to set things in order, there, get acquainted with the work and workers better, and prepare for a greater work when Benny and Betty Rosell return there for their missions work.

The college at Stanberry reports that they are far behind with wages for their teachers and behind on their bills which are positive obligations to their creditors. They are badly in need of help, and at once, if we are to continue this work or even pay present obligations. All available funds have been exhausted and the need is urgent.

The Home Missions Department has had to call a halt in its work for lack of funds, and other departments are in need. We feel that you should know these needs so that it might stimulate some of you to action who have been putting off your personal efforts to help with the work. If we had 100% co-operation from all of you the burden would not be great for any of us. Our Heavenly Father has not given this work into the hands of a few; but it is the work of all of us, and we believe from past experience that once you realize the needs of the work that you will exert greater effort to meet the needs of an expanding work of the Church of God.

Your budget committee is faced with a crisis at the present time and we need the full co-operation of ALL. We are trying as best we can to apportion the funds sent in to the different department according to their needs and our ability to furnish them, but when the funds are divided among them and their obligations are still unpaid, we cannot do more. We are therefore appealing to you to not let down in your efforts.

All of us know that even our home budgets are much more than before 1949 because of inflated national currency. It takes much more for us to live at home. Because of this condition it also takes more for us to continue the progress of the Church. We do not wish to close any of our present interests or projects unless it becomes absolutely necessary; but this committee can go no further than our help will permit us.

Again, we say, THANK YOU, and may God richly bless all of us and keep us in the hollow of His hand.

We hope to be able to give you an encouraging report in our next letter.
