Instructions introduced to govern the service. All the above occured in just one year from their departure from Egypt. Paul describes the Sinaitic view of Sinai when the law was given as follows:

"For ye are not come unto the mount that might be touched, and that burned with fire, nor unto blackness, and darkness, and tempest,

'And the sound of a trumpet, and the voice of words; which voice they that heard intreated that the word should not be spoken to them any more:

"(For they could not endure that which was commanded, And if so much as a beast touch the mountain, it shall be stoned, or thrust through with a dart:

"And so terrible was the sight, that Moses said, I exceedingly fear and quake:)

"But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels,

"To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,

"And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel.

"See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more shall not we escape, if we turn away from him that speaketh from heaven:

"Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven. "And this word, Yet once more, signifieth the

removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain.

"Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear:

"For our God is a consuming fire."-Heb. 12: 18-29.

The above all occurred in the twenty-five hundred and fourteenth year after the creation of the world. The person who familiarizes their minds with the books of Genesis and Exodus will understand much of the whole Bible. God at this point of history laid the organization of Israel which was to last till the end. "What God doeth he doeth it forever." "Nothing can be added to it neither can any thing be taken from it." Eccles. 3:14. This second covenant was made with the house of Judah and the house of Israel. Joseph's house, the head of Israel as a representative of the remedial system of the gospel. Judah, the representative of the law and civil rulership. Note, the civil was subject to the instructions of the house of Israel. They were the teachers of both law and gospel as will latter appear. Both were united in the theocracy of Israel. Both had one aim to fill. Namely, obedience to God and faith towards our Lord Jesus Christ. Both in perfect harmony. God himself being the head and only organizer and first instructor of all.

Don't let the student leave the question of the covenants till the two, the one with Abraham and the one at Sinai, are clearly defined in their mind. See our teaching on them in Volume one and Volume six in "Book of the Law Found Again."

#### How to Be Saved.

The whole was a school-master to bring all men to Christ. There is a difference between the teacher and the student. The teacher can instruct how to do a thing but the performance must be done by the student. Just so the old covenant in all its teaching, taught the everlasting covenant and its principles in saving men. But salvation could only be realized by faith in Christ, the Redeemer of the world. Hence as a saving power it was faulty, says Paul, in that respect, for it was never intended to do that through the blood of animals. But faith in the blood of Christ which was represented by the blood of animals, would save men. At the same time the educational system of the old covenant was perfect and not faulty. The new covenant (everlastingly) was established on better promises. It did and could save men through its promises. That was just what it was intended to perform. If the reader will just take the national covenant made at Sinai with all the people in both its civil and spiritual education, and realize it was all designed to teach men how to live in both civil and spiritual things in this life, and the life to come, then they will know what the Mosaic covenant with all the people, was designed to do. Then on the other hand take the everlasting covenant through Christ, and faith in his blood, and power, to aid us in performing that which the Mosaic covenant taught us to perform, then you have the purpose of them both.

## The Book of Exodus.

I have now passed through the examination of

Exodus chapter by chapter. The story as recorded is one of especial interest to the children of God. I was made to realize why so much had been said in the Bible about the departure from Egypt. Why David five hundred years after wrote such beautiful songs to be sung, giving the experience and history of Israel in their departure from Egypt and their experience in the wilderness. In brief, when we remember all that has been written in the Bible concorning the things recorded in the book of Exodus, we find that much of the whole structure of the Bible rests on that period of time.

Paul writes the book of Hebrews from the record of Exodus. Christ had much to say about Moses be-ing a prophet like unto himself. The narrative is one of deep interest as we read of the story of Moses being hid among the flags. His mother being provided to care for him. How he was educated in all the wisdom of the Egyptians. How he slew the Egyptian and fled from Pharo. How he went to the Medianites, who also descended from Abraham. His meeting God at the burning bush. His begging of God not to send him to deliver Israel. How Aaron was made his mouth piece. He lays the matter before Israel. His visit to Pharo. Pharo's refusel. The ten plagues visited on Pharo The marking of the door posts. The borrowing of wealth. Their departure at midnight. Near three millions in all leave. Not even a dog barked at their departure. Pharo pursues them. Their manner of crossing the Red Sea. The drowning of the Egyptians. They reach Sinai. The appear-ance of the cloud seen. God proposition to make of them a great nation. He delivers his laws. Moses reads them to the people. All the congregation agrees to obey them. The sealing of the covenant. Moses makes the second visit with God on Sinai. Joshua and seventy elders go with him. God stands on a pavement of Saphire stone, (blue being the emblem of loyalty to the laws of Jehovah). The terrible con-dition and appearance of Sinai. The request of the people for Moses to thereafter do the speaking lest they die. Thirty days later they break their agree-ment. God slays three thousand for their rebellion. Moses pleads for their restoration to God and the renewal of the covenant. God grants the request. The building of the tabernacle. Renewed. The colors used in the curtains. The rams' skins dyed red as a covering. The making of the garments of the priests bearing the same colors. The anointing and consecration of the priests to their office. All like a story of romance made up of supernatural events of fac's. Such is the book of Exodus.

Rules Govering the Kindergarten System of Teaching. Note.—There were no written laws or scripture prior to the giving of the laws on Sinai. Paul speaks thus of giving the written law, "For till the law, sin was in the world." Rom. 5. Abraham "kept God's commandments, his statutes and laws." Thus they existed but not written. Paul in speaking of the Abrahamic covenant and the one at Sinai, says: "The law which was four hundred and thirty years after." Gal. 3:17. There being no written law is the reason why the object lesson system was in vogue since the days of Adam. And then at Sinai it was written for the first time.

It is very necessary to understand the lesson taught by each offering if we would know the truth. God also used certain days of worship to be set apart to teach certain lessons. Also certain observance to be performed on different occassions. All to teach some lesson of truth. We have given in "The Yellow Peril" rules govering the study of prophecy. We will here introduce certain rules in order to understand the kindergarten teaching of the laws.

First, the law required the one defiled by touching a dead body to remain out of the camp seven days. The ground to be tilled six years and not to be tilled or sown the seventh. The blood to be sprinkled seven times before the vail. The seventh year to be the release of all debts. The seventh year to be the release of slaves sold for debt. In various other instances is the use of the number seven. These all teach the duration of the world till the new earth will be ushered in seven thousand years from the creation.

Second, each appointed season of worship at stated seasons had an application and education for the people then, and now. Also there was in them a future time of prophetic fulfillment.

Third, the tabernacle and all the services connected with it was educational in its purpose. Each part of the material used as well as the serice, taught some special lesson of truth. It was an educational center for all Israel. No other place or service of the kind was permitted. The tabernacle and its service was the great object lesson for all.

Fourth. In the cloud with its colors of the bow in the time of rain, each color taught a specific lesson.

Fifth. The organization, the order of encampment, the location of each tribe, taught a great future lesson on the final inheritance of the saints.

Sixth. The land of Canaan was an object lesson of the final inheritance of Israel.

Seventh. The two houses, Israel and Judah, last till probation closes and Israel is gathered. Then the house of Israel ceases, and there will be one king over all. He will rule on the throne of his glory. The throne of grace then ends. Eze. 37.

Eighth. The Aaronic priesthood represented the priesthood of Melchesidec which is Christ, who rules in heaven as our high priest. The cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night taught a great lesson of the future to the remnant. Isaiah 4th chapter. Also safely in the everlasting burning.

## The Service and Offerings.

when the lake of fire comes Israel will dwell First. The altar of sacrifice out side the taber-

nacle taught the great sacrifice made for us through Christ. As the offering was killed and laid on the altar, it taught that we were willing to sacrifice all, even our life, and suffer with him that we might reign with him. The blood which contains the life was poured at the bottom of the altar when the animal was This signified that we offered our lives and slain. that our life was under the altar as a witness to our sacrifice for him. The animal being consumed taught that our life was to be wholly consumed in the Master's service. The washing of the inwards and the legs and feet, taught that those only who had been made clean inwardly and whose feet and legs were consecrated to God's service could make the consecration complete. It also taught their feet were not "swift to shed blood." Neither to be tale-bearers, but they were shod with the gospel of peace and innocency. "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring glad tidings of the gospel." The burning of the fat, (fat being an emblem of sin) signified that all our sins were consumed. The portion of the animal which was to go to the priest as his, signified that we were willing to support the laborer for he "was worthy of his hire." Says Paul, "They which minister at the altar are partakers of the altar." Thus God ordained that those "who preach the gospel shall live of the Abraham met the angel with a basin of gospel." water for his feet, signifying the relations of peace between them. Christ washed the disciples' feet for the same purpose, and so do all saints. The altar of sacrifice being out side, signified it was the door to the church of the firstborn. It is at that altar where Christ the true door meets the aplicant. "He that will not forsake all is not worthy of me."

## Five Principle Offerings Made.

The first is the burnt offering. There are used the following offerings for a burnt offering. First, a Second, a male sheep, or goat. bullock. Next a turtle dove or young pigeon. No hands are to be laid on the head of the burnt offering of consecration. The offering must be the result "of his own free and voluntary will." The burnt offering we have already described in the foregoing. The next is "the meat offering." This offering is not made of an animal but of the products of the ground. The word meat signifies food. God requires his portion of all the products of the ground. So the next offering which comes in its consecutive order is the food offering, due the Lord for the support of his work in the world. The food offering was to be of fine flour with oil poured on it with frankincense. Bread is the staff of life made from the flour. Oil is a symbol of the spirit of God. The Lord wants only that which the spirit puts into the heart to give. We must not give grudgingly, but cheerfully.

The next is the peace offering. Peace means reconciliation. Hence applies to a newly converted person. So he brings the animal to the door of the tabernacle, lays his hands on its head, asking God's mercy with confession of sin, then kills the animal. The priest takes the blood and sprinkles it round about on the altar. The peace offering can be either a lamb or a goat according to conditions. The next is a sin offering. The animals used for a sin offering are a bullock, a sheep, a goat, male or female, according to conditions. The next is the trespass offering. Trespass is sin known to be wrong. For this the offering is the female sheep, or goat, turtle dove or young pigeons, or even fine flour without oil or frankincense on it. The offender is required to confess his guilt. In addition, there are certain cases where the offender was required to bring a ram.

The above are the principle offerings to be made. See Lev. chapters one to six. The laying on of hands was a symbol of imploring the blessing of God on the penitent and the curse of God on such as make no repentance. Blessings and cursings come on our own pate. The use of water in washing was emblematic of cleansing. The continual fire on the altar never to go out, taught our daily and hourly consecration to God and the final destruction of sin and sinners in the lake of fire. Circumcision taught our final inheritance promised to Abraham on conditions of being converted at heart and not marrying with other nations of unbelievers. Circumcised the eighth day taught we would receive the inheritance eight thousand years from creation.

#### Special Numbers Used.

The scriptures are systematically constructed. This system must be known if we would understand its teaching. I have before called attention to the use of the number seven, and the lesson taught by its use. Namely, the age of the world. It also stands for completeness in certain places. The number forty is another common number. Ninevah was warned forty days before hand of its overthrow. Israel was in the wilderness forty years. Samuel, Saul, David and Solomon each ruled Israel forty years in succession. Other kings did the same. It rained forty days before the flood. Moses was in the mount on two occasions with God, each time forty days. Christ fasted forty days. These with many more did not happen to be so, but taught a lesson of forty years in the feast of tabernacles. As Israel spied out the land forty days, the Lord said Israel would dwell in the wilderness forty years. That great experience to which the whole scripture points as one of the most remarkable in history is to be lived over again just prior to the coming of Christ when Israel will again dwell in booths which will appear later. So I understand the frequent use of the number forty has their central point. Namely, to the great truth of the future feast of tabernacles.

The number three is also a number so often used. Its central point is the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. Let the student look up this line of thought till it becomes fixed in the mind, then in reading the scriptures they will see their use.

The building of the temple to which we in another place call attention. The whole structure was to teach the complete organization of Israel with the teaching also of the law and the gospel. No text book is so well prepared to give the mind such a logical training as is the Bible.

Only the burnt offering, the meat offering and the peace offering were burned on the altar. The sin offering was burned without the camp. In the covenant made with Abraham, the everlasting covenant which was confirmed by the death of Christ, and sealed with his blood, the offering bought by Abraham was three years old. Hence the full grown ram represents, first, Christ when here, and second, a person of responsibility in knowledge and age, who offers it. These are all rules to be learned in order to understand the Bible. When the five books of Moses are once familiar, then the whole Bible can be easily understood. In order to understand symbolic teaching these rules must be learned well. Both as used in the law and second, as used by the prophets, in the study of prophecy. With this instruction we are prepared to proceed.

The symbols further used are the pine, the cedar, the olive and the fir trees. These represent the Lord's people. The cedar is a symbol of Christ. Hence used in the construction of the tabernacle. The oaks of Bashon symbolized the rulers of that country. The bramble when used signified a worthless, unprincipled person. These trees represent men. A bullock represents as stated a person of mature age. It taught the original sin of Adam. So it is used to represent the original sin in us. Hence used by the high priest and also the whole congregation as a sin offering. The heifer three years old taught the original sin of our mother Eve, who was first in the transgression. It is used also by the people to teach the lesson of salvation from that death which passed upon all men. The heifer being red with no spot on her, taught that sin covered us all over leaving no clean thing in us. The calf is used to teach original innocence, when a man is fully restored through forgiveness. The lamb represents Christ as an offering for the sin of the world. Also used by individuals when faith is exercised in Christ for forgiveness. The ram is used to represent Christ when here. The tabernacle was covered with rams' skins dyed red, signifying Christ the sin bearer, in his ministry. The priest and people also used the ram showing their faith in him and their consecration to the work of Christ. The goat represents a civil ruler of the Lord's people, who has sinned ignorantly in his work. Lev., chapters one to six. It is used the animal is used, neither any which has a blemish. Let these rules be well established in the mind. The students can't progress till they are learned.

## LEVIATHAN: WHAT IS IT?

In spite of the fact that the minor prophets use over and over the expression, "In the latter days" and "In that day," ministers who claim to be students of prophecy will contend that these prophecies had their fulfillment in ancient times.

In the forty-first chapter of the book of Job we find a very unique description of Leviathan. In Isa. twenty-seventh chapter the prophet completes the description carrying it to its final destiny and locates definitely the time when the prophecy has its application. Verse one says, "IN THAT DAY (which is the same as the expression, In the latter days) **the Lord** with his sore and great and strong sword, shall punish leviathan, the piercing serpent, even Leviathan that crooked serpent, and he shall slay the dragon that is in the sea."

Should anyone be in doubt as to the meaning of IN THAT DAY, let him note what follows: What does he punish with his sword? "And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite the nations . . . ." Rev. 19.50. When will he smite the nations? All will say, at his coming, at the battle of Armageddon. Therefore we must conclude that the whole prophecy has its application in the last days.

Now what are the main features or characteristics of leviathan? First, it is a nation to be slain at his coming. Second, it must be of great prominence at the coming of the Lord. Third, it is an island power. Fourth, It lies in the shape of a serpent. Fifth, it is called the dragon in the sea. Sixth, it is a piercing serpent.

Now let the reader look the world over and see if he can identify the leviathan. Unquestionably the eye must rest on Japan as the only nation in the whole world that fulfills the six specifications mentioned above. Of course it is Japan, and always will be That Japan is coming into great prominence Japan. there is no question. It is an island power. Its physical outline is that of a serpent. Its nature is the same. The dragon in the sea, indicates that it is an unrelenting heathen power. At this point I must use Elder Rupert's illustration of the lost horse. The owner will describe specifically the animal to be searched for, describing all the marks, brands, color, weight, etc. Anyone finding the animal takes it up with the assurance that there are no two animals that. will answer to the same description. So the prophets use this method all through their writings.

It matters not whether we believe that Leviathan is Japan or not. The description says that Japan is the nation that fills the bill.

Let those who are always studying Daniel 2, 7, 8 and 9 stop and take a glance at some of the other Old Testament prophecies and see if they do not mention many things equally as important as the book of Daniel. A careful study of these prophecies will remove that narrowness found in teaching just one or two books and give the student a chance to teach the whole Bible. I thank the Lord that I have such confidence in the whole scripture that I am not afraid to believe and teach it.

Japan being the chief of the heathen nations will no doubt be the main factor on the side of the heathen in that struggle. Do you realize why she so mysteriously stepped out of the late war? It was for this very reason, "In measure when it shooteth forth, thou wilt debate with it: he stayeth his rough wind in the day of the east wind." Isa. 27:8. The rough wind being Armageddon and the east wind, the kings of the east against Christendom. He shot fourth in the late war but was debated with and is now preparing and waiting for the proper time. It simply stood by and took lessons in all the horrors of warfare.

"Upon earth there is not his like who is made without fear. He beholdeth all high things. HE IS A KING OVER ALL THE CHILDREN OF PRIDE." Job 41:33, 34. "Out of his breath kindleth coals and a flame goeth out of his mouth." V. 21. Nearly everyone knows how fire was used in the late war. No doubt it will be used much more effectively by the heathen. The desastating effect is vividly described by the prophet in these words: "Yet the defenced city shall be desolate, and the habitation forsaken and left like a wilderness: there shall the calf feed, and there shall he lie down and consume the branches thereof." Isa. 27:10. The calf here mentioned is leviathan as united with the rest of the heathen who seem for a while to be master of the situation.

"By this shall the iniquity of Jacob be purged; and this is ALL THE FRUIT to take away his sin: when he maketh all the stones of the altar chalk stones that are beaten in sunder, the groves and the images shall not stand up." V. 9. Let the reader note that this is all the fruit, this closes the drama, the number of the saved are made up and God's work in the earth for sinners comes to a close. Not an honest soul will then be left in all the churches of Babylon as their systems of worship will totter and fall.

Space will not permit of a discussion of the entire two chapters referred to above, but the reader can continue the study at his leisure. Suffice it to say that a careful study of these two chapters will reveal the fact that Japan will in the near future surprise the entire world with its power and destructive inventions of warfare.

That Japan has come to be a very great nation goes without saying. Fifty years ago she was practically an isolated nation of small importance. Now she is feared by other nations because of her greatness. England and the United States have concluded that they must stand shoulder to shoulder in order to cope with the little nation that has in such a short time grown to be a wealthy warlike monster. She has made loans to China till she practically controls all the important factories and major industries of that great nation.

For several years Japan has had men in military training in the United States acquainting themselves with the methods of warfare and habits of Americans. She now has German officers training her soldiers in her own country. You see by this that she recognizes Germany's methods of warfare as superior to that of any other nation. This gives us an inkling of the coming conflict. She is now sending military officers into China to train the Chinese in the latest that she has learned. By this we see that when the time comes for God to use the heathen to punish his professed people for their transgression of his law, China will tread to the music of Japan.

If Japan is not Gog at that time by control of Russia, the land of Magog, she will unite with Gog as will all the heathen. Eze. 38:3-7. Making a vast

army of two thirds the population of the world.

About the first of December last there appeared in the Denver Times the following headlines: "CHINESE LEAGUE DELEGATES WARN THAT JAPS ARE PREPARING FOR WAR ON AMERICA. ADVISE U. S. TO BUILD UNDER SEA GIANTS TO COMBAT YELLOW FOE. . . . . STRUGGLE MAY COME IN 1924."

Many are now agreed that on account of our very strained relations with Japan on the imigration question, that war is inevitable. But Japan will not declare war till the time for the kings of the east to move out. This is called by the prophets, "The time of the heathen."

Jeremiah's warning to leave Babylon applies at this time. "My people, go ye out of the midst of her, and deliver ye every man his soul from the fierce anger of the Lord. And lest your heart faint, and ye fear for the rumor that shall be heard in the land: a rumor shall come in one year, and after that in an other year shall come a rumor, and violence in the land, ruler against ruler." Jer. 51:45, 46.

In the above scripture is given the sign for the remnant to leave Babylon. Whether the rumor spoken of is a declaration of war from the heathen, or the enforcement of the mark of the beast, I cannot at present say. I will leave this for those who are more competent.

"And it shall come to pass in that day, that the Lord shall beat off from the channel of the river unto the stream of Egypt, and ye shall be gathered ONE BY ONE, O YE CHILDREN OF ISRAEL." Isa. 27:12. It would seem from this that the remnant will be gathered as the kings of the east begin to move. The way of the kings of the east is here called the channel of the river. The remnant to be gathered, not as a whole church, but ONE BY ONE.

"And it shall come to pass in that day, that the great trumpet shall be blown, and they shall come which were ready to perish in the land of Assyria, and the outcasts in the land of Egypt, and shall worship the Lord in the holy mount at Jerusalem." The modern land of Assyria is always the land of the heathen. Egypt in the above as in some other scripture applies to professed Christendom. By this we see that the remnant are gathered from the entire world. The lessons taught by the prophets have their culmination in the last days; therefore we must study not only a part of the scriptures but the entire book.

The "We don't believe this part of the Bible age," will soon be a thing of the past. May the Lord help all honest souls to get down to business.

## URGES WAR ON BOLSHEVISM

#### Former Commander-in-Chief of German Armies in East Says If Red Terror Is Not Conquered It Will Engulf Europe.

Bolshevism must be smashed or it will engulf Europe.

This is the belief of General Hoffman, former commander-in-chief of the German army in the east and one of the leading German representatives at the Brest-Litovsk peace conference, the result of which was to take Russia out of the war. General Hoffman, who had much to do with sending Lenine into Russia to demoralize the Russian armies, now favors an international army to invade Russia and drive the Bolsheviki out of power. Unless this is done he predicts the engulfing of Europe by the Red Terror. "All the armed efforts to overthrow the Soviet government made hitherto—by Kolchak, Denikine and Wrangel—have simply served to strengthen the Soviet government," says General Hoffman. "The leaders of the volunteer armies have failed to measure properly the strength of the Soviet armies and the dexterity of the Red devil. The anti-Bolshevist generals fell victims of their own mistakes. their over-confidence and the complexities of the international situation. The army of General Wrangel suffered defeat chiefly because it was supported only by France.

#### Can Be Crushed Easily.

"I declare emphatically that Bolshevism can be crushed into dust by a real, international armed force. An international army corps, composed, among others, of the troops of General Wrangel evacuated from the Crimea under the general command of a Russian, could liquidate the Soviet government in very short time. Such an international corps, beginning operations in the vicinity of Petrograd, could very soon clear Russia of its 3,000 Bolsheviki. I mean the 3,000 commissars. The rest are simply Bolshivik tools, operating within the Bolshevik bureaucracy.

"The international force I suggest would meet with very little resistance, for it would not be a national army but one composed of international scum and riff-raff. I know full well the fighting quality of the Red army, which is very much exaggerated. The Soviet herdes would turn to flight at the very first clash with well armed opponents.

#### German Strategists Needed.

"We Germans do not seek to play the leading role in the overthrow of the Russian tyranny. It is all the same to me who will lead the international anti-Bolshevik army—Pershing, Joffre or Foch—but the participation of German strategists is necessary to success.

"The Soviet of People's Commissaries will capitulate immediately upon the fall of Petrograd or Dno."

Comenting on the part he himself played to break up the Russian armies, General Hoffman says:

"As the commander in chief of the eastern front I was in charge of propaganda within the Russian army. While the war was in progress the general staff, of course, used everything possible to break through the Russian front. One of the measures we utilized—call it poison gas or anything you please was Lenine.

"The imperial German government transported Lenine into Russia in a sealed car for a definite purpose. Lenine and his friends demoralized the Russian army with our consent. State Secretary Kuhlmann, Count Czernin and myself concluded peace with them at Brest-Litovsk for no other purpose than to be able to shift our armies to the west front.

"While negotiating at Brest with these gentlemen we were deeply convinced that they would not stay in power more than two or three weeks. I ask you to believe the word of honor of a German general that had we been able to foresee the consequences, the misfortunes which would befall humanity as a result of our dispatch of Lenine to Russia, we would never have entered into relations with the Bolsheviki under any circumstances."—Selected from Utica (N. Y.) Saturday Globe (Jan. 22, 1921).

#### WHY DID SACRIFICES AND OBLATIONS CEASE? Dan. 9:27.

It has been taught that the death of Christ caused the sacrifices and oblations to cease because they were no longer of any good. That type met antitype, hence, they ended.

The above I now hold to be a gross error and a misapplication of the text. No one claims that Christ caused oblations to cease, for they are all willing to receive oblations still. I ask in what sense if it was Christ that caused these things to cease, was it caused to cease? I answer, the death of Christ marked the end of the old covenant with the Jewish people, as a nation. The covenant "then vanished away," and by doing so, as the text next states the way was now open for the over spreading of abominations, (Roman army in A. D. 70) "to make it desolate till the consumation. End of the world, and that determined (time set). The end of the world being determined it shall then be poured upon the desolater. Thus the ending of the sacrifice had no reference whatever to type meeting antitype or doing away with the law. We can only say it is too bad that such gross errors should be taught to the people.

We are further told that the rending of the vail signified that all the law had then been fulfilled. Too bad that such a text could not be found to sustain it.

That tabernacle was the tabernacle of the covenant. It did show that that covenant no longer existed. Decay set in when the crown and diadem was removed and the ephod, the ark and so on at the captivity were taken away, and now the last vestage ended so far as God was concerned when the death of Christ took place. Why can't our teachers see some of these plain things?
