# Talking Booklets Teach the Blind

"Talking books"—especially recorded for blind listeners to *The* WORLD TOMORROW— are now available through the facilities of the Ambassador College Press.

Our own radio studio, in cooperation with the American Foundation for the Blind, has produced the texts of SEVEN different booklets on L.P. records. The library of 27 minute, 33½ RPM recordings now includes transcriptions of Does God Exist; The Proof of the Bible; Seven Proofs God Exists; Why Were YOU Born; Does God Heal Today; What Is Faith and The United States and British Commonwealth in Prophecy. Further additions are expected soon.

All the recordings feature the voice of God's Evangelist, Mr. Norman Smith, and are loaned out like library books for two-week periods to interested blind persons. Nearly 500 blind people—primarily co-workers—have received the "talking books" so far—and over 20 inquiries are arriving weekly.

## Are YOU an Achan?

"What difference does it make if I pray," we sometimes wonder. "What difference will it make if I participate—I'm just a nobody in a BIG OR-GANIZATION—someone else will fill in for me," is a common complaint.

And many of us students feel the same way—MANY TIMES! But just HOW IMPORTANT is our part? Does it really make any difference?

IT MAKES A WHOLE LOT OF DIFFERENCE! What YOU DO can make or break—can mean the difference between failure and success—for an activity or function of God's College or Church.

#### ONE MAN Spelled Failure

In Joshua 7 we read the account of Achan. Put yourself in his shoes!

Are YOU an Achan?

Israel was ready to take the city of Ai. The people of Ai were but few —very weak (verse 3). But three thousand Israelites were put to the worse by the men of Ai—THIRTY-SIX ISRAELITES WERE SLAIN!!

But why?

Because ONE MAN—out of *millions of Israelites*—had disobeyed what God had commanded. He was responsible—*personally*—for the death of thirty-six INNOCENT MEN. He was responsible for the COMPLETE HALTING of God's Work at that time—the work of taking over the land of Palestine.

Remember, only ONE MAN HAD SINNED! This ought to be a lesson to each and every one of us.

#### God's Intervention Real

We ask for God's blessing in Ambassador Club—in Women's Club—in all our activities—in blessing His Work—in church services.

That means that God has put his *stamp of approval*—his blessing—His *GUIDANCE AND LEADERSHIP*—into that activity. That is either true—or we are kidding ourselves.

Everyone—then—is *involved*. EVERYONE has a *PERSONAL RESPON-SIBILITY* in that group. Will God withhold his blessing BECAUSE ONE has failed—will that activity fail because one is sinning or has dropped his part?

This isn't a psychological gimmick. It's more real than this paper you are reading.

Will God make the whole operation—all the *innocent people* involved suffer—because YOU FAILED to do YOUR PART.

Think about that—everytime you go to Ambassador or Women's Club. Everytime you attend a class—everytime you take part in some activity or function of God's Church, Work or College. God demands your part—whoever or whatever you are. Make sure you have done—and are doing YOUR PART! Be sure that you are fulfilling your obligation in every way.

Other furnishings contribute to an inspiring family atmosphere. Most commented about is the table lamp situated between two Danish Modern lounge chairs.


