

At Shiloh, N. J., March 24th, 1872, Mr. JONATHAN AYARS, of Lawn Ridge, Peoria Co., Ill. He emigrated to Illinois from Shiloh some years past, and last fall came here on a visit, expecting to return; but, alas! how uncertain the future! His health failed, and sickness, disease and death found him in the land of his nativity. He was buried by the side of his wife, the mother of his three children, who had been in her grave forty-two years. His children are living in the West. He was in the 75th year of his pilgrimage. W. I have taken the following from the history of the Ayres (or Air) family found in the Newbury Library at Chicago, Ill. The first of the family was named Trulove. The first of the family was named Trulove, one of the followers of William the Conqueror, At the battle of Hastings, Duke William was flung from his horse, and his helmet was beaten into his face, which Trulove, observing, pulled off, and horsed him again. The duke told him, Thou shalt hereafter from Trulove be called Eyre (or Air), because thou hast given me the air that I breathe. After the battle, the duke, on inquiry respecting him, found him severely wounded (his leg and thigh having been cut off); he ordered him the utmost care, and on his recovery gave him lands in Derby in reward for his services, and the leg and thigh in armor, cut off for his crest; an honoratory badge yet worn by all the Eyres or (Ayres) in England"
