

Dr. Hoeh Visits Palestine!

Dr. Herman L. Hoeh, Dean of Instruction at Ambassador College in Pasadena, California, has been attending an eight-week summer session at the foreign branch of the Hebrew Union College in Jerusalem. Included in his studies was to be a two-week on-site archaeological expedition at the site of the ancient city of Ashdod.

Dr. Hoeh's trip to Europe and the Middle East commenced the middle of June. Writing up to the last minute, he barely completed his 275 page thesis (Volume II of the Compendium on history) in time to pack and catch his 10 P.M. transatlantic BOAC flight.

First stop was the sister college in Bricket Wood where, on June 28, he was presented with Ambassador's first Doctor of Philosophy degree. After commencement, and also a short visit to the German office in Düsseldorf, Dr. Hoeh headed for Jerusalem and the main purpose of his trip.

Dr. Hoeh plans to return to Pasadena around September 1. Let us all remember him in our prayers, brethren, and ask the Almighty to bless the fruits of his labour that he can come back with a good amount of knowledge and experience that can benefit the Church of God.

MINISTERS VISIT——from Page 1 verse with natives on a grass-roots level in personal interviews and to investigate world conditions firsthand. The material thus obtained will be used in future PLAIN TRUTH articles and college classes.

In a rather comprehensive report to the Sydney Church, Mr. Meredith gave a progressive account of the revealing trip. In visiting 17 countries, Mr. Meredith said they were continually impressed with the OVERWHELMING NEED FOR GOD'S KINGDOM TO BE ESTABLISHED.

After making stops at Copenhagen, Denmark -- Zurich, Switzerland -- Athens, Greece and visits to the ancient cities of Ephesus and Corinth -- and Istanbul, Turkey, Mr. Meredith and Mr. Hill spent a full month in the always-seething Middle East. They made visits to Egypt, Petra and Jordan, into both Arab and Jewish sectors of Jerusalem and then to Tel Aviv. A refreshing spot in the tour was a reunion at Tel Aviv with Dr. Herman Hoeh who was with an archeological team excavating the ruins of Ashdod.

They were to return to Pasadena a few days later with their heads and note books filled with much personal information and inside knowledge of world affairs, equipped to more forcefully and authoratatively preach sermons and write articles in spreading the significant, prophetic news of the end-times and the Gospel of God's Kingdom to this frustrated and strife-filled world.
