
Poised to Plunge Gym and Pool Ready to Open

Ambassador College Press Shows Prolific Production Increase


Growth keynotes God's Work around the world. Thirty percent a year has come to be taken for granted. While this is the over-all growth of the *entire* Work—and is especially connected with the necessary increase of incoming monies—different departments at different times

increase out of proportion in reaction to the press of necessity.

This is what has happened to Ambassador College Press—especially in this last year.

Many factors govern an unprecedented one-year growth in production. For a little over a year we have been cutting an unnecessarily large inventory of booklets, reprints and Correspondence Courses. Over this period of time inventory has been cut by well over one million pieces! After a minimum inventory was reached, there was a necessary increase in monthly production to keep even, rather than continu-

We must remember one thing:


Only those Ambassadors who keep their embassies preserved become Presidents—or KINGS!!

The gigantic addition of *The Plain* Truth made an automatic *one-hundred* percent increase in production of the total number of pieces each month.
