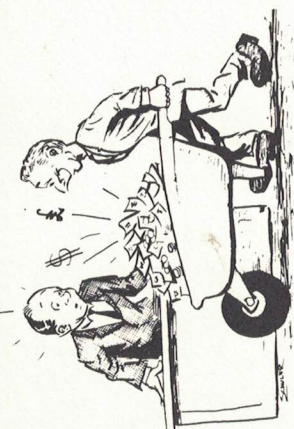

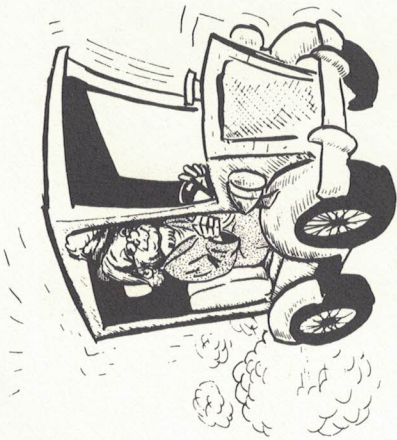
ENJOYING THE FEAST . . .

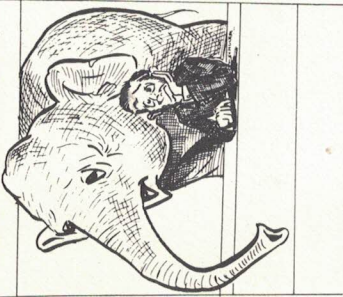
When parking at the Tabernacle you may use the upper or lower car park. Please park in an orderly fashion and show consideration for others. THIS WILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY as there will be no parking attendants present.

FIRST AID

SIMPLE First-Aid will be provided at the Tabernacle. The First-Aid room is located near the side entrance to the hall. A nurse will be in attendance thirty minutes before and after services and other times as emergencies arise. This service DOES NOT include treatment of serious or chronic injuries or illnesses.

The Lost and Found Counter, located in the business office, will be open daily during normal business hours. Be sure to check with Lost and Found for ALL misplaced items.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Please remove all *personal belongings* from seats after services. All items left on chairs will be gathered up and turned into Lost and Found. By removing your belongings after services you will help the seating attendants to quickly discharge their duties.

SONG BOOKS

Please take good care of the song books. DO NOT ALLOW your children to abuse them! Neither should you use them as a backing for taking notes. These books are to be used at Church Services and they SHOULD NOT BE REMOVED from the auditorium. At the close of the services please pass the song books to the aisles where the attendants will collect them.

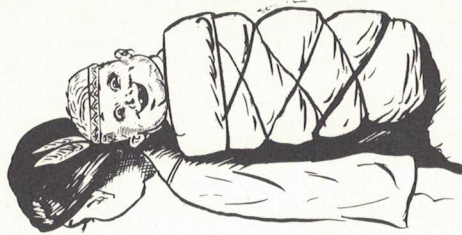


SMALL CHILDREN

Parents are responsible AT ALL TIMES for the whereabouts and conduct of their children and **PARTICULARLY DURING SERVICES!** Small children *must* be accompanied by a responsible person to and from toilets.

Children are a heritage from God and a serious responsibility. You **MUST NOT ALLOW** your children to wander around the Tabernacle property or **OFF** the grounds unattended.

A Mother's Room is provided for the convenience of those with very small babies. This room may be occupied during services but do not allow your children to disturb others. The room is within the small hall area and can be entered through the door next to the Counseling desk.

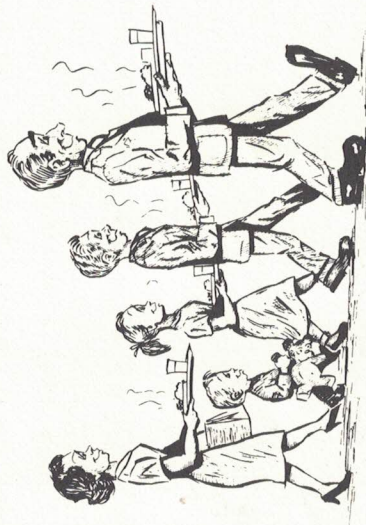

PLACES TO SEE

The entire Blue Mountains area abounds with sites of historical interest and scenic attractions. From the Tabernacle property there is a spectacular view of the Kanimbria Valley. A short journey from the Tabernacle will bring you to numerous look-out points and facilities for enjoying the rugged splendour of the Blue Mountains. Listed below are some of the main attractions:

- JENOLAN CAVES
- ECHO POINT AND THREE SISTERS
- SKYWAY AND SCENIC RAILWAY
- EVERGLADES GARDENS (LEURA)
- GOVETTS LEAP AND BRIDAL VEIL FALLS
- ZIG ZAG RAILWAY. (Recently restored and hailed as one of the world's great engineering feats.)

Those who would like to enjoy the beautiful surroundings should be sure to join the organised bushwalk. (See the programme for times.)

EVANS LOOKOUT — GRAND CANYON — NEATES GLEN
Three to three and a half hours.

You will not walk through a mini version of the American scenic wonder but through a magnificent geological feature in its own right, quite different from its American namesake. From Evans Lookout, the track drops swiftly some 200 m to Greaves Creek. You then follow the creek through the Canyon. The Canyon walls rise straight above, at times seemingly so close together that you might touch both walls with outstretched arms. Shaded and damp, the creek is lined by mosses, ferns and other moisture-loving plants.

The climb out of the Canyon is steep, ascending some 150 m to Evans Lookout Road, to a point a little over 1 km from Evans Lookout.

The billy will be boiled somewhere suitable along the creek.
