"And in that day will I make Jerusalem a burdensome stone for all people: all that burden themselves with it shall be cut in pieces, though all the people of the earth be gathered against it."

"In that day will I make the governors of Judah like an hearth of fire among the wood, and like a torch of fire in a sheaf: and they shall devour all the people round about, on the right hand and on the left: and Jerusalem shall be inhabited again in her own place, even in Jerusalem." Zechariah 12: 3, 6. Read also Obadiah 18 and Ezekiel 37: 15, 28. Also Isaiah 11: 12, 13.

The "Sunday World-Herald Magazine" (Omaha) of Feb. 1, 1948, under the heading, "Problem of Jerusalem" reads, "One of the major headaches of the U. N. will be the government of Jerusalem, long a chief trouble spot in the Holy Land. Under the partition plan, Jerusalem will be ruled by the U. N. as an international territory entirely independent of the proposed Jewish and Arab countries which are to be carved out of Palestine."

This article then recites the difficulties the U. N. will encounter in setting up and maintaining the government of the city of Jerusalem. It recites that the city will be surrounded by Arab territory making travel to and from the city touchy.

In September, 1947, an editorial under the head, "A Major Problem" appeared in the World-Herald (Omaha) from which we quote, "The distressing problem of Palestine, of the homeless and deeply wronged Jews who long for a home, is not a minor but a major problem. And it is loaded with high explosives."

On Feb. 7, 1948, in said paper, under the heading "Arabs Deliver Grim Warning," we read, "The Arab Higher Committee warned the United Nations Friday that Palestine Arabs will fight any international force sent to the Holy Land."

On Feb. 21, an editorial in the Morning World-Herald, under the heading "Ducking on Palestine," says, "At Lake Success, the United Nations Little Assembly was getting precisely nowhere in the matter of Palestine. China announced that it would not support an international army to enforce the partition. Britain has already taken the same position and France is expected to follow. The small nations, likewise, want no part of the Palestine affair."

"This leaves the United States and Russia, which have not announced their position. Russia has been playing coy with the Arabs, but is expected in the long run to be willing to send a force to Palestine—right into the middle of an area that supplies the Western world with oil. Such a possibility gives the United States diplomats cold chills. But what will the United States do? Nobody knows yet."
