

Yes, Jesus gave His all, and certainly He expects us to give no less. Perhaps this side of Jesus




IS for Real!

more striking! 

What in the world is a Baha'u'llah? Strange as it may sound, Baha'u'llah is a who and not a what! Baha'u'llah is the prophet of the Bahai Faith, and that religious body began with him. He is a man who claims to have been sent from God to unite the religions and all the prophets of the world. Through him the Moslems, Hindus, Jews, Christians, etc., are to be unified into one body. Baha'u'llah came to bring peace and unity to man and religion; therefore, the picture painted by this man is one of beauty that appeals to many people, but is this picture based on the Word of God?

Let's consider Matthew 16:15, 16—"He saith unto them, but whom say ye that I am? And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the SON OF THE LIVING GOD." Here we have the answer as to who is the Christ! What a fantastic claim for anyone to make! The records of the testaments point to the fact that Jesus would be the Messiah, yet, every claim ever made concerning Jesus was supported by miracles—proof of the claims! The greatest proof of all was the death and resurrection of Christ.

The Scripture is very clear as to who Christ is. If it is such an overwhelming fact that Jesus is the son of God, why do we have such warnings as:

Mark 13:22 "For false Christs and false prophets will rise, to seduce, if it were possible the very elect."

I John 4:1 "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits to see if they are of God: because, many false prophets are gone out into the world."

Can't everyone see and understand that Jesus is the final authority and guide for mankind and the Church? It is quite evident that all do not understand, and this is reflected by the out-croppings of "modern day prophets" such as Ellen G. White, Joseph Smith, Mohammed, Buddah, Krishna, and Baha'u'llah.

The Bahai movement began in 1844 with a young man who said he was the "Bab," or gate, sent from God to declare the "way" of the "promised one" (Note the similarities to John the Baptist and Christ). This movement began in Persia with a sect of Moslems who were looking for a Messiah. The movement occurred during a time of social and religious unrest in that part of the world, so the conditions were right for the preaching of a coming Savior. Later this "Bab" was killed for his preaching. In 1863 a rich gentleman decided he must be the "promised one," so he then revealed his "identity" to the followers of the slain "Bab." He adopted the name "Baha'u'llah" which means glory of God. In time he was exiled to Palestine (Mt. Carmel) where in 1892 he died, in spite of his claim that he was immortal. If these facts don't impress you as to the danger of this sect, perhaps then these will:

- 1. Bahai is predicted to become the religion of the world.
- 2. It is the fastest growing religion in the world.
- 3. Bahai is now represented in every country of the world.
- 4. It has grown from 10,000 to 100,000 in ten years.

The teachings of the movement are very simple:

*These facts are derived from non-Bahai sources

- 1. Baha'u'llah is a descendent of Keturah, Abraham's third wife.
- 2. Moses, Christ, Buddah, Mohammed, etc. were all prophets of God and all served a purpose during their lifetimes.
- 3. Now, for this age the prophet of God is Baha'u'llah.
- 4. Man doesn't need salvation, only enlightenment.
- 5. Man is created to know and love God, and the only way this can be achieved is to know and love the manifestation of God Himself, BAHA'U'LLAH.

In summary, the Bahai Faith is very believable and DECEITFUL!!! When the Bahai's speak to Christians they use the Bible, twisting and perverting its true content. For example, note Isaiah 40:3, "The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, prepare ye the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." When we compare this with Mark 1:2-4 we can easily see that this is a prophecy of John the Baptist, but the Bahai's use it to say that this is a prophecy of the "Bab" (gate). Consider Isaiah 35:1, 2. "... and the desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose. It shall blossom abundantly. The excellency of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the Lord...." Remember, Baha'u'llah (glory of God) was exiled on Mt. Carmel and the Bab's remains are buried there. In 1950 Bahai's built a shrine on Mt. Carmel and established their headquarters there. They claim this is when the desert blossomed and saw the glory of the Lord. In truth, it is a direct perversion of God's Holy Word, and they will be held accountable for it.

We need to stop being afraid to expose these false religions for what they really are. We need to let everyone know how false these ways are before Christ returns to establish his rule!



The Important Decision

"This can't be real! I can't possibly be enrolled in college! Me—in college!"

> "There are so many things happening, and so many new people to meet . . . I can hardly wait to get involved . . .

Undoubtedly, all college freshmen, with a bit of uncertainty, selfconsciousness, and even awe, find themselves thinking thoughts such as these. College is a wonderfully exciting new world. In most cases, entrance into college necessitates a teenager's move away from home, gives him a new feeling of freedom and independence, and forces him to learn to make decisions without advice from his parents. There are many decisions he'll be faced with, but one of the first and most important ones all Christian collegians must make involves Christian standards and Christian witness. "Shall I keep my standards as high as they are or can I lower them just a little bit so I won't appear so peculiar? Can I go to that movie Friday night? Should I attend that fraternity party? Should I be different and keep all of God's commandments as I've done in the past, or is there a new me now?

In considering this matter further, let me tell you about the decisions of two of my friends, Sheila and Francie, during their first year of college . . .

CASE HISTORY I

"Wow," Sheila thought, "There are so many activities planned! If I attend all of them I'll meet lots of people. Let's see, there's a movie that we're all invited to tonight and a fraternity party tomorrow night, and Sunday there's a picnic, and a dance . . .

"But wait a minute! What am I going to do about God and all those things I've been taught ever since I was a kid? I know that I'll meet many of the students and start making new friends if I participate in all those activities, but then I also know what will happen if I turn my back on God. Ever since I committed my life to God, He's never let me down. One way or another, He's always worked things out. I'm sure that if I'll just be patient, God will provide many opportunities for me to meet the other students. Besides, knowing that I was deliberately breaking God's commandments just to gain friends and become popular would make me feel guilty and unhappy. Knowing God as I do, and after all He's done for me, the least I can do is live for Him here at college just as He's taught me how to live.

Unlike Sheila, Francie allowed herself to base this decision upon her concern for what her friends might think.

CASE HISTORY II

"Well, what's everybody going to think if I don't go to that movie tonight?" Francie questioned herself, "How can a Walt Disney production do me any harm, even if it is on Friday night? Everybody else goes. How could I ever explain why I don't care to go? Those kids wouldn't understand-they'd just laugh at me. And about that fraternity party tomorrow night... I know they'll serve liquor, but I can go anyway-I don't have to drink. And that dance might be fun. I know how the Church feels about dancing, but everybody else will be there and it will give me a fantastic opportunity to meet the other kids. I don't have to participate in those activities more than once or twice because by then I'll know most of the kids My parents and minister would never find out. And God would understand that it's impossible for a teenager to be square all the time and He will overlook these few little mistakes."

FOLLOW-UP:

Sheila and Francie led quite different lives throughout college due to the influence of their first important decisions. All during her college life, Sheila had many friends. Everyone she knew held a great respect for her because she wasn't afraid of being different. She had set her standards high and steadfastly upheld them. Today, she's a very (Continued on page 21)

Dear FYCer,

Have you noticed the trend in advertising? Products are being promoted on the basis of benefits to be received by using them. We are advised to be sure our body has no offensive odor by using SURE anti-perspirant. Such advertisement is effective in catching the public eye and in selling the product. The F.Y.C. needs such a promotion that will catch the eye of the church and inspire greater participation in its programs.

Promotion is an essential facet of further growth and development of any organization. The effectiveness of a promotional program is easily measured in terms of response to that program and projected needs. Success or failure is attributable to the presentation of promotion.

At times, special promotionals are organized to build or to rekindle interest in specific areas. With this in mind, we appeal to you to promote the F.Y.C. in your local church. There is a certain "deadness" in most current F.Y.C. programs, excepting VISTOC. This is due, in part, to the fact that change is coming and young people are waiting for these changes before rejuvenating their charges in the programs. Change is due, but promotion must be constant and positive to insure constant growth in the F.Y.C.

December 21 has been designated as Youth Emphasis Sabbath by the United Missions Board. With the proposed changes at hand, Youth Emphasis Sabbath might effectively be employed to promote the F.Y.C. and the new, rejuvenated F.Y.C. programs. Promotional materials will be sent to each F.Y.C. with the intent of presenting and introducing the entire program to the church, new programs included. A special program is being encouraged utilizing local F.Y.C.'s, sponsors, and pastors to present a positive F.Y.C. I urge each F.Y.C. to be prepared to involve themselves with this promotion!

Speaking of promotion—the United Missions Board plays an important role in aiding and funding the F.Y.C. program. In turn, they expect the F.Y.C. to contribute its fair share to fund the budget. The means established to provide such sharing is through the Quarter

per Quarter system of the Mark of Merit program. Even though Mark of Merit will be phased out, Quarter per Quarter will remain and needs the support of each F.Y.C. group.

Quarter per Quarter is a program of financial assistance to the National F.Y.C. which asks each local F.Y.C. to establish its financial goal on the basis of average church attendance. The average church attendance should determine the goal by assessing the local F.Y.C. \$1.00 per person. EXAMPLE: If a church has an average of 113, its yearly goal would be \$113.00. Local F.Y.C.'s should try to meet this goal on a quarterly basis, hence, "Quarter per Quarter."

Whatever you do, don't ignore the responsibility of meeting your Quarter per Quarter goal, as future promotion and programs may depend upon our response to that responsibility. The F.Y.C. fair share of the United Missions budget through Quarter per Quarter is \$1600.00, or \$400.00 per quarter. Needless to say, we urge your participation in Quarter per Quarter!

The F.Y.C. Committee feels that continual promotion of the F.Y.C. is essential to its very existence. Your response and promotion will determine future success or failure.








NATIONAL FYC SECRETARY RESIGNS; **NEW APPOINTEE**
