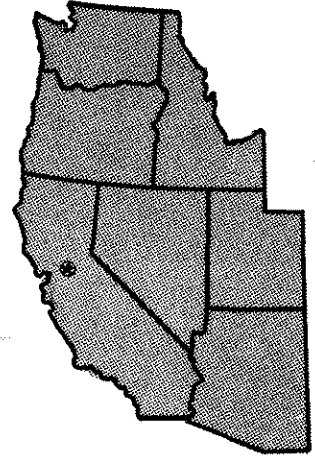
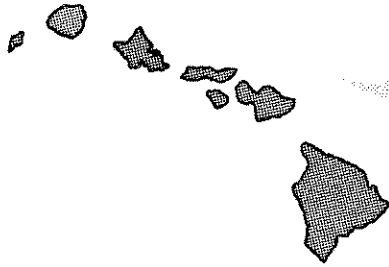

THE NUMBER OF BIBLE ADVOCATES SENT OUT IN OUR DISTRICT HAVE INCREASED SUBSTANTIAL THIS PAST YEAR. IN 1978 THERE WERE 2,846 EACH MONTH. The Walla Walla Church of God continues to be blessed in their service for the Lord. Recently a long wanted and much needed nursery was added to the back of the chapel.

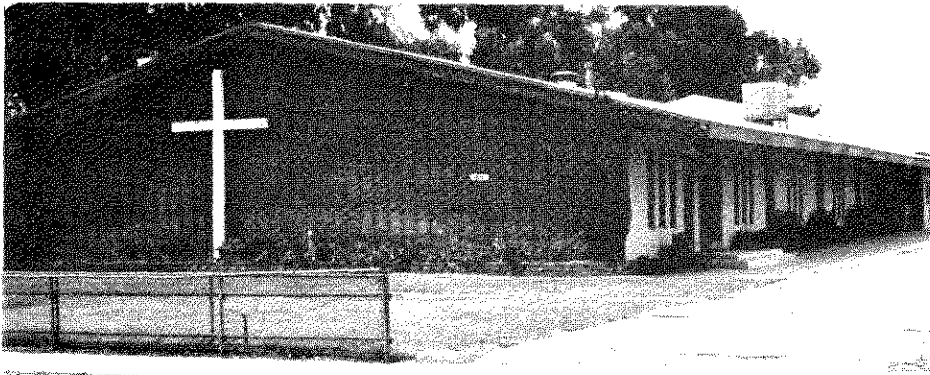

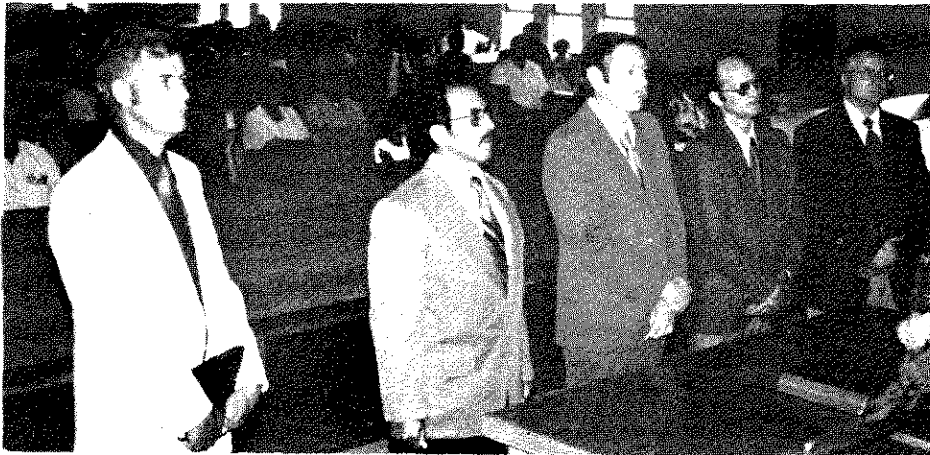
SAN FERNANDO VALLEY - CALIFORNIA

*The San Fernando Valley Church of God (Seventh Day) has an interesting history, a part of which includes a severe earthquake that ruined the church they were then renting. This caused them to have to move the location of church services. After renting a few years in North Hollywood the group recently moved to the present building on Van Nuys Blvd in Pacoima. They wish to be known as the San Fernando Valley Church.*

*Two years ago this group averaged 30 in attendance. Then this past year attendance climbed to an average of 45 each week. In the past three months they have averaged an attendance of 84. So this congregation is on a beautiful growth pattern under the expert direction of Pastor Trinidad Padilla. Elder Padilla is also working with the Hawthorne Spanish church and the new English speaking group that has began meeting there.*



This energetic and growing group at San Fernando has set goals for attendance and outreach that should easily be met with all the talent they have. Elder Padilla comments;

"We are hoping to reach the 100 mark soon. Since our building will seat over 600, we are working real hard to fill it. 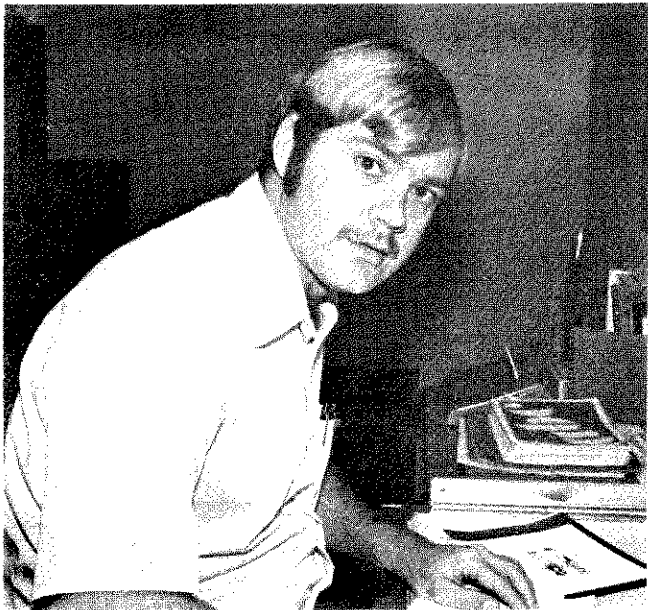

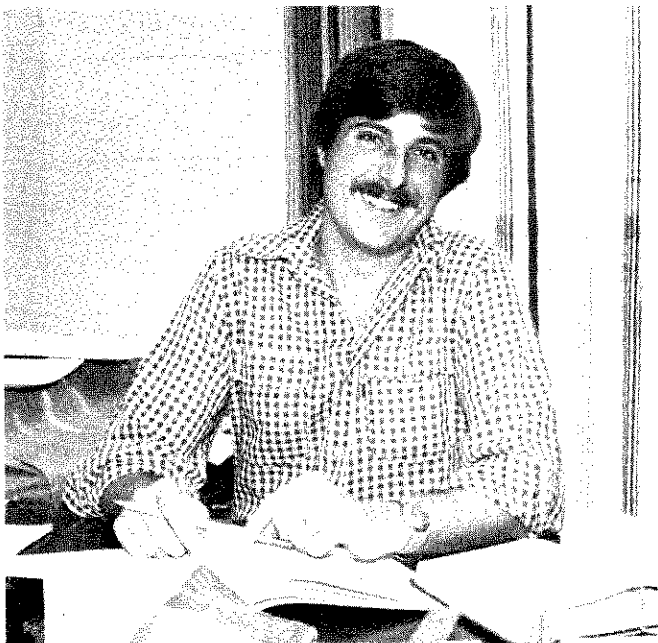


### STEVE BRIGHTBILL

In addition to his studies at MTC, Loren is a member of the Bible Advocate Press editorial team. Editing the Harvest Field Messenger is his primary responsibility.

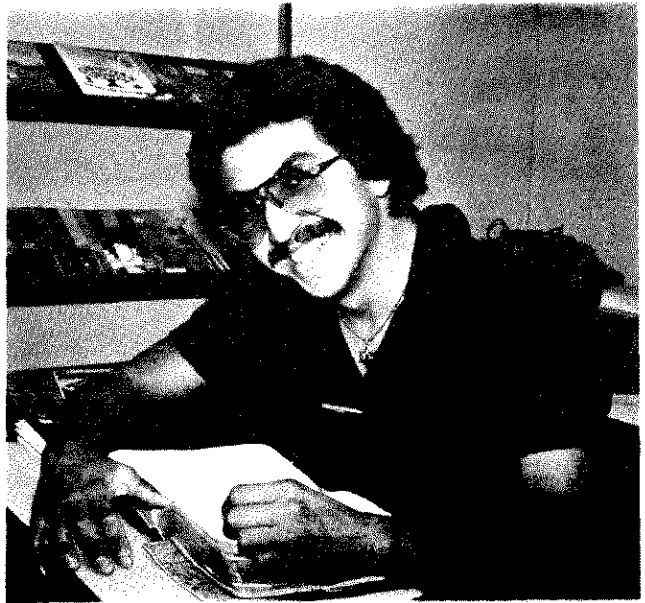
