ISRAEL POTASH EXPORTS RESUMED

New Company Has Sent First Shipment To Great Britain

HAIFA-(ISI)-The first shipment of potash exported since the establishment of the State left Haifa recently. Part of a 3,000 ton British order, this consignment weighed 250 tons.

This shipment represents the culmiration of efforts to rebabilitate the Dead Sea industry which was disrupted by Arab aggression in 1948.

The completion, last spring, of a 48mile highway from Beersheba to S'dom, constructed by the Government of Israel, was an essential step in the reactivation of these works. This road provides easy transportation to and from the coast.

Before World War II, Dead Sea potash was exported to Great Britain, Australia, Ceylon, Eire, India, Scuth Africa, Austria, China, Czechoslovakia, Holland, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Scandinavia and the United States.

Be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves" (James 1:22). It is muc't, very much to be thankful for when the Holy Spirit has illumined a man's understanding, dispersed the mists of error, and established him in the Truth. Yet that is only the beginning. The Holy Scriptures are "profitable" not only for "doctrine" but also for "reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (II Tim. 3:16). Observe well the order there: before we are ready to be instructed "in righteousness" (right doing) there is much in our lives that God "reproves" and which we must correct." Necessarily so, for before conversion everything in our lives was wrong! for all we did was for the gratifying of self, with no thought or concern for God's honor and glory. Therefore, the first great need, and the primary duty of every voung convert is not to study the Old Testament types. or puzzle his brains over prophecy, but to diligently search the Scriptures in order to find out what is pleasing and displeasing to God, what He forbids and what He commands.

If you have been genuinely converted, then your first concern must be to form all the details of your life—in the home, in the chruch, in the world—so as to please God. And in the actual bringing of this to pass, the order will be "crase to do evil; learn to do well" (Isa. 1:16:17)

Now the extent to which the young Christian does use the Holy Scriptures in a practical way, regulating his thoughts, desires and actions by their warnings and encouragements, their prohibitions and precepts, will very largely determine the measure in which he will enjoy God's blessing on

The tragic thing is that instead of the average young Christian studying diligently God's Word so as to discover all the details of the Divine will for him, he does almost anything and everything else. Many a one engages in "per-

For as is commonly known we cannot ostracize ourselves from other nations and peoples of the world, even though this has been advocated by some well meaning and honest men in this country. Developments since World War I including and especially emphasizing new methods of warfare and transportation, have conclusively proven this theory to be wrong. This is true only to such extent and degree that people and therefore nations, are what they are, and that no power on earth seems to be able to change them for what they are.

If, as we seem to hope, war can be completely abolished what do we purpose to do about overproduction of ourselves, and eating ourselves to death? Wheather we die on the battlefield, or by the continuing trend to produce more food than we can consume, and then trying to consume it, we shall be no less dead; Naturally where there is an overproduction of food, and an increased national income, people as a whole will actually consume more of the things produced, and if continued on into the future without hinderance from any augrter will not only in theory, but actually eat themselves to death.

Current nutritional studys show that we are eating 12 per cent more food now than before World War II, we are spending 27 per cent of cur income on food as against 23 per cent from 1935 to 1939. With regard to this I also offer the percentage increases in per capita consumption of basic foods of common variety, we consume 36 per cent more eaas, 18 per cent more meats, 23 per cent more citrus fruits and tomatces, and 11 per cent more green and yellow

ANCIENT AND MODERN

Four years ago ancient Beersheba, about 26 miles from Jerusalem, was a sleepy town of a little more than 300 people. Today it is a flourishing community of 25,000 Jews from 60 countries of the world.

ACRESTS IN RUMANIA UP

TEL AVIV (JTA)—Many Jews, including rabbis and community leaders, were recently arrested in Rumania and some of them already have been tried on charges of illegal Zionist activity, it was reported here today.

Reports, which have been arriving over a period of weeks recently, say that among those tried were Dr. Miklos Feinfeld, identified as the Chief Rabbi of the city of Arab, and Stefan Krois, Ludwig Gardos and Moshe Weissberger, who are otherwise not identified. The sentence passed on Rabbi Feinfeld is not known, but Krois is reported to have been setenced to a three-year prison term while each of the other two defendents have been setenced to 12-year terms.

THE SHELTER OF SOLOMON'S QUARRIES

It is pointed out in **Sunday School Times** that no city in the world has the underground protection from air bombing equal to that of Jerusalem. These are the so-called quarries of Solomon, vast in extent, which are being prepared rapidly for the accomodation of the inhabitants of the city.

THE "QUEEN OF SHEBA" STORY

According to the Jerusalem Post, modern science has vindicated the Bible once again. The latest American archeological expedition in southern Arabia proved that the empires of King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba were co-existent.

Critics of the Bible have denied this fact in the past. Students of ancient history have contended that the Sheba empire came many centuries later than that of Solomon.

But Prof. W. F. Albright, of Johns Hopkins University, addressed a packed audience at Ratisbonne Hall in Jerusalem recently and revealed the latest findings. The American expedition was the first to carry out a proper arceological excavation in southern Arabia, the Professor said, and it established the fact that the Sheba reign was much earlier than historians have supposed.

The findings of the expedition proved the truthfulness of the Biblical account of the visit of the Queen of Sheba to King Solomon. The Sheban Empire was a military and commercial power which extended not only to the coastal cities of Arabia but also to Ethiouia.

SHEEP-BREEDING IMPORTANT FOR ISRAEL'S AGRICULTURAL ECONOMY

HAIFA—(ISI)—The Sheep Breeder's Association of Israel emphasized the importance of sheep-breeding as an coliunct to Israel's agricultural economy at its annual convention in Haifa. Sheep berds grew 30% larger during the past year, and the current sheep population of Israel has reached 65,000 hcad.
