Bible Story Returns Flood Department



What Is Your Barricade?



"Old Faithful" Yields to Progressive A.T.F. Offset Press

Ambassador College print shop's "Old Faithful" letterpress has been retired and more than replaced by a new ATF offset press. This new press will print sheets up to eighteen inches by twenty-four inches in size, at the rate of 7,500 per hour.

Though a gigantic monolith is being purchased to print *The PLAIN TRUTH* and *The GOOD NEWS*, this smaller press will be indispensable for many other jobs such as reprint articles, let-

ters, and *The* PORTFOLIO. It is capable of running full color pictures and is already eating away at the backlog of work that the old-fashioned letterpress could not consume.


very spacious one. It will offer ample room for two full-size basketball courts side by side. It will have fold-down bleachers to accommodate spectators on *both sides* of the court.

Panoramic view of new gym site.





The dim, dark, dank recesses of the newly-acquired property with its gloomy compartments, translucent windows, somber halls and cadaverous atmosphere will be visited by the demolition team. It will be revamped and refurbished from floorboards to light fixtures. A full-ledged butterfly will emerge from the cocoon of gloom that pervades the present building. Indirect lighting, central heating and air-conditioning, easy-eye windows, and planter boxes will enhance the attractiveness of the modern office-building.

Within two or three months the Letter Answering Department will transfer its accountrements from the Press Building.

Occupying the first floor will be Dr. Zimmerman's office, two counseling rooms, and the typist section. Sharing the second floor will be the letter answerers and the filing, microfilm, and proofreading sections. The kitchen will be transformed into an employee lounge.

Adjacent to the ANNEX is a chapel. It is slated for renovation into a long-



Four Engagements Announced





BUNYA-BUNYA

In ALL of the preceding years, Ambassador College gardeners assumed that there was a *Monkey-Puzzle* tree southeast of Manor Del Mar. But last year we discovered there *wasn't* one! A young researcher was cataloguing the campus trees and discovered we have a BUNYA-BUNYA tree instead!

The BUNYA-BUNYA tree and the MONKEY-PUZZLE tree are similar in design and size. They both also belong to the same family—'Aracicaria.'

But what gave the clue to the researcher? IF the trees were SO similar, HOW did he know? The major difference is in the scales. The scales of a Bunya-Bunya tree are SLIGHTLY shorter and thicker than those of the Monkey-Puzzle tree.

By now you must wonder WHERE it is from? WHY is the Bunya-Bunya rare in North America? And HOW did it come so far from its native land?

The Bunya-Bunya is a native plant of Queensland, Australia, where it grows mainly along the coast. The tree has large, heavy cones that fall from it periodically. These cones are made up of seed pods, and sometimes grow to the length of one foot.

We do not know how the tree came to be here, but we guess that the wealthy Mr. Merritt had it shipped from Australia.

So THAT is the mystery of the Monkey-Puzzle tree uncovered at last! Next time YOU go by Manor Del Mar, LOOK at that deceiving, conniving Bunya-Bunya tree.

Wednesday, Dec. 4, the Spanish Clubs met with a brand new format. The new approach stresses language,




