

Messiah-Grand Success



New IBM equipment in action!

Installed

A tremendous converting process is now under way at the Press Building. With the installation of a new IBM system, gigantic strides toward more efficient and speedier work have been achieved

Here is the step-by-step process. If you have ever belonged to a book of the month club, you know what an IBM card looks like. A special electric machine types pertinent information on the card.

Each city and state has a code number. This, together with the name, is indicated on the card by perforations on the card.

The card is then processed by a 'verifier" which flashes on a red light if the code on the card doesn't agree with the proper address.

Next, the electronic printer goes into This machine duplicates the information found on the cards. The duplication is imprinted on a seemingly endless tape. On this tape is the name, address and status.

Then comes the final astonishing step The clattering Address-o-Graph has been replaced by "Magnacraft," part of the IBM equipment.

Now we can run EIGHTEEN-THOUSAND PLAIN TRUTHS per hour -- 10,000 more than with the old machine! Each minute in operation, "Maggie" -- as the machine has been dubbed, can label 300 addresses.

There will be less noise, fewer mechanical breakdowns and almost no torn or ripped P. T.'s. "Maggie" will also be able to handle the P. T. when a hard cover is added.

Most of this is response to the annual bulletin; nevertheless, this could be ONLY THE BEGINNING of an even greater rapidity of growth than we have at Headquarters.


Lain-Grabbe Union
