

## Paul Flatt--**New President**



### Overcomers -- In Spite of Everything!

Why is it that in wartime some men "crack" mentally under the strain, but others DO NOT? Why is it that some people just can't hurdle the problems of life? They become fearful, self-conscious, insecure . . . CANNOT SUCCEED! But then others seem to have a ZEST FOR LIFE. They fight through EVERY problem, trial or misfortune.

Sickness, danger, fright, limited ability . . . NONE OF THESE THINGS seem to bother these individuals. They succeed *in spite* of all the odds which SEEM to be against them!

WHY IS THIS SO?

The question and answer is very important to us. It is going to DETER-MINE our success in God's Work—and is going to either keep us out of or propel us into God's Kingdom.

This thing of "problems" and "pressure"—how we fight through these trials—ALL DEPENDS on our POINT OF VIEW . . . our attitude . . . the frame of mind with which we view our problems.

It's like someone once said about comedy: Comedy isn't a matter of funny lines: IT'S A QUESTION OF TAKING A POINT OF VIEW OF LIFE!!

So is success and overcoming. It isn't a matter of geographical location, heredity, past environment, ability, position, the amount and type of problem we have. It isn't any of these things.

Success and overcoming depend on our point of view, or attitude *toward* our situation. You can either take it *positively*—or *negatively*. You can accept it as a SCINTILLATING CHALLENGE, or sulk and mourn about how the world, others, or God is treating you.

You can hate and despise the weak mind you have and cry out to God for strength. Or, you can *coddle* it. You can tell it what a *rough time* it is having . . . that it ought to be *better* for it . . . that it shouldn't have such a "rough go of it."

But know this! If you do the latter, GOD WILL NEVER BE ABLE TO WORK WITH YOU AND CHANGE YOU!!!

Success and overcoming HINGE ON this approach to problems. The fact that there SEEMS NO POSSIBLE WAY OUT OF THE PROBLEM—OUGHT TO BE PROOF THAT THERE IS A WAY!

Learn to trust Hebrews 11:1. Faith is the EVIDENCE of things not seen—it is the PROOF that the solution we do not see IS THERE . . . being worked out by God!

All of us need to remember this! When the going gets rough and the pressure of problems, trials, classes, social life increases—through all the situations that pile up on us we need to remember TO ACCEPT THE CHALLENGE and KNOW THE SOLUTION IS THERE!

As with most answers it is so simple to see that it's hard to find!

Accept your situation, your weakness, your problem, as opportunity from God, as a zestful challenge TO GROW! Know that sooner or later the solution we don't PHYSICALLY SEE will be clear.

We haven't been called to a life where we pamper and feel sorry for ourselves. We have been called to be "God's MIGHTY MEN and women—fighting the spiritual war of wars.

Let's accept the challenge and FIGHT until the battle is won!
