Crusader for peace to talk in PE

THANKS to Mr Solly Rubin, district governor of Lions International in the Eastern Cape and Midlands, Port Elizabeth will have a chance to hear one of the world's best-known crusaders for world peace, Mr Herbert W. Armstrong, after all.

The itinerary of Mr Armstrong, who is in South Africa as a guest of the South African Foundation, originally included only Johannesburg, Pretoria and Cape Town.

But Mr Rubin, an avid reader of Mr Armstrong's magazine "Plain Truth" for the past 10 years, felt Port Elizabeth should also hear the 84-year-old private ambassador's message.

So, on Tuesday, June 15, Mr Armstrong and his party will land at the H. F. Verwoerd Airport in their private Boeing, and move into three VIP suites in a beachfront hotel.

He will speak at 5.45pm that day in the Great Room of the Hotel Elizabeth on world peace and current affairs. The talk will end before 7pm.

Mr Rubin has invited leaders from all sections of the community to hear Mr Armstrong. "Lions believes in building bridges between all men," he said yesterday.

"Herbert Armstrong's principles fall closely in line with those of the Lions and of all service organisations. We align ourselves with him in the fight for world peace."

For Mr Rubin the visit of Mr Armstrong to Port Elizabeth will be his swan song as district governor of Lions. His term of office ends on June 19.
