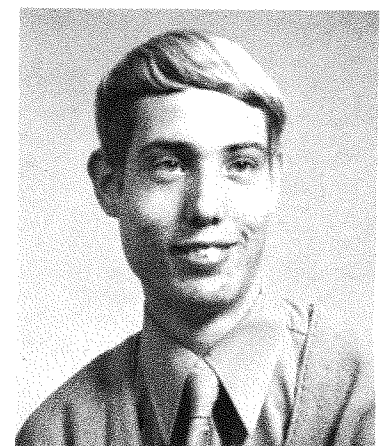
MICHELE CARION

Rhona, who has already travelled in Europe, has a desire "to see the United States before graduating".

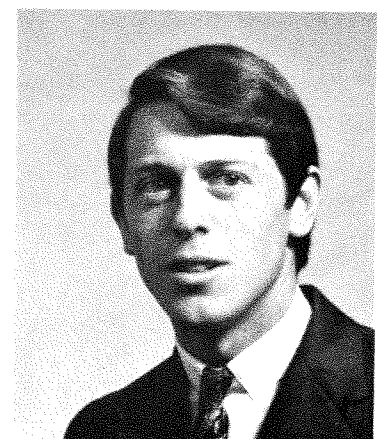
At present Rhona is employed on the Janitor crew.



LAURA DAVIS

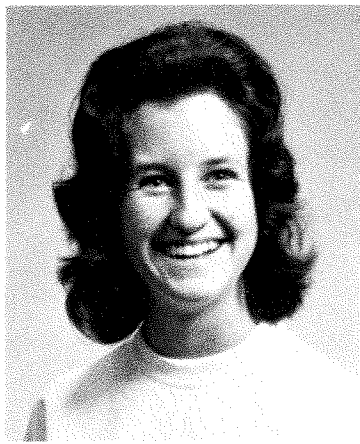
Straight from high school comes 18 year old Laura Davis. Lively Laura is a sports enthusiast and is a welcome addition to the freshman girls' basketball team.

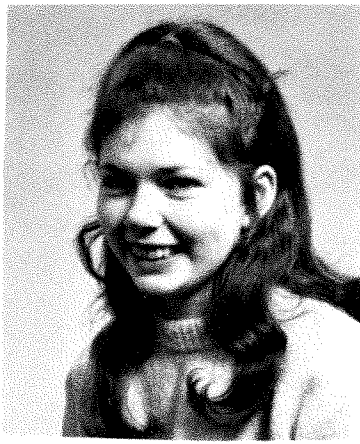


JEANNETTE FANN

Have you met the lively brunette janitress over at the dining hall? Her name is Jeannette Fann.

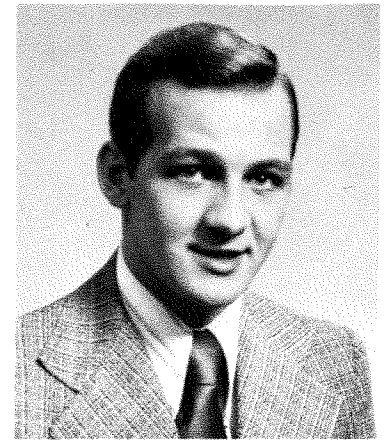
Jeannette, who hails from South Africa, graduated from school last December. Before coming to England, Jeannette worked as Girl Friday for the Durban telephone accounts department.

Now with reading as one of her main interests, Jeannette's ambition is to become an Imperial School teacher. Welcome to Bricket Wood, Jeannette.



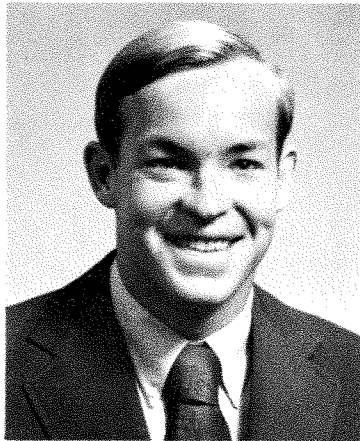
HEATHER FAWSETT

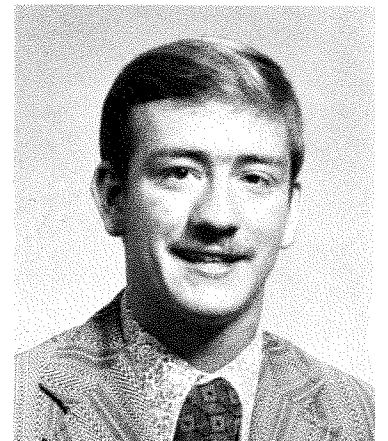


RICHARD FORKUN

Oxford to Kent to Bricket Wood — welcome to the best part of England, Richard!

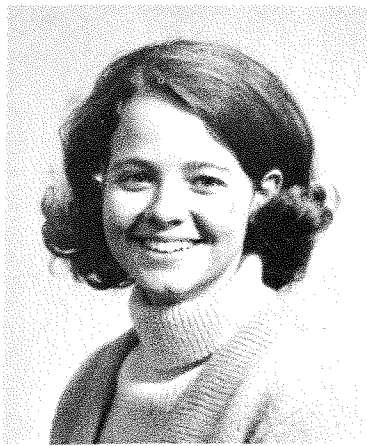


DAVID FOWLER

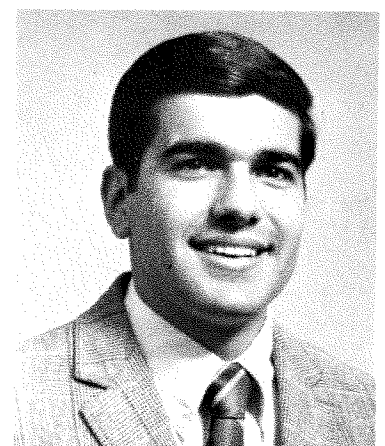
CAROLANNE GIBSON

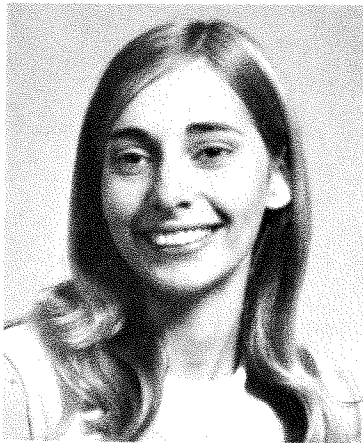
Sewing, cooking and painting are Carolanne's hobbies as well as horseriding, basketball and skating.

Queensland, Australia is the life-long home of 18-year-old Ruth Hensley.

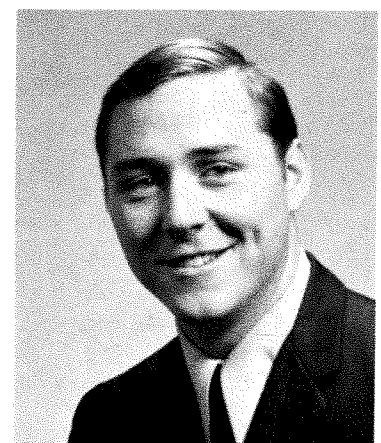
Having spent the last year "governessing" two small children, she is a welcome addition to the college pool of babysitters. She has interests in horseback riding, animal training, cooking and sewing.

Bricket Wood gives a big "Howdy" to you Charles.



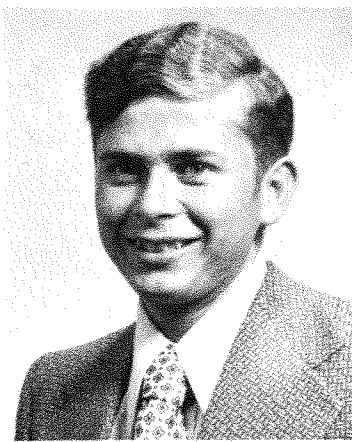
TONY HUTCHINS

Tony, who already has a Bachelor of Science degree, should find his stay at Bricket Wood most profitable.



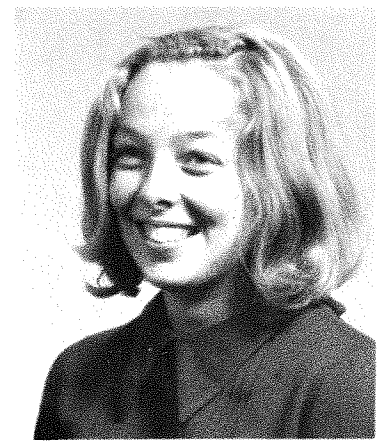
TOM IVICEVIC

Other interests include surfing, volleyball and football. Peter Bacon please note, Tom has been trained as a part-time fireman.

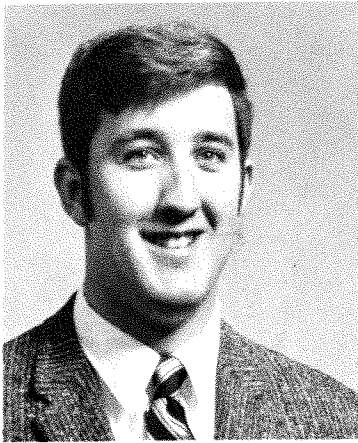


CAROL JOHNSON

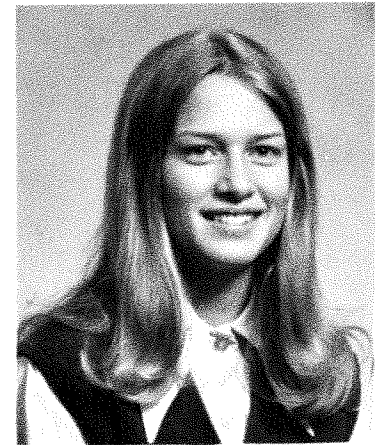

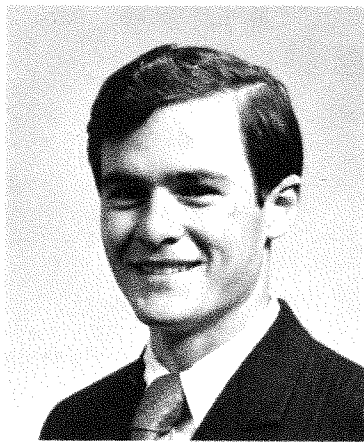
COLEEN KUNZ

Welcome, Coleen.

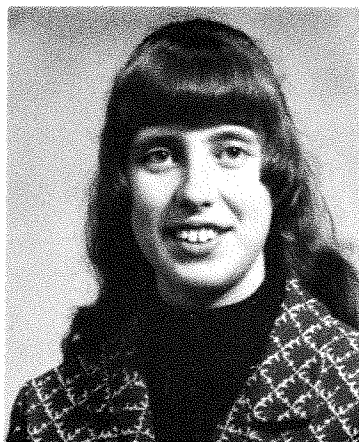


GLENN LaMOUNTAIN

Learning new sports such as swimming and squash is one activity Glenn is looking forward to at Ambassador, as well as travelling on the continent, particularly in France.

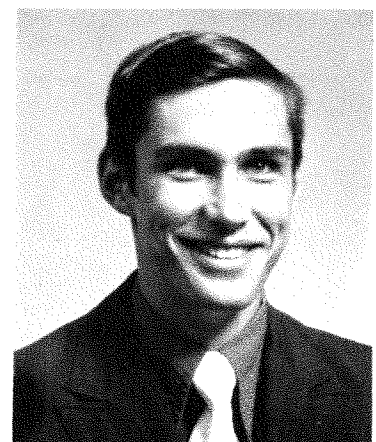


MARIE LITAVSKY

Having just graduated from high school, Marie's hobbies are basketball, swimming, badminton, canoeing, sailing and water ski-ing.

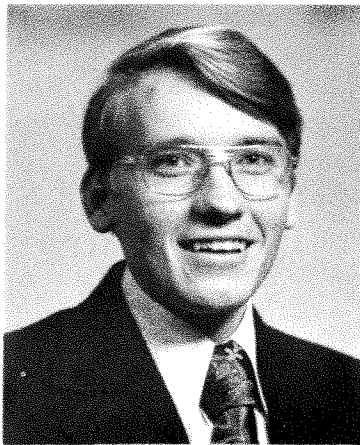
Why did she choose to come to Bricket Wood? Because she has a lot of friends here, and she wants to travel more. There's plenty of opportunity for that over here, Marie.

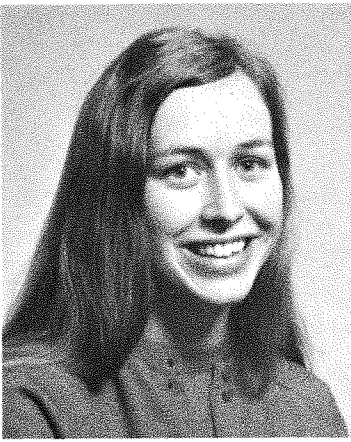
MARLANE MacLEOD

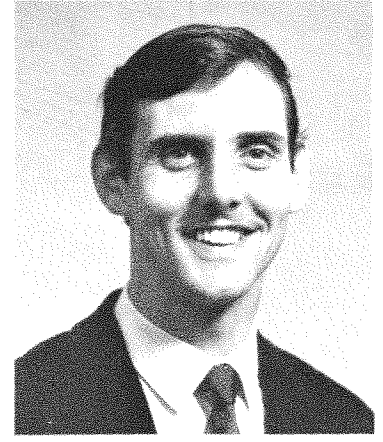
GALE MAWHINNEY

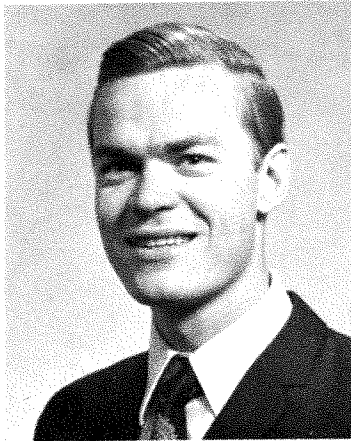


BILL MURPHY

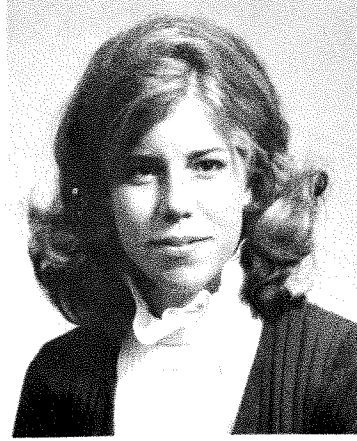
After leaving school, Bill had two years' professional training in youth and community work. This prepared him for a position in charge of youth activities at an Experimental Youth Centre in Glasgow.

One of his interests gives Bill lots of *kicks* — he's a keen football player!



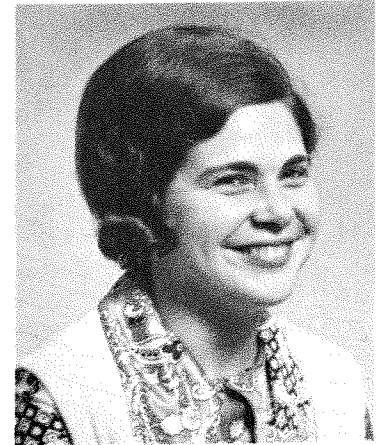
KEN MURRAY

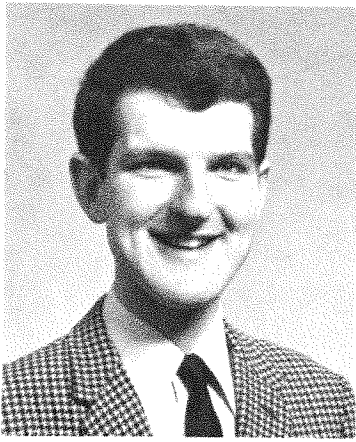


DONNA PATTEMORE

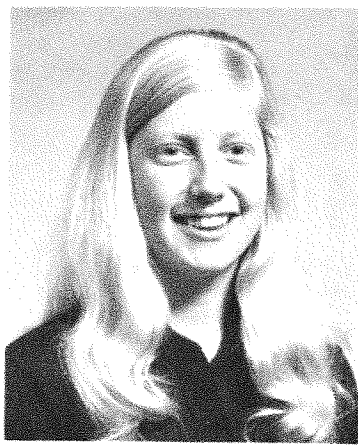
That'll get Mr. Crabtree thinking, and there's news for Mr. Michel too! Donna's an enthusiastic sportswoman — especially when it comes to basketball!

Her favourite sports are swimming and softball. Gillian also likes cooking — something Mr. Canvin's making use of in the kitchen this year!



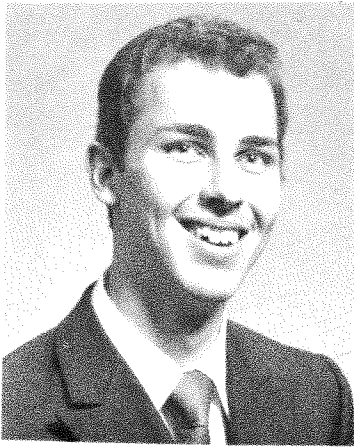
JAN PORTER

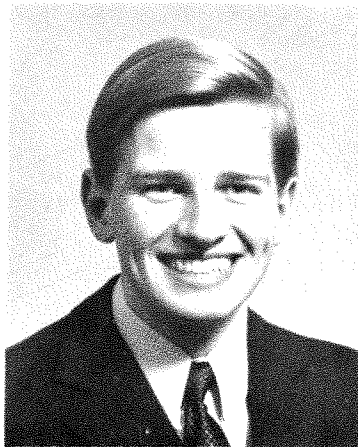
But Jan is a determined young lady. Not to be daunted, she has *boomeranged* back into action at Bricket Wood.

Great to have you back, Jan! Keep dancing!



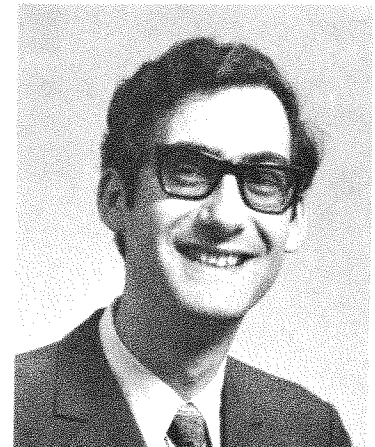
DENNIS RAMLOW

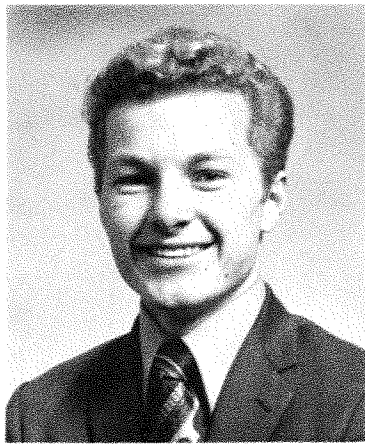
ALAN REDMOND

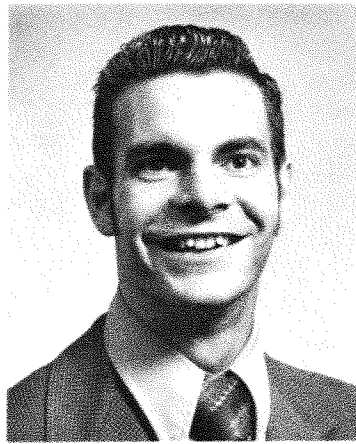
MARTIN REGTIEN

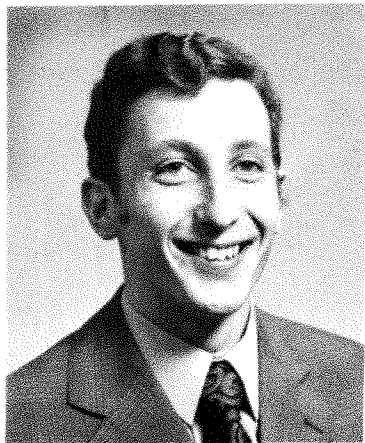


JILL SMITH

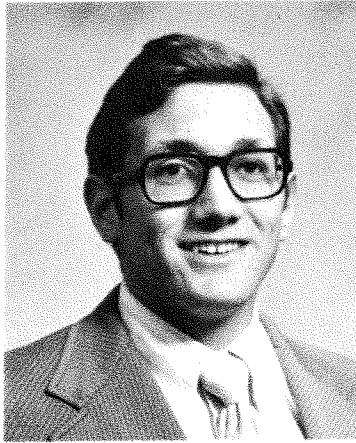

Another interest is "people". "Not just talking to them, but watching them," as she says. So if you ever feel you're being watched . . . maybe Jill Smith's around!



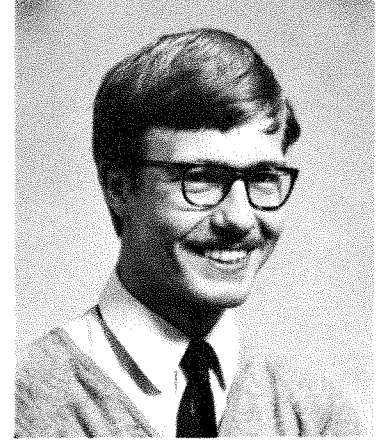
JOHN TATTERSALL

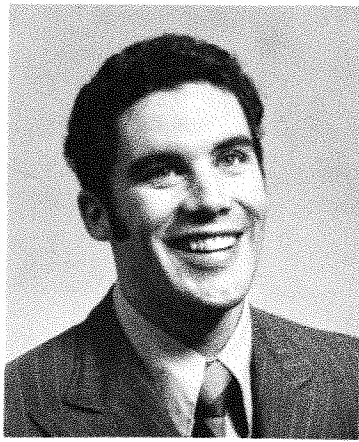


MARTIN TRANQUADA

Martin enjoys playing football, cricket and basketball. Other interests include history and geography. There is plenty of scope for these at Ambassador, Martin!



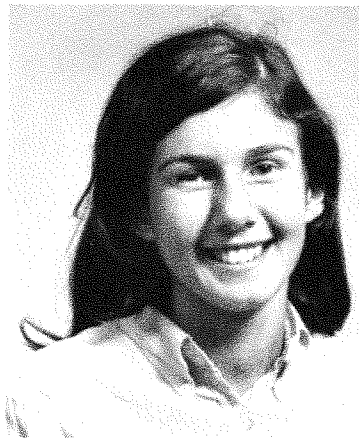
STEVEN WALDEN

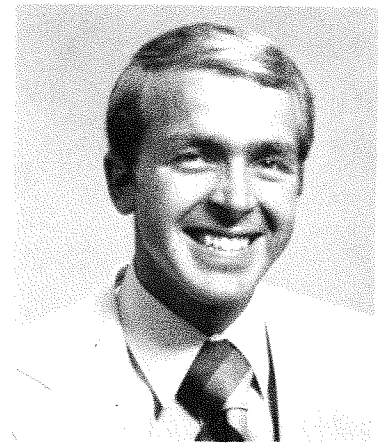
How old does that make him? He's all of 23! Welcome to Ambassador, Steve!

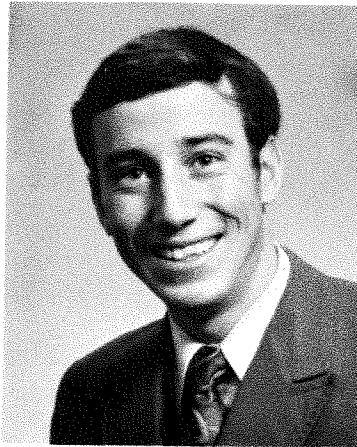
Annette spent last year studying French and Marketing at the Southampton College of Technology. Along with travel and languages, she lists sports and meeting people as her chief interests.



RONALD WEINLAND

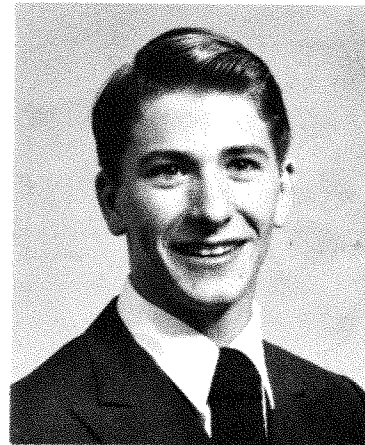
Born in Colorado, Ron's family moved to Kansas when he was only three years old. Brought up on a farm, he graduated from high school and went to college, majoring in physics and maths.

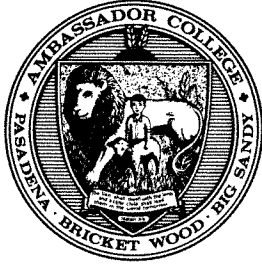
GREG WHITE

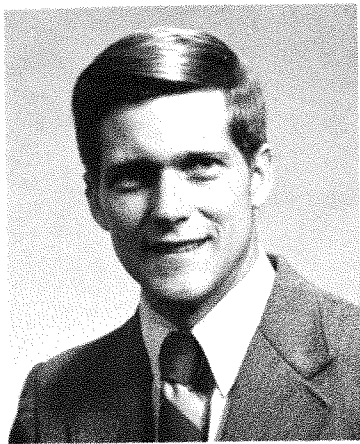


EMORY WILLIAMS

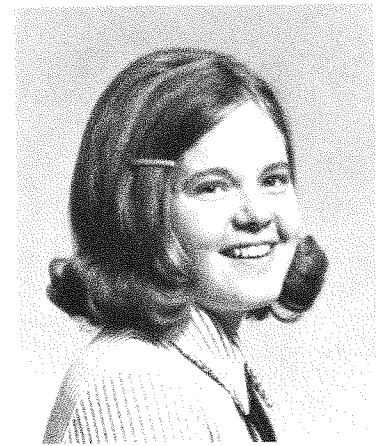
In his spare time, Craig plays American football, tennis and enjoys surfing. Yet he still finds time to delve into Roman history and play the guitar.

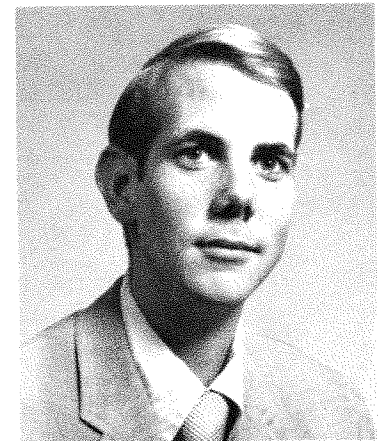


CAROLYN LANG

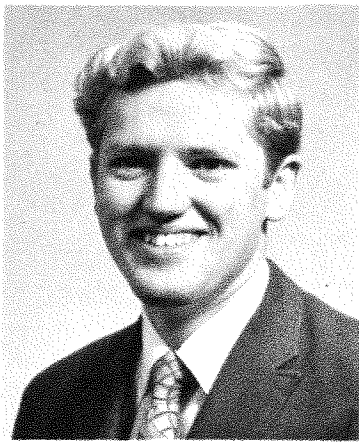
JOHN McCAULLEY

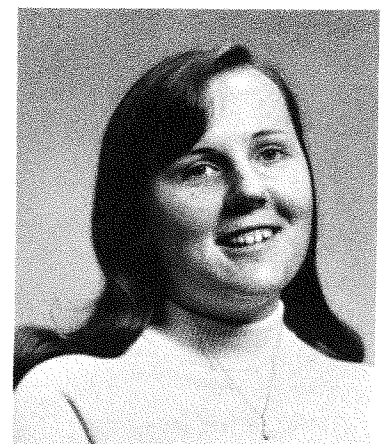


COLLEEN MATTHEWS

He also has an interest in history, geography, antiques, art and watching ballet.

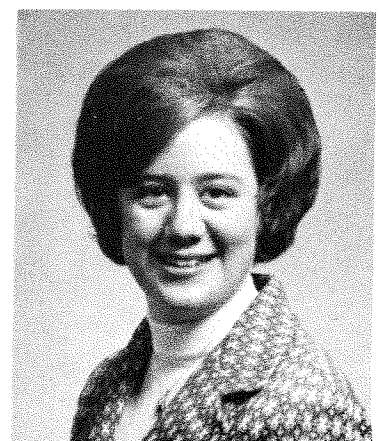
Paul, who has travelled widely in the States and in Europe, is a welcome addition to the Sophomore class.
