ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY ON ANGLO-ISRAELISM

The publications cited below are a product of the collective research done by John Halford and Rick Sherrod from 1987 - 1991. Most of the titles located below were found from research in either the *Library of Congress Catalog* or the *British Museum General Catalogue of Printed Books*. This bibliography is also the product of research done by Messrs. Halford and Sherrod between March - August 1991 at the Andover Divinity Library at Harvard University; the Sterling Memorial Library, the Beinecke Rare Books Library, and the Yale Center for British Art at Yale University; the Ransom Humanities Research Center at University of Texas at Austin; the Library of Congress in Washington, D. C.; the British-Israel World Federation Library in Putney, England; and the library holdings of the British Museum in London, England. Regarding the BIWF Library, their collection houses a vast archival record of the B-I movement itself, including records and photograph, e.g., those pertaining to the B-I college which existed in the early-20th century at the Harrow Weald Park Mansion in Middlesex. Recognition must also go to the Ambassador College Library staff and Ambassador College student, John Miller, Jr., who devoted dozens of hours to the location and analysis of British-Israel publications in the German and Italian language.

All the books cited below with an asterisk (*) are listed in the Library of Congress holdings. The number symbol (#) indicates a listing of the publication in the *British Museum General Catalogue of Printed Books*. The small print in this catalogue is difficult to read; consequently, some of the call numbers for books in the British Museum may be incorrect. The symbol (ac) indicates this volume is in the holdings of the Big Sandy, Texas Ambassador College Library. The symbol (b) indicates this volume is in the library of the British Regional Office of the Worldwide Church of God located at Elstree House in Borehamwood, England.

Not every book cited below may focus exclusively on British-Israelism. Each author, however, (excepting possibly Edersheim) takes a stance either for or against the doctrine, or, has written material which is relevant to it.

ALLEN, John Harden 1847 - 1930

There is a curious coincidence which links (probably unintentionally) Allen to Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong. It was from Allen's book *Judah's Sceptre* that Mr. Armstrong became acquainted with the truth of the identity of modern-day Israel. The 1st edition of this book listed in the Library of Congress holdings came out of Portland, Oregon (published in 1902; later editions most generally came out of Boston published by A. A. Beauchamp), the same state in which Mr. Armstrong began the Philadelphian era of God's Church. The next to last (in chronological order of copyright date) of Allen's publications listed in the Library of Congress holding and *Heraldry*. Allen wrote this book's "Preface and Dedication" written from 591 N. El Molino Avenue, Pasadena, California--only a few blocks from Ambassador College, and the same city where Mr. Armstrong did the Work of God for over four decades! Did Mr. Armstrong unwittingly follow the same geographical path of Allen?

Allen was a Bishop in the Wesleyan Methodist Church in the U.S.A.

Research done by Jim Franks while pastoring the Boston congregation of the Worldwide Church of God indicated John Wilson drew upon Brothers' work to produce what is generally credited as being the earliest monograph on British-Israelism. "Works by this author printed in America before 1801 are available in this library [of Congress] in the Readex Microprint edition of Early American Imprints published by the American Antiquarian Society. This collection is arranged according to the numbers in Charles Evans' American Bibliography. NB 0849070 DLC." Brothers is sometimes referred to as "Brothers, the prophet." At least one of his books was translated into French (*Prophéties de Jacques Brothers; ou, La connoissance rélévée des prophéties et des temps*, Paris: Chez les Marchands de Nouveautés, 1796--EX 5790 .21 .11).

The claim of *The Universal Jewish Encyclopedia* that Brothers took "these various ideas [about Anglo-Saxons being Israel]" and "systematized and raised [them] to the dignity of a creed, out of which the modern Anglo-Israelite movement has grown" is recklessly overdrawn. Systematization is simply *not there*. This reference work is, however, correct to cite Wilson's work as "the first clear exposition of the theory." (p. 316)

Brothers appears on the scene at roughly the same time God began bequeathing the Birthright Blessings to Joseph. The giving of these blessings is coincident with a faint, incipient yet distinct stirring of the English consciousness to an awareness of who they themselves truly were; to some of the key British-Israel truths later to be refined by men like John Wilson and, in our own day, Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong. In the arena of historical research, Sharon Turner (born only 11 years after Brothers), pushed forward the historiographical frontiers which revealed the trail of Israel from the regions of their Assyrian captivity to the British Isles. Certainly, Brothers appears to be near the edge (if not completely off) of the lunatic fringe of contemporary religious thought-far from being inspired by God! Was he a "red herring" produced by Satan shortly before God bequeathed the Birthright and revealed the identity of lost Israel? Compare to Acts 5:36-38.

Note that God used men like Pitt, Washington, and Wellington--Brothers' contemporaries, and men who were likewise unconverted and unaware of the basic essentials of God's truth--as instruments to fulfill the prophecies of Genesis 48-49.

James Morris observes, "As long as before the 1640s, it is said, a New England assembly of overseas Britons had passed the following resolutions: (1) The Earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof. *Voted*. (2) The Lord has given the earth or any part of it to his chosen people. *Voted*. (3) We are his chosen people. *Voted*. By mid-Victorian times these assumptions, warped by the theories of racialists like the Comte de Gobineau, and apparently supported by the hazily understood principles of Darwinism, were most virulently translated into colour prejudice." *Heaven's Command*, p. 448.

The time is 12:30 p.m., and I'm at the Harry Ransom Humanities Research Center, University of Texas at Austin Campus, examining the book by Richard Brothers entitled A Correct Account of the Invasion and Conquest of the Roman Colony Alboine of

Britain by the Saxons. In the title on the title page there is a secondary title line which reads "never published before; and which is very interesting to the present English, who are descended from these great and brave men." The earliest reference (which we have found) to this alteration in the title of Brothers' 1822 publication is found in Cecil Roth's biography of Brothers, Nephew of the Almighty (see below). The changed title creates a false impression of the contents of the book.

This volume is striking in terms of its purely historical nature. Much of what Brothers usually included in his earlier writings was laced with scripture, apocalyptic emphasis, and the projection of the images of Daniel or John in the book of Revelation onto contemporary events. This work is almost entirely free from references to scripture, and appears to be more a work of history than theology or prophecy.

This work is incorporated in a larger volume with several of Brothers works entitled *Brother's Tracts*. Apparently it was owed by a man named Bar Prescot. Prescot makes numerous annotations throughout the collection of Brothers works. The initial work by brothers is entitled *A Letter to the Subscribers for Engraving the Plans of Jerusalem, the Kings Palace, the Private Palaces, College-Halls, Cathedrals, and Parliament Houses*. Prescot has written under the by-line which says "by Mr. Brothers." Prescot writes, "in the eleventh year of his captivity under Mr. Pitt's government." The year of publication is 1805.

In the volume entitled A Correct Account of the Invasion and Conquest, etc., Prescot has written a note on the title page that reads: "The lost history of our" and the next word is unclear—it perhaps is "Israel"—"forefathers revived from oblivion; showing from whom we are descended and where we ought to return to. Isaiah, in his 18th chapter foresaw us 2500 years ago. Bishop Honeley translates the first verse 'Ho! To the land shaded with wings that is, defended by our winged fleets!" Then in another note on the title page he continues "'apeople terrible from their beginning' says Isaiah: truly they have been terrible to their enemies. B. P."

The length of this volume is 142 pages. It was printed in London by R. George, East Street, Manchester Square, publication date 1822. The preface of the book begins with a discussion on how William of Normandy, upon his invasion of England, was most suspicious of the English and consequently worked vigorously to Normanize as much as he could.

On p. v of the preface, Brothers writes, "in William's time the Saxons of Rarlar were completely Frenchified, as anyone may be convinced on a comparison of their names with those of the English Saxons." On p. vi, Brothers writes, "my superiority of knowledge enables me to state what I do, which no other man in existence can, or I would have let the errors of fable pass by without the least contradiction, knowing that the monks where often guilty of writing such stuff; and those in Britain, from the mortal hatred they bore to the Saxons, were always ready to throw every action of deceit and treachery on them, misstating names, and misrepresenting circumstances."

The text of the book begins with a chapter entitled "A Memorandum." The subtitle a lengthy one reads "Of the Invasion and Conquest of the Principalities of Taura, Tiuer, and Semore, in the West of England, by the Saxons under Kerdic Hael, their chieftain and in the year 543; *it is an error of historians to guess at this invasion being in 512. And of the North of England by his grandson, Ethelfrid, in the year of 560; of Chester and North Wales in the year of 613."

Brothers diminishes his credibility considerably, at least by the standards of the historical-critical method in that frequently he will sight lengthy speeches (word for word) of various figures connected with the Saxon invasion. He quotes specifically those who were the leaders of the Saxons at the time of the invasion of the British isles. He claims that the Saxon invasion of 543 took place on June 1st [Pentecost of A. D. 543 fell on May 31] of that year and included a division of 20,000 men, all warriors, and their families. Their leader was Kerdic Hael. On p. 8 Brothers writes, "the great grandfather of Kerdic had come from Italy and his grandfather again from Judah; and being an officer of considerable abilities in the Roman army, he improved the system of warfare so much among the Saxons of that part he came to reside in, that he carried victory with ease wherever he fought, and thus gained the confidence and esteem of the people."

Brothers explains that England was attractive to the Saxons because of the prosperity that had been built in the region over several centuries of Roman colonization. Of note, a theme that is frequently sounded throughout the book is the Saxon name for England: "Angelland." Angelland is a term which alludes to the attractive nature and quality of the country. During its days as a Roman province, England or Britain was for several centuries, a very attractive area or a region. That's one of the reasons the Saxons immigrated to it.

Brothers dates the arrival of the fleet under Kerdic as June 2nd: "late in the afternoon, the fleet arrived of the coast of Sussex." It wasn't however until June 4th that the fleet was able to locate a suitable harbor. The length of the voyage up along the coastline looking for a place to debark enabled two

Briton chieftains, one named Tiuer on the East and Taura on the West to prepare to meet Kerdic militarily once they did land and debark. Thus Kerdic was confronted on both sides, once he landed, by hostile enemies. It is interesting that Brothers' account of this confrontation on pp. 19-24 reads in a very similar fashion to the Biblical account describing Joab and his brother Abishai when they were sandwiched between two hostile armies the Ammonites and Syrians (II Sam. 10:8-10).

The first 40 pp. are essentially an historical account of the invasion in the 6th century A.D. of the British Isles by the Saxons. William has been portrayed to this point as being something of an autocrat. In contrast p. 39 there is a quotation which illustrates the kind of Whiggish history I suspect influences Brothers approach. It reads [this is a Saxon speaking]: "but we on the contrary to them [the Britons inhabiting the British Isles and having lived under Roman influence], show mercy to all who ask for it and give liberty of departure to our enemies. We never enslave or sell anyone; nor as free men will we ever do anything of the kind."

On p. 43 there is a long direct quotation, allegedly the speech given by Tiuer, the Saxon commander, upon being overwhelmed/overcome by his Saxon opponents. The speech reflects again the Whiggish bias. It gives accolades to the Saxons for their clemency, their mercy extended after they had won the confrontation. This is consonant with contemporary Whiggish historiography and the notion that there is something inherent within the Saxon people which lends them to a more democratic approach to life in governing themselves. Relevant to this, on p. 9 there are numerous observations made by Brothers which tied the Saxon people back to the custom of the folkmote. Brothers writes about the jury of twelve men, "to assist the judge, with liberty to appeal from their verdict to all the people in court, or all the people at a folkmote, if such were in a field and the trial before them;" and a little later, "thus no Saxon of this government could be fined or punished, deprived of his life, liberty, or property, but by the majority of the public voice expressed against him in open court."

Speaking about the institution of grand juries he describes them as "noble" and he says, "if our present form [of grand jury] is not exactly like theirs, it yet partakes of its wise intention, its independence, and its virtues, for the better accomplishment of the divine intention of impartial justice to all men."

On p. 46, Brothers writes: "It is the law of the Saxons to show mercy when asked for, to give liberty to depart in safety, and to give a lot to all those who unite with us: but we never enslave people, because free ourselves; nor do we ever sell them, because we deem it dishonorable for brave warriors to traffic in their fellow creatures; we fight for territory to live on, and if we did not act as our great law directs, our chiefs would be confused, our generals would fail in knowledge, our weapons would fail us in battle, and we should become slaves in turn for having enslaved also others." This allegedly was a statement made by the Saxon commander confronting Tiuer. His name was Ima. Brothers' accounts of the Saxons in victory portrays them as a greatly magnanimous people who provide for their defeated opponents who survived.

On p. 46, Brothers takes a shot at the Tudor line, which he connects with the original Britain race. He makes reference to: "the history if the Tudors for the name and distinction of this man, whose descendant swayed the sceptre of England, and certainly partook of more cruelty, oppression, and injustice, than clemency, favor, and impartiality." (He of course if referring to Tiuer the Britain commander confronted by Ina.)

Page 51 illustrates the kind of monologue that Brothers seems to be inventing here. For instance, the Saxon leader Ina, about three weeks after his victory in the west, fell ill. After being surrounded by his generals and his principle officers, it says that he encouraged them. Then follows a quote, supposedly of what Ina said: "Our doctors say, I can not live beyond the time of two days. I bow my head with resignation to the almighty will of fate, knowing it was he who gave me courage and wisdom to imitate my excellent father, that with you his faithful friends, I might assist to establish the Saxon people in this island. But now, it seems that my course is run, and that I war no more. To leave a beloved wife and an infant son, fills my heart with grief: but heavy and great as my sorrow is for those two;" (now on page 52) "I will leave a memorial of regard, and foresight also, I hope, for the good of the people, that will make them praise me when dead the same as when living."

Pages 54-55, as well as some earlier sections, Brothers evidences a strong bias against the monks in general and the papacy in particular. He apparently has a strong disposition against both of those groups. On p. 56, regarding the teachings of the monks he says that because of them, "thus mankind are often circumstanced, believing error and renouncing truth, until almost overwhelmed with darkness."

Pages 56-57 relate how that after Ina died, his next brother Hael took his place. It is "from him the Hales of England are descended." Brothers also observes, "from him [Hael] the Wellesley's are descended, as the Pitts are from his father's general of that name, whom he settled at Dorchester," that is after Hael established a presence in the western region. He established a garrison which now today is known as Dorchester and he settled a number of Saxon families there. The point is that Wellesley, that is the Duke of Wellington of 19th century fame, was directly descended from Hael and William Pitt's line would have been descended from a general who served under Ina.

Pages 61-62 addresses the origin of the Saxons: "They were the greatest part of the ten tribes carried into captivity by Salmanazar, and placed on the borders of his empire, near Georgia and Armenia, as military guards against the incursion of the Tarters. They were stationary in Poland, with the Vistula for their barrier, in Caesar's time, and they did not reach further than their second barrier, the Elb, until the year 300. For thus by degrees, they conquered, then rested and multiplied."

On p. 63: "It was a later division of the Saxons coming out of Poland, who passed through France, under the distinction of Vandals, and settled in Spain."

After laying out the history of the initial Saxon campaign (particularly that where the Saxons confronted Taura and Tiuer), the next major discussion of battle experience is that of Ethelfrid around the mid-6th century and the continuing incursions of the Saxon people into the British Isles. The Saxon leaders in this account always come off looking benevolent and very kind hearted.

On p. 89, Ethelfrid is described in this way by Brothers: "He being of a mild and generous disposition, always forgave them on delivering up their arms [them meaning his Britain enemies], and restoring double to the people they had taken from."

On p. 96, Brothers discusses the etymology of the name Prescot and Bar Prescot. The original owner of the book has made a footnote in his own handwriting at the bottom of the page, observing that about three hundred years ago the name was written "Prestcote: cote to cover in terms of its meaning."

Pages 111-112 describe Ethelfrid who "lived to an age of 75, when he died universally lamented by the Saxons from one end of England to the other. He was the greatest warrior and the wisest chieftain of his time. His fame had spread over the continent, and throughout all England: and his praise for his liberal acts flowed with admiration from everyone's lips. The monks of those times, usually distinguished him as a king, but the Saxons as their chief."

From p. 112: "Had not the Danes, in their turn of invasion and conquest of England, destroyed all the writings, records, and monuments of the Saxons,

that they could lay their hands on, we should know more than we do of our Saxon ancestors, their laws, their policy of governing, and great actions in war. But as it is, we know nothing comparatively, even their very names we do not know the meaning of."

Page 114 discusses the Britons of England at the time of the Saxon invasions. "Let it be reflected on, that the inhabitants of Alboine at this time were in a civilized state, and converted to a belief in Christianity; they formed a numerous population of hardy men, and spread from the north of Scotland to the south of Cornwall. They were not the naked savages of Caesar's time, but were all clothed, and lived comfortably. Among them many Romans had settled, who now made common cause with them, to discipline them, to form armies, and to instruct them how to fight with policy and skill."

On pp. 113-115 Brothers makes frequent mention to the "providential" direction or unfolding of circumstances which enabled the Saxons to conquer the island in the first place. His view is that the odds were against them being successful in that regard.

On p. 116 is found a typical example of Brothers' use of the etymology of names. He works diligently throughout the text to tie them back to Saxon linages. "Drax" he identifies as the origin of Drake, "a great west Saxon family, who came over with Kerdic."

On p. 119 is yet another reference to the jury system and the democratic quality and nature of the Saxons in terms of their governing of themselves.

On pp. 120-121 is a discussion of Saxon religion and place of origin: "The Saxons were neither pagans nor idolaters in the least. Their traditional accounts, though very imperfect, from length of time and variety of settlements, with almost a constant state warfare to dispose some and oppose other great bodies of people, gave them a faint knowledge of their numerous long journeys, their Aslatic origin, and where they came from. But as long as they got more and more acquainted with the Christians, they heard of the new reign of Christianity, and that all who believed in it would never want anything." On p. 121, Brothers writes about the Saxons resisting "the crafty monks" who tried to convert them. They "resisted every frightful tale of purgatory and hell, as well as the communion of godliness with their wives and daughters in holes and corners, by private confession of sins." Here he's taking a potshot at the practice and ritual of Roman Catholicism.

Brothers blames the monks of England on spreading a reputation that the Saxons were brutal, inhuman and barbaric, as well as being idolatrous. On p.

121, he writes: "the monks, boldly and audaciously, accuse the Saxons of every degree of committing all the crimes complained of." On p. 122, he calls the monks "idle drones in monasteries". On that same page he says that celibacy is "a state contrary to the law of nature, and contrary to the express command of God to Noah after the flood, which makes all such associations abominable, unholy, and wicked." On p. 123, he refers to "the pernicious custom of private confession, the greatest hold of superstitious fraud upon the human mind that was ever invented to cheat of deceive." He goes on to say "if monks desire to be holy, they must conform to the written will of God in the scripture, and marry like the Levites, whom they pretend to imitate."

On p. 124, Brothers writes: "the monks were persevering warriors one way or other, privately or openly. Every opportunity they watched, and every lie they invented, to misrepresent the Saxon, and to stir up the Britain to war against him." Brothers alleges that the monks, anticipating Ethelfrid's death (which came shortly thereafter in 1613 A.D.), stirred up a rebellion, particularly in North Wales, to go out and make war against the Saxons, taking advantage of circumstances now that the king of longstanding was about to die.

On pp. 125-127, Brothers polemic is obvious. He is trying to roll back the traditional historiography, or any historiography which casts Ethelfrid in the role of a pagan barbaric Saxon. He would argue that the monks tried to paint not only the Saxons, but Ethelfrid in particular, in that way. He rounds out these thoughts by observing (on p. 127): "My own account of the Saxons every way, from beginning to end, is the only true one ever published. The Saxon records of early times were, almost all, destroyed by the Danes, in their fury of firing every place they came to; and the policy of the Normans being to suppress likewise those records, in order to keep the people from looking back to their free institutions, great generals, and brave ancestors they completed the ruin of what the former had left. The accounts we have now are nothing but detached pieces from the cells of monks in after ages; they wrote them from the hearsay of others, and those again in the process of time varied the accounts, as prejudice or fancy influenced the mind."

On p. 128, Brothers again cites the "Saxons" regarding their "impartial administration of justice, and free government. My own account is the most correct that was ever published: the names of families, parishes, towns, and places, verify every occurrence I have stated."

On p. 130, referring to the monks, Brothers writes: "These were the kind of men who lived by the hundreds in monasteries, herding together like so many swine, whom the natives were to believe as holy, and to be guided by in divine knowledge. There were no regular ties at that time [in] Britain, but the monks extorted double the value by begging (practice which was forbidden by the Saxons and which was severely punished through corporal punishment), and thus kept the people very poor." In all of this, Brothers is linking the monks to the native Britons and attributing to them the conflict between Britain and Saxon which is rooted in racial difference more so than religious difference.

On p. 133, Brothers makes an interesting, a provocative observation. He talks about, "the fraud of the monks: the one for giving away what have might have descended to them, and the other for procuring it through the means of private confession and religious delusion; which will ever be the case, while the old part of the Bible is rejected, and the new part but partially explained."

On p. 134, he speaks of the government which succeeded Ethelfrid, that being government under the direction of his eldest son. He, Brothers goes on to write, "in consequence of this wise reflection by the chiefs, they advise the people of every district under the governments, to hold great folkmotes in order to choose Earlemen (first man) to form a great wittenmote in the capital, to assist the king in counselling for the public good to raise armies when necessary, and to make wise laws. For the better administration of justice the people chose, of course the chiefs, the members of his family, and the popular descendants of their former great generals. This was the first representative form of legislative assembly among the Saxons of England."

Brothers has very little good to say about the Danes. He talks about their brutality in slaughtering the inhabitants when they came to Britain burning and pillaging. On p. 135, he writes: "no age or sex escaped the fury of the barbarians." This goes back to the comment cited on p. 134, i.e., the post Ethelfrid period lead to the rise of the Heptarchy and the confusion injected by the Danish invasions created a new situation.

Brothers, on p. 135, writes: "this condition of the country accelerated the change of government, or disillusion of the Heptarchy. To oppose the enemy everywhere successfully would be an act that could be much better directed by one man, than by many independent of each other."

Page 136 includes a discussion regarding the Saxon inclination toward democracy. The centralization of government, according to Brothers, "highly offended the Saxons; they considered it no less than a designed fraud on their liberty to take away their representatives, that he [the new king, Egbert—descended from the line of Ethelfrid's second eldest son] might convert them to his own purposes of ambition."

On p. 138, Brothers writes: "thus, a representation for the people in the *Great Wittenmote* of the nation (now called a parliament) proceeded from the wisdom and caution of the old chiefs, or kings of the Heptarchy, who advised the people to it, while the distinction of earls and nobs (now nobles) proceeded from Egbert, the first universally chosen king of Angelland, then pronounced En-geland, and now contracted to England." Brothers praises the new system arguing that it reflected the "honor on both king and people."

Still, on p. 138, Brothers observes: "afterwards the representative body increased by towns and burrows uniting to send one, others two, from them, according to their population; which again was a wise measure for, as all were free alike the descendants of the first Saxons, so all men alike to choose, and to send up a representative body from among them. The great wittenmote, or *great wise meeting*, assembled once every year at least, sometimes oftener if the king required it; and every third year [begin p. 139] a new election for a representative body of early men (earls) took place. The Danes broke up this excellent form; but it luckily revived again, though feebly, when the Normans in their rage for destroying everything that was Saxon, laid it in ruins; but not being able to govern without restoring some part of the old form, they changed the wittenmote into a parliament, and allowed representatives to be sent from privileged places only."

Brothers purpose in writing this book seems almost entirely absent of British Israel notions. There are very few references along that line: only pp. 61, 62, and 120 include anything on it. It seems more an effort to interpret history through pro-Norman spectacles, or, alternatively, in a polemical sense, using it as an opportunity to strike out at the Monastic System and Roman Catholicism.

On p. 140, Brothers again take a shot at the monks: "the monks have bewildered their minds [the Saxons], and made the bravest people in the world some of the most indolent." To wit, Brothers blames the monks for undermining the moral and character of the Saxons over the course of time between their original conquest of the Britons and leading up to the conquest of the Saxons by the Normans (beginning at the battle of Hastings).

He alleges (pp. 140-141) that in contrast to the times of Ethelfrid, the Saxons were unwilling to rally to the call to arms that was issued in the eleventh century as the Normans were on the verge of crossing the channel and taking control of the area of England.

On p. 142, the last page of the book, Brothers makes an observation which is not meant to apply to the identity of the Saxon people linking them to the Israelites, but certainly could. He is using or making this comment in reference to how the veneer of Norman culture and things Norman have been spread on things Saxon. "So mutable are all things, and so great the devastator of names and titles is time, that man, constituted as he is, cannot, seemingly, by any degree of prudence oppose, nor by any degree of wisdom guard against, the mighty changes passing in succession under its sphere." And that is the final sentence of the book.

The first work appearing in this collection of "Brothers' Tracts" is *A Letter to the Subscribers for Engraving the Plans of Jerusalem, etc.* by Brothers. Brothers makes reference on pp. 8-9 to the implied restoration of the Hebrew people in Genesis 49, even "before God had formed them as a nation; in 11th, 25th, 27th, 43rd, and 49th chapters of Isaiah, their restoration is plainly foretold; and in the 52nd, 54th, and 60th chapters of the same, the building of their capital with the solemn promise of being affirmed by all nations under heaven, as plainly expressed as the fingers are seen of on a man's hand but to determine the moment that God will reveal his visible power for their departure now, as he did before, for their departure from Egypt, I am not informed to communicate; suffice it to say that the utmost periods recorded for their dispersion, are expired, since 1794 and 1798. Knowing all this from the almighty, I am better enabled to state what I do, and give to the world the model of that city, which is to be built by it, the capital of a peculiar people."

On pp. 10-12 of this book Brothers gives an extremely explicit and strong statement that he (as he perceives, verified in prophecy itself) is the individual who will firstly publish the information about the restoration of the Hebrew people, and secondly, he will be the one who will be their king to affect that restoration.

From the marginal notes that Prescot has left in this particular volume, it is apparent that Prescot himself was in England and made attempts from time to time to see Brothers while Brothers was incarcerated in the asylum. Prescot's notes indicate that he was denied that opportunity. In the margin of p. 17, he compares Brother's situation to that of Jeremiah's, where Jeremiah was imprisoned in the dungeon by the ministers of Zedekiah.

The second article or item in this collection of Brother's tracts is entitled *The Ruins of Balbec in Palmyra, in their present state, described and explained from the plates of Robert Wood Esquire. Under Secretary of State to his Britannic majesty, proved to be Lebanon House in Tadmor in the desert, the palaces of Solomon, King of Israel* (copyright 1821). It begins with a letter to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent of the United Kingdom from Richard Brothers dated September 30, 1815.

The third item included is entitled A description of Jerusalem, according to scripture; published in support of the Bible, and the divine revelation it contains, for the benefit of all denominations and distinctions of people on earth (London, This particular part of the volume has incredible detail, July 1821). information, etc. regarding what the city of Jerusalem architectural (presumably the new Jerusalem) will look like. Toward the end of the section on pp. 86-87, Brothers makes an observation which may connect to some degree with British Israelism: "This is what God said to the father of the Israelites in the 35th chapter and verse 11 of Genesis. 'I am God almighty, be fruitful and multiply; a nation, and a company of nations, (meaning many) shall be of thee, and kings shall come out of thy loins.* Not only the Danes and Swedes, but the Germans, Dutch, Flemmins, Normans, Picards, Franks, English, Lombards, Lowlanders of Scotland, and Easterlings of Ireland, are from this man, but most of the Spaniards and Portuguese, as well as the Greeks, Poles, and Russians. The Mexicans and Peruvians are likewise from him, and owe their origin to some of the ships of Solomon being compelled to remain in those countries when on their way home by that route, instead of the usual one, westward from Japan and China to the Red Sea."

In the first article to appear, A Letter to the Subscribers for Engraving the Plans of Jerusalem etc, Brothers argues for political support—the support of statesmen of his day to facilitate the repopulation of the Promised Land. He argues that it would be profitable in terms of stimulating European and Near Eastern commerce and makes his argument based on those grounds.

This is noted particularly on pp. 13-14. Page 16 may include an implicit reference to the Englishman being connected to the Northern Kingdom. Brothers writes: "How easy, and what a pleasure will it be to English nobleman and rich Jews, to come occasionally in their yachts, or embark from the south of Spain, France, Italy, or Greece, to visit their vineyards and fine estates until by their attention they become valuable sources of wealth to their families. To be sure all things at first commence with trouble, but with care and industry of man they are soon conquered; therefore, like the wastelands of any other country those Syric, those of Syria, Asia Minor, Chaldea, Egypt, and Cyrene, will be made productive by tillage."

He shows sensitivity to the concern about prophecies of a restored Israel (e.g., pp. v, 46, 51, 93), but at this point in his work, there is still no hard and fast connection proposed in writing between the Lost Ten Tribes and the Anglo-Saxons. Brothers speaks of the "visible Jews" (e.g., p. 195) distinct from the Lost tribes (see also v. 2, pp. 371-372 by Halhed in Rare Books collection at Library of Congress). In the Preface, and on p. 51, Brother's predicts the restoration of the Hebrews to Jerusalem by 1798.

Brothers claims he is able to reveal "considerably more than what this Book contains." p. vii. He claims special revealed knowledge has been given to him. His awareness of the "day for a year" principle is evident (see p. 16). He claims "national laws are undesignedly made to oppose Christ" (p. 32). His approach smacks of disloyalty if not treason.

Brothers identifies the Turks as Esau, p. 45; however, he claims special revelation has shown him that their emperor is descended from Jonathan, son of Saul. He identified the Pope as the Beast of Rev. 17, and the harlot as Rome (p. 70).

He identifies himself with the Zerubbabel of Zechariah and Haggai (p. 48), as well as the Elijah of Mal. 4 (p. 208 and Appendix, p. 12). Brothers claims descent from David, King of Israel (p. 55). "It is fifteen hundred years since my family was separated from the Jews, and lost all knowledge of its origin.

... Told to me by revelation." (p. 66, and Preface to Book 2, pp. xxxvii, last paragraph; see Appendix, pp. 8-9). Page 55 also establishes a link to JOSEPH. Brothers claims the Countess of Buckinghamshire is descended from him. "There are many families of the fame origin as those three I have named, made known to me by revelation, but I am forbid to mention of them at present for public knowledge." WAS THIS A RED HERRING DRUG BY SATAN IN FRONT OF THE BRITISH PUBLIC. DID SATAN HAVE HOPES OF DISCREDITING THE B-I MOVEMENT IN ADVANCE OF ITS ESTABLISHMENT? Might not Satan (who would have known) have given Brothers such information--possibly even some accurate and correct information--for this purpose? Brothers work is laced with claims of visions (e.g., pp. 55-56, A PASSAGE WORTH COPYING AT A LATER DATE).

Brothers identifies London as spiritual Babylon, pp. 57-58. Isn't this like Satan's style of calling black white and up down (cf. Acts 17:6)?

Regarding his personal peculiarities, he refused to take oaths or swear (see Anecdotes of Richard Brothers," Appendix, pp. 3-5 from the Register of the Times, 1795; it describes Brothers as eccentric but selfless with many admirable qualities).; he was a pacifist. Note pp. 76-77 where he speaks of oaths and war as "two evils enforced by law."

Brothers outlines a whole new political structure for Great Britain. His plan prescribes the division of Britain into 12 territories, each to be named after one of the 12 tribes of Israel.

Brothers claims he is Jewish but his family--his "immediate Ancestors have been separated from the jews such a considerable length of time as to make them forget they ever belonged to such a name." He also reflects the concern of the late-18th century identifying himself as the "revealed Prince allotted to order the sudden return of the Hebrews from all nations and govern them in the Land of Israel." (p. iv) The narrative includes considerable reproduction of scripture. Specifically, Brothers claimed Jewish descent from James, the oldest son of Mary by Joseph (he cites Mt. 12:55), noting the use of the word "Brethren" as a prophecy about himself, i.e., "meaning his Brothers." (p. 87) Brothers identifies himself with the lamb of Rev. 14:1-5 (p. 104). He demanded that the king give over his crown to himself, to be revealed as "Prince of the Hebrews"--a treasonous mandate (p. 106). Brothers likens George III to Pharaoh who wouldn't listen to Moses (p. 106), and prophesies the invasion of Britain (written at a time of international chaos, i.e., the French Revolution of 1789). The letter including such demands went to both George III and Pitt.

Brothers identifies the winged lion of Dan. 7 (Babylon) with George III about to have his wings plucked and be reduced to "the condition of other men possessing similar thoughts." (p. 8--interestingly, the government had Brothers committed to an asylum; given the mental fragility of George III in his latter days, one wonders whether he himself might have been a suitable roommate for "Brothers the Prophet"). Brothers besought George III and Pitt the Younger "in the most earnest and respectful language, not to join in the war on any account whatever, or even encourage it" (pp. 8, 21--involvement would mean "the absolute certainty of losing all they [the English people] possessed being destroyed. ... to support a war which is in consequences to fulfill the Judgment of God, is designed to throw down for ever the English monarchy." See also pp. 22, 42. In effect, Brothers was discouraging the positioning of Britain to acquire the double portion of the Birthright from brother Reuben, i.e., a part of God's plan (I Chron. 5:1-2). It would be Satan's style to call white black and up down... so why not call London (not the 5th resurrection of the Holy Roman Empire to come under Napoleon in only about 10 years) Babylon or warn off fighting the coming Napoleonic Beast power?

Satan, who would shortly bring Napoleon on stage to head the 5th resurrection of the H.R.E., appears to be using Brothers to thwart fulfillment of the prophecies of Joseph's ascendancy which would have come to fruition during the very generation in which Brothers lived. Brothers declared the French Revolution and the execution of Louis XVI as proceeding "entirely from the Judgment of God to fulfill this prophecy of Daniel" (pp. 8, 19). He applies Rev. 13--the "deadly wound"--to Charles I of England (i.e., his beheading in 1649) and the healing of that wound to the Stuart Restoration (1660). (pp. 11, 102). He identified the Beast of Rev. 13:1-5 as "the English monarchy; and by its ships and commerce that it has rose from the sea to such astonishing grandeur and magnitude. The Heads, Horns, and Crowns, allude to the many departments of government and their splendid distinctions" (p. 101). In this, Brothers is again reversing roles (i.e., Israel is portrayed as

the Beast), i.e., God's blessing to Abraham is the root of British economic and commercial ascendancy.

Brothers describes in great detail his belief about end time prophecies which he believed were being fulfilled by contemporary events and through the powers of the European nation-states. His writings are highly charged politically. No wonder the British government had him locked up in an asylum.

He claimed that God had commanded him to speak directly delivering his prophetic message to Parliament. On May 17, 1792, he went to do so only to be rebuffed by the Speaker's messenger.

He claimed that the U. S. would declare war on England (cf. War of 1812), and applied Isa. 41:1 & 25 (Brothers identified himself as the one whom God had raised up from the North--note p. 99) to himself (as well as the Elijah of Mal. 4--see pp. 88-89, 108). He also claimed to have remarkable visions applicable to the present European political context. Brothers correctly predicted the death of the King of Sweden (pp. 18-19, 67-71).

The editor notes that Brothers' "books have excited the public curiosity, in a much greater degree than any other upon the same subject [i.e.,prophecy]." (p. xii) He casts Brothers not as a wild-eyed fanatic, but rather a well-meaning man.

The book well-illustrates the religious climate of the late-18th century--very sensitive to prophecies, visions, etc.

Under William Bryans' testimony on Brothers behalf (pp. 475-477)--a title reading "To the Children of Israel, wherever scattered, under the multitude of names which Christendom is divided into, (that Great Wilderness in which the Church is hid:) and also the Dispersed of Judah in all Nations." Assurance is given that their "day of deliverance being at hand, to put down oppression, and to restore"--(which was true, i.e., did happen given the outcome of the Napoleonic Wars!). See also p. 479, 557.

On pp. 569-571, there is a discussion of Brother's generous dealing with, attitude toward the French. On pp. 540-545, a section entitled "On the Sabbath" explains why there is no longer a need to observe it.

Rector of Wonston, Hants. Dallas wrote extensively on many Biblical topics. Among his publications are:

Drawn from 3 sermons, 2 preached at St. Bride's Church in Liverpool and one at West Street Chapel in London. Ch. 4 (pp. 41-60) predicts the restoration of Judah-Benjamin and the ten tribes to the Holy Land. Dallas notes "the great difficulty arising from the fact, that now, for upwards of 2,500 years, the ten tribes of Israel have not only ceased to be known as a distinct people, but that no satisfactory traces can be found of any one individual of them. The latter part of the former argument however, places in our hand a key which enables us to unlock every door which this difficulty closes against us. That argument establishes the proposition that the whole system of God's dealing with the Jewish nation is one of miraculous providence, as contrasted with the providence of natural causes by which he influences the destinies of other nations. ... It is quite reasonable to expect that the future course of events for the Jewish nation will be miraculous" (pp. 42-43). This is interesting in light of the fact that Wilson's seminal book was published two years before this one and the reference to "2500 years." "Speculations as to how the ten tribes are to re-appear, in order to [realize] their restoration, must be as utterly useless, and may be as dangerous, as an attempt to navigate the vast ocean without a compass or the sight of a star" (p. 45). "A reasonable anticipation of the restoration of both Judah and Israel to their land may be drawn from these passages, which cannot be challenged; an anticipation so reasonable that it might be maintained in argument, as a matter of certainty, if not other ground were at hand" (p. 46-47). He follows this assertion with many exemplary passages of scripture to demonstrate his point.

The Restoration of Israel to Be Anticipated from the Unchangeable Nationality of the Jews, and God's Miraculous Dealings Toward Them. From pp. 325-371 in Fremantle's Israel Restored. 1841. 1356.g.6.

Barbara Tuchman observes, "Certain Puritan theorists evolved the scheme of recalling the Jews to England in order that their conversion under the proper auspices might proceed as soon as possible ... That the restoration of Israel would follow conversion [of the Jews] was

part of accepted theology." Sir Henry Finch "predicted the restoration in the near future of temporal dominion to the Jews and the establishment by them of a world-wide empire . . . The Puritans believed that . . . the Jews, once in contact with Puritanism, would no longer resist conversion . . . Jews could not start on their return to Zion until their scattering to every country was complete. Therefore they must be brought to England before they could get to Palestine." *Bible and Sword*, pp. 123, 131.

DANVERS, Frederick Charles 1833-1906

Danvers was quite knowledgeable concerning the Indian Office, the East India Company, and the rise and decline of the Portuguese empire in India. He had several publications on these topics and appears to have been a man of some responsibilities, possibly with the Indian Office. Jim Franks describes Danvers' *Israel Redivivus* as the most balanced of the monographs he has examined.

This work captures the spirit of theological interest during Fremantle's day. His goal is "to take up a fragment of long-neglected prophetic truth, and to seek for its place and connexion in the yet broken outline of future events" (p. 80). His purpose is "to make it clear that the promise to Israel can never meet their accomplishment until the ten tribes which revolted under Jeroboam, and went into captivity under Tiglath-Pileser and Shalmaneser, are restored to their land and their covenanted inheritance" (p. 81). For proof that the ten tribes did not return to the Holy Land, Fremantle cites a speech "by Agrippa to the Jews, exhorting them to submit themselves to the Romans. 'What! do you stretch your hopes beyond the Euphrates? do any of you think that your fellow tribes will come to our assistance out of Adiabene? Besides, if they would come, the Parthians would not permit it'" (p. 94). Fremantle gives no source for his quotation. However, in an essay be Henry Innes (see below), the same quote is cited and the reference is listed as Josephus' Wars of the Jews, vol. ii, book ii. Fremantle also cites the 5th century commentary on Hosea in which Jerome alleges that the ten tribes were, in his day, subject to kings of Persia (vol. vi., p. 7, and vol. vi., p. 80). "In the fulness of the time, He who hid them will find them" (p. 95). "Where are the ten tribes? Where are their mysterious families, which for above 2,000 years have been multiplying and increasing into an immense multitude, which, at the given signal, shall come forth like Lazarus from the grave, at the bidding of Jesus" (p. 105). With this in mind, Fremantle makes a strong plug for missionary efforts in the East.

Of Wellington, Rogers writes: "that great man, who was God's great instrument of subduing the enemies of our land, and blessing us with the gifts of prosperity and peace" (p. 4). Note the Birthright and Millennial language about Wellington's victory: "Were we to boast of the strength of our armies, the power of our fleets, or of the bravery of our generals, -- were we to walk forth in proud vanity of our self-sufficiency, and pay the just tribute of respect to the memory of the great hero whose loss we mourn, as if it were his arm which wielded the sword of victory, and restored peace to our shores. ... It was He [God], and He only who gave us victory. . . . How free, how undeserved, how unmerited was his gift. What had we done to call down upon our land the blessings of the Most High? ... Were we more holy as a nation than others? Surely, when we reflect upon our national blessings; how we have been defended as with a shield; and how the waves of peace and prosperity have begirt our happy isle, we must feel, that the victories which secured all this were not ours, but his, whose are the armies of heaven. And can we recall our former weakness and insignificance among the nations of the earth, -- how that but a few short centuries ago, we were heathen barbarians, worshipping idols of wood and stone, -- without ascribing all our present greatness to his free sovereign mercy? We now seem to occupy the honoured place of ancient Israel, and the language addressed to them may with great

propriety be addressed to us, -- 'The Lord did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye were the fewest of all people: But because the Lord loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your fathers, hath the Lord brought you out with a mighty hand, and redeemed you out of the house of bondmen, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.'... Let us recognise his gracious hand in all his dealings, in those which exalt us" (pp. 12-13).

G. A. Roberts was married to a British-Israelite, but evidently did not subscribe to the theory himself.

It ceased to form part of the great European Empire and for the time lost the link which connected it with the civilisation of the West. It no longer took part in the common life of the Western nations; and, isolated from all that created for them a common interest, or unconsciously combined them in a common struggle, out of which the elements of a new historical world were to emerge, it seemed to relapse into that state of barbarism from which the influence of Roman domination had for the time extricated it. The British Isles seemed as it were to retire again into the recesses of that western ocean from which they had emerged in the reign of Emperor Claudius; and a darkness, which grew more profound as their isolated existence continued, settled down upon them and shrouded their inhabitants form the eye of Europe till the spread of that great and paramount influence which succeeded to the domination of the Roman Empire, and inherited its concentrating energy -- the Christian Church -- took Britain within its grasp and the works of its monastic and clerical writers once more brought its fortunes within the sphere of history.

"When the page of history once more opens up to its annals, we find that the barbaric nations, whom we left harassing the Roman province till the Romans abandoned the island, had now effected fixed settlements within the island, and formed permanent kingdoms within its limits" (p. 114).

"So little is known of Britain during this interval of upwards a century and a half, so undefined were the notions of the Continental writers, that Procopius, writing from Constantinople in the sixth century, describes Britain as extending from east to west, and consisting of two islands" (p. 115). "Deserted almost entirely by Continental historians, and deprived of the clue which any connection with European events would afford, we are left for the history of this interval to the uncertain guide of tradition" (p. 118).

The opening paragraph of the book reads: "Between the end of Roman government in Britain and the emergence of the earliest English Kingdoms there stretches a long period of which the history cannot be written. The men who played their parts in this obscurity are forgotten, or are little more than names with which the imagination of later centuries has dealt at will. The course of events may be indicative, but is certainly not revealed, by the isolated or incidental references to Britain made by writers of this or the following age. For the first time in five centuries Britain was out of touch with the Continent" (p. 1).

"Archaeological discoveries have shown that permanent English settlements were founded in Britain during, if not before, the last quarter of the fifth century [tradition places the Saxon arrival in Britain between A. D. 446 - 454]. But archaeological evidence is an unsatisfactory basis for absolute chronology, and even if the British traditions may be trusted, they do not indicate the rate at which events moved between the first coming of the Saxons and their establishment of permanent Kingdoms" (pp. 1-2).

"The early history of these nations [Saxons and Angles] is enveloped in the obscurity which overhangs all Germany in the age of national migration. ... For the next two hundred years the nations of Germany were involved in a movement which carried them to distant seats, created new confederacies which caused the adoption of new racial names. ... It is only an imperfect story which can be recovered from these [fragmentary comments of Roman writers or poems], and there are irrecoverable passages of crucial importance in the early history of the Angles, Saxons, and Jutes. Of these nations the Saxons are the least obscure [Ptolemy] places them on the neck of the Cimbric peninsula, in the modern Holstein" (p. 11)

TOTTEN, Charles Adiel Lewis 1851-1908

Totten graduated with his B. A. degree from Trinity College (Connecticut) in 1869, and from the U.S. Military Academy (West Point) in 1873. He received an M.A. degree from Trinity College in 1885. At the rank of Lieutenant in the U.S. Army, he was detailed by the War Department Professor of Military Science and Tactics (1889-1892) to Yale University. Totten's work is prolific and herculean. He had a lively and far-reaching intellect which took him into the arenas of pyramidology, astronomical and chronological theory. While his calculations have obviously failed, they are evidence a remarkable mind. I view him as the most significant 19th century North American exponent of the British-Israel movement.

TURNER, Sharon 1768-1847

Turner wrote prolifically on English history from the earliest of times to his own day. He also wrote about the affinities and diversities of languages. Sharon Turner came on the scene at the precise time in history of the issuing of the Birthright Blessing to Jacob's descendants. Born only five years after the end of the Seven Years/French and Indian War, he lived through the American Revolution and the Napoleonic Wars--major events which set the stage and laid the foundation for the fulfillment of key Bible prophecies (Gen. 48:19, 49:22-26, I Chron. 5:1-2). It was in this context that he planted the seed of an idea that, at the hands of John Wilson writing seven years prior to Turner's death, was to germinate into the British-Israel doctrine. Turner also wrote on sacred history. Respecting Turner, Hine writes, "entirely apart from the view of discovering the Ten Tribes, which was not his purpose--his sole object being to give a true solution of the difficult question of 'Who were the ancestors of the Anglo-Saxons?'--succeeds in tracing our British ancestry into Media." (*Forty-Seven Identifications*, p. 8--see also pp. 5-6, 101-102).

Harold Stough observes that Sharon Turner, Dr. George Moore [who made an independent study of the Sacae], and John Wilson "compared notes and, together ...corresponded with the result that a great work was begun." ("Jubilee of Witness," p. 5).

WILSON, John 1799 - 1870

Wilson is credited by such Anglo-Israelite exponents as Edward Hine and Harold Stough with writing the seminal British-Israel thesis in 1840. In Hine's *Forty-Seven Identifications*, he lavishes praise on Wilson's work (pp. 138-140, 151--see also p. v, 97). He observes, "Wilson is the man of all others whom God selects to first impart the light, and convey to mankind the chain of thought that will secure this grand Glory to our Country."

"Mr. Wilson's authorities for his fact and deductions are chiefly Sharon Turner, Rapin de Thoyras, and the Abbé Milot, from his work, entitled, "Elements of the History of England:" all of shown, without being at all aware that they are speaking to the case, and viewing things in general from quite different points, most curiously illustrate the theory of Mr. Wilson." From Glover's *England the Remnant* (pp. 152 - 153 -- see above). On p. 151, Glover calls Wilson "learned layman" -- he evidently was not ordained. Wilson's career evidently began in Ireland (pp. 151 - 152).

Wilson was from Cheltenham. From 1866, he was the editor of *The Watchman of Ephraim* listed under P.P. 728.b. in the British Museum. Wilson was by no means a "single-issue" theologian. While he was without doubt the first articulator of the British-Israel idea, his

writings cut across a wide range of theological topics, particularly those of interest to premillennialists.

Note that Wilson viewed the Welsh as Manasseh.

This volume contains a "Subject Index" and "Scripture Index" on pp. 9-16. Richard Brothers is nowhere cited. Wilson endorses the notion typical of the day that the Anglo-Saxons were particularly gifted in governing (see McDougall, *Racial Myth in English History*) and that parliamentary form of governing had roots in the *wiggenagemot* (pp. 114 - 122, Lecture 11). In Lecture 9, Wilson draws from the best of contemporary scholarship on the origins of the Anglo-Saxons, citing the work of Sharon Turner. In Section 2 (pp. 41 - 44), he totally misreads the 5th Seal of Rev., perceiving it to contrast Israel's fate with the destruction wrought on her spoilers. The focus is on Israel's preservation.

The Millennium; or, World to Come; and Its Relations to Preceding Dispensations. Cheltenham, England: 1842. 3186.b.36. New Edition published in London, 1895. 3187.aaaa.19.

This book is an important one in laying the framework of Wilson's theology. It would be good if we could obtain a copy for the Ambassador College Library.

The Preface (pp. iii - iv) sounds a positive note for ecumenism, an applauding of "various sects" to show "a remarkable tendency to merge minor differences in their common Christianity." Wilson speaks favorably about "Evangelical Christianity."

The Preface implies Wilson kept Sunday and pp. 31 - 33 offer excuses for not keeping the 7th day Sabbath (see also Mission of Elijah, pp. 285, 300 - 301).

The first 2 chapters draw an analysis between the days of creation and their typical fulfillment in the Millennial days of God's plan, culminating in the great Sabbath Rest for creation and the world. On p. 64, Wilson connects the transfiguration to the 7th day as symbolic of the Millennium which the 7th day Sabbath forecasts. On pp. 74, 76, he connects the Feast of Tabernacles to the Millennium. Wilson understood the distinction between the 1st resurrection just before the Millennium began, and a later "General Resurrection" (pp. 42 - 47, 131 - 132, 194, 167—but he seems to view the 2nd Resurrection as one for the wicked). Like Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong, he places *great* emphasis on the concept of Acts 3:19-21, i.e., the restitution of all things (note Ch. 5). The subtitle of his work *Mission of Elijah* is "To Restore All" (see Ch. 7).

Ch. 3—good to show Elijah's larger role in cutting off Israel at the same place, Horeb, where God made the covenant with Israel (cf. Mt. 17—both Moses and Elijah appeared —both were at Horeb in connection with the covenant). See especially pp. 41 - 42. Tie to Mal. 4:5 - 6 and the end time. Restoration is linked to the revealing of the true identity of lost Israel. Wilson cites Elijah's message to Jehu and connects it to Shalmanessar's Black Obelisk (cf. pp 209 -210). The book is a call for the Church to act in the role of the 2nd Elijah prior to Christ's 2nd Coming. Wilson argues that Elijah did not die (p. 65—cf. *Mission of Elijah*, Ch. 9 and p. 242); on pp. 162 - 163, Wilson addresses the issue of mission work (cf. *Mission of Elijah*, pp. 89 - 90). "Elijah's last journey upon the earth before his translation was a foreshadowing of his ministry in the Apocalypse" (p. 224).

Ch. 4—excellent on Israelite-Assyrian relations. On p. 48, Wilson writes about the burial of Israel followed by the burial of Nineveh (only re-discovered around the time of Wilson's writings—cf. p. 115). I Kings 18:37 and Js. 5:16-18 and Mal. 4 are tied together by Wilson on pp. 60, 328. It is worth copying pp. 43 - 60.

Ch. 5—on enmity between Israel and the Beast, see p. 61. Concerning the Church being critical of Roman Christianity, ritual, and popery, see pp. 182 - 189, 222, 268 - 270, 333 - 334. On pp. 171, 281, 321, Wilson gives a strong endorsement to Protestantism over Roman Christianity.

Ch. 6-Mal. 4 discussed on pp. 86 - 87.

Ch. 7—on revealing the identity of Israel as part of the restoration process, see pp. 92, 97.

Church Eras—see pp. 185 - 186, 257 - 272 (Ch. 27). Wilson's view agrees generally with the tradition Worldwide Church of God understanding, although

we do not line things up chronologically in quite the same way he does. On Irenaeus, see pp. 185 - 186, 257.

Wilson argues that the New Testament books are to "All-Israel," i.e., the Lost 10 Tribes who had been cut off from their Husband but re-gathered into the Christian faith (pp. 172 - 171).

On the 2,520 and 1,260 years, Napoleon, and the Papacy, see pp. 333 - 345.

Most chapters conclude with poetry by Wilson which is often related to various passages of scripture. Not until Ch. 8 does Wilson introduce the concept or allude to the idea of Joseph's descendants: "Our God hath also farther prepared for the Coming Glory by preparing 'many sons through suffering', who have chiefly been the nations in the north-west of Europe, and who first under Rome Pagan have suffered 'for the witness of Jesus and the Word of God!" Wilson develops this theme on pp. 158 - 160, 162.

Wilson says, "As to the Risen Saints, it may be that during the Millennium, they are but under further training for still higher service in other worlds. During the ages to come they may be employed in making known to principalities and in the heavens the magnificent wisdom of God. . . . The Dispensations of God are progressive and. . . every succeeding step hath been the preparation for higher. . . . This our Godlike calling we may not expect will end with our present imperfect ministry, nor even with that in the Millennial kingdom" (pp. 149 - 150, 167-cf. Mr. Armstrong's thesis in *Incredible Human Potential*).

Wilson uses the idea of "embryo antichrists" (p. 108), and writes about "counterfeits of Christianity" (p. 141). He links these ideas to Roman Christianity (pp. 164 - 165). WAS THE OXFORD MOVEMENT OF THE 1850s SATAN'S ATTEMPT TO OBSCURE THE DEVELOPMENT OF TRUE DOCTRINE AND PROGRESSIVELY WIDENING REVELATION? RELATE THIS QUESTION TO THE QUOTES FROM CARDINAL NEWMAN FOUND IN Patience Strong's *Someone Had to Say*, chapter on "Bricks and Mortar" (see above).

David and Solomon "were given but a type of the Kingdom to see that man in his mortal state cannot be intrusted with the promised power and glory" (pp. 41 - 42). Ch. 6—Wilson forecasts a time of darkness and trial before the restitution of the Millennium. . . but he applies this only to Judah and the break up of that polity; not Lost Israel.

Wilson has the same theology on the binding of Satan for 1,000 years (pp. 145 - 148) as does the Worldwide Church of God.

Wilson pillories "Balance of Power" politics and politicking internationally to support "moneyed interests." He sees contemporary events as opportunities to bring the Moslems of Turkey under the Christian Gospel. He decries the atrocities committed against Christians in Turkey, some of which are at the behest of the Turkish rulers. They are "deeply degraded" (p. 17). Wilson sees it as Joseph's duty as the "Firstborn of nations" (p. 19) to intervene. He perceives Joseph as the "chief of the nations" (p. 22) with a duty to lift up the oppressed. "You have the power of doing much toward this" (p. 25).

Wilson offers his explanation of why his theory of British-Israelism did not become popular (pp. 27 - 31).

The article concludes: "It is useless to try and submit such far-fetched hypotheses to critical investigation, because instead of the theory's having been deduced from the evidence, the evidence has been painfully collected and distorted to support the theory." Cf. Barbara Tuchman's assessment in *Bible and Sword*. She writes of the Anglo-Israel movement which "might appeal to enthusiasts. . . who by a tortured interpretation of stray passages from the Bible have convinced themselves that the English are the true descendants of the ten lost tribes of Israel" (p. 82).

This essay indicates that various legends, e.g., 13th century Matthew Paris legend about how Alexander the Great "shut them [lost Israel] up in the Caspian mountains" [cf. "Beasts of the Bible" slide show theme]; 14th century theorist Sir John Maundevilled, who located them in the mountains of Scythia; 16th century writer Giles Fletcher who identified them with the Tartars. John Sadler "implied that the English are the descendants of Israelites" in his Rights of the Kingdom [Halford and Sherrod, who have read this essay, find no evidence that Sadler's references to the English as Israel were any more than metaphoric -see Sadler above] which "endeavored to show that the constitution of England had been derived from that of Israel: "It is believed that the former's [Stadler's] view that elements of the English population might be traced back to the Ten Tribes [who were aware of Britain because of Solomon's far-flung maritime connections through the Phoenicians and who 'may have sought refuge there after the fall of their kingdom'] swayed the mind of the Protector to give a favorable reception to Manasseh ben Israel's plea for readmission of the Jews."
