I believe the Church of Christ is made up of individuals all of whom are imperfect in knowledge, and subject to misconceptions of truth. B But the best way to help them, as I view it, is not to get on the outside and fight, but to stay on the inside and exhort "in the spirit of mackness; considering thyself lest thou also be tempted."
