Sermons-

During 19 sermons and 16 sermonettes, messages of hope, exhortation and inspiration were powerfully con-

veyed to an eager audience. These messages enabled us to hear more of God's righteousness and learn more of His great glory and holiness.

At the beginning of the Festival we heard Mr. Cole say, "On the behalf of Jesus Christ and the Father I say welcome to this Feast of Tabernalces." From that moment, encouraging and inspiring subjects were to include: Becoming different . . . Trials, and understanding their good purpose...The Philippines and our being concerned and interested in God's Work around the world... Why we assemble to observe the Feast of Tabernacles . . . God's government in action at the feast ... Basic doctrines of Hebrews 6 enable us to answer what the basic doctrines and beliefs are in God's Church... If we are truly in the body, in Christ, in the Rock --we shall be in the physical rock (Petra) of safety soon...Successful and happy husbands and wives...Child training...Some lukewarm, placid, indifferent, lax and lazy Christians may soon be sent into outer space and down to the depths of the sea in "guinea pig" experiments... The great age of abundant living to come under the rule of Christ...Blessing of children...What happens to the unconverted who die --Great White Throne Judgment -- all the dead resurrected.

Speakers elaborated on the subjects of CHANGE, doing, bearing fruit, and not just drifting and hoping "somehow" to be in God's Kingdom by care LESS and DE-CEITFUL living. It was pointed out that we are to live lives of CONTROL, careful PLANNING, ORGANIZATION, SYSTEM and ORDER -- having a GOAL and KNOWING the WAY to achieve it through determined effort and very real LABOUR in the short time left!

God Almighty provided that which was necessary for each in attendance to be so helped and encouraged by the messages and fellowship, that each should have been able to return home more determined than ever to labour at overcoming the carnal mind, and at being a more faithful servant of the Ever-living God.

Social Activities——

"Around the world in less than two hours" was the theme of the first social event for the 1963 Feast of Tabernacles, when all present were taken by way of coloured slides to many areas of great interest to God's people. Colourful narration by Messers. C. W. Cole, T. Higgins, G. Hughes and D. Faulkner stimulated greater excitement in the "journey," during which the audience was inspired to see such places as the



Blessing of Children

On the Last Great Day the annual ceremony of blessing the little children took

place. This custom, ordained by Jesus Christ, is one of the most inspiring events to be held during the Feast of Tabernacles. We find examples of this in Matt. 19:13; Mark 10:13 and Luke 18:

The Church of God following the example Jesus set has made it an annual custom to bless the little infants and young children on the Last Great Day at the Feast of Tabernacles. This is the time when most of the members from outlying areas are congregated together. This year FIFTY-SEVEN children, a tenth or tithe of the total attendance of FIVE HUNDREDSEVENTY, were taken up into the arms of the ministers and those assisting them and blessed by their Creator through the laying on of hands of His servants.

Baptisms -

"Undoubtedly this has been the <u>largest</u> group ever baptized at one time here in Australia; in fact, in the whole of the southern hemisphere!" This bold statement accurately describes the tremendous growth God has given to His Church in this part of the world.

One of the highlights of every Feast of Tabernacles is the addition of new brethren to the body of Christ by the baptism of the Holy Spirit (I Cor. 12: 13). Especially was this true at this year's Festivalas God's Churchtook a fantastic numerical increase of FORTY-EIGHT, over eight percent of the total attendance at Blackheath!

With additional ministerial duties this year -- sermon preparation, counsellings, anointings etc., Messers. Cole and Winner turned the individual baptismal counselling over to Messers. Huse, Simpkins and Abraham. Then, prior to the actual baptismal service Mr. Winner spoke to the entire group, emphasising the seriousness and gravity of their individual decisions to "bury themselves with Christ in baptism."

A small caravan of buses and private cars transported the group to the Parklands Hotel where their large, outdoor swimming pool had been reserved as in previous years. Many of the brethren lined both sides of the pool in order to witness this unusually large baptismal service. Messers. Huse and Abraham each doned a pair of chest-high fishing waders to do the baptising, which they did from the two opposite corners of the pool's shallow end. The "laying on of hands" service was conducted later back at the Community Centre.

Echoing Mr. Cole's words which he spoke at the completion of the "laying on of hands" service, "WELCOME INTO GOD'S CHURCH, BRETHREN!"
