### EDITORIAL:

Have you realized as you ought the PRIME IMPORTANCE of The WORLD TOMORROW broadcast in fulfilling Christ's commission to His Church? Mr. Armstrong has admonished the ministry to listen to the broadcast even if it means stopping a visit in someone's home to do so! It is VITALLY IMPOR-TANT to all of us to know how God is warning this world, and what He is saying. The WORLD TOMORROW is HIS broadcast! It is inspired and directed by Him! New understanding and repeated principles and truths are the reward of all who faithfully listen to it. It affects their thinking, their conversation and their ability to remember principles and scriptures which are so easily forgotten. It helps us to personally fulfill Christ's command to WATCH (world events) through the eyes of God's ministry.

Some in New Zealand and other countries must stay up late and, in some cases, have their radio sets exchanged or modified, in order to hear this ONE broadcast of its kind on earth! They recognize their NEED for the broadcast and are willing to make a DETERMINED EFFORT to hear it! Yet, the Bible clearly states that God opens doors that man cannot shut and shuts doors that no man can open! This verse shows that God must open the door, or WAY, of carrying out His commission to preach and publish His Gospel to all

nations.

The "Door" is being relentlessly, persistently knocked on in New Zealand and other areas, but until God opens those doors, many people will hear The WORLD TOMORROW broadcast only in the middle of the night, until better times are opened on stations available to them either inside or outside their country. This is God's decision! Some few in New Zealand are exercising the management and fortitude necessary to hear the broadcast. They realise that staying up (or getting up) to hear the 30 minute broadcast is only a small part, when compared with all the effort and expense invested in bringing the Gospel to them. One man in New Zealand hears the broadcast clearly from Australia after midnight on a common battery transistor! SUPER-NATURAL effort on God's partis what makes it possible to hear the programme anywhere at all, anytime, day or night. Christ said to His disciples just before His crucifixion, "... What, could ye not watch (keep awake and vigilant) with me one hour"? Can you set an alarm, whether you live in Australia or New Zealand -- or anywhere the broadcast can be received -- and stay awake only ONE HALF-HOUR to hear this vital, God-inspired broadcast? Can you investigate into methods of receiving the broadcast in your area? Is the TRUTH more important to you than anything else? A FAMINE OF THE HEARING OF THE WORD is coming! Before you allow yourself to forget what you have just read, or before you come to any final conclusions, ask yourself whether or not you would expect Jesus Christ to accept your efforts to hear the broadcast. Would HE accept the kind of zeal you put into carefully listening to, retaining and applying all you receive on the broadcast? If you have reasons or excuses as to why you don't hear it, ask yourself if you would expect Jesus Christ to accept those reasons or excuses! It is He whom we serve! If you cannot receive the broadcast on your radio, write immediately for a free article explaining steps you can take to enable you to receive it.

# Tasmanian Baptizing Tour Report

Following is a report from the Melbourne pastor, Mr. William D. Winner, on the FIRST known baptising tour by one of God's ministers to Australia's only island State, Tasmania. It serves

to remind us of our <u>need</u> to PRAY for one another, especially for those who are scattered and do not have the blessing of being able to attend regular Church services.

"God now has a handful of His own people in Tasmania. The addition of six people to the Body of Christ was made possible by a recent tour of the island by my wife and me.

"Leaving the evening of March 9, we boarded the Princess of Tasmania bound for Devonport. After a very rough night crossing Bass Strait we were indeed happy to set our feet on stable land once again.

"Our first meeting was held the same morning and our first baptisms resulted. Two out of the four people who we met were baptised, getting us off to a fine start -- 50% of those met baptised. The days that followed whittled down this percentage and the tour terminated on March 18 with a low 33-1/3%. Only six out of the eighteen counselled



Meet Mr. Eric Berry, of Ulverston for baptism were ready. Three did not meet us and one person met for general counselling.



On the most solemn assembly of the year -- the Passover -- a total of 179 persons gathered to partake of the symbols representing the blood and body of our Lord. This represents an increase of 29% over last year, which is quite good when it is considered that a number of brethren from Brisbane were then in attendance.

The "night much to be observed" was an occasion for much HAPPINESS and REJOICING, when 312 of God's called and chosen people -- and their families -- gathered in the Lane Cove Municipal Continued on Page 5

# Melbourne Spokesman Combined Meeting

Coppin Hall was the scene for another first—the combined meeting of the Melbourne Spokesman Clubs A and B on Sunday afternoon, March 29. Many of the brethren representing FOUR states of the Commonwealth were able to gather and witness this truly historic occasion during the Days of Unleavened Bread.

The growth, not only in number, but also in personality and enthusiasm, was in contrast to the "24 pairs of knocking knees" which had assembled exactly twenty-one months earlier for the first Melbourne Spokesman Club meeting. In fact, from the moment the Director, Mr. William D. Winner, welcomed the guests and opened the meeting, till his final over-all evaluation, the afternoon sparkled with life, vigour and earnest participation.

The Business Session saw eager discussion of such items as a forthcoming formal dance or ball, and copies of club photographs for Mr. Tony Hammer. It was followed by a lively and stimulating Tabletopics Session, in which twenty-two Spokesman expressed their spontaneous answers to a number of thought-provoking questions.

Mr. George Thomson, who served as Topicsmaster, achieved the honoured standard of excellent, as did the Toastmaster, Mr. Stan Chivers.

The second half of the program featured six <u>colourful</u>, <u>fact-filled</u> speeches, ranging from the evils and abominations of Australian society, to the gore of the first brain operation and the quaint customs of Japan. The award for the Most Improved Speaker went to Mr. Gordon Ames, who spoke on the career of Sir Winston Churchill, and for the Most Effective Speaker to Mr. Robert Lumsden, who exposed the <u>weakness</u> of the Australian defence forces. The Most Helpful Evaluation was given by Mr. Keith Crouch.

The last Holy Daywas observed in the Anzac House Auditorium). This figure represents an increase of 42½% over last year! On the first Holy Day, however, all records were broken when 318 gathered to hear Mr. Cole expound God's Great Plan and Purpose for mankind, a plan which thrills as ONLY the TRUTH can!

The Sydney congregation had an additional blessing this year, in having present three of their brethren from New Zealand! The brethrenwere reminded of the NEED to OVERCOME in order to enter the Kingdom of God. Other sermons and sermonettes carried this same theme, impressing upon the members the urgent NEED to RECOGNIZE SIN as the ENEMY it is, urging them to MAKE WAR upon it according to the instructions contained in God's Word.

Mr. Cole said that this was the most exhortative Festival of Unleavened Bread he can recall. ### USED CLOTHING FUND!

Following the recent article on <u>used</u> clothing which appeared in the March issue of The GOOD NEWS magazine, we have received a number of enquiries from members who are desirous of <u>contributing</u> to the fund.

Rather than write every one personally, we have decided to answer the questions raised by means of this article in the Church of God News.

In the first instance, when donating clothing to the Used Clothing Fund, it would be greatly appreciated if you observed the following:

- (1) Only donate clothing which is in reasonable condition -- still "wearable." It is useless sending garments which are suitable for use only as cleaning rags, as this necessitates considerable work on the part of the assistants in sorting out and disposing of them.
- (2) Wherever possible, clothes should be <u>laundered</u> or <u>dry-cleaned</u>, and <u>neatly pressed before</u> they are forwarded to us. Make sure they are properly packed for consignment, otherwise they may still arrive in a <u>rumpled</u> condition, despite the trouble you went to in preparing them.
- (3) Any necessary mending should be attended to by the donor, wherever possible. If it is impossible for you to mend the clothing yourself, a list showing which items require attention will be a big help.
- (4) Packages should be addressed: "CLOTHING FUND," P.O. Box 345, North Sydney, New South Wales. Do NOT send your used clothing to Pasadena, as it will be distributed from North Sydney.
- (5) A card or note stitched (NOT pinned) to the garment and giving its measurements will be a big help to those making a selection. IF you are sending CHILDREN'S wear, the card should also indicate the approximate age and height of a child for whom the garment would be suitable.
- (6) SHOES are in continuous demand, but should NOT be donated if they are in a warped and stiff condition. Previously, some shoes have been donated

which would have been almost impossible to wear, because hardening of the leather -- through <u>age</u> and <u>lack</u> of <u>use</u> -- had warped and twisted them beyond repair.

Finally, a Used Clothing display will be arranged during the Festival of Tabernacles. If YOU have NEED, please feel free to avail yourself of the clothing FREELY offered! ## Melbourne Clubs Visit Ford Plant

Spokesmen from both Melbourne clubs spent an interesting evening on April 9, when they visited the Broadmeadows plant of the Ford Motor Company. This factory produces complete Falcons and Cortinas, including commercial bodies and utilities. The Geelong plant supplies Broadmeadows with pressed sheet steel body parts and complete motors. The bodies are built up by spot welding as the parts pass a complex of forms, clamps, and flexible electric welders.

A remarkable feature of the factory is the selectivity system, which looks more like a miniature railway marshalling yard than anything else. By a system of rollers, overhead hooks and moving belts, a partly-completed vehicle may be taken out of the assembly line and removed or replaced on the line in a different position.

There were many notices about the plant reminding the workers that "Quality is your business," or asking, "Did you produce a quality product today?" and so on. These are apparently the management's counter to the 'goof-off'

After a very enlightening two hours under the guidance of A-Club's Mr. Charles D. Gover, an employee at the plant, the thirteen spokesmen were pleasantly surprised to find a handsome supper prepared for them by Mrs. Gover. This provided those concerned with an enjoyable climax to an extra evening of fellowship.


