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THE NEEDS OF THE CHURCH.

SOME CURIOUS THINGS.

I have just read in the October issue of one of the monthlies printed, an article wherein the Editor writes to prove that not all of the writings of Mrs. E. G. White are not divinely inspired. He quotes from a certain book and page where Mrs. White taught a certain thing for twenty-six years and sold many hundreds of the publication and later the publication was changed and a certain paragraph was left out in the new edition, thus showing that the position first taken as all who read knows now it was an error as first taught by her. He thus proves to our mind and every other fair minded person that her writings were not inspired of God. For God makes no mistakes through his chosen prophets. If it were so who would know what to believe in the Bible to be true and what not to be true? This Editor then states (which is true that scores of such mistakes exist in Mrs. White's writings.

Now the point with us is this, The writer says her writings are not all inspired. This statement is made several times in the Editor's article. What shall we understand by the statement, They are not all inspired? I would conclude the Editor accepts the position that many others hold, that some are inspired and some are not. Further, so far as I know (and I have known the writer of these articles for some years personally), to this time I don't know what his positions are, or if he has any or what he wishes us to know as to his real position on this subject. Is he afraid to tell it? Is there some policy in not telling it? Is he astride the fence and don't know which side to fall on? Or is he hoping that some time to be in the denomination again and does not now care to take too strong a position on the question. He says not all inspired. I like

frankness. I will say further this is not the only Editor who keeps this personal idea on this question in the background. I would like for them to speak plainly as to where they stand and no doubt hundreds of others would like the same. Do they, or do they not, believe any are inspired when they say not all? Does God give and use a prophet to give messages to his people who are not reliable? I answer, No, emphatically. If God's word stands on that platform then I for one am at sea and do not know what to believe. It is true false prophets say many good things. Baalem did so, Satan himself told the truth in some cases, but a lie was always there too.

This position that all of Mrs. White's writings are not inspired, to my mind is too much like the old woman's fruit jars. She marked one certain kind "'tis," the other kind she marked "'tisent" and set them up. When she came to open them she had forgotten which was "'tis" and which was "'tisent." So the one who says they are not all inspired is fixing an escape when caught teaching from the testimonies that which is wrong. Well, he says, they are not all inspired. But they will say to fix it up Sister White was a good woman, and the Lord used her as his special agent. Mr. Hastings, a great opposer of infidelity, answered the infidel when the infidel said Christ was a good man, of course. Mr. Hastings replied by asking what the infidel's standard of goodness was when he said Christ was a good man? Mr. Hastings then referred to Christ's teaching where he claimed to be the son of God and that he came down from heaven and so on. Now you say he was not what he claimed, you make Christ the biggest liar we have any record of. Is that your standard of a good man, as you say Christ was. If your claims are true h ewas the biggest fraud the world has known and yet you say he was a good man. So if Mrs. White has taught so many errors as it is easy to see she has taught, can I say or you say in truth that any of her writings were inspired of God? Nay verily. Show me where any of the prophets of the Bible teachers erred, if you can I lose my interest in them. They are God's witnesses, they are to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth. That is my standard of a prophet. If you have any other please tell it to those whom you teach. Tell it plainly without equivocation. This is no disrespect to her personally or her followers. One thing is evident, her mistakes are many in the teaching of the Bible. As to her personal standing God alone must settle with her the same as when I or you make a mistake. One thing is certain, none of her writings were inspired. She never had a vision from the Lord.

Now while speaking on this I wish to ask those who have left the denomination, Do you still hold the two thousand and three hundred days ended in 1844? Do you still believe the S. D. A. position on the three messages of Revelation 14? Is it correct as taught by the S. D. A. people? Do you still hold their position to be true as they teach Daniel 7, 8, and 9 chapters? I notice that most of those who come out from the denomination keep silent on the very vital points that

made the denomination what they are. Shall we understand they still believe these points as formerly or not? If their comeout is simply based on some questions whether all of Sister White's writings are inspired or not, and whether the day of at onement took place in 1844 and such questions their comeout is on a small platform. It is not calculated to help the people very much. I do not hesitate to say that the very foundation principles upon which the denomination was founded are wrong, and nothing short of a revision of the whole thing will ever bring them to the truth for this time. The Pharisees were right on the Sabbath and the state of the dead but that was not sufficient. The fact that a man keeps the Sabbath (while that is true and right), that will go no distance in saving him if he will not receive the light God has for him. If we fail to declare the whole truth, God will hold us responsible. The trouble with many who are separated from the communion of S. D. A. they are not far separated. Other causes have entered into their separation besides differences on doctrine.

I do hold that if the advent movement from 1833 to 1844 was scriptural and correct in positions taken that would have much to do with me in consideration before I would separate from the denomination and the visions as they claim them. In other words if I today believed their positions correct as to their teaching of Daniel I would hardly know how to avoid swallowing the whole dose. I therefore suggest to all who have left the S. D. A. people to take a review of the whole ground held by them and not the position alone whether all the visions of Sister White are inspired. I would also suggest to those who are teachers to take a stand on other teachings of the denomination. If you still hold to all the rest let it be known. If not let that be known.

The apostle says to provide things honest in the sight of all men. Ministers of all classes say to their hearers on the Sabbath question, Why halt ye between two opinions? So we say to all comeouters, Get on one side or the other of the fence and teach the whole question in some way as you now believe. Then we will know where each stands.

A NEW PLAN IN THE OFFICE.

We thank God for the courage we have and the faith that leads us to believe in great things in the near future. We move with that assurance each day that all is ours and he will provide. He has done it and he will do it if we live where he can use us. It is in our hands to determine what the end will be. If we are faithful the result is sure. If we fail then God will raise up some one else to take our place. His part never fails, his work never stops. Lord, keep us faithful is our laily concern.

THE GIFT OF TONGUES.

We have in the past written on the above gift and published it in the tract, "Bible Doctrine." But there are some points not noticed in that booklet which we now wish to further consider. My attention is called to an article recently written by an "Editor" of one of our monthly Sabbath keeping monthlies which calls my attention to some positions taken which I believe to be error. This "Editor" expresses his longing desire to have this gift as he has seen it witnessed by some Sabbath keepers who are connected with the Apostolic people which he has come in touch with in his labors.

He further states in his article some conclusions which he states he has proved in his former article. Among these positions taken are the following:

"The summing up of our last study of this subject was as follows:

"One who speaks or prays in a tongue (one of the gifts of the Spirit).

- "1. 'Edizeth himself' though 'no man understandeth' and he does not understand himself.
 - "2. He speaketh unto God.
 - "3. He speaketh mysteries.
 - "4. He giveth thanks well.
 - "Paul says that he
- "1. Prayed in the Spirit without his understanding and that he
- "2. Sang in the Spirit without his understanding
- "3. Spoke in tongues apart from his understanding, more than all the members of the Corinthian church (but not in public), and
- "4. He thanked the Lord that he spake in tongues more than they all without understanding

what he said, but this speaking was not in the assembly."

The above are in quotation showing them to be copied from the article referred to.

Position one says this gift edifieth though no one understandeth and he does not understand himself.

If this is the object of the gift, namely, no one understandeth, neither the one possessed understandeth, pray tell us its purpose and benefit to any one? None of course. To this position we could not agree, no, not for a moment. On the day of Pentacost did the people who heard the disciples speak understand Certainly they did, and it is so stated. Did the apostles understand what they said to the people? They certainly did, and is so stated. It says they heard every man in their own tongue (language). It also says Peter spoke to them the words of Joel. How could that be if neither understood what they said? The above position all grows out of the "Editor's" confusion in trying to harmonize what he has heard and claimed to be Bible teaching on the gift on tongues. He ought to know that such teaching was What he has heard is not the gift of tongues, if it had been his eyes would have been opened differently to what they now are.

The second position is off of the same piece. Namely, "he (Paul) speaketh mysteries." What was the mystery? Was it because he spoke something that neither he himself nor any one else could understand or did he reveal the mystery of the gospel to the hearer in their own language that they might understand the hidden mysteries of the gospel? Further on the day of Pentacost it was a mystery to the hearers how those Gallileans could speak having never learned the language, yet speak so that every man could understand them in their own tongue.

Such interpretation as this article gives is sad indeed when it makes our God a being who is a performer of such foolishness as is palmed off in our day for the gift of tongues.

Don't let the reader think for a moment we do not believe in the gift of tongues for we do. But we do not believe that what is practiced in our day is that gift at all. I confess I have seen quite a little of what is now called the gift of tongues, but to my mind I have never seen the gift of tongues as referred to in the Bible. What I have witnessed is a trick of the devil. When I hear some one expound the mystery of the gospel to me or any one else who has never knew my language or the other fellow's language, give in an intelligent manner according to the teaching of the word in my own tongue then I will hear this gift and not till then.

Position one, two, three and four of the "Editor's" second summing up says Paul prayed in the Spirit without his understanding, he sang in the Spirit without his understanding, he spoke in tongues apart from his understanding, and last he thanked God more than they all without understanding what he said, more than they all. Surely Paul was quite an artist in doing things which he knew nothing about what he

done. "He talked to God," "He prayed to God," "He sang for God," and "spake in tongues which he knew nothing of what he said," more than any one of the believers. All this was done and Paul not responsible for any of it, for he did not know what he was doing. If that was all true he surely would be like much of the modern gift of tongues or rather that which is claimed to be tongues. Namely, beside oneself. This confusion and wrong teaching all grows out of trying to fit the Scripture to this false claim. Its deception is to deceive those who do not know the Bible and palm this error off on the people. The whole as now practiced so far as we have been able to see is of this counterfeit, and is the work of Satan to deceive the people. We take the liberty to here give the Scripture from which this "Editor" Brother takes all his argument from to prove as he calls it that Paul did not know any thing he was saying or doing when he spake in tongues. It seems to us as the reader will read this Scripture they will see the "Editor's" position is not sound doctrine.

"Follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy.

"For he that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men. but unto God: for no man understandeth him; howbeit in the spirit he speaketh mysteries.

"But he that prophesieth speaketh unto men to edification, and exhortation, and comfort.

"He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church.

"I would that ye all spake with tongues, but rather that ye prophesied: for greater is he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues, except he interpret, that the church may receive edifying.

"Now, brethren, if I come unto you speaking with tongues, what shall I profit you, except I shall speak to you either by revelation, or by knowledge, or by prophesying, or by doctrine?

"And even things without life giving sound, whether pipe or harp, except they give a distinction in the sounds, how shall it be known what is piped or harped?

"For if the trumpet give an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to the battle?

"So likewise ye, except ye utter by the tongue words easy to be understood, how shall it be known what is spoken? for ye shall speak into the air.

"There are, it may be, so many kinds of voices in the world, and none of them is without signification.

"Therefore if I know not the meaning of the voice, I shall be unto him that speaketh a barbarian, and he that speaketh shall be a barbarian unto me.

"Even so ye, forasmuch as ye are zealous of spiritual gifts, seek that ye may excel to the edifying of the church.

"Wherefore let him that speaketh in an unknown tongue pray that he may interpret.

"For if I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit prayeth, but my understanding is unfruitful.

"What is it then? I will pray with the spirit,

and I will pray with the understanding also: I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also.

"Else when thou shalt bless with the spirit, how shall he that occupieth the room of the unlearned say Amen at thy giving of thanks, seeing he understandeth not what thou sayest?

"For thou verily givest thanks well, but the other is not edified.

"I thank my God, I speak with tongues more than ve all:

"Yet in the church I had rather speak five words with my understanding, that by my voice I might teach others also, than ten thousand words in an unknown tongue.

"Brethren, be not children in understanding: howbeit in malice be ye children, but in understanding be men." 1 Cor. 14:1-20.

The above shows plainly in verse six that the question of tongues is for the education of the church in doctrine, teaching and so forth, Paul says plainly the only way they could be edified is for them to understand what he desired to impart to them. He further says in verse eleven, "If he knows not the meaning of the voice" he would be to them a barbarian and they the same to him. Note what the apostle says in verse fourteen about understanding. He says his understanding could not be imparted to them by speaking to them in a language they could not under-Then it is useless to say Paul did not understand. stand himself what he would speak in any tongue or language. He plainly says his understanding would be unfruitful, that is, it would bear no fruit unless the hearer could understand though Paul himself under-Note verse fifteen. He says he will pray stood. and sing with the spirit and with the understanding That is, when he prays or sings he will do it in a language that can be understood. This is shown in verse sixteen to be the absolute idea of praying with the spirit and singing with the spirit and understanding, also in verse fifteen. So when the "Editor" quotes such Scripture to show that Paul did not know what he was praying, singing and speaking is a false teaching of this Scripture. Verse seventeen shows that the party speaking in an unknown tongue to those who hear him gives thanks well in his own language but the others do not understand him. Verse eighteen shows that Paul spoke in many languages more than any of those who heard him. But he did not use them where they could not be understood. Thus an unknown tongue is not a tongue unknown to everybody, especially to the speaker, but unknown to those who hear it spoken. The German, Italian, French and all others but the English are unknown tongues to me. This leads to the reason why it was necessary on certain occasions to speak in unknown tongues by the apostles. They were sent to the various languages of the world to preach the gospel. There was no time to go to school to learn those languages, so God worked miracles and like the making of the wine by the Saviour, thus shortening the process in those days.

God is just as able to do that now, but not for curiosity, but when Israel is being gathered into the feast of tabernacles from all countries and tongues, it would be reasonable to believe there would then be a special need of that gift with others being again manifest.

A SUPPLIMENT.

Either in a suppliment or tract form we will now publish the letter heretofore mentioned, as written by a scholar and a prominant minister of the Seventh Day Adventist faith from his childhood. He therein gives in a clear and Christian manner an exposition of the faith of Seventh Day Adventist and their early positions on prophecy. JUDGMENT OF THE WHORE.

"And there came one of the seven angels which had the seven vials and tarked with me, saying unto me, Come hither; I will shew unto thee the judgment of the great whore that sitteth upon many waters:
"When whom the kings of the earth have committed fornica-

tion, and the innabitants of the earth have been made drunk with

the wine of her formication.

The first thing to do in the teaching of this chapter is to give the location of the beast and the woman that sits upon it. Inis same beast is first mentioned by the propnet in chapter 13, there is no woman connected with it there. Hence, kev. 13 so far as the beast alone is concerned represents the civil power and the 10 kingdoms of the western Empire of Rome. It is represented as having 7 heaus, the same as the dragon of the 12th chapter has 'I heads. In the 12th chapter the 'I heads wore the crowns. But in the 13th chapter the crowns are transferred to the norms. This teaches that both the heads and the horns represents kingly governments. It also teaches that the heads and horns do not both represent the same governments. For there are 10 crowns on the horns, and 'I on the heads. 'this teaches the heads to be prior in point of time to the horns. Let this distinction be noted for it will be necessary in locating the neaus separate from the horns.

The dragon in the 12th chapter represented Rome universal.

The beast in the 13th chapter represents the Western division of the Roman power after the death of Constantine. 'The woman introduced in Chapter 17 is a symbol of an ecclesiastical organization. All who know the Bidle know that a pure woman is a symbol of a pure church. A corrupt woman is a symbol of a corrupt church. That this woman represents a religious organization there is no question. Her symbolic clothing all show this. Her ¿ n dates back to the name she bares upon her crown, which is Babylon. Hence it is necessary to locate her identity definitely the first thing. The name Babylon is derived from the word Babel. The history tollowing the flood gives the origin of the word Babel as we now read:

"And the whole earth was of one language, and of one speech.

"And it came to pass, as they journeyed from the east, that

"And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.

"And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded.

"And the Lord said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

"Go to, let us go down, and there confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech.

"So the Lord scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city.

"Therefore is the name of it called Babel; because the Lord il there contound the language of all the earth: and from thence did the Lord scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth." Gen. 11:1-9.
