CAPE TOWN. - One of the world's strongest and probably best - known crusaders for world peace, Mr Herbert W. Armstrong, had a clear message for troubled humanity yesterday: "Learn to give and we will have peace." But, as he explained at

"The natural way ociety is the way of get. t is the way of compeition, greed, lust and unnappiness, no matter how much was received."

In the opposite directowards peace and appiness, was the way of giving, Mr Armstrong aid. He said he was prac-

tical proof that his philosophy of concern for others worked. "Since we started we

have not solicited or asked for money or assistance from anyone," he said. Twenty-five charity jects, organised and paid for by his foundation, were in operation all over the world. Three colleges had been built and 12 million copies of Plain Truth were being circulated free.

Mr Armstrong and the ice-chairman of the vice-chairman foundation, Mr Stanley R. will travel South through Africa. South West Africa and Rhodesia for the next three weeks, addressing public lectures and meeting leaders in the business. political and other sectors and organising charity

projects.
