## Philippines Leaders Meet

As recommended and instructed by higher authorities in God's Church, a conference -- the first to be held in the history of the Church of God in the Philippines and conducted for the <u>first time</u> by a <u>Filipino leader</u> -- was held at Manila from January 31 to February 7.

When the "go" signal was received from God's Headquarters, it was a very short time before things moved quickly. Swift communication and transportation were used to bring the leaders from the Island of Mindanao to Manila. All things were done smoothly and the event was a tremendous success with all enjoying a happy and a profitable time.

Five of the outstanding leaders in



God's Church in the Philippines conferred in a hotel room with the writer. The whole office staff in Manila also attended, alternately. News of God's Church and Work around the world was related, together with lectures on Church government, discipline and policy. There was also discussion of detailed questions on Bible doctrines including the 100 year period following

Following are a number of questions concerning the Passover and the Festival of Unleavened Bread, taken from The Bible Story, Vol. II, pp. 59-62, by Mr. Basil Wolverton.

See how many of the questions you can answer. If there are any that you can't, then get your Bible Story book right away and look them up!

- 1. What is the name God gave to the month in which the Passover is commemorated?
- 2. On which day of the month were the Israelites commanded to select a lamb from their flocks for the sacri-Page 4

fice?

- 3. What was the lamb a type of?
- 4. Was the lamb to be without blemish -- a perfectly healthy lamb? Why?
- 5. On which <u>day</u> and at what <u>time</u> was the Passover lamb to be <u>sacrificed?</u>
- 6. What were the Israelites commanded to do with the blood of the lamb? Why?
- 7. Is the Passovera memorial, to be observed for EVER?
- 8. How OFTEN should we observe the Passover? On a <u>definite</u> <u>date</u> <u>once</u> <u>a year</u>, or once a month?
- 9. Was Jesus Christ -- the Lamb of God -- slain on the same day and month hundreds of years after the first Passover lambs were slain?
- 10. Were the Israelites commanded to put all <u>leaven</u> out of their homes during the <u>daylight</u> portion of Abib 14? Are <u>we</u> commanded to do likewise today?
