CHARACTER BUILDING

During the past month, the Corpus Christi and San Antonio Churches have heard some very good sermons, but one stands out as being particularly needful at this time. The title of this sermon was "How to Build Charcter."

It was on the Sabbath of December 2 that Mr. Foster brought this vital subject into sharp focus. Points to remember in character building were expounded with such clarity and emphasis that we were brought to the sober realization that many of us are not building the type of character needed before we can qualify to enter into God's Kingdom.

Mr. Foster pointed out that character is the ability to: (1) Know what is right, (2) Choose what is right, (3) Do what is right. Our purpose in this life is to grow until we have the exact nature of Christ. We cannot do this by ourselves, but must have God's Spirit to overcome our human faults. It was stressed that we must be as Christ, putting the entrance into God's Kingdom first above all other things.

Mr. Foster gave us three tools Satan uses to tear down character. They are (1) Consuming all your time with worldly projects, not leaving any for prayer and study, (2) Discouragement and vanity by letting the cares of the world bog us down until we forget that Christ will take care of our physical needs and (3) Familiarity with the Scriptures leads to contempt of them. We get the feeling we know all we need to know and fail to study.

Next, he gave us five ways to build character: (1) Set your mind on the goal of becoming perfect and keep it there (Matt. 5:48), (2) Don't just read, but really study the Bible(II Tim. 2:15), (3) Meditate on God's Word (Psalm 1:1-2), (4) Pray fervently, dili-

gently, regularly and (5) Fast in order to get closer to God.

Let's watch how we spend our time and not allow the cares of this world choke off our time from Bible study, meditation, fasting and, above all, our prayers. If you think you are just too busy to pray, remember that Christ gave us the example. Even though He was the busiest man alive at that time, He took time out from preaching the Gospel to go to a private place to pray alone.

Recipe

RAW APPLE CAKE

1cup raw sugar 1/4 cup butter 3 raw apples chopped fine (with or without peeling) 11/4 cup whole wheat flour 1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon soda

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1 teaspoon nutmeg

1 large egg or two small

Chop apples, then cream butter and sugar, add egg and beat. Measure flour and add salt, soda, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Mix these dry ingredients and add gradually to liquid mixture. Add apples and mix well. Pour into tube pan that has been greased and floured. Bake at 350° for 1 hour.
