Dear Brother Ballenger:

In making research for the data you desired we begun with the volume corresponding with the date of Brother Smith's letter of 1883 and intended to work backward until the article to which he referred was found, but noticing that he made reference to the "Hope of Israel" and the paper we printed at that time was "Advent And Sabbath Advocate", the name being changed the spring of 1872, we went to that date and begun, but we did not find what you wanted, or what we believe you want, until the year 1866 was reached. In this volume there are numerous articles published questioning the divine claims of Sister White. They are too lengthy for us to attempt to copy for you here, as it would be more expensive than you would like, and we are not sure just what portions you would wish, so have decided just to mail this entire volume to you by registered mail, believing that you will take good care of it, and register it back to us when you get what you wish. We would not take \$100.00 for the book.

You will find articles on pages 12, 26, 29, 37, 41, 49, 57, 65, and 158 that will interest you I presume, and there may be a good many more from 65 on through the volume as we did not look carefully after that page was reached.

Two persons worked on this and the time required from their other duties amounted to \$2.50, and if you wish you may send this together with the cost of registration if you wish.

In going over these old volumes we find that there are six volumes older than this one, being commenced the year 1860 at Hartford Michigan, with Brother Bell as Editor, and Elder Crammer connected with the paper. It was begun with volume one when moved to Iowa from Michigan, after the Marion church had divided, through having received literature from the Michigan brethren.
