ZION NEWS

No New Houses in the Old City

We learn that the Authorities have ordered to stop all reconstruction work at the buildings in the Old City which were destroyed by the earthquake. The Authorities are of the opinion that there should be no new houses in these places. The house owners will receive from the Government plots for building outside the City Wall.

Dead Sea Hills Split.

The hills near the Dead Sca were badly damaged by the tremor of recent date. According to the photographs taken by the Royal Air Force a veritable upheaval has taken place in the immediate region of the Dead Sea.

National Jewish Land More Than Doubled in Three Years.

The table of the rural land possessions of the Jewish National Fund in Palestine (contained in the report of the Jewish National Fund to the forthcoming Congress) shows that in the course of $3\frac{1}{2}$ years the Jewish National Fund in Palestine has acquired more land than in 22 preceding years.

Relief to sufferers in Jerusalem.

An extraordinary meeting took place at the Vaad Hair (Council of Jerusalem Jews) last night to discuss measures of relief in connection with the earth-quake losses. It was decided to continue the gathering of information concerning the families which were compelled to leave their dwellings, to demand that the Government should send a certain amount to the houseowners for carrying out repair work in their houses, and to find possibilities of financial relief to the sufferers.

Telephone Line Haifa-Nahala.

Work for the establishment of a telephone line between Haifa and Nahala has started at the order of the Post Office. Some fifty workers are engaged.

QUESTION CORNER

Question: Please explain Rev. 14 where it says: And they shall be tormented in the presence of the holy angels and the Lamb, and the smoke of their torment ascendeth up forever and ever, and they have no rest day or night that worship the beast and his image."

Answer: First we must notice that this refers specifically to the end of this age after the Third Angel's Message has accomplished its work, and the separating time has come. The saints are on the one hand of whom it is said they keep the considerable other hand the wicked are victims of the unmingled wrath of God poured from the cup of His indignation.

This expressly refers to the time of the seven last plagues as you will quickly note by a comparison of the language found in Rev. 15th and 16th chapters where the warning is given relative to the contents of this cup of God's wrath. Compare Rev. 15:1, 7, 8 and Rev. 16:1 with the text in question viz., Rev. 14:10

If the reader will note the horrible nature of the seven last plagues he will quickly see that the ones thus afflicted will have no rest day nor night that worship the beast and his image. And referring as it does to the final events of the age, it quite naturally says that these "are tormented in the presence of the holy angels and the Lamb," the concluding plagues reaching as they do down to the coming of the Lord with all His holy angels.

The smoke of their torment ascending up forever and ever, simply sets forth a truth unquestioned. Smoke being the subject of the sentence as all grammarians will affirm, and ascends being the predicate, the truth set forth is simply that smoke never again returns. The subjects thus are gone forever, their very substance being consumed away into smoke as Mal. 4th chapter also affirms. It does not say that their torment continues forever, for torment is not the subject of the sentence, neither can we suppose that there will forever be an ascension of smoke from their burning. Smoke is substance, being composed of the thing consumed and in all cases the thing itself is destroyed.

Q.: Why is it that after the 144,000 of Rev. 14th chapter are saved and set apart, that the Revelator mentions seeing the three angels flying through the midst of heaven, constituting as they do the three angel's messages.

A: This arrangement is not only found in the book of the Revelations but it is also found in most all books of history. One chain of events is brought down to a close, and then going back over the same period, another line is followed giving additional in-

formation interwoven with those previously mentioned. We cannot read the book of Revelations as one connected narration of events consecutively in their order, or confusion will be the result. We give for one example the judgment of the nations, the resurrection of the dead, and reward of the servants of God and of the saints, brought to view in the conclusion of chapter eleven, which carries us down to the very end of this age. Then the twelfth chapter opens up by saying "And there appeared a great wonder in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and upon her head a crown of twelve stars" etc.

The reader student of prophecy knows well the application of this symbol to the true people of God at the opening of the gospel dispensation. be folly to claim that these events were to transpire on earth after the day of judgment and the resurrection of the dead. The twelfth chapter starts in again with the dawning of the gospel age, and carries us down over a period pertaining to the Church of God to the conclusion when the dragon again makes war with those who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus. The 13th chapter likewise begins with another line of prophecy carrying us again through the gospel age and reaching the climax with verses 1 to 5 of the folowing chapter, when the redeemed of earth are ansomed and safe under the shadow of the Almighÿ.

From verse five we have the beginning of another line carrying us again through the events of the gospel age as pertaining to the "Gospel of the kingdom" which Jesus said was to go to the whole world as a witness to all nations before the end would come. Here we have it divided into its three phrases, or three messages heralded as it was by angels, or messengers. The everlasting gospel beginning as we all understand with the apostles, and continuing without end overlapping into and being carried through each of the following periods when there is a peculiar and distinct message due the whole world at each given time. The second message pertains to the fall of Babylon and the corruption of the apostate woman, or church, fully described in chapter seventeen. Then next comes the last or Third Angel's Message now going forth likewise to the world.

The climax in this series of events is reached toward the conclusion of the 14th chapter. Chapters 15 and 16 are especially a summary of the events more in detail of the closing of this age, and the consequence of not heeding the warning message of the thirl angel. These facts are clearly seen when notice is especially given these chapters.

Charles L. Carpenter, was born at Afton, Shenango County, New York, December 14, 1854, of colonial ancestry and passed away September 17, 1927 at Bassett, Nebraska, age nearly 73. Death was caused by injuries sustained in an attack by his Jersy animal while driving his cows in from pasture Sabbath morning from which he died three hours later.

He came west to Nebraska when twenty-four years of age, and settled in Knox county forty-nine years ago. He went through the privations in current with the early settlers living many miles from a railroad, broke prairie on his homestead and taught school during winters. The last twenty years of his life have been spent in Rock county, thirteen years of which he has lived near Bassett.

He was married to Arminda M. Grimm December 23rd, 1880 and they have been constant companions for nearly forty-seven years. Eight children were born two dying in infancy. The living ones are: Paul R., Seely B., Charity Jeffreyes, Hester, Maurice H., and Effie Dugger. There are twelve grandchildren, one brother, Fred of Bloomfield, and five sisters residing in New York.

He has since early childhood been ardently dedicated to God, and his life has been one constant preparation toward perfecting himself for the reward of the righteous. His religious life has been fully exemplified in every day life, being patient, lovable, honest, prayerful, steadfast, industrious, helping others, with fearlessness in convictions, which has been to his friends and associates wherever he has lived uplifting and elevating, and these remain today as his greatest monument.

In later years, as he saw it, he conscientiously became convinced of certain doctrinal errors and embracing clearer light changed his church affiliations to that of the Seventh Day Church of God. He was a charter member of the local church serving as

(Golden Gospel) With Paul as in Rom. 11:33 we exclaim "O the depth of the riches both of wisdom and knowledge of God! how unsearchable are His judgments, and His ways past finding out." All this the foregoing is included in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
