
Latest Results Of Baptising Tours

This Is Too Hard For Me



Recently, I saw a film "The Birdman of Alcatraz." The story dealt with Robert Stroud who spent fifty-three years in prison. Many of those years were spent in solitary confinement.

During those years, this man became the *foremost authority* on bird diseases. Mind you—while in *prison*. He laboriously wrote a book dealing with the history of penology (prisons).

He studied histology, pathology, morphology, and a host of other sciences—studies that are difficult for college professors. This man became proficient in these *in prison*.

wonderful body of art treasures from the Renaissance and the warmth and friendliness of the people, at least to me with my rusty Italian. I must have truly taken on the atmosphere of the country, for I was stopped twice in Florence by



Italians inquiring about street directions.

My tour finished with a one-day stay at the chateau of a friend, very luxurious and quite beautiful. Then on to Amsterdam, where I viewed the old Dutch master painters and heard a Verdi opera at the charming little opera house. Four days after my return to London we were on the *Queen Mary* sailing for home.

Stroud withstood every physical and mental privation. Many men go "stir crazy." Robert Stroud never did.

On the other hand, another man—Loeb—also a young man, allowed prison existence to get the better of him. He and another man attempted a prison break. Loeb was shot, but *not* badly wounded.

But his attitude was miserable. "I can't stand this place," he complained. "What do I have to live for. *I'll* be in this place for 25 years—*I* can't take it. *I* want to die."

"Die?" Stroud replied, "You've got your whole life ahead of you and you talk about dying—quitting!"

Loeb looked at him and spit out, "Bull!" and died!

There is a great lesson to learn from that situation. Here was Robert Stroud—who could have continued feeling sorry for himself, who had every "reason" to do so.

But he didn't! He dug in—worked, studied, accomplished. He rose above his environment, above his problems!

Loeb became a slave to his environment! He murmured and complained. He ate himself internally.

Stroud took the bull by the horns. He didn't excuse himself by saying "it's too hard," or "I've always been this way," or "I've had a miserable life," or "I don't have the ability."

This is what creates character—doing what YOU don't want to do.

Robert Stroud became free from the humdrum cycle of prison life—by not yielding to boredom and disgust. YOU can become FREE—physically, mentally, and SPIRITUALLY by not yielding to human nature—and YIELDING TO GOD!

YOU can't do anything of yourself! But God brought YOU to His college. God KNOWS that HE can do it THROUGH YOU!! But first, you must have the burning desire—unflinching—to serve Him in any capacity HE sees fit to use you in. You must want to!!

Messrs. Catherwood and Luker — baptized 127 OUT OF 270. "Many who do not meet us write that they either 'can't get off from work' to meet us, or 'have things to do' that day, and ask if we can come by at 'a more convenient date'." Isn't it amazing how many things seem more important than ETERNAL LIFE!

BAIRD-HOLLADAY

Messrs. Baird and Holladay—BAP-TIZED 74 OUT OF 247. In Louisiana they counseled with and baptized a Negro. When they returned to their motel room that night the motel owner, accompanied by the Sheriff, ORDERED THEM TO LEAVE—without a refund! They were "kicked out of town" for baptizing a Negro.

JACKSON-ATLAS

Messrs. Jackson and Atlas-BAP-TIZED 13 OUT OF 50. Mr. Jackson wrote, "Last year my wife and I left a young woman in Whatley. Alabama in tears because she could not be baptized. She was ready for baptism. Her husband was very antagonistic but was not home at the time we visited her. She asked us to leave before he arrived because she was sure he would use physical force to prevent baptism. This year Mr. Atlas and I arrived in Whatley determined to baptize her. We were expecting to be confronted by an angry, snarling husband, but instead, we were welcomed by a humble, gentle, REPENTANT man. BOTH are now baptized."

JONES-BEDFORD

Latest Philippine Developments


Conditions and circumstances are much different in the Philippines. But, in that Jesus Christ is leading the Work and giving us favor, it is coming along in a very favorable manner. There have been TYPHOONS, FLOODS, AND OTHER SETBACKS (I have had a severe intestinal upset) but nevertheless, the Work has progressed much faster than I thought possible (Eph. 3:20).

God has given us unusual favor in the eyes of many, and through very miraculous circumstances, He has opened up fine offices for His Work in these Islands.

I arrived on the morning of July 23rd. By early afternoon, Christ had led Mr. Ortiguero and me out of the district in which I thought offices would open to us—to a very new business district in Makati, a suburb of Manila. Not only is the atmosphere much more favorable here than in the city itself, but also, it is within a five minute drive of the nice home God has opened to us.

Even though there are several new buildings in this district, only one had available space. Had I been here one week earlier, there would have been several spaces from which to choose. But, it seems Christ caused every space to be taken right out from "under our nose," showing us where He wanted an office.

There are probably several reasons why office space was opened to us in this building and not in the others. However, I would not have seen these reasons had I not been forced to analyze why Christ

opened space in this building instead of in some of the much taller ones.

The "CCC" Building (Commercial Credit Corporation) has been open just more than one year and has just the space I think we need. The grounds around it are spacious compared to most office buildings, offering no parking problem. Surrounding the building is a fish pond about six feet wide with various trees and shrubs planted nearby.

Even though the building has only two floors and a mezzanine, it is an attractive building for this area of the world. It is constructed more sturdily than the others. Also, it won an award from the Hawaiian Architectural Society for several features of its design. And it makes me wonder if God kept us out of the tall buildings and in this shorter, more sturdily-built building for a reason—perhaps He sees there is going to be a terrible earthquake in the next few years. Maybe I am wrong on this assumption, but God surely caused these doors to close right before us.

The crew doing the work (partitioning the office) started the day the contract was signed, July 31st, and within 12 days had completed the initial work in the office space. "God's Work Is A Challenge"

Raymond McNair and I were looking into the muzzle of a .22 calibre rifle! The squat Texas farmer was rasping at us, his voice tense with rage: "We don't need any of your religion here. Get out!"

My mind flashed back to 1945, when, as a fifteen-year-old boy, I heard Mr. Armstrong proclaim: "God is working out a PURPOSE here below. Germany WILL rise again to destroy America and Britian—these things are REAL!"

I was there on that baptizing tour because I had proved that this was IT. Raymond and I carried on during that tour because we KNEW whereof we believed!

But, when I first came to Ambassador, I could not have imagined what would later befall me. After a year of junior college in Missouri, I arrived at Ambassador in early September, 1949. After having attended a high school with some twelve hundred students enrolled, I found that there were only twelve students in the entire college that year. These were still the pioneering years!

EARLY YEARS AT AMBASSADOR

Terrible financial crises had passed, but financial trials were still very much with us in all those early years. Before The GOOD NEWS magazine—then going to the entire mailing list—was published regularly, the income for God's Work was very erratic: student pay was less than it is now, and it came still less frequently.

The early "Mayfair dinners" had a very limited diet. Lentils and cornbread were much in evidence. Pancakes were not only served at breakfast, but again and again throughout the day until every morsel was consumed! The male students often cut each other's hair to save money, and we never—and I mean NEVER—had the money to eat out in a restaurant unless Mr. Armstrong himself took some of us as a special treat.

Baptizing tours often delayed for weeks because of insufficient funds. I



remember Herman Hoeh and me discussing the idea of working our way around the country in order to baptize many on the waiting list. We were planning on washing dishes in cafes, mowing lawns, digging ditches—ANY type of part-time work so we could get around the country and baptize people.

But, although progress seemed to come slowly back then, God was using Mr. Armstrong to direct the Work's activities in a businesslike manner and laying the foundation for tremendous growth to come.

We, who were the early ministerial students, though, were not thinking of glamorous foreign trips, of pastoring large churches, of driving new Chrysler 300's. There was no example of this sort of thing then. We were thinking of prayer and fasting, of long hours of work and SACRIFICE. For there were plenty examples of that—in Mr. and Mrs. Armstrong and many of the early church members.

UNEXPECTED BLESSINGS

But, as the Work, the financial resources, and the world-wide scope of our activities increased, GOD began to shower upon us many wonderful opportunities and blessings which we did not foresee and were not expecting!

Some of those blessings which came my way include two nation-wide baptizing tours plus several smaller ones—seeing the major cities of the United States and Canada.

Boarding the Queen Elizabeth in 1954 with Dick Armstrong, feeling the huge ship literally quiver as the giant fog horns blasted farewell to New York, viewing with mounting excitement the really deep, luxuriant green of Ephraim's Isle as we steamed up Southampton waters—these are all memories which will never be forgotten.

Flying to Rome with Mr. and Mrs. Armstrong, seeing the *fabulous* wealth and splendor of the Vatican and St. Peter's, hearing and seeing a shoving, excited Italian mob packed into the courtyard of Castel Gandolfo, screaming: "Viva Papa, Viva Papa," to Pope Pius XII, as he appeared on a balcony overlooking the courtyard—these experiences also will be remembered and used.

My wife, Margie, was with me on the next trip to Europe—and two of our three children were born in England. So Elizabeth and James are half English—they have dual citizenship until they are 21! During these trips, we held four evangelistic campaigns in England—in London, Bristol, Birmingham and Manchester. These campaigns evoked not only many exciting events and experiences, but resulted in the conversion of such men in God's Work as James Wells, Robin Jones, Royston Page and others.

In the meantime, there were interesting "side trips" to Dusseldorf, West Berlin and communist East Berlin before the "wall" was erected to hide the shame of communism's wretched failure. There was the baptizing trip to Africa where we stopped off at such fabled cities as Khartoum, Nairobi, Johannesburg and Capetown—where we drove to almost within firing distance of the strife-torn Belgian Congo — and later stopped off in Rome to see another Pope, John XXIII, conduct Christmas High Mass amidst pomp and pageantry under the high dome of St. Peter's.

GOD'S WORK A CHALLENGE

Being a "member of the clergy" doesn't sound very exciting. But being in the true Work of God—being a direct servant of the Creator—this gets to be mighty exciting — interesting —


Supply Department Moves Downtown
