

The Sabbath In the Early Church

A. J. S. BOND

HE first Christian churches were organized by converted Jews, who of course were Sabbath keepers, even as Jesus and His disciples were Jews and Sabbath keepers. Many proselytes also became Christians and these were numerous in this early period. The keeping of the Sabbath was evidently one of the most noticeable changes in their outer conduct as they went from paganism to belief in Jehovah, God of the Hebrews. It was but another step to Christianity, and their Sabbath keeping which had helped to bring them thus far, was found to be a practice followed by the disciples of the New Way.

So many pagans adopted Jewish customs that Josephus could say, "There is not any city of the Grecians, nor any of the barbarians, nor any nation whatsoever, whither our custom of resting on the seventh day hath not come." And a modern authority says that the Sabbath of later Judaism became exceptionally important "so that 'to Sabbatize' was a current phrase in the Roman Empire for adopting the Jewish religion or customs."

The Ethiopian eunuch was doubtless one of these proselytes, who had been to Jerusalem to worship in the temple when Philip found him and taught him about Jesus. In the days of Jeremiah banished Jews found a refuge in this region of the upper Nile, the modern Ethiopia, and took their faith with them. Possibly the queen's treasurer was a descendant of one of these persecuted Jews, or more likely a descendant of a native convert. After his baptism by Philip he carried back home his newfound faith. If this be true, he becomes a most interesting link in the history of the Sabbath, for Ethiopian Christians were Sabbath keepers until modern times.

Paul, the great missionary, was a Sabbath keeper. He was so brought up; and although he renounced the formal Jewish worship, including new moons and sabbaths, there is no evidence that he ever forsook the weekly Sabbath, which was older than Judaism. From its place in the religion of the Hebrews it was taken up into Christianity. Paul clashed with the Jews everywhere he went, but never on the Sabbath question. We may be sure that these strict legalists, who hounded Paul to the death. would have found fault with his Sabbath keeping if there had been the least occasion. Like his Master, Paul rings true on this question.

The first European convert was a God-fearing, Sabbath keeping Gentile woman. Lydia had forsaken the polytheistic faith of paganism for belief in one God Who created the heavens and the earth, as taught by the purer religion of the Jews. Still openminded, she accepted, through Paul's

preaching, the true and warmer faith of Christianity.

It was in a Sabbath-afternoon prayer meeting that the first church in Europe was born. The apostle and his companions on that first Sabbath in a strange city were looking about for a place of prayer. When these Sabbath-keeping followers of the Christ came upon the Sabbath-keeping worshipers of Jehovah, everything was favorable and time ripe for the organization of a church of the new faith. The Philippian church became noted for its spirit of generosity.

The Roman Catholic church has never claimed Bible authority for Sunday. On the other hand, that church has repeatedly referred to the change of the weekly day of worship from the Bible Sabbath to Sunday as evidence of the authority of the church over the Bible.

As early as the fourth cenutry Augustine was sent by his mother to inquire of the Father-confessor in regard to the "Saturday fast," which was then agitating the minds of believers. The answer of the venerable St. Ambrose was: "Follow the church." In the thirteenth century Thomas Aquinas, an authority in the present day Roman Catholic confession, declared that the Lord's day depended upon the authority of the church. The Roman church has held consistently to this position to the present time.

The primitive type of Christianty prevailed, however, in many parts of the world, and was never wholly crushed. It was early planted in the British Isles, and here the Sabbath was kept to a late date. The evidence that St. Patrick kept the Sabbath is not to be despised. The

church in Ireland was evangelical, accepted the Scriptures as the rule of life, and repudiated Rome. Patrick's successor, St. Columba, observed the Sabbath as a day of rest, but held worship on Sunday. A church or society of Sabbath keepers persisted in Ireland to the middle of the last century, and included in its membership members of the nobility as well as peasants.

What has been said of Ireland is equally true of Scotland. In commending Queen Margaret of Scotland as a Christian ruler of the eleventh century, history says she was successful in establishing the observance of Sunday. "For until that time the Sabbath was a day of rest." Sunday was observed as a day of worship, but not as a day of cessation from labor.

Other groups of Sabbath-keeping followers of Christ have persisted to modern times. According to good authority there is undeniable evidence that the early churches were Sabbath-keeping churches and that such were the churches planted by the early missionaries of the Cross as they went everywhere preaching the gospel. It is true that the Sabbath, with many other elements of New Testament Christianity, was lost from the main body of the Christian Church when the latter "entered the tunnel of the dark ages." But if these scattered Sabbath-keeping groups form no part of the in-flowing current of Christian history, they, as a bayou formed near the source of the stream, bear testimony to the character of the waters near the fountain head before they were polluted by the inflowing streams of paganism.

Shining for Christ

THERE is a beautiful scripture found in 2 Cor. 3:18 (Living Bible): "But we Christians have no veil over



our faces: we can be mirrors that brightly reflect the glory of the Lord. And as the Spirit of the Lord works within us, we become more and more like him."

This shows that if we walk in the Spirit and live in thankfulness, praise, and victory, the glory of the Lord will so fill us that it will be seen to radiate through us. Remember when Moses came down from the mountain with the Ten Commandments "... his face glowed from being in the presence of God" (Ex. 34:39, Living Bible). We too are one of those who are to shine for Jesus, radiant with the glory of God, called out ones who are to "shew themselves to be entirely trustworthy. In this way they will make people want to believe in our Savior and God" (Titus 2:10, Living Bible). Of course a person should be cautious of those who do not love the Lord and respect His Commandments. We should "love not the world, neither the things that are in the world," and refrain from places which our hearts and consciences tell that Jesus would not have you to go.

The Bible is plain concerning one's dress. "Don't be concerned about the outward beauty that depends on jewelry, or beautiful clothes, or hair arrangement. Be beautiful inside, in your hearts, with the lasting charm of a gentle and quiet spirit which is so precious to God" (1 Peter 3: 3, 4).

No set rules can be laid down as to just how young people ought to dress, since fashions are continually changing, but it is not necessary that a Christian must always look years out of date. There are some general rules which a Christian ought always to follow. One's dress ought always to be modest. We can ask ourselves. "Is this a modest way to dress? Will the wearing of it glorify my Savior?" If you feel it does not meet these requirements, do not wear it, no matter how many others may do so. We shouldn't be afraid to be looked upon as different from others, for surely we are.

Exactly What is the

Bible Sabbath Association?

The Bible Sabbath Association (BSA) is an interdenominational group formed to promote fellowship and cooperation between all Sabbath-keepers.

How Did the Association Start?

It began in 1943 when a few Sabbath-keeping Christians of various affiliations felt the need for closer fellowship.

Specifically, What Is the Purpose of the BSA?

Simply to promote fellowship among all Christian Sabbathkeepers. However, in fellowshiping, we hope to:

Restore respect and honor to the Ten Commandments, with special emphasis on the Fourth.

Encourage repeal of blue laws. Defeat the adoption of any calendar which would disrupt the weekly cycle.

How Does the BSA Carry Out Its Program?

The BSA sponsors "Echoes from Eden" radio program.

A monthly magazine, the SABBATH SENTINEL, is published.

Publishes and distributes thousands of tracts, a Sabbath calendar and a Directory of Sabbath-Observing Organizations.

Local branch chapters augment each area of BSA concern.

Does the BSA Represent Any Particular Denomination?

No. Currently the BSA has cooperative relations with Seventh-day Adventists, Seventh Day Baptists, Churches of God (7th Day), and independent Sabbatarians. The BSA is comprised of members from all these churches.

What Relationship Does the BSA Have With Churches?

The BSA encourages its members to be active in their churches. It is not the purpose of the BSA to compete with any church, but rather to complement the efforts of each. It seeks only the advancement of the seventh-day Sabbath.

How May I Join the BSA?

All Sabbath keepers are urged to join the Association. Simply complete the application on page 2 and mail it to the BSA or give it to an officer.

The B.S.A. Receives a Letter from Bob Jones University

March 21, 1974

My dear Sir:

There is no such thing as a one-true-church. But there is a true Sabbath—God's Sabbath—for you.

Disaster for the B.S.A.

A member of our U. S. Congress has added to H.R. Bill 636 a totally unrelated bomb, Section 312. If left to ride through Congress unnoticed, this injection would eliminate tax deductions for charitable contributions.

This means that an individual would not receive a deduction on his income tax for his contribution to the Bible Sabbath Association, his church, or any other organization which is presently considered a charitable or religious institution.

To the average American these contributions would be more difficult. To the charitable and religious organizations this would be disaster! The small donor would be smaller, many large donors would be eliminated.

These political theorists who promote such tactics know what they are doing. They would have no objection to eliminating every religious organization if they could and to get every charitable function under government bureaucracy. At least this is what they themselves have said.

Unfortunately, tax laws often make it difficult for charitable and religious organizations to be as active in lobbying for their cause on Capital Hill as are the agents of industry and labor. If such organizations lobby "substantially," they risk losing their non-profit tax-exempt status. But each individual can write to his Congressmen. Many Congressmen are not parties to such tactics, but it is important that they hear from you anyway. Present the case concisely, accurately, and objectively. Be truthful, dispassionate, and honest, but don't accuse or threaten, for this would only polarize, rather than keep all avenues of communication open.

Tell your Congressmen plainly, "we the people of the United States" wish the state to remain separate from the church when it comes to matters of contribution control. Congressmen frequently need—in fact welcome—information from persons affected by matters that come before them.

If you lack the proper wording that would make your letter totally objective, we suggest that you write to the secretary of the Washington, D. C. chapter of the Bible Sabbath Association for a form letter properly worded and typed up in good order. All you need to do then is type your name and address, sign it, and send it on to your Congressman.

THE HOLY BOND OF UNITY

T seems that believers everywhere sense the need to "get together," even though they are not always clear about how. We are living in a time when the supreme test of our faith has come. It is imperative that we all speak, act, and serve TO-GETHER!

It is proper to urge for the unity of all believers. But unless that unity is based on the right principles and right action, it is a vain and dangerous thing. True unity is not to be achieved by coercion of falible men governed by carnal reason, who serve as inquisitors. Coercion causes one half of the people to act as fools and the other half as hypocrites. The involvement and cooperation of people with a variety of ideas working for a single cause is the basis of true unity.

One of the priceless gifts of our heritage as members of the Bible Sabbath Association is the joy of flowing in company of believers from different denominational traditions and social levels. Experiencing this unity of the spirit in the midst of diversity is a challenging task! We are different, yet there is unity in our diversity. Our unity does not depend on our unanimity but on purpose, and in vision of duty and opportunity to serve in a greater capacity. We are united upon a program which is wise, enlightening, and constructive. We derive strength and wisdom from our differences. It is from these elements that we attribute the success of the Bible Sabbath Association.

Mature and experienced religious leaders know only too well that harmonious relationships, effective work, and spiritual growth do not come automatically with people. They must be cultivated, promoted, encouraged, and implemented. We who desire unity must match that desire with eagerness to act towards its fulfillment. We who are eager to maintain unity will be, conversely, eager to prevent disunity, strife, and division. We must be eager to keep the unity of the spirit.

The Bible Sabbath Association seeks to consolidate the efforts of all Sabbatarian groups, whether large or small, into a super-active force against those who would war against our faith. As members of the B.S.A., we all contribute to the welfare and interest of each other. In this way no one group is compelled to compete with another.

This unity is worth preserving, but it cannot be preserved unless we are "wise as serpents and as innocent as doves." We must pray to be kept in dove-like innocence and yet be alert enough to know when we are being beguiled into bondage.

Some ways in which our unity can be broken are as follows:

1. EXCLUSIVENESS-In general,

there is a projection of "my group is onto something 'special.'" Those who would fall into this category will appear to believe they have a superior revelation, usually tracing their revelation to a single teacher.

- 2. PREDOMINATE REACTION-ARY QUALITY—This reaction may be against "organizations," "religious movements," or "the establishment," referring to these as "Babylon," of which God's people need to "come out and be separate." The characteristics of a reactionary spirit are zeal, impatience, and "pushiness."
- 3. COMPULSIVENESS Commonly known as "ax grinding," this is a determination to buttonhole everything. This closes out the possibility of mutual sharing.

The unity of the spirit can be maintained only as believers are cemented together by the bond of peace. This bond is stronger then personal disagreement, misunderstanding, or independent division, and steadfastly resists all attempts from any source to disrupt our sweet mutual relationship with each other.

The phrase, "We're all in this TO-GETHER" is rapidly becoming quaint, but it sums up what many of us who are members of the Bible Sabbath Association would like to believe we represent as we submit ourselves individually and mutually to the bond of peace.

Above the Clouds

T was a gloomy March day when I boarded the huge Delta Airlines plane at Chicago. As it rose slowly from O'Hare Field, smoke from the industrial Calumet area of Indiana could be seen mingling with the clouds to produce a dirty looking haze that almost obscured everything below.

As the plane rose higher, buildings, cars, and people seemed to shrink into insignificant size, partly hidden by the haze. In a few minutes, with the Chicago area behind, the man-made portion of haze grew less and visibility increased. The checkerboard pattern of midwestern agricultural land was evident below.

But then we could again feel the upward thrust of the plane as it climbed to a still higher altitude. The clouds closed around us and we seemed to be suspended in a white mass of cotton.

Then—with a suddeness that startled me—the clouds were below us and the sun was shining brightly. Visibility was excellent, and in the faroff distance the silver-white vapor trail of another plane was lining the blue sky. Just a few minutes later we again descended through the clouds to land at the Nashville, Tenn., airport. But even though it was somewhat cloudy here, too, blooming forsythia and redbud all around broadcast their beauty and the message that spring had arrived in that area.

Perhaps that illustrates the stages in the Christian life—especially the life of a Sabbath keeper. He learns of the claims of the Commandments and tries—often depending on his own spiritual strength—to keep them. When he discovers that within himself he does not have the power to do anything good—that all his accumulated righteousness amounts, in the words of Isaiah, to nothing more than "filthy rags," gloom and despondency may cloud out much light from heaven.

But he needs to rise to a higher level, to see that, above all, the Lord's love is shining, and that this love will enable him to stand perfect in the sight of his Maker. Then even the sin-filled earth becomes a cheerful place, for he realizes that somewhere God's love is shining. Clouds are a passing thing—the sun is not; it will be there forever. When he basks in the light of God's love, obedience becomes a delight, not a burden.

ON SABBATH KEEPERS

20TH CENTURY CHURCH OF GOD

Church literature of the Worldwide Church of God, formerly known as the Radio Church of God, indicated that in January, 1934, God allocated to this movement two 19-year time cycles (ending in January, 1972) to complete the mission of carrying the gospel to the world, as outlined in the Scripture, to precede the return of Christ. These two 19-year cycles were to parallel a believed two 19-year time cycles of preaching by the early apostolic church.

A new era was begun in the history of what believers consider the only true Church of God on earth in 1973. The Laodicean Church, under the direction of Herbert W. Armstrong, had served its purpose. The 20th Century Church of God was born. Mr. Alfred Carrozzo, 41, who had served as director of ministers for the western half of the U.S. in the Worldwide Church for over a decade, resigned as a minister of that group on November 13, 1973, and incorporated the 20th Century Church of God.

Major differences in doctrine between the Worldwide Church and the 20th Century Church include qualifications of ministers of God's church, marriage and divorce, tithing, the law, church government, the commission of the Church today, and church eras.
