Report of Nigeria, Africa Camp-Meeting

from Elder E. E. CHARLES
Secretary and treasurer of Nigeria

The meeting opened by singing "Rejoice in the Lord, Oh Let His Mercy Cheer". Then prayer was led by Elder R. K. Iye. We stood and sang "What a Friend We have in Jesus"; after which lesson was read by Elder E. O. Eke. Another hymn was sung, "The King of Love My Shepherd is" and the Ten Commandments were repeated in unison while standing. Then the roll was called by Elder R. O. Orukwowu. The attendance was nearly 200 or more. Some had gone out, not being present, when the attendance was taken. The following churches attended the meeting: OBITE, OBIOZIMINI, EREMA, OMOKU, OB-EKEGI, AGBADA, AND IHUBOGO from AHOAD DIS-TRICT. Another two districts sent their representatives and they are ABA and IBIBIO DISTRICTS. Two were from IBIBIO and five were from ABA. Brethren from Kano failed because of train disappointment by strike, as Bro. Wokoafor wired us.

A chorus of thanksgiving was raised while offerings were received from the congregation. After the offerings were taken, we stood praising God with chorus asking Him to receive the offering as He did for Abel and other saints whom He delighted in. While we knelt down Elder J. O. Ikeagu offered a brief prayer confirming the pleading chorus.

Elder A. N. Eke taught the lesson on the pamphlet. The subject being "God's Power of Deliverance". After choruses were sung Elder R. K. Iye preached on the subject "As It Was in the Days of Noah, So Shall the coming of the Son Of Man Be." This was a heart touching sermon and it brought to our minds the corrupt world of sin that we are living in. Brother Bernard then gave a good testimony of the work in Ahoada district and assured us that the people there had not gone with another group of Church of God people, as we had formerly been informed. After Elder Orukwowu gave announcements of the various time when we would have our meetings, we sang a closing hymn "It is Well With My Soul". Elder Orukwowu, the general overseer of Nigeria, led us in a closing prayer. Thus ended our morning service.

At 2:30 o'clock we opened our afternoon meeting by singing a hymn. Bro. Orukwowu led in prayer, and the meeting was turned over to Elder Ebenezer E. Charles who preached on "The Second Coming of Christ". Supporting choruses were sung to confirm this important subject and we could not help but feel happy in the Lord, knowing that He is comming SOON. Oh,

we hope to meet you there, Brethren. We sang the choruses about the second coming of Jesus in glory and the reaping of saints, both dead and living, and as the brethren from Ibibio stood they sang eight choruses in their native tongue. Bro. Johnson interperted to us. This is the first time that these brethren sang to us and the choruses were melodious. Praise God for them. These people are progressing regardless of the enemy's evil plans to hinder them. The church of God must prosper. Amen. After the general overseer of Nigeria had given us a lively introduction of Aba and Ibibio Districts, Elder R. K. Iye gave a short report about Ibibio brethren as he had been there.

Again Elder Orukwowu gave a general report of Nigeria, praising God for the failure of Satan in attempting to do away with the church of God in Nigeria, and that instead of failure God had promoted it.

A brother was received into the fold and family of God, here on earth. All the ordained ministers gave him the right hand of fellowship. Elder Orukwowu quoted a text in 2 Cor. 2:5-11. Then after many choruses, we stood and sang a hymn for closing, "Abide with Me." Elder Orukwowu said the closing prayer.

The following day, baptismal service was held. We went down to Odieke waterside and Elder Orukwowu baptized 13 souls After coming to camp those who were buried in the watery grave were given the right hand of fellowship, by the ordained ministers. We then had a few minutes rest period, and a committee meeting followed. We discussed several matters and then closed that night. Saturday night, January 6, 1952, we had a wonderful testimony meeting. Many told of the wonderful works of God, and thanked Him for giving us this wonderful camp meeting for the enemy had so planned that we should not have had this lovely meeting this year. God is wonderful and to be praised. This campmeeting was one of much interest and I am sorry to say that time has failed me to express the joyfullness and wonderful testimonies of the Brethren.

When the meeting was declared closed, all the brethren went home to their respective places, while the ministers continued three days in their meetings and discussed many things of interest that I will report to you. There were many brothers and sisters in the faith who failed to attend this wonderful meeting,

We have all been working hand in hand during this period of years, and it is our hopes and prayers that conditions will be such, that the same fellowship may always continue.

Questions and Answers

Question:

Do you think there is any comparison today, in the end of Gentile Times, with conditions pertaining to divorces, etc., with the same conditions in the ending period of the Jewish age, when Christ was here?

Answer:

Yes, conditions are very much alike, not only with divorces but all other wick edness, corruption and sin. There were just five Sabbath keeping sects then, viz. Pharisees, Sadducees, Essenz, Herodians and Nazarines. Today there are also five Sabbath keeping sects, all with organizations. That was the ending days, spiritually speaking, of the Jewish, and Old Testament dispensation. A new order was about to be ushered in, with the Old Testament law of pardon to be done away, and the new law of pardon through the blood of Jesus, brought into effect, among both Jew and Gentile.

That age was one of unbelief, with no stability to be found among those professing to know God, and it was the turning point to the Gentile world. Now we are in the very same period of the Gentile Nations, and there is a turning back to the Jews, where we find great piety among those returning to Jerusalem and much prayer.

About all of these Sabbath keeping sects now have resolutions passed permitting those involved in divorce and remarriage to occupy leading positions in the church, which is absolutely contrary to divine order.

Question:

We have a woman as Treasurer of our Sabbath School, is that contrary to the scriptures? I find that Salem is condemning women acting as Treasurer.

Answer:

It has long been the practice of the "Church of God", for women to act as Treasurer of Sabbath schools, and also Treasurers of local churches, but not as one of the seven stewards of the church. There is no scripture that we know of that would forbid this, and even at the Salem headquarters, a woman has been doing the work of the Treasurer, except signing the

checks, for a good many years.

Question:

How long has the church opposed, persons involved in divorce and remarriage, holding leading positions,, or becoming ministers?

Answer:

This has been their practice for nearly two thousand years and much longer. The priests of the Old Testament were required to marry only virgins. See 1 Tim. 3:1 to 4, and Titus 1, realtive to the leading officers of local congregations. By these scriptures we can easily discern the Lord's will, that persons qualifying as members of the body, could not qualify for officers.

Question:

Are all church funds expected to go from here to Jerusalem to be distributed when headquarters is operated from there?

Answer:

This would be decidedly out of place, and no one has taught this at any time. Our foreign countries all have their headquarters where tithes are distributed from, the same as here. We will of course have a headquarters just the same as always, and publications go out from here as usual, in this country. Look at the Harvest Messenger Paper Head and note that Jerusalem is there as our headquarters. This is where our Saviour placed it. See Acts 15:1-4.

Question:

Please explain why the lesson in our quarterlies for May 10th is contrary to the doctine of Israel found in the Bible Home Instructor page 442. Also did the recent article get into the Advocte teaching this subject in a false light?

Answer:

The truth on this subject as taught by the church, has never been abrogated. Neither has this new doctrine been accepted according to the constitution, therefore its appearance in our publications has been in violation to the constitution. Article 8, Sections 3 and 4. The ones responsible for this intrusion, and violation of trust, are not now in good standing in the church. See Section 5, Article 8. An investigation is under way.

THE NIGERIAN COUNCIL

Meeting Held At Erema, Nigeria, Jan. 7th to 9th

The meeting opened by singing "Through the Love of God our Savior" Then we knelt while the overseer of Nigeria Led us in prayer. Eleven ministers were present. See photos of ministers.

We discussed important business, and arranged about the brethren from Aba and Ibibio, and their transportation expenses were handed over to them. We closed the morning session by singing "Praise Him-Jesus our Blessed Redeemer," and prayer.

The afternoon ession was called for 2 o'clock, and we went over the constitution, and it took a long time to get through with it, and in fact it is an inspired constitution. Many things were asked and discussed.

The following morning we came together at 8:30 and sang "Revive Thy Work, Oh God". Then we read in unison 2 Peter one. Elder Orukwowu made remarks on verses 4 to 10. Then the "Nigerian Guide Rule" was made which took considerable time. It was decided that our Nigerian headquarters be at Obite until a representative from America comes and then the buildings will be made at a suitable central place.

Here is a list of churches in Nigeria: Obite, Obizimini, Erema, Omoku, Obekugi, Agbada, Ihubogo, Aburuike, Avo, Umuebi, Naikta, Osauku, Ikotuku, Ikotobok, Ntuapako, Ikotebak, Ekpoyotai, Kano and Oguta.

Elder O. R. Orukwowu, the general overseer to reside at Obite; Elder R. K. Iye to be transfered to Oguta; Elder J. O. Ikeagu to Ibibio district, Elder F. W. Ihuoma to remain at Aba district; (This brother was appointed into the ministery this month), Elder A. N. Eke to Obite as district overseer of Ahoada district; Elder T. O. Ojum to still remain in Igubogo; Elder E. O. Eke to still remain at Erema; A. O. Wachuku for Umukiri and Avo; Mark Okugo for Obiozimini and

Obukegi; Jonas Theanacho for Umebi; Ndiakata church for R. Shadrack: Bernard E. Umorou for Ilkotebak and Ekpeyotai; Aaron Obudu for Ikotebok and Ntuabako: Timothy Okwuonu layman preacher for Aburuike; Godwin N. Uboforohite to be employed and sent to Agbada and Omuku to care for the two churches. The General Secretary has too much to do for the work in general, and it was decided that an assistant secretary was to be employed in the near future.

Then the trustees for the church buildings in whose names they will be registered were selected by vote as follows, Elder R. O. Orukwowu, E. E. Charles, R. K. Iye, and F. W. Ihuoma.

Many more important matters were discussed pertaining to the advancing message but time and space forbids further details.

WORLD CONDITIONS OF TOMORROW ANNOUNCED IN BIBLE PROPHECY

"How long shall it be to the end of these wonders?" Dan. 12:6.

After Gabriel had revealed to the prophet Daniel the rise and fall of great world kingdoms which were future in his day, he concluded with the announcement of a time of trouble such as never was since there was a nation, to be followed by the resurrection of the dead. Daniel 12:1, 2.

Then the question was asked, "How long shall it be to the end of these wonders? The answer was, "When he shall have accomplished to scatter the power of the holy people,, all these things shall be finished". Verses 6, 7.

All of the four world empires announced by the prophet have come and gone, only we now live in the very last events of number four. The history of the world, as we look backward, has filled the prophetic mould. All world events of any consequence have most accurately met the announcement of the prophets of God, thus vindicating the divinity of the sacred WORD, and establishing the certainty of our World Tomorrow. The resurrection of the dead, and the coming age of peace with eternal life given to the righteous, is very near at hand.

THE TEN WORLD DICTATORS

The beast whose deadly wound was to be healed (Rev. 13:3), is now coming into view. This beast when wounded was the fourth and represented the European nations, now in the North Atlantic Treaty. The same power from the city of Rome, actuated it then, as it does NOW. There are just ten nations which make up this combination whose territory is in Europe where it was before. The other two nations in the treaty are across the Atlantic to the West, and were not embraced in the territory forming this fourth beast, when it ruled before as a world power. There is good reason therefore to know that they will not form a part of this combination because they are not IN EUROPE

and therefore cannot do so. They will be a separate power, or combination, also revealed in this same 13th chapter.

When this beast comes back, after the wound is healed, it cannot possibly be Communism, because Communism is of recent origin. It never has been a world-wide power before, to have suffered the deadly wound. This beast (ROME) did, when the so-called Holy Roman Empire became dismembered, and divided, after the woman rider was compelled to dismount, and church and state were separated. If the coming beast were Communism, then we would have a fifth world kingdom, which is contrary to the Word of God. It would not be the same kingdom coming back, as it is in the case of Rome, but it would be another power entirely different, hence another kingdom, the fifth, but remember that the fifth kingdom is the stone kingdom of Daniel 2:34, to 45, representing the kingdom of God, and this is not Communism.

Remember, dear reader, that the beast which carries the harlot woman to her judgement, and destruction, is the same old beast that was here before. Then it was wounded, but it comes back again, giving rise to the expression by the prophet that "It was, and was not, and yet is". Rev. 17:8. This is the same as having received the deadly wound by the sword, and that wound was healed, Rev. 13:3. Such could not be said of Communism because it never has been here as as a world power, neither has it carried or supported this woman rider. Communism represents the DRA-GON, another of the triune powers to gather the nations of the world to Armageddon.

Capitalism Enthroned

Capitalism is to be enthroned with power, together with the woman rider in the closing drama of Gentile times. The prophet has most clearly announced this condition as we find in both the 17th and 18th chapters of Revelation. The gorgeously adorned harlot

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decked with gold and precious stones, is branded BABYLON THE GREAT (see verse 4), and in this capitalistic garb she sinks never to rise again. This included all combinations of capitalism, monopolies, and rich incorporations representing the profiteering of our day. Read about it in Revelation 18th chapter. The writer had nothing to do with these announcements of TOMORROW, but they will accurrately come to pass, just as all others have come, which the Father in Heaven has revealed to the children of men.

Catholicism, and Capitalism are now united together against Communism, and both are the strong supporting pillars of the "Atlantic Treaty", the object of which is a defense against the rising threat of Communism, but Communism will remain on the stage of action until the Waterloo of Gentile nations at Armageddon.

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WHO IS WHO IN THE FOREIGN FIELDS?

THE WORK IN MEXICO

As was stated in the April "Reporter", I have been closely connected with the foreign work of the Church of God, for nearly forty years, and have keenly watched its beginning and growth in every country. The name of each pioneer minister as well as his trials and successes is very familiar; familiar to me which time has not erased.

It was Elder J. M. Rodriguez, who around 30 years ago, launched the message in Old Mexico, and it was 26 years ago that I made my first missionary journey through that country in company with Elder Milton Grotz. About this time a minister by the name of Ramirez was given the clearer light of the Church of God, and as a result he was cast out of the Adventist church, but his congregation of over 100 members, in Mexico City followed him, and they found a home with us as a people. From this time the truth rapidly spread forth far and near. The brethren in different parts of the country, it was reported, were persecuted by the Roman Catholics being the leading church of the country.

The history of the work, and those called of God who carried the message there as I remember it, would fill the reporter, therefore I must make the items brief. When the church was re-organized in 1933, these people followed happily in the new light of the Bible organization, Elder P. Campos being one of the leaders, like Moses, of God's people at that time. Later Elder Jose Kim Peck, Elder L. Ramirez, Elder Albert Garcia, Elder Theodore Martinez, Elder Hecktor Lodinez, Elder Tames Farrgoza, and Elder Arnulfo Moreno, became leaders and pillars in the movement.

Sometime before this, however, a Spanish minister by the name of Saenz had arisen to considerable prominence in the leadership of that people, and who was chosen as one of the 12 of the reorganization with American headquarters at Salem, W. Va., He remained in this position for some time, and by virtue of the appointment became the overseer of Mexico. His conduct, as reported from there, became overbearing, and instead of having the humility of a servant, he was exalted and craved self-honor, requesting gatherings of the members to bow upon his coming in their midst etc. As a result his dismissal was requested by the Spanish people, and he was removed from the 12, several years ago. A few months ago, however, he was placed back on the board of 12 by the leaders at Salem. Soon after this there were two of the brethren made a trip into Mexico, which has been reported in the Messenger. As soon as these brethren arrived in Mexico City, the following letter was sent to me by air mail. It was an answer to this letter that our readers received from Salem quite recently. The letter follows-

Mexico, D. F., Feb. 21, 1952

Elder A. N. Dugger;

Dear Elder: As you know we are very happy with the back to Salem movement, since you came to Mexico City. We have been working for the truth, and for the faith that was once delivered to the saints.

Elder Olson and Elder Summers arrived in Mexico City this week, and they say they are two of the 12, that they represent the "Back to Salem movement." It that true Brother?

They have raised the suspension of Brother Saenz, and they gave him a new credential as one of the 12. Brother Dugger, please tell me if these brothers are right or not. We are with the "Back to Salem" movement, but we are NOT with Saenz. If he is newly one of the 12 we are not with him, neither with you if you accept him. Answer me quick, if it is possible by telegram, that I may know the position of these brothers.

I answered Elder Gonzales as best I could under these circumstances, and told him just how the situation stood, and sent my letter by air mail, which was published recently, from the Eastern district.

The general body of the "Church of God" in Mexico includes many thousand people as I have witnessed its growth from one man around 30 years ago, to what it is today. One church in Mexico City has a membership of over two thousand. There are over 100 Church of God ministers in the general movement there. The few who followed Elder Saenz, and were reported by the brethren returning from their recent visit, includes but a very small body compared to the general movement of the Church of God in Mexico.

A few years ago when two Sabbath keeping groups in the U.S. planned to merge, which work did not materialize, the general body in Mexico joined in with this other group, but they DID not embrace the wrong doctrine of that body which prevented the Salem people from uniting together, and becoming one group. It was decided by the 12 before this meeting was held that unless the doctrines of difference were settled the Salem group would not merge. As these doctrines have never been settled there was no general merger, and the Spanish people in Mexico, while they have been working with the other brethren, they still hold to the true faith.

From the letter printed above, however, it would appear that they were more with Salem than they are with the other group, but the main point we are interested in, bretheren, is whether they are with Christ. It is not Paul or Apollos or Cephas, but if they are truly with Christ and holding steadfast to "The faith that was once delivered to the saints", then they are our people, and we are ONE.

A Hebrew paper in ISRAEL recently carried this item,-"Two thousand years ago we Jews cut off our son Jesus. Now that he is so largely cut off by Christians, perhaps he will return to His own People".-

About the fund to furnish ministers Bibles at cost prices to sell, and help them with their expenses. I like that but the folks here have nothing like money to buy with. Our enemies who received the same light of the Sabbath the same time we did, tell us that we have a bad spirit, and they gave leave that we must be chased away from their churches, unless we would say that we have a bad Spirit or an unclean Spirit, and they drove our people away. The white man came to them and said they did very well. In May 1941 these people gave laws that we must be chased out of town, and they came one day about 120 people and packed away all the furnishings of our church house and also the doors and windows. They came with knives, spears, and bows and arrows, and many other things for fighting. They usually come with policemen and court messengers. We cannot say one third of what we suffered because of this bad Spirit, but when we see you face to face we will tell you more. We have been taken to prison so many times, and some of our company have been wounded, both men and women. We were driven out of Omoka, and came out empty handed to where we live

now, but we have become stronger

Some of the churches we have left behind we cannot get to only by foot, or bicycles, and we have many loyal people there who love this clear light of the Church of God. One of these towns is 42 miles, another 67 miles, another 77 miles, Oz Opapo 140 miles, Mz-Ogon 170 miles, another is 200 miles and another 100 miles. Mz-Measa is 82 miles, Mz-Obeti 80 miles, and Mz-Azugo 79 miles.

If there is anything you can send for us it will be good. So ask the Father of Spirits if all I say is true. Ask Him in prayer, and if there is any way you can send the Bibles, please send them. It was St. John 16:8 and 14:26 that these people taught us when we were with them. Then when this Spirit came it taught us this precious truth, and we found all of these things, that were in your tracts you sent to us. We came out from different towns and villages, and all of the people who remain in these places have promised us that they will never go back on the truth, and will stand firm, for God is meciful, and promises His mercy to them. Matt. 5:7.

DON'T-MARRY-DIVORCED-PERSONS RULE CITED

By Lord Bishop at Anglican Synod

Priests of the Church of England may not marry divorced persons. Nor may an Anglican clergyman marry a couple when one of them is not a Christian.

These rules of the Church were cited by Bishop Dale, in his annual charge to the Anglican Synod vesterday.

Said the Bishop: "It may be helpful if the following rules with regard to marriage are made public:

"1. On no account whatever may a priest take the Marriage Service for a person or persons who are divorced. Application to the Bishop for permission to do so is useless, for authorization will not be given.
