Dear Brethren: At last I'll take time to send in my experiences on my trip to Meridian from Carthage, Mo. to Greenacres, Wash. They say better late than never.

I've been very busy since coming to Greenacres, Wash, where my brother, eighty years old, was in critical condition. For three years he had to be a nurse to his wife who had spreading cancer, which means a living death. She passed away on March 31, 1954 and about a month later he lost his youngest daughter, who gave birth to her tenth child. The child lived but the mother gave her life for her family. All this continual care for his wife, made my brother a nervous wreck, with a low blood pressure. He is under the care oa doctor. With prayer for him and the doctor's care he is slowly improving. I'm writing you all this to show that my burdens have been rather heavy since I left Missouri, Having arrived safe from Meridian to Greenacres, Wash., I had just a rew bennie, or .. \$5 when I arrived at my brother's and for this reason I had to find work so as to be able to get back to Meridian in time for campmeeting.

Now then, before I left Missouri, I had bought and traded for a 1946 Pontiac Sedan. My motive was to help others get to the campmeeting at Meridian. I had intended to bring six persons besides myself. Finally Brother and Sister Curry decided they were not physically able to go. That left Brother and Sister Friend and Brother and Sister Fred Myers, who wanted to come to Meridian. Then when I got news of my brother's condition, I felt that it was my duty to go to him in his hour of sorrow and grief. I'm very glad that I came as I feel he is on his way to recovery. However, I'm sorry I had to disappoint Brother Friend and Myers. I notified each that I had to go to my brother's bedside in Wash. I felt it was my duty and I've always believed that which is my duty to do, that is what I should do. However, there is a limit to enduring our own burdens, and the burdens of others. Praise the Lord, he has sustained me by never leaving me.

When I left Carthage, I went as far as my sisters at Topeka, Kansas, The next day I drove 611 miles. On the way I had the armature of my generator to break, with the pully wheel broken. This delayed me two hours, and over \$16 expense. The next day I drove about 650 miles and again something happened I had just filled the tank with gas when I tried

to get away, the gas line was stopped. I had the car pushed into a garage. There they used air pressure to blow it out. This air pressure opened up a leak in the tank and I was loosing my gas, and by the way it only cost 35c per gallon out here in the West. Not being able to get a tank for my car, all I could do was to have it taken off and mended. Again this meant a delay of two hours. I stayed all night at Burley, Idaho. To add to my grief before I got to Burley, Idaho, I encountered a severe dust storm and was detained for quite some time. To add to my displeasure, when I attempted to find a place to stay, I either could not find a bed or else I was unable to buy outright a motel. I said to one man, when I asked for a room, that I didn't want to buy his motel but just wanted a room. This insulted the man so that he really got angry. The storm had made rooms as a premium. Therefore, I had a travel from 5 a.m. to 12 p.m. before finding a bed at a

Now brethren, this was not the end of my experience. The next morning I had gotten about half way between Burley, Idaho and Twin Falls when almost without warning a rod in the motor came loose and went out through the block, literally ruined the engine. So I flagged down a car and rode into Twin Falls, Idaho, about 150 miles from Meridian, There I hired a wrecker to pull me in and that cost me \$10. Now all this, brethren, happened on the Sabbath day. If I ever had an os in the ditch on the Sabbath day, I guess this was the time. The Pontiac people wanted \$375 for a short motor, so not having that amount I was forced to do some shopping for a motor and someone to put it in. 1 found a motor at Sears Roebuck and one of my Missouri friends to put the motor in. In the mean while, I had contacted Brother Palmer at Meridian and he, his wife, and daughter came down to Twin Falls to pull me to Meridian. However, I had made arrangements to have the motor taken out and the new one put in on Monday, but it was Wednesday before I got to Meridian and on Thursday, I arrived at Greenacres, Wash.

While my trip was somewhat discouraging, yet, the fact that I got a job of painting a house, this will assure me my goal, the campmeeting at Meridian, I hope I meet all my old friends and many I have never met before

I hope, trust, and pray that at least in one will have a greater or sadder experience than I have had so far and that like Paul in Phil. ?:14, I may continue to press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. Let us, everyone who can, strive to be at the campmeeting at Meridian and let nothing interfere with our goal in life. So that when the ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads. They shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.
