



A Supposedly Minor Offense

Even as slaves, the Hebrews had been accustomed to gourmet delights in Egypt, and their clothing was probably much nicer than what they were wearing on this desert trip. The hot, tiresome journey set the people to complaining and looking back. They did not have enough vision to realize that God was going to supply their needs. In spite of their covetousness of the old ways, God provided manna for their hunger, and kept their clothes and shoes from wearing out for forty years! (Deuteronomy 29:5). It was to these people, who had just left the richest country in their time, that God spoke the words, "Thou shalt have no other Gods before me."

The Israelites had been putting fleshly wants and desires before their desire to please God, and in so doing they were breaking at least two commandments—the first and the last. Not only were they coveting things that were impossible for them to have at the moment, but in so doing they were putting those wants before God. The desire for these pleasures was causing them to grumble

against God and against Moses, their God-chosen leader.

"For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world" (1 John 2: 16). Perhaps we are lucky since we have Christ's own thoughts on the lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, and the pride of life. And yet I believe this is one

area in which Christians fall down. Sometimes we find ourselves just as occupied in "keeping up with the Joneses" as the rest of the world. Christ explains in Matthew 6: 24-34 that we should not be so concerned about clothing, food, furnishings, etc., that we cannot put God's interests first. ("For after all these things do the Gentiles seek.")

Unless we examine ourselves closely, this supposedly minor offense may be all that is needed to keep us from entering God's Kingdom, For instance, if we get to the place that our pleasures take preference to tithe-paying. what do you think will happen? Would this not be putting something before God? Consider 1 John 2:15—"Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him." If we are so busy buying the latest clothes, the fastest cars, and the most expensive furniture (when we could get by on less and still be neat and attractive), per-

ousness, although seemingly haps our pocketbooks will be empty when offering time comes at church—or when we see someone in need.

Christ explains in the Sermon on the Mount that our treasures here on earth are but for a moment—they pass away, and we are left with nothing but our love for God and others. What will we feel like when we face God at judgment time, stripped of our earthly treasures?

One of the biggest pitfalls to modern man is the credit card. Although they may be fine for emergencies, if one is not careful he can become hopelessly in debt because of them. Credit cards make it so convenient for a youth beginning life on his own to get everything he wants and needs from the very start, instead of working, saving, and waiting for his new furniture, T.V., stereo, and other pleasurable items. Soon he may have to borrow to pay off these bills ... and then borrow to pay off the loan, and he goes farther and farther into debt—unless he is very careful at the beginning to charge only what is absolutely necessary! Romans 13:8 warns us to "owe no man anvthing, but to love one another." Although we may have to borrow for certain large items (such as cars), it looks as if we ought to borrow as little as possible, even if we must do without at times. Love is the only thing we should owe to others.

Paul over and over exhorts us to be content with what we have (or possibly we could insert-with what we can afford. without owing others and without taking from God). See Hebrews 13:5; Philippians 4:11, 12; I Timothy 6:8. He also explains we should not be conformed to this world (Romans 12:2). In other words, we may be somewhat different, as horrible as it may sound. We need to be content with the necessities and pleasures we can afford-in moderation. We are to live soberly and modestly, so as not to attract undue attention (see Titus 2:6, 12; 1 Tim. 2:9; I Peter 3:3). The Pharisees were condemned for placing importance on clothing (Mark 12:38).

Christ gave up certain things for us. (He did not even have a place of His own to sleep—Matthew 8:20), so why can't we sacrifice certain things in order to give more to His work? According to the signs of the times, it will be very soon that He will reappear. We need to sacrifice even more of our time and money now to see more saved, if we love our fellowman. We must deny ourselves and follow Christ (Matthew 16:24-26).

To you young people who have not yet left home, or who are only beginning a life of your own, consider these things, carefully reviewing the Sermon on the Mount. Let God guide you, so you will not fall into Satan's trap. Remember, lust of the flesh, lust of the eyes, and covet-

harmless, sever you from God just as surely as Sabbath breaking, killing, or any other commandment breaking.


"Rejoice, O young man, in thy youth; and let thy heart cheer thee in the days of thy youth, and walk in the ways of thine heart, and in the sight of thine eyes: but know thou that for all these things God will bring thee into judgment. Therefore remove sorrow from thy heart, and put away evil from thy flesh: for childhood and youth are vanity" (Ecclesiastes 11:9, 10).

driver. Careful examination of the unconscious boy, X-rays and surgery, revealed that the injuries were extensive
but survival was assured.

Why should there be the pain, the days in bed, and the months on crutches, we cry out?

I chatted with a teacher friend. We discussed an illness which had drastically changed my life, including plans I had to complete certain college courses so that I might be better prepared to help the children I often work with. I turned the conversation from myself to my friend. Her face saddened as she related that a son had become involved in a crime that might well mean a prison sentence.

God knows the answers we do not know.
Sometimes trials reveal more of God's will to us; sometimes a refining of our nature takes place to make us pure for His kingdom. "But He knoweth the way that I take: when He hath tried me, I shall come forth as gold" (Job 23:10).
This young man testifies that he has had to ask God for courage. With faith in God, the future can be assured and blessed of God. A new life is being built: may

of that life!

Alcohol and drug addiction had caused the young man's problem. I told my friend I would pray for her and her boy. She grasped at the promise and pleaded for my prayers. God can send His Spirit to lead and intervene. A new life can be built.

. "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God" (Luke 18:27).

Over and over the stories of shattered dreams as fragmented as burst balloons can be related. Youth are graduating from high schools and colleges and the jobs that were hoped for are sometimes impossible to secure. New plans have to be laid and followed through. Men with college degrees are pumping gas or doing other jobs they were not trained to do, thankful for a chance to even have a job and not becoming cynical and faithless as though God had failed. After all, manual labor is not degrading! Prayerful reconsideration of plans may reveal God has another way of life for the disappointed one; step by step God will guide if we let His will become our will. At the right time He will provide the desired goal. "Ask and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you" (Matt. 7:7).

Whatever your disappointment, look to God through prayer and to His promises in the Scriptures. Remember "... that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed..." (Romans 8:18). We are told to forget "... those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before... press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3: 13, 14). The prize is Life Eternal where there will be no more burst balloons.

LITTLENESS OF BIG MEN

Great men never feel great, and small men never recognize their smallness. That is one reason for the greatness and success of the former and the insignificance and failure of the latter.

Emerson spoke of the "greatness of humility," and Moody preached, "Be humble or you'll stumble." It is true that the man who is so proud that he turns up his nose at his fellows usually bangs his toe on a boulder and is brought low, to be lifted up and dusted off by those whom he regards with contempt.

Spurgeon said that "humility is to make a right estimate of one's self."



People, Problems, and Pollution

Planet earth has a problem—a very bad problem. This difficulty has to do with her air, her water, and her land. You see, earth's air and water and soil are becoming very crowded, very noisy, and very dirty. And that's no joke. It's a life and death matter for the human race since we depend upon clean

air and water and soil for our very existence.

Pollution! Today, it's everywhere! And it's killing us! The best-informed scientists tell us that something must be done to reverse the trend of pollution on our planet during the 1970's OR we may face the extermination of normal life from the face of the earth! Doesn't that sound more than vaguely like these Bible predictions:

"And the land is defiled: therefore I do visit the iniquity thereof upon it, and the land itself vomiteth out her inhabitants" (Leviticus 18:25).

"The earth also is defiled under the inhabitants thereof" Isaiah 24:5).

When God created the heavens and the earth, He made all things "very good." In the original order of the earth and nature, God installed a wonderful balance and harmony among all His creation. As long as this pattern was not seriously interrupted by outside forces, "nature" kept this planet in beautiful condition: pure, uncorrupted, and relatively quiet.

But God also created man, and gave him something that no other creature possessed. This unique possession is the privilege of making up his own mind, and doing "his own thing." In exercising this privilege, far too many men choose to behave in a way that was contrary to the revealed will of the Creator. This rebellion against God is called "sin." And sin is the reason why there is pollution in the earth today.

Let me explain.

Nearly every sin can be boiled down to a basic selfishness which exists in people. It is a greedy willingness to do what we want to do, regardless of what God says about it. This kind of a "live it up—pay later" attitude will inevitably bring disaster, both in the physical and spiritual realms.

In his efforts to "get all you can," and "can all you get," mankind has had little or no regard for the total effect of such greed upon the environment and the generations to come. Thus, it was not until the mid-1960's—just a few short years ago—that man began to think seriously about what his "prosperity" and greed were doing to planet earth. It wasn't until nearly 1970 that "ecology" became a household word; and now, it may be too late!

Actually then, planet earth's problem is not so much dirty water and soil and air. Planet earth's major problem is people—selfish and sinful people. For wherever there are people, you will be sure to find problems—and pollution!

Things are bad. The air we breathe is smog-filled. The water we drink is either polluted or heavily treated with chemicals. The soil from which our food comes is often bleached of nutritional values or laden with unhealthy chemicals and foreign substances. There is precious little pure air or water—or anything—left. The landscape is littered. Garbage piles increase. Things are bad, and getting worse. . . .

What can you do?

- 1. MAKE UP YOUR MIND THAT YOU WILL NOT LITTER OR POLLUTE. You can hardly quit driving your car or burning the trash, but you can determine not to toss cans and wrappers along the roadside or in the park. Certainly a Christian should be the best example in this matter—don't be a litter-bug.
- 2. QUIT SMOKING. The greatest single source of air pollution in many people's lungs is cigarette smoke. If you want to breathe cleaner air (and live longer), never smoke!
- 3. BE INFORMED. Keep abreast of the efforts to restore and retain natural purity in your community. BE CONCERNED. Cooperate with these

efforts wherever possible. Do what you can with this problem of pollution. You cannot do it all, but you can and you should do more than your share.

4. PRAY for those who are in authority, dealing with the pollution problem. Read I Timothy 2:2. A quiet and peaceable life partly depends on the fight against pollution.

5. SEE THAT YOUR OWN HEART AND LIFE IS FREE FROM THE POLLUTION OF SIN. Revelation 1:5 tells that Jesus washed us from our sins in His own blood. I Timothy 5: 22 commands us to keep ourselves pure. In this pollution problem, we are either part of the problem...or part of the answer. Which is it with you?

Young people have their own definition of what it means to

be a "big man." In cities throughout the country young people are involved in gangs, cliques, and clubs which require a person desiring membership to prove he is a "big man." This may be accomplished in various ways, such as sex, theft, drugs or possibly even killing. If the young person "proves" himself by "passing the test," he then becomes a recognized member. He has presumably attained the status of a "big man." What has he measured up to? What did he prove? He was measured according to the standards of a select group. This does not necessarily prove how "big" he is.

Just like the superstar is ad-

mired by his fans, the young person who accomplishes these daring acts is admired by his comrades. This is why the young person feels it is important that he do something impressive and sensational.

Is a man measured by the sensational feats he performs? The methods of measuring the greatness of a man differ according to various ideals. But God's ideals remain constant. The amount of physical power a man possesses or the immoral acts in which he indulges do not make him "big" either in the sight of God or the majority of men!

A really "big" man is one who has Christ dwelling in his heart! He truly has something "big" in his life! Therefore a Christian man, whether of large or small physical stature, can truly be a "big man." He has access to a Power beyond human comprehension—the power of God conveyed through Christ. The man who has not invited Christ into his life has no power to do anything to change prevailing circumstances. He is doomed to accept his "fate."

The man who accepts the power of Christ in his life is enabled to say "NO." ... NO to alcoholic beverages, drugs, cigarettes and immoral acts. Along with the power to say "no" the Christian has power over sin. And the reward of overcoming sin is the promise of a future eternal life in God's Kingdom. Every person who has ever lived or ever will live has the same opportunity to claim God's wonderful promise of eternal life.

The promise of eternal life certainly is a big promise! It is a promise made by God for all those who are "big men" according to His standards.

Nevertheless, it must be made clear that Christians are not necessarily "big men" according to the measurements of the world. Christians may not be "big" in the eyes of professional sportsmen, gangs in the cities, or even businessmen. But after all, which measurements are MOST important—those of man or those of God?

KEEP FACING IT!

A tramp, when asked about his philosophy of life, replied, "I turn my back to the wind." That probably is why he was a tramp. Following the line of least resistance is what makes rivers and many men crooked. A man cannot drift to success.

In contrast to this philosophy is the statement which Captain MacWhite spoke to his mate in Joseph Conrad's immortal tale of the sea, *Typhoon*. In the midst of a great storm, MacWhite said: "Keep facing it! They may say what they like—the heaviest seas run with the wind. Always facing it! That's the way to get through!"

It is better to be shunned by the worldly, wicked and proud because you live for God than be applauded because you are one of them.

Oh, they try every con game in the books, from commiseration, to a declaration of complete love. Even force, until you pull your shank, and show no shame or fear. Who thought I'd ever attend school on time and never miss a single day?

I was one of the lucky youths ... they put me in education. First it was just a mass confusion and hard struggle. Then a few rays of light dawning in what had been utter darkness. Nothing comes easy if it's worthwhile. Huh? Two years before I'd have died rather than admit even that much.

Just a few more months, then graduation from high school. Mom sure will be proud. I'd give anything to recall her tears and heartaches spent on my selfish youth.

Yes, I've been lucky. Another dawn and another administra-

tion has replaced most of the corrupt prison pitfalls. Even to-day, when a youth finds companionship from one just a little older, one who will guide him from the cesspools of prison's mistakes, the older con and even a few of the unfeeling hacks accuse them of "running together."

The education Dale Carnegie and other worthwhile endeavors offer to us young men, make it possible for us to help others, and to accept our own responsibilities

Rehabilitation? At one time I thought it was just a catchy word for spelling bees. Now I know its real worth, and hope to improve as the years pass... and to help others... so that we, the youth of the prison, might hold our own heads high and challenge the future.

Yes, from utter selfishness to a longing to help others. From bleak darkness to sunshine and hope. Hope for the future. Hope, not only for myself, but for the few that call me their friend.

I'm grateful, still young, and in a better position to understand myself and others. Perhaps, someday, I can help someone to capitalize on their age and avoid, not youth...but its follies!

Tell Me, Please

QUESTION

QUESTION

What does it mean to be "translated" as Enoch or Elijah were?

ANSWER

Let's start with John 3:13! John said, "And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven."

This makes it necessary for us to conclude that they were not translated (transported or transferred) to God's abode; to the heaven of His throne.

Now! Hebrews 9:27 says, "... it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment."

Then Hebrews 11:5 includes

Enoch with a list of the faithful—verses 4-12—and verse 13, inspired by God's Spirit, says, "These all died in the faith, not having received the promises."

This makes it necessary for us to conclude that the ascension of Elijah to heaven was a transfer through the heaven (atmosphere) to another place and that he died! Also it shows that Enoch's translation (that he should not see death) was a temporary one. It may well have been that unrighteous men sought his life.

Who's Charting Your Course, Mate?

(RALLY OF THE MONTH)

SETTING

The stage setting is quite impressionable. The stage is set nicely with a cardboard boat 3 to 4 feet high. A bulletin board in the background displays the theme over a sea and sky setting. A sail, easily made from a sheet, may be hung on a mast. Ropes draped from the top of the mast to the bottom of the boat and colored nets flung over the side will add originality to the setting. Waves drawn with colored chalk or painted on a foot-wide roll of white paper covering the lower portion of the boat give the effect of the ship's actually sailing on the sea.

The narrator stands offstage (unseen). Announcement of numbers is unnecessary because all participants are informed ahead of time as to when their part will be.

SCENE I (Curtain opens)

(Crew working on ship...ropes slung over shoulders...anchors placed... Sailors are hastily buying tickets to come aboard. Some sailors try all kinds of methods to board the special ship.)

"Stand by to weigh anchor"

"Belay!"

"Hold Fast!"

"Aye, sir!"

Ticket Master: (Yelling) "Behold! Now is the accepted time. Behold!

Now is the day of salvation!"

1st Sailor:

(Sailor rushes in to buy ticket...) "I'd like a one-way

ticket to Paradise Island, please."

Ticket Master: "There are certain requirements one needs to meet. Are

you ready to meet them?"

1st Sailor:

"Aye, sir! The fruit of the Spirit...temperance!"

Ticket Master: "Well done! The 'Charity' will be boarding soon!"

2nd Sailor:

(Running...out of breath) "I've been trying so long to get

here. That old snake downstairs has been trying to shanghai me!" (Hold up Bible) "And this is what's brought

me through!"

Ticket Master: "Stand fast...bondage!"

3rd Sailor:

(Hesitates . . . stands in background)

Ticket Master: "Come on, what's holding you up?"

3rd Sailor

"I don't know. It's a long way to Paradise Island! There's

just so many problems once we get under way. The lurches. tumbels and capsize or upsets that could surface."

Ticket Master: "Let us not be weary in well doing, Pipes (referring to a mate), for in due season we'll reach Paradise Island

if we faint not."

END SCENE I... Curtain closes

Narrator:

Luke 8:22-25.

(Change scene background. The whole ship must be

shown. Set up masts, ropes, sails.)

SCENE II (Curtain opens)

Narrator:

"All passengers are on board"..."

Deck members calling back

and forth:

"O.K., Skipper, weigh anchor!"

"Let's set sail!"

"Stand by the main sheet!"

"All hands on deck!" Listen, mates, this is gonna be a rough trip but for those of you who can stay with it, there's a dazzling treasure awaiting ya at the journey's end. We've set the sail for Paradise Island and we ain't gonna come

aground until we see the shinin' island."

2nd Mate:

"There's a lot of advantages to sailing on the 'Charity.' Our Captain is the finest and wisest Skipper on the seven seas. You can be assuring yerselves that He won't be lettin' us down. Yes, Captain Christ has helped many a falling sailor back into the ship. He helps them buffet the waves and bruise the sea. And the strangest thing of all is He don't hold no grudges when we've disobeved

orders. Forgive 'N Forget, that's His policy."

1st Sailor: 1st Mate:

Excuse me, mate, but when can we see the skipper? 'Now don't ye be worryin' about seeing Him, lad, cuz if yer

a faithful worker you'll be feelin' Him right beside you in

(INTERRUPTION!!)

3rd Sailor:

(To first mate) "STOWAWAY ON BOARD!! STOWAWAY ON BOARD! Sir. sir. below deck they found a stowaway!" (Turning and addressing deck officer): "Deck officer, fetch him up on deck."

(Sailors bring in stowaway)

3rd Sailor:

"Here he is. 1st mate."

1st Mate:

(Picks up microphone) - "Captain Christ, sorry to be disturbing you, Sir, but we have to be reportin' a stowaway

aboard . . . any orders. Sir?"

Stowaway:

"Please, please give me a chance. I know I did this in the wrong way. I should have worked harder for my passport."

Captain: "Crew, if a mate be overtaken in a fault, you who are spiritual, restore this one in the spirit of meekness, con-

sidering yourselves lest ye also be tempted."

1st Mate:

"Ye know, lad, when you desire employment on the 'Charity,' ye have to have a personal interview with Captain Christ, and then submit to the rules of the ship which are written in the Captain's log."

(1st Mate hands stowaway a Bible.)

Stowaway:

"I do want Christ as my Captain and I want to make this voyage to Paradise Island."

"Study to shew thyself approved unto Christ, a shipmate that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth!"

SONG:

In Times Like These

END SCENE II ... Curtain closes

SCENE III (Curtain Opens)

Narrator:

"The ship is now sailing along, night is coming on, clouds are gathering." (House lights are off. Colored lights are being used.)

3rd Sailor:

(Anxiously looking over the edge of the boat. Craning neck to see the dangers arising...) "We've got to do something!

We'll all be killed in this storm!"

SONG:

Don't Be Afraid

(While this song is sung, the 3rd sailor will be pacing back and forth dramatically playing the fear scene. As soon as the song is completed, the sailor begins to act hysterical.)

3rd Sailor:

"Change course! Ease the helm! Change course. I tell you! (... running to the wheel. As he grabs for the wheel, he slips over the rail—into the back of the boat. As he slips, a dummy is thrown over the rail in the background and a splash is made in the bapistry.)

Captain:

"No mate, having put his hands to the wheel and changing course, is fit for Paradise Island!"

Narrator:

"Storm becomes turbulent and waves splash up over the

rails."

SONG:

Instrumental: Master the Tempest is Raging (Lightning flashes, bolting down thru the black skies.)

Crew members softly sing "With Christ in The Vessel."

Sailors (together):

"Lend a hand, mates!" "Shift the rudder!" "Ease the helm!"

"Right 5 degrees-rudder!"

"Heave Ho!"

(Storm slowly passes by, and a small voice of despair is

heard thru the night.)

Drifter:

(softly) "Help, Help!"

1st Mate:

"It's a man ... overboard ... let's have some help, mates!"

(Crew rushes to lift the drifter on board—back of boat)

Drifter:

(Out of breath, weak and weary)

"Oh, bless you, mates, I was traveling toward yer harbor when I was 'shanghaied' on to that wicked ship 'Sin.' The company was terrible. The only way I could escape was by jumping overboard. I've been drifting for days.

(Blankets are wrapped around him.)

Drifter (sings) "I WILL PILOT THEE" (Captain below deck joins singing

on the chorus.)

Congregation then sings: Love Lifted Me END SCENE III ... Curtain closes

SCENE IV (Curtain opens)

Crew members look over land

SONG:

Lead Me, Guide Me

"Land Ho!" "Land Ho!"

1st Sailor:

"Crew mates, I can just see it now! That glorious island where we won't be troubled any longer. No more storms

or rough sails."

2nd mate:

"We've hit it! We've found the greatest treasure in the whole world, more than great treasures of gold or rubies or diamonds. More than all the pleasures this world has to offer. This is the treasure all men are searching to find. Captain Christ is such a Great Skipper. I knew we'd

make it! Look! We're almost there!

Chorus by crew members: "We're Nearing the Shore"

SONG:

The Lighthouse on the Shore

Narrator:

"Well, folks, our journey has ended and our crew has reached Paradise Island. How happy they are. (Crew members must be smiling, and singing) It's only by using the requirements and knowledge of their passports (the way of salvation) and charting their lives according to the instruction of Captain Christ that they have gained



... In the Last Days

Perilous Times

"This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come" (2 Timothy 3:1).

The word "perilous" could just as accurately be translated dangerous. The period of the "last days" reaches from the time of the early church until the second advent of Christ. There have been dangerous conditions in every part of this time period, but this situation has increased a great deal in recent years.

The verses following the quotation list many causes of the dangerous times. These causes are listed in a general way. "For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemer... fierce, despisers of those that are good..." These words do not tell how these would be expressed, and this has been different at various times. Today covetous men snatch women's purses or they "mug" people and rob them of their money. It is dangerous to walk through many of our city parks, especially at night. It is even dangerous to walk down some city streets at night. Frequently we read of people's being attacked and robbed in their own homes. This condition is getting worse and worse and the outlook is for it to increase yet more. How good it is that the people of God have the assurance of His care! Let us trust Him more and more as the perilous times get worse and worse!

Mid-East Tension Increases

In recent weeks the cease-fire between Israel and the Arab nations has ended as fighting has broken out again. Armed forces of Israel have invaded Lebanon and Syria in a move to stop the guerrilla attacks on Israel farming settlements near the border. This has increased the general tension between Israel and the Arabs. The Arab nations still want to conquer Israel and take over all the land. But the Word of God shows plainly that after Israel has gathered from all nations of the world and established their nation again, they will continue there until the coming of Jesus.

"Because thou hast had a perpetual hatred, and hast shed the blood of the children of Israel by the force of the sword in the time of their calamity... Because thou hast said, These two nations and these two countries (Israel and Judah) shall be mine, and we will possess it; whereas the Lord was there" (Ezekiel 35:5, 10).

"And I will bring again the captivity of my people of Israel, and they shall build the waste cities, and inhabit them... And I will plant them upon their land, and they shall no more be pulled up out of their land which I have given them, saith the Lord thy God" (Amos 9:14, 15).

Yes, God is there and His Word is true. Wonderful things are yet to happen in the land which God gave to Israel. Jesus said we should watch for the signs which show that His return is near.

Knowledge Increases

"... even to the time of the end...knowledge shall be increased" (Daniel 12:4).

When President Nixon was in China we were able to see just what he was doing at the very time it was being done. This was possible by television equipment which is portable and thus could follow the president wherever he went. The television was beamed to a satellite which is located midway over the Pacific Ocean, and then beamed to the U.S.A. Such things would surely have been thought impossible just a few years ago. Just how much more God will cause man's knowledge to increase we do not know. How wonderful it would be if this great ability could be used to spread the true gospel!

"NOT GOOD IF DETACHED"

Did you ever notice on a railroad ticket, or on many coupons of various kinds, "Not Good If Detached"? The coupon was made of the same material as the rest of the ticket, was printed with the same ink, on the same press and was kept in the same office and used by the same company. But it was not good if detached. Its usefulness, its ability to take you places, was dependent upon its relation to the rest of the ticket.

Of how much worth is a church member if he is detached from the rest of the church? How much fruit can a branch bear if detached from the vine? How good is your hand when detached from your body? A Christian is one who stays with the rest of the church. He cannot serve apart from it. You may be a foot, a hand or an eye of the body of Christ, but you are not worth much to yourself, or to anyone else when separated from the church, which is His body.—Selected


