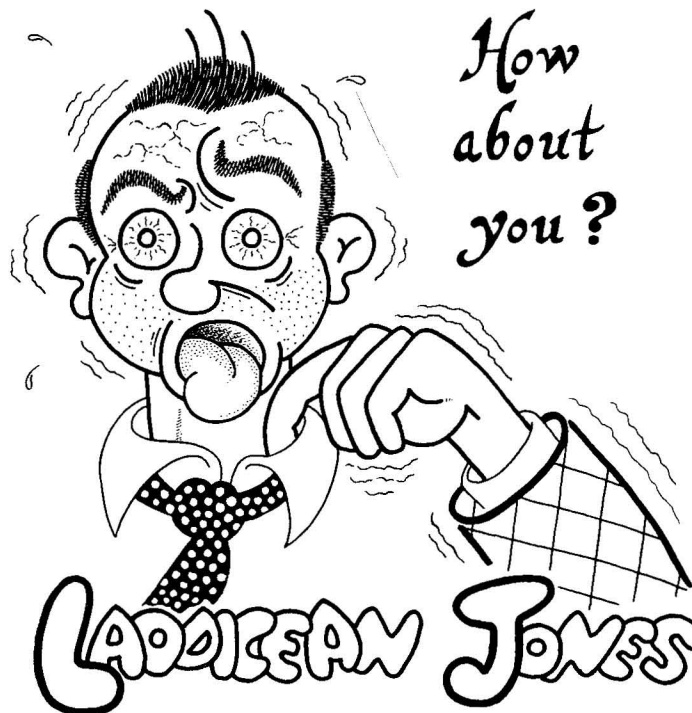
The bride was attired in a white satin

gown with Venetian lace overjacket, a white pillbox with white tulle veil, and carried a bouquet of white stephanotes, hyacinths and carnations.

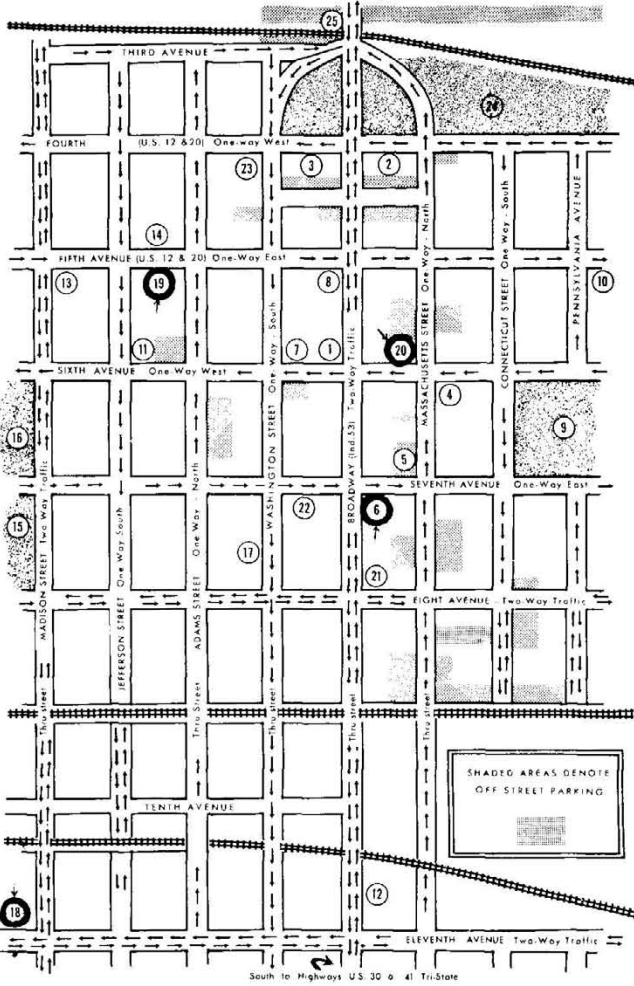

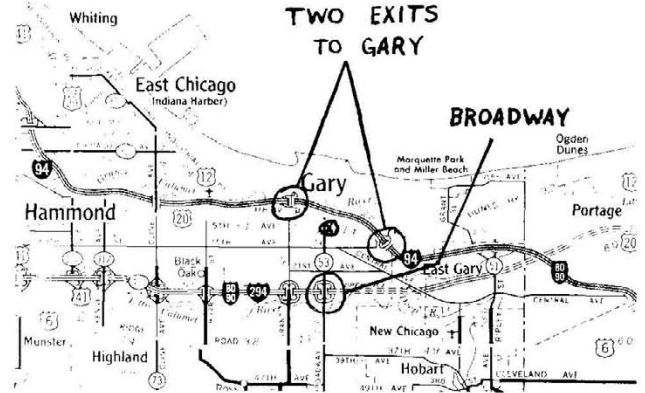

location of the Keymen's Club and routes between it and Gary. Not clearly indicated is the fact that the Calumet Expressway, Route 94, now leads directly into the Dan Ryan Expressway running North. This should then be followed until the junction with the Eisenhower Expressway heading West for the quick trip from Gary to the Keymen's Club. When leaving the Eisenhower Expressway, use the Kostner turn-off and proceed North again to Madison St. A left turn (West) will take you the one-half mile remaining to go to the 4721 W. Madison address.

The last map shows the Gary area overall and should help you to locate Route 53, Broadway. Don't forget to take this issue with you!



# All Roads Lead to the Feast!

We hope that the maps reproduced on this page will save you time and trouble. We would like to show you clearly where the meetings are to be held and the best way to get there.

In the map printed in the upper left there is shown a close-up of downtown Gary. The buildings you will need to find are numbered and circled heavily. Please note that the main artery through town is Broadway (which is also the turn-off to take from the Tri-State Tollway). The meetings will be held at the Memorial Auditorium which is number 6 on the map. The other buildings circled heavily contain cafeterias or restaurants which may be used for noon meals.
