Mr. Armstrong travels throughout the

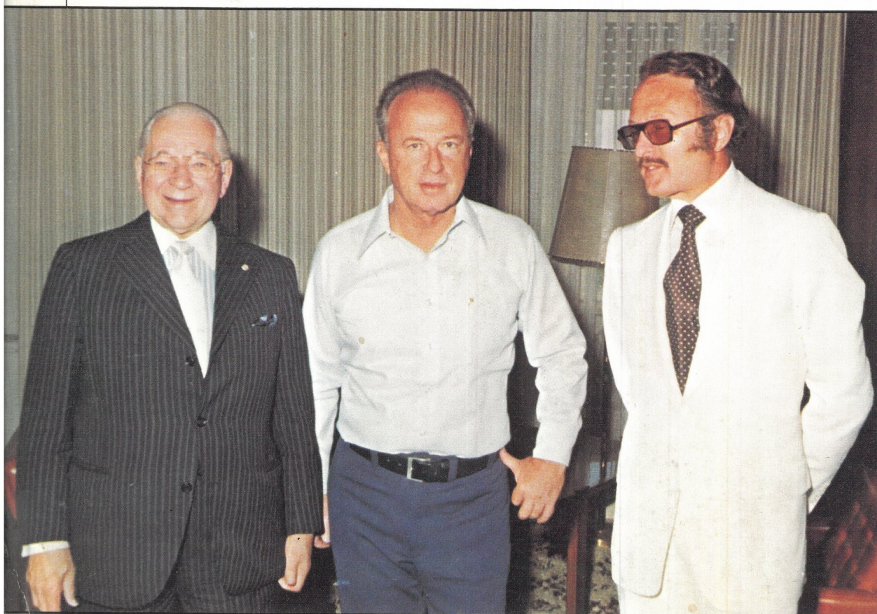
