It has come and gone! How time flies! Reports from around the world tell us this was in reality the greatest Feast of Tabernacles in our time. The entire Church had been made ready for it, because the Church is in process of making herself READY for a far GREATER event--the coming of the KING of kings and LORD of lords to usher in the very event of which we were enjoying merely a foretaste!

Definitely God's Church is by her Head Jesus Christ being set back on God's track. Reports from around the world have one tone--a NEW SPIRIT has been injected from God into His people the earth around. There is a spirit of LOVE--of REJOICING--of UNITY--of TOGETHERNESS--of a common LOY-ALTY to Jesus Christ, His TRUTH with no watering down, of being truly ONE --AT-ONE-MENT with GOD! It is a HAPPY spirit, a joyous spirit!

The attitude of division, suspicion, taking sides, seems to have vanished. Now we are once again truly <u>O N E</u> Body of Christ in harmony and peace and love!

And of course it was another FIRST! Modern technical facilities did not yet enable us to bring together by microwave and satellite every feast site on earth. BUT for the first time, on the first day and the Last Great Day, all festival sites in the United States, Canada and England were joined together by television cameras and motion picture screens at the various sites--all but Hawaii, where they heard the audio portion only.

A few mechanical difficulties caused a delay on the opening day. But from all reports the Last Great Day transmission was technically OK and all of you were as if you were right with us at the moment here in Tucson. When I spoke, they tell me, by TV camera close up, my face appeared live many times larger on your screen than if I had been physically there. I hope it was all satisfactory, and many reports say it was.

THIS DREW US ALL TOGETHER--AS IF WE WERE ALL IN ONE AND THE SAME BIG AUDITORIUM!

But the main thing is that we all had the attitude, feel, and spirit of BEING TOGETHER--one of UNITY in CHRIST!

Reports from all over say the sermons were somehow inspired by the living Christ to be the BEST EVER! I know they surely were here at Tucson, where upwards of 5,000 were assembled together. Through the years I have heard some very fine sermons at various festivals, even by some of the younger ministers. But this year EVERY sermon here at the Tucson site, as well as every sermonette, was simply super. For one thing, the messages were kept generally on the theme of the occasion--the coming millennial reign of the Kingdom of God, and/or our preparation for it. There were deeply spiritual and moving sermons on our need to prepare spiritually for it. There were messages on the GOVERNMENT of the Kingdom during the millennium. There were explanatory sermons on the type of civilization--the agricultural nature of society and the happiness it will bring, during the coming thousand years.

Both sermons and sermonettes hewed to the line, as God instructs, and gave us "MEAT IN DUE SEASON." These Festivals were given us to remind us every year of God's great Master Plan working out HIS TREMENDOUS PUR-POSE here below. This year all ministers "hewed to the line."

I personally congratulate all the ministers, and I know all the brethren join me in this. You ministers did look to the living Christ for guidance and inspiration, and He answered your prayers!

This morning I happened to tune in for about thirty seconds on Pat Robertson and his 700 Club. He was offering a little leaflet or tract of some kind that would show the reader how to live this new wonderful life in Christ. Too bad all those evangelists do not understand fully what the true life in Christ is.

To them, their brand of "Christianity" is one that exalts Jesus Christ, worships Him, but as PART of this world--assuming this is HIS world. They remain PART OF this world, while talking about, accepting, even worshipping Christ. But Jesus said, "In VAIN do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. For laying aside the commandments of God, ye hold the traditions of men...Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition" (Mark 7:7-9).

How thankful we should be that God has revealed to us HIS GOVERNMENT, based on His LAW, which is HIS way of life.

The Church of God is the Body of Christ CALLED OUT FROM the world. We must live in it, but we are not OF it! We look forward for God's WORLD TOMORROW!

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NEW MAGAZINE TO BE BORN

During the midst of the Feast of Tabernacles God put in my mind the need of still another magazine.

Already we publish more magazines and regular publications than any church so far as I know. I have even wondered if we are top-heavy-publishing too many. But I really don't think so--people are reached through the eye more effectively than by any other means. The PRINTED WORD has done more to build and inspire God's Church than any other means. Radio and TV have been effective--the first approach. But the booklets, Correspondence Course, The PLAIN TRUTH and, in the Church itself The GOOD NEWS, the WORLDWIDE NEWS, and for the ministry the PASTOR GENERAL'S REPORT--not to mention even full books-have done more to follow up a first temporary, casual interest into a completely changed and dedicated life than radio and TV by far!

But God has now shown me that we have been neglecting a MOST IMPOR-TANT NUMBER OF OUR PEOPLE--the youths from age 18 and under. We have the Y.O.U. and the Y.E.S. and the S.E.P. summer camp at Orr, Minnesota. But our young people coming along are the FUTURE MEMBERSHIP AND LEADERS IN THE CHURCH AND THE LEADERS IN THE WHOLE WORLD GOVERNMENT OF TOMORROW!

In a sense, doesn't that make them almost the MOST IMPORTANT PEOPLE ON EARTH?

So it came to my mind that they need a REAL MAGAZINE of their own. Not even a tabloid "newspaper" type paper--a REAL MAGAZINE! Full color. I have thought, turned over in my mind and prayed over the NAME of the new magazine. I had thought of several, such as the JUNIOR PLAIN TRUTH, and then "YOUTH TODAY." Discussing it with Dexter Faulkner, Managing Editor of our publications, he came up with,

"YOUTH/81."

The following year it would be "YOUTH/82" and so on--a takeoff from "QUEST."

The first issue will come out as the January, 1981 number--Volume 1, Number 1. It will be sent without subscription price to all youths, children of Worldwide Church of God members, ages 13 to 18.

We will have a department for "What Our Readers Say," and if some of our youths will write in right away telling us what they think of the idea of a magazine OF THEIR OWN, the editors will select from among them letters to be published in VOL.1, No.1. And that will become a treasure copy to be kept for years.

I want this magazine to be well illustrated. There's a saying that one picture says more than a thousand words. I would like some of the illustrations to be humorous, some to bring a laugh--yet others to illustrate more serious or thought-provoking articles. There will be articles on sports, and the things all youths are interested in, and also articles looking into the future, such as "WHAT DO TEENS AND YOUTHS HAVE TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN A MODERN WORLD?"

There will be news of the Y.O.U. and the Y.E.S. I would like someone to write a good article on "LIFE AT S.E.P. CAMP." There will be updated articles on the PLAIN TRUTH ABOUT SEX. There is perhaps no need more urgent for pre-marriage youths than proper, intelligent and frank knowledge about sex after puberty and before marriage--AND <u>W H Y</u>? You can't get this sorely needed knowledge from other kids--and very few ever get it from parents. Nor any book on sex at bookstores.

There will be articles about youth and parent relationships, about competition in sports, about sports in the World Tomorrow.

Articles on where do youths get their LIFE-STYLE, and where SHOULD THEY? An article on "Did SATAN Get to YOU When You Were Young?"

The above gives you a few ideas of the type of articles and material that will appear in "YOUTH/81."

Another, "Is the BIBLE For Youths--or ONLY For Middle-aged and The Elderly?" I would welcome ideas and suggestions from youths about the kind of articles and subjects they feel should be covered in THEIR new magazine.

I am personally very enthusiastic about this. I myself will be in my 90th year a year from now--but don't ever get the idea I'm an old man. I still have very YOUNG IDEAS--though both God and the years have added enough wisdom to know which are the BETTER values even for kids and youths. I don't mean better for God or for parents--I mean better for the YOUNG. Yes, and better for us ALL!

Remember, God does not deny us anything that is good for US--He wants our lives to be happier, with more JOY that is good for \overline{US} . Some people--adults, middle and old-aged as well as the young--are deceived into thinking some things are good that make us painfully sorry afterward.

I will have this story of "YOUTH/81" run in Worldwide News also.

FROM MINISTERIAL SERVICES

News of God's Work in French-speaking Areas

<u>Record-breaking Times</u> God's Work in the French-speaking areas has experienced much growth since Mr. Herbert Armstrong has begun to put the Church back on the right track. We have achieved records in many areas such as the number of renewals received from former PV subscribers (11% response in France, over 15% response in Guadeloupe and Martinique, and about 8% response in Switzerland), in the income (June 1980 income in Geneva up 67.5% over June 1979) and the attendance at services in all French churches including Canada. We are certainly very grateful to God for all these blessings. The French PT The French PT is now published in the U.S.A. by the R. R. Donnelley & Sons Co. The September issue reached France in less than four days--and its production cost was much lower than when printed in England.

<u>News From Martinique</u> Immigration officers in Martinique have become increasingly suspicious of the cassettes we send to the country. Apparently there is a high black market on U.S. cassettes containing music which is hurting record merchants in Martinique. So in order to receive the sermon cassettes we send to the Church, Mr. Carbonnel must personally prove there is no music on them. He routinely brings his own cassette player with him to the excise office and plays the cassettes in front of an immigration officer before they are finally released.

The Jehovah's Witnesses in Martinique are publishing much libelous and slanderous material in the local newspapers against Mr. Armstrong and the Church, referring to the false accusations made by the Attorney General. Mr. Carbonnel has warned the brethren not to be offended by these assaults of the Adversary. In general, our members are holding on to the truth because they realize that God's Church and true Christians are to receive persecution in the end times.

Hurricane Allen has now caused at least a one-month delay in the daily broadcasting of "Le Monde a Venir" on Radio-Caraibes. The breakdown was due to damage done to a transmitting station. Fortunately there were no deaths due to the hurricane, although Martinique's banana plantations were almost 100% destroyed.

And in the vast unprotected and unpatrolled forests of Martinique, several marijuana plantations have been discovered. Increasingly, the drug culture is invading and becoming a way of life in Martinique.

<u>Cameroon</u> Mr. Ray Clore is busily making plans to have trained personnel and an efficient office going once we are officially and legally recognized in Cameroon. Due to the poor mail system (a problem as well in the Antilles), a French office would greatly enhance the chance of our readers receiving the literature we send them. Presently, international mail coming in from Paris takes from 6 to 60 days to reach its destination. Sometimes it doesn't even get through!

Mr. Clore wrote relating his situation in Cameroon: "As you can tell, I'm again in Douala. Washington wants to have me transferred permanently down here. Yaounde wants to have me back around August 1. It's nice to be wanted but living out of a suitcase and not knowing where we can really settle down here in Cameroon is not too pleasant. I think it is somewhat amusing to see how God manipulates the U.S. government personnel process to keep me going back and forth from Yaounde to Douala to be able to pastor the flock effectively here--at U.S. government expense!"

Miracle in Guadeloupe Mr. Dubois, our minister in Guadeloupe, writes: "God intervened miraculously for the Moradel family in Guadeloupe. Their son, Freddy, 22 years old and not a member, was helping his father construct a small vault at the cemetery in Baie-Mahault. He was putting up metallic braces with iron shafts. It was while adjusting one of these iron shafts that it came in contact with a high voltage electric wire several meters above his head. The current in the wire was 30,000 volts. A big noise like that of a cannon exploding was heard hundreds of meters around. The young man's clothing disintegrated, and he fell over 19 feet, and landed in some grass. He only received some minor burns on his chest and right leg. We can glorify God for always intervening and protecting us miraculously."

ON THE WORLD SCENE

ON THE SPOT IN BONN: NOT YET TIME FOR STRAUSS--Unwilling to take political risks in an increasingly uncertain world, West German voters, on Sunday, October 5, returned Chancellor Helmut Schmidt to a new four-year term of office. The electoral challenge of Franz Josef Strauss was decisively turned back.

I was at the Christian Democratic Union headquarters in Bonn when the first election results poured out over the television monitors shortly after polls closed at 6:00 p.m. By 6:45, the sophisticated computers employed by the two key television networks had already clearly and accurately projected the outcome--bad news for the CDU and its Bavarian sister party, the CSU (Christian Socialist Union). A few minutes later, as I was standing near the entrance to the CDU building, a caravan of cars sped up. Out from the first one stepped a lively Herr Strauss, smiling graciously, though he already knew his electoral fate.

The "Wahlparty" (Election Party) that evening at CDU headquarters was not to be a particularly happy one. But as Wolfgang Thomsen (from our Bonn office) and I walked into the Social Democratic Party building just down the street, we noticed that the mood there among the party faithful was strangely subdued. Their champion had won, but the German electorate had hardly given the slate of SPD candidates a ringing endorsement. The SPD made only fractional gains over the last election in 1976. The real winners of the election were the Free Democrats (FDP), the small party which operates in coalition with Schmidt's Socialists. The news magazine <u>der Spiegel</u> made a cover change halfway through their copy run and ran a picture of Free Democratic Party head (and Foreign Minister) Hans-Dietrich Genscher with the title, der Sieger (The Winner). The Free Democrats increased their share of the total vote to 10.6% from 7.9% in 1976. Not bad for a party that some believed only a few months ago might not even clear the 5% hurdle necessary for representation.

Clearly what German voters had done was to try to strengthen the moderate center of German politics. They did not want to give the SPD more power since they feared the party's left-wing would impose more socialistic measures on the German economy and society. (Schmidt himself is on the conservative side of the SPD.) Yet, a sizeable bloc of voters simply could not conscientiously support Herr Strauss, whom they considered to be too far to the right. Thus many Germans, including at least 500,000 regular CDU followers, cast their votes (or more correctly their <u>second</u> votes) for the FDP. In doing so, they believed the moderate Free Democrats would act as enough of a brake on the Socialists, without taking a risk on Mr. Strauss, whom they believed to be unpredictable.

(In West Germany, each voter casts two ballots in the national election, one directly for a representative to Parliament from his local constituency, the second for a list of candidates put up by each party in the land, or state, in which he lives. Half of all Bundestag members are directly elected via the first ballot, the other half are drawn from the party lists proportional to the votes cast for each list. The FDP strength comes entirely from this second ballot; it has no directly elected members. What happened in this election was that many CDU voters, loyal to their party but suspicious of Strauss, split their votes, sending a CDU representative to the Bundestag on the first ballot, while voting for the FDP list on the second. Anticipating this factor, the CDU had printed campaign posters appealing for voters to cast both their ballots for the CDU, but obviously this didn't work.)

The result was the worst showing for the CDU/CSU sister parties since the first West German election in 1949. Nevertheless, the CDU/CSU alliance, with 44.5 per cent of the vote (down from 48.6 in 1976) and 226 seats in the Bundestag remains the single largest party in parliament, retaining their edge over the SPD, which pulled 42.9 of the vote (almost the same as their 42.6 tally in 1976) and 218 seats. Thus Schmidt's Socialists continue to govern only with the help of the Free Democrats, who upped their seats in the Bundestag to 53 from 39.

"Hardest Period" Ahead for Chancellor Schmidt

Herr Strauss found out how hard it is to unseat a successful incumbent riding at the crest of his power and prestige. He found himself in the same shoes as Adlai Stevenson in 1956 running opposite President Eisenhower. Yet Herr Strauss was right when he said after the election that Mr. Schmidt "is now faced with the hardest period of his political lifetime."

Structural problems are beginning to appear in the West German economy. For the first time in 15 years the Federal Republic has chalked up a trade deficit. In foreign relations, Bonn faces severe problems from Eastern

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Europe to the Middle East. The eruption of war in the oil-laden Persian Gulf casts a huge pall over the economies of all of Western Europe. Because of his years of experience on the job, West Germans were not about to turn out Herr Schmidt, one of their most successful chancellors ever, at this time. Strauss represented too much of a risk now. As one lady told me, she was voting SPD but would probably have gone with the CDU had it not been for Strauss personally.

The Free Democrats, feeling their oats, are certain to ask for more power within the SPD-FDP coalition. This could make life a little rougher for Herr Schmidt who always has a tassle with his party's troublesome left wing. Also, since the FDP drew so much of a "protest vote" from the CDU, it must be more sensitive to traditional conservative desires. Hence more trouble for Schmidt. This means, editoralized the Times of London, that "a change of coalition partner becomes in principle easier to contemplate. However the intention is clearly to stick with the present coalition for the next four years. A break is likely only if Herr Schmidt steps down for reasons of health or principle and if life with the left then becomes intolerable."

Strauss's Future

And what of the future of Franz Josef Strauss? Right now, it's bleak, a development the Bavarian has faced numerous times in his long up-anddown career. Under normal conditions, Strauss stands little chance of becoming the CDU-CSU standard bearer four years hence.

The only chance Herr Strauss has is to retain his power base in Bavaria, the Republic's biggest state, and to continue to speak out against Schmidt's policies from within the Bundesrat, Bonn's upper chamber. Increased world turmoil is certainly in his favor. Strauss will, as he did continually during the campaign, warn that the left-leaning Socialists are cutting Germany's moorings from the West and from America in particular. At the present time, with relative prosperity still to be enjoyed, West German voters didn't feel Strauss had enough of an argument. This could change, especially if Russia ends up with a strangle hold on Persian Gulf oil and holds Germany and the West at ransom, demanding that NATO be dismembered, forcing the Americans to leave Europe.

Finally feeling the chilling embrace of Moscow, the German people may yet call for the Bavarian strongman--the one they feared in good times--to rescue them from their crisis. Herr Strauss may yet be Germany's--and Europe's--"man for emergencies."
