



Do You Have the Original?

SHOWN above are two seals. A seal is a stamp of approval on a legal document to give it force or authority. It has been used by kings and rulers for ages. In ancient times it consisted of a special design stamped on a piece of wax to show ownership or authenticity.

To be valid, a seal must contain the following specifications: (1) The name of the ruler, (2) His position or office, (3) The territory over which his authority extends. To illustrate: the seal of the President of the United States of America contains the name of the President, his official position—that of President, the territory over which his authority extends—the United States of America.

In searching through the Bible for God's seal, there is only one place where the required specifications are mentioned. It is found in Exodus 20: 8-11, the Fourth Commandment of the decalogue. It reads: "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six

days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: for in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it" (Ex. 20:8-11).

The Sabbath Commandment has God's approval. Sunday is a counterfeit Sabbath, a relic of ancient sun worship, a mark or seal of apostasy which does not have God's approval. If Sunday Sabbath were adjudged genuine, then the Creator would have placed His seal on it. The day that is self-identifying offers its own authentication . . . an authentication which was recognized by the early Christian church for over 100 years A.D. before anyone attempted to change itl

Salvation's Essentials Revealed By the Sabbath

HERE in Jesus' prayer is contained the essence of salvation. Scrutiny of the text and the complete prayer shows that knowledge alone does not save, nor does salvation come without knowledge (See Rom. 10:13-15). Experimental or saving knowledge, Christ said, is centered upon the "true God" and upon "Jesus Christ." Men will be lost because they have rejected this essential knowledge (Hosea 4:6). It is therefore important to know Scripture ref-

erences to signboard directions as to how having knowledge of God and His son is attained. Three great prophets were inspired to direct us in our search for the answer. Moses, Isaiah, and Ezekiel refer to the rightful observance of the Sabbath (as the "sign" pointing to the Creator—Ex. 31:16, 17); as a means by which His righteousness is revealed—Isa. 56:1, 2; and as a gift, to be a "sign that they might know that I am the Lord that sancti-

Led by His Spirit

HOW dark the night before we started traveling in the west after giving up home possessions, and leaving family and friends!

I cried. I thought, What will this do to me to never be at home in any community or church as we would move like gypsies from place to place with my husband's work in the FAA communications? I planned to travel only five years.

I had prayed definitely about it. My answer came in a dream as I saw us drive off the highway and I cried in fear, "God help us!" How many times it was fulfilled. But then it was clearly His will. How little I realized the great plans the Heavenly Father had for us in this adventure!

I discovered that in this move I had not only the outer possessions behind but had discarded inward traditions which did not fit with my study of the Scriptures.

I could understand then what our Master meant when He told the young man, "If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come and follow me" (Matt. 19:21). This was the answer to all of us who are rich in mental and spiritual possessions and even physical ones.

"What good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" is a question we all ask at different times in our life, do we not? We think that if we do some outward act of charity or accomplishment we inherit the tree of Life—eternal life. But to follow Him in all ways is to have treasure in heaven and fruit bearing maturity.

Revelation 22:14, Proverbs 11:30, and Genesis 2 and 3 tell us how to obtain the right to the Tree of Life. "The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life; and he that winneth souls is wise."

What does it mean to be righteous? This is the wisdom and understanding which is a tree of life to us (Prov. 3:13-18).

"Blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have the right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates of the city" (Rev. 22:14).

So I began reading (and diligently comparing scripture with scripture) the Bible, seeing it through my own spectacles. Every Sabbath from Genesis to Revelation was listed and compared. Was it not a part of the first covenant written on tables of stone, then written again by His Spirit in our mind and heart that we might all know Yahweh from the least to the greatest? I discovered how many ignored this. I remembered a song my mother used to sing, "O, brother, to know Him is life's great crown. Will you then accept Him and sin lav down. He longs to receive you. O, hear Him say, Come ye heavy laden. O come today."

This song was a peculiar blend from the teachings of my Sunday School childhood and the new truth I was learning of the wondrous Sabbath. A contrast in many ways.

"By your traditions ye make the Word of God of none effect," the Master said. To follow Him all the way, I could hold onto none that would hinder becoming perfect in fruit bearing.

When I finally decided to keep the Sabbath, it seemed impossible, as it always does. My husband was not with me on this. So I prayed, "Father, open the door to keep the Sabbath for a year so that we will not plan things to do which hinder keeping the Sabbath holy." We were to commune with Him, remember Him in not doing any work and not doing our own pleasure on His holy day.

How wonderfully He answered this prayer! Things seemed to work out fine and my first year of remembering the Sabbath was orderly and harmonious.

How often I think of this when others who take this new path of obedience find it hard at the first. He does open the door by faith and prayer. I remember in Oregon of a friend who seemed to be going to lose his job after telling his boss about his decision. But he maintained his stand with courage and faith and the door opened to a better job. Our Father does not promise the road of obedience to be easy, but with our taking the first step He opens the way.

Our travel lengthened to 13 years of travel over ten states and working with 25 denominations of 125 churches. Only about ten of these were Sabbath-keepers. Nor was I two-faced about my new view of Truth. I did not push it too much, but when the Father opened the door, I spoke on it. For we are not to judge others on Sabbath-keeping, but be ready to give reasons for the faith as we understand it. We all know this is not easy. But "he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him" (Heb. 11:6).

Our selling of earthly possessions to give to the poor is not at all limited to material things. How rich we are in Bible knowledge, guidance from childhood, training, traditions, prejudice, and habits of thought. Some of this is good but must be sorted to bring out of our treasures things both new and old. "Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old" (Matt. 13:52). The Sabbath is new just to us, but as old as the universe to the Creator. He is unchangeable and gives us every good and perfect gift. We must be led by His Spirit to be guided into all truth, to be comforted, and have all

No Man (or Vitamin) Is An Island Unto Himself

LET us consider the importance of interrelationship of nutritional elements. First, the vitamin which has been given so much attention the past several years, vitamin C. Much of the attention which this food element has been given arises from the important role it plays in warding off colds.

Many people still say, "I have tried vitamin C and it doesn't help me." Did you ever notice that your car may have plenty of fuel and still fail to start? Well, there are other factors which are important too. But before we go into some of the other factors, I would like to point out that 100 mgs of vitamin C is hardly enough. In fact, it is considered that 30,000 units (mgs) is saturation.

It is common knowledge that vitamin C is lost rapidly from the body, so it should be taken in broken doses, according to authorities. The other elements are important.

Noted nutritionist Adelle Davis says, "One report shows that in people fed a diet low in protein for only one week, the antibodies fell to one tenth the normal level." So don't forget to keep your body supplied with plenty of protein, vitamin A and B vitamins, as well as vitamin C if you would avoid colds and infections.

Adequate rest, absorption of foods

and good elimination also play a role in helping prevent folds and infections. A lack of almost any nutriment may lead to lowered resistance. Deficiencies of vitamins A, C, biotin, and protein appear to result most quickly in susceptibility to colds and infections. Studies have shown that few antibodies are produced when protein is undersupplied.

Frequent colds and colds that hang on invariably indicate that the nutrition is poor.

Concerning visual problems, though we take a minimum of 10,000 units of vitamin A and 3 mgs of B2 daily. we find that the vitamin E intake must be adequate for vitamin A to be utilized. And while on the subject of vision, remember that cataracts can be produced in animals by witholding the nutriments riboflavin (B2) and Vitamin C and the amino acid tryptophane. These all work together and these are probably not the only elements necessary to avoid the above-mentioned problems. Research in the future will doubtless show that our present nutritional understanding is incomplete.

On the subject of virility: in the past few years vitamin E has been given credit of being a sex vitamin, but a lack of the amino acid argenine is a cause of partial sterility in men.

For this important element your diet must include good amounts of food rich in B vitamins, such as milk, cheese, meat, wheat germ, brewers yeast, black strap, liver, whole grains, and others. Adelle Davis in her book You Can Stay Well says "Normal virility is the result of general good health."

Quoting again from Miss Davis on the subject of mental health: "A lack of almost any B vitamin shows itself almost immediately in mental depression, tendency to worry, sluggish thinking, and pessimistic forebodings Every nutriment which goes to make up an adequate diet probably plays some role in maintaining mental health."

In isolated districts where nutrition has been found completely adequate, there is no cancer at all Dr. E. H. Tipper writes in his book Cancer a Disease of Civilization. Dr. Tipper writes that among some two million people on the Nigerian Delta there has not been found one case of cancer. But in the African coast towns where inadequate diets were used, cancer was rampant.

Dr. Weston Price, who studied isolated groups of people in Switzerland, Alaska, and the South Sea Islands, stressed the same thing, that cancer is unknown as long as people do not adopt the diets of civilization, which lack vitamins and minerals. Dr. McCarrison states that during nine years of work among a group of people in the Himalayas who have magnificent physiques and whose health is far above average, he never saw one case of cancer.

In case you are really in radiant health, forget to pamper your educated appetite. In most cases of low cancer incidence the food was simple uncommercial milk, cheese, fruit, vegetables, glandular meats, eggs, and unmilled grains. These people were not getting refined flour and sugar, soft drinks, cakes, pies, and candies, and other refined foods which make up one-half to two-thirds of all calories consumed by people in our country.

Let's talk about broken bones for a minute. Elderly people especially have such a fear of broken bones. Frequently the broken hip results in months or years of constant care and all the miseries that accompany the bed patient. Fragile bones are the result of cumulative deficiencies.

Now, reflecting briefly on these cumulative deficiencies, people often say, "I eat just like I have eaten for 20 years and it didn't hurt me before. Why does it hurt me all of a sudden?" The answer is that it didn't hurt you all of a sudden. You have been building this deficiency for years; maybe all your life.

Dr. Pearl Swanson, who has been professor of nutrition at Iowa State University, asks, "How can the aged of tomorrow (the youth of today) be stirred to the realization that what we will be years hence depends in large measure on the food choices we make today?" What we will be tomorrow we are becoming today.

Most people seem to be aware that calcium is important for healthy bones, yet fail to realize that the same elements which were stressed in their diet as children would build and maintain strong bones for the elderly as well. Remember, the basis of bones is protein, the elasticity of bones depends upon vitamin C and their hardness on calcium and phosphorus.

OUR PURPOSE

The association is supported by free-will gifts of churches and interested individuals.


Who Are Its Leaders?

Its leaders are comprised mainly of volunteers from among its membership, both clergy and laity. They consist of the president, first vicepresident, second vice-president, third secretary-treasurer, vice-president, and six directors at large. These leaders are expected to be reasonable, with moderate views, and be able to make compromises when necessary. They are expected to see another person's point of view, and must speak for all members-not just one special group. They respect and listen to the opinions of other people. They believe that the time, effort, and financial support rendered on a gratis basis is an investment rather than a sacrifice.

The Program of The Association

- 1. Education—Through a tract ministry that reaches thousands of people each year; the distribution of The Sabbath Sentinel, the official monthly magazine of the B.S.A.; the publication of an annual calendar which has the Sabbath dates in red; Home Bible Studies, an attractive 75 page book containing 13 lessons on the Ten Commandments; and The Sabbath Handbook and Directory of Sabbath-Observing Organizations.
- 2. Visits by a B.S.A. field representative to churches, Sabbath Schools, and other groups to encourage a program of Sabbath observance.

fy them" (Ezek. 20:12, 20).

Rightly understood and observed, the Sabbath is the key to man's happiness both here and in the hereafter (Isa. 58:13, 14; 66:22, 23). How does the Sabbath point to the right way to obtain knowledge of God? As the late President Lyndon Johnson

once said, "It isn't so hard to do right as to know what is right." I believe the Sabbath Commandment recorded in Exodus 20:8-11 clearly points that the Sabbath, rather than being an end in itself, is the means by which we become acquainted with the divine character and lofty purpose of the Creator. Note there the essence of the saving knowledge that can permeate the mind of man.

1. "To keep holy" plainly refers to communion with the Creator by worship.

2. "To remember" His creative power suggests using the agencies of the five senses to receive impressions from the external world of nature.

First we note that God calls all men to worship. Worship has many facets, including prayer, song, tithes and offerings, Bible study, personal

Our calendar has been changed once since the time of Christ. In 1582 the Gregorian calendar replaced the Julian calendar. But, while the dates of the month were changed on the calendar, the days of the week and their sequence were not altered in any way. Jesus who created the week in the beginning would have known of any error in the weekly cycle and would surely have corrected it if it had been wrong in His day, But the Sabbath immediately following His death was the true Sabbath "according to the commandment." The weekly cycle in the Jewish calendar has not been changed through the centuries, yet it agrees perfectly with our Roman calendar as far as the weekly cycle is concerned. By mathematical calculations modern astronomers are able to reckon time forward and backward. and the loss of even one minute can be promptly detected. Read the testimony of these noted astronomers (Gen. O. M. Mitchell, Astronomy of the Bible, p. 235 and Dr. W. W. Campbell Director of Lick Observatory. Mt. Hamilton, California.) If you want to know that the seventh day is Saturday, just check with the Jew, Moslem, and pagan calendar. What will you find? Perfect agreement-Sunday the first day of the week, and Saturday the seventh. Would not the seventh day vary each month after the new moon? I think that would have nothing to do with the Sabbath. I haven't found any proof of it. -Jackie Mae Vance

things He said brought to our remembrance.

A Note from the Editor

When the Lord Writes

N my desk is an autograph book which once belonged to my mother. She made a hobby of sending pages to famous people. In it, mixed with autographs of her friends, are signatures of such noted persons as Carl Sandburg, Clifton Fadiman, Eleanor Roosevelt, and mother of the President, Hannah Nixon, with whom my mother went to school many years ago.

Autographs do not mean much to me, but in time some of the ones in her book will possibly be of value. An autograph is something personal—almost a bit of the person who wrote it; that gives it value.

If it were available, what do you suppose an autograph of the Lord would be worth? Perhaps it is good that there is none extant, for it would become an object of worship in itself.

There are only four recorded times in the Scriptures of the Lord's writing with His own hand. The first of these was when the Ten Commandments—His eternal law—were "written with the finger of God" on "two tables of stone" (Ex. 31:18). Surely the Lord must have attached much im-

portance to these precepts to have written them Himself rather than have Moses write them.

The second instance of the Lord's writing something was at the feast of Belshazzar, when the fateful words Mene, Mene, Tekel, Upharsin were written on the wall. These words were important too; they pronounced a divine judgment upon a king who had forgotten Yahweh, who holds all kingdoms in His hands. The message was there for all to see before their city was destroyed.

In the New Testament we are told of a sinful woman who was brought before Jesus. He was asked if she should be stoned as the law of Moses required. But instead of answering, He wrote in the sand.

What did He write? It is possible that He wrote the sins of her accusers, for we are told that "being convicted by their own conscience," they "went out one by one" (John 8:9). Whatever He wrote, we can be sure it was not idle doodling; He had a message to give.

The final recorded instance of God's writing is His promise to write His law again—not on tables of stone, but in our hearts (Jer. 31:33). This time we can become "autograph books" for the Lord. His law in our hearts can be read by those who might never read His Word from the printed page.

It is a privilege and a tremendous responsibility; it has been entrusted to those who honor His law. Are we going to let Him write His law in our hearts?

mineral and enzyme depletion march in the same parade," says Adelle Davis. Those of us past the fourth and fifth decade need more vitamins, minerals and enzymes and less calories. We cannot eat as we did 20 or 30 years ago; our requirements increase each year.

One of the insults which some regularly impose on themselves is white bread. The brown variety in the market may be very slightly better. This

brief article will not allow a complete discussion of white bread, but consider these essential food elements which are removed from the grain of wheat before making the bread. At least 19 important elements are removed; below we list but a few: Total percentages removed:

Chromium—40 per cent, important to healthy vessels and heart; Magnesium—16 per cent, for proper growth, sexual health and muscle tone; Potassium—77 per cent, essential for sodium balance; Phosphorus—mediates energy throughout the body; Calcium—78 per cent, for muscle action,

strong bones and teeth; Vitamin B1—77 per cent, protects against nervous disorders; and Folic acid—67 per cent, essential to health of the intestinal flora and important as anti-anemic factor.

One of the elements not shown above is vitamin E, one of the most important factors in preventing circulatory and heart problems. Possibly all of this important element is removed in milling. If you are interested in health, spend the amount which you have been spending on bread on wheat germ (preferably raw), which has the following nutriments per half cup: vitamin A, 400 units; vitamin B1, 1600 Gammas; vitamin B2, 750 Gammas; calcium, 71 Gammas; phosphorus, 1050 Mgs.; iron, 7.5 Mgs.; and protein, 24 grams.

I hope I have conveyed a good reason to change some established habits for new improved ones—no short cuts. You would not build a home in which you intend to live for many years with shoddy material. How much more important that the temple of God should be supplied with the greatest care and only the best materials used in its building and maintenance.

member, and The World Forgot."


- 5. Legislative Program—Working to secure for all the religious and civil rights constitutionally guaranteed.
