Women's Club Brunch Delightful

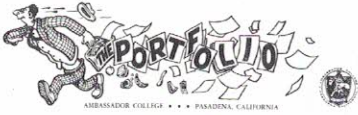
The Annual Women's Club Brunch provided a welcome and delightful break in the year-end rush for the students, faculty, and families of Ambassador College.

Duuuh, w-e-e-el.

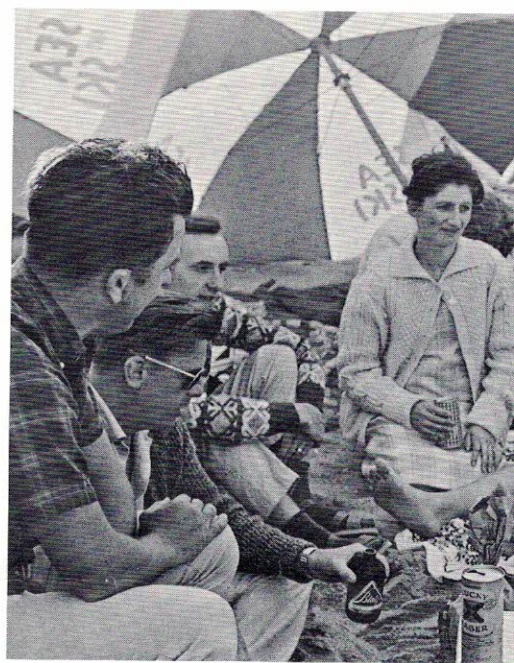


Could this be greed?

The men played touch football while the women watched. Actually, the men

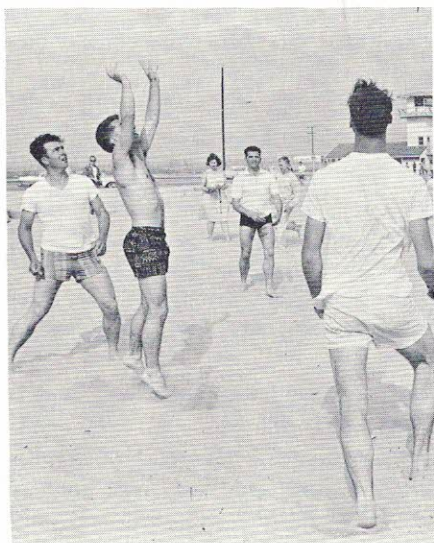




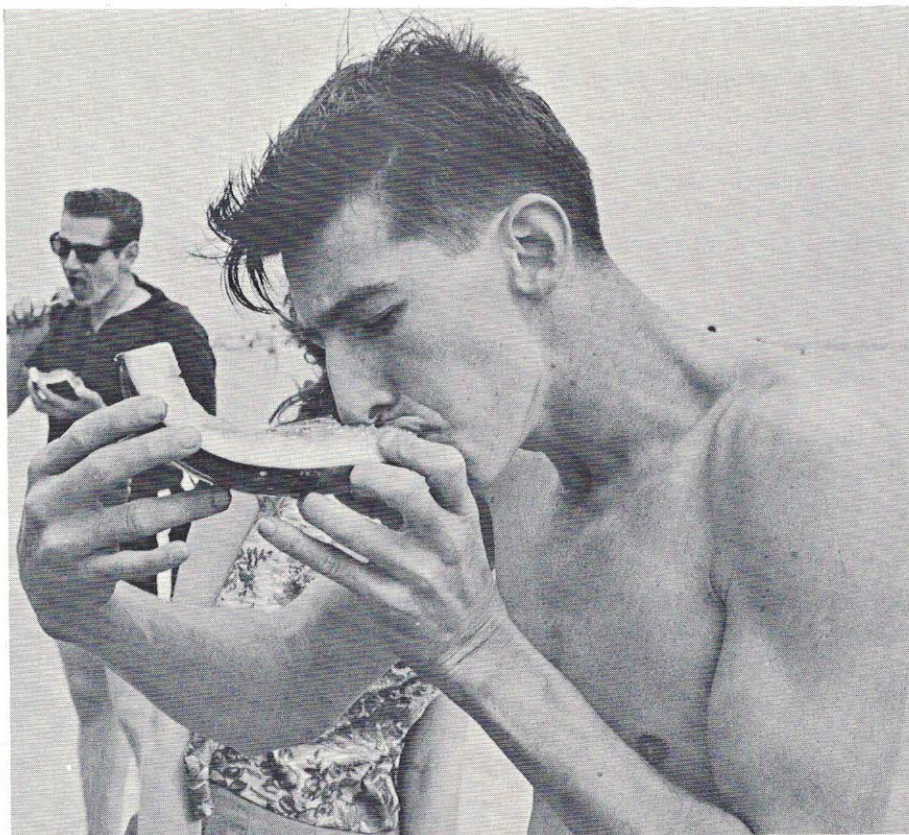

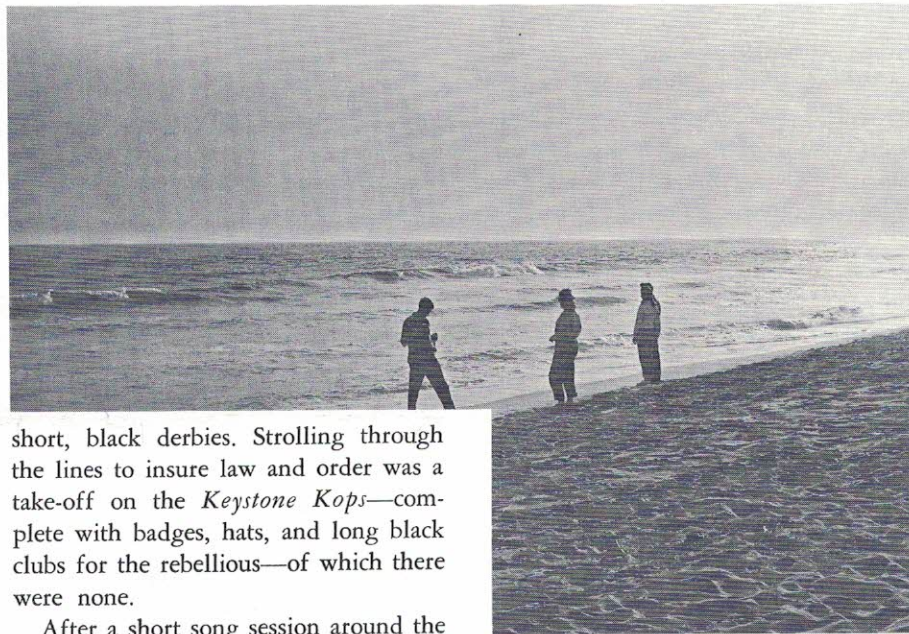
And this year there were plenty. Servers were decked out in tall chefs' hats and the men serving the beer wore

Fifty people, many of them living in areas in which it is difficult to find either good hotels or good roads, have so far requested baptism or a visit.

Leaving from New York, June 8, Mr. Apartian will meet Mr. Anthony Buzard in Geneva. During the following three weeks, they will together meet those whom God is calling in Belgium and northern France. After returning to Geneva, Mr. Apartian will almost immediately lead a new tour (southern France), this time accompanied by Mr. David Wainwright, one of God's ministers.

Talk about a "shirt-tail-shoot"! The summer will not end here! On July 19, Mr. Apartian will fly back to the United States, where he will meet Mr. Leslie McCullough in New Orleans. Next stop: the French and British West Indies!

What good news it is that our representative there, Mr. Leo Joseph, will for the *first time* be able to meet some of God's ministers! You can be sure that every second of the visit will be jam-packed with questions and answers on both parts. The trip to the West Indies will also include a stop in Martinique. On this small island, Mr. Louis Jubert, a former SDA minister, as well as his congregation, will have their *first* meeting with God's ministers.

For several years now, the people on these islands have earnestly desired to talk to someone in God's Church. Here is their opportunity.

Mr. Apartian expects to be back in Pasadena near the first part of August. Yes, it will be a busy summer. No one can say exactly how many new brethren we will have when these tours are finished. But *YOUR* prayers can make the number bigger!
