Whether the matter be concerned with real estate or personal property is immaterial from the standpoint of the application of that rule. There is not the slightest showing by the defendants that there was any compliance with the constitution of the Matie Salem Organisation.

To bolster their position that the National Jalen Organization has properly and legally adopted a merger the defen dants stress at great length in the evidence, a meeting which to place at Stanbury, Missouri, in August of 1949. A meeting which the defendants themselves say is the point at which the merger was completed. At that meeting some seventy -seven members out an admitted total of several thousand members of the National Jalem Organisation met to discuss among other problems, the question of merging with the National Stanbury Organization. Th persons in attendance held no official position as delegates and came with no authority to speak of represent tiels in

"A. averything was left up to the Board of Twelve in the final analysis."

The testimony of the plaintiffs supports this. On page 35 7. L.

Summers states,

"They elected the Board of Twelve but our organizati only had seventy-five members out of the whole body prese and therefore, they could not speak and not a one of thes people were delegates from any church. They were just members...."
