The attendance was a pleasant surprise to the Manteufel's since there had not yet been a letter from Headquarters to the brethren in Kansas giving the details of the new church. The only ones who knew about it were the members Mr. Manteufel was able to visit ahead of time and the other brethren whom they in turn informed. The 101 present were composed of 48 adults (that's 4 times 12!) and 53 children. Many came to the services from over 70 miles distance.

The new Church meets in the 20th Century Club in Wichita. The members here will also have the privilege of having the Passover and Days of Unleavened Bread services available to them in the same hall. For some this will be the first time these services have ever been close enough o attend. For others HUNDREDS OF MILES will be cut off the trip normally nade to observe these days.

The Manteufels are also pastoring the tarden City Church of God, which still neets at the same time (Friday evening :30 P.M.) because the drive of 224 miles etween the two cities is too much to enble them to have both services in the day-

MR. GENE HUGHES-Australia Bound

On February 28, Gene Hughes, with his wife Judy and his son John Anthony, flew to the "land down under" to become both office manager and business manager of God's work in Asia and the Pacific area.

Mr. Hughes grew up in the environs of Bakersfield. At age five, he was asking his parents about the discrepancy between the story of cave men in science books and the account of Adam and Eve in the Bible. He developed a great interest in science and scientific philosophy.

At 14, Herr Hughes began listening to The World Tomorrow broadcast and reading the PLAIN TRUTH magazine. He realized then that Ambassador would be the only college where he could get what he wanted from life.

When he graduated from high school, he received an award from the Westinghouse Science Talent Search for a paper he wrote about jet propulsion.

Gene spent three years in junior college, majoring in mechanical engineering and geology. Then he and two other men spent a year doing geo-physical surveys. They traveled over much of the western third of the country in a jeep measuring background radiation--relating it to geological structure.

Are You A Telephone Slave?

How many times should a telephone ring before you answer it? USUALLY ONCE!! If you are a step away or engaged in conversation--perhaps twice! NEVER more than THREE TIMES.

Some phones have continued to ring FIFTEEN TIMES before the caller hung up. Could this have been you calling? What thoughts must go through the mind of the persistant caller, if any? If you keep calling, eventually someone at the other end of the building will get up in disgust and answer your call. Ministers' phones are often reached only through the switchboard. Their phones ring ONLY ONCE, a second time if it is an urgent call. But the phone across the hall can still be ringing incessantly be cause someone isn't thinking!

When calling an office or dormitory on campus, if you don't get an answer, conclude that no one is there! That may take a little thinking--of others instead of yourself! Call back in five minutes or fifteen. IF it is urgent, call a nearby phone and leave a message.

Whatever you do, don't just sit there doodling for minutes while a dozen people trying to work suffer the distraction of your persistence, wondering when you will hang up.

Let THREE RINGS be the <u>MAXIMUM</u> for campus calls, with the possible exception of a dormitory hall phone.

How should you answer a phone? WHAT SHOULD YOU SAY? Introduce yourself, the other party wants to know to whom they are talking. "Hello, this is Edward R. Portfolio speaking", then state your business. Answer the obvious questions in a listener's mind courteously and quickly.

The principle in defining the use of any of these material gadgets is that they are to serve us, not to ENSLAVE us!
