International News

Spanish Department Report The latest income reports continue to show a substantial increase in all the Latin American countries. The year-to-date increase is an encouraging 73.4 percent overall!

Following are excerpts from a letter from Mario Seiglie, the minister in Santiago, Chile. His words seem to sum up the feeling of the ministers and brethren in the Spanish-speaking areas of God's Work.

On November 15, both churches (Temuco and Santiago) joyfully celebrated the successful rout in the California Court case. The lesson driven home for us was how vital the "trunk" of the Church is in relation to the branches (the rest of the countries, including Chile) of God's Work. If the trunk at headquarters would have been taken over, the flow of nourishment would have ceased with the consequent withering--how astute is the devil! Mr. Armstrong's recent point about not having a Spanish, French, Australian, or German Work (trunk) was extremely timely.

Here in Santiago, the Church is drawing closer together spiritually and socially. Income and visit requests are up and each Sabbath there are new faces in the crowd. We know God will continue to provide the growth accordingly.

In recent months, efforts have been made to increase Spanish PLAIN TRUTH (La PURA VERDAD) circulation in certain countries where little, if any, advertising of La PURA VERDAD has been done. One of those areas is the country of Spain, with a population of 37,000,000 highly literate and sophisticated people. Recently, a few small ads have been placed in the daily LEVANTE, printed in Valencia, Spain's third largest city, and EL PAIS, of Madrid. This advertising, combined with a special gift subscription offer that was mailed to La PURA VERDAD subscribers as well as a cardholder display program maintained by only five Spanish members, will net an estimated 2500 new subscribers by late January. In just four months we expect the mailing list in Spain to triple!

Since July, nearly 5,000 new subscribers have been added at a very low cost (approximately 18 cents U.S.) as a result of a July PV card insert. The insert was placed in subscriber issues destined for selected countries where PV circulation has been low compared to total population. The response has been double what was expected and has bolstered circulation in such countries as Uruguay, Argentina, Chile, Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Latest News From Canada November has been a very busy month as Mr. Fahey assumed his new responsibilities in Canada. Already he has visited the churches in Toronto, Winnipeg and Regina and conducted ministerial meetings

in those cities. Next Sabbath he will visit the Ottawa and Montreal Churches and hold a ministerial meeting for that area. The ministers from the Maritimes and Newfoundland will also attend.

The busy month of November was rounded off with a very successful visit to Toronto by Mr. Stanley Rader. Radio, television and press interviews occupied his three-day visit along with two services on the Sabbath. Mr. Rader was able to speak to one million Canadians via Canada A.M. alone--this country's main morning news program. In this favourable live interview, the host held up Mr. Armstrong's full-page ad "A Voice Cries Out--What's Wrong With Government..." from the Toronto Globe and Mail and asked whether the Church should be involved with government when the same Church was saying government should not be involved with the Church. A very good question, and one which Mr. Rader delighted in answering.

Statistics for November were again exciting and encouraging. Financially, God's Work in Canada is 23% ahead on the year-to-date figure with expenses running 5% under budget. Incoming mail was again high with over 30,000 responses to the ad campaign for the book UNITED STATES AND BRITAIN IN PROPHECY. The Work is truly booming on all fronts.

Mr. Waterhouse in London Mr. Gerald Waterhouse is currently touring Britain bringing a vision of the coming Kingdom of God to the Church here, and the need for all of us to be solidly behind Mr. Armstrong as we come nearer to the time that Kingdom is to be established.

Speaking in London on the Sabbath of December 13th, Mr. Waterhouse was true to form. One wonders if it wouldn't be easier to describe what he didn't say in his fast moving graphic sermon, as he journeyed from what led up to the court case to the reasons why the Church will need to go to the place of safety--all in three and a half hours! Throughout it all the central message was clear and well received by the brethren present: God is doing the Work at this present time through Mr. Herbert Armstrong whom He has personally prepared for the task. Whatever may occur, God is in charge and we should therefore recognise and respect the authority He has placed in His Church.

Mr. Waterhouse will be in the U.K. until January 6th and is eagerly awaited by the churches for sermons and Bible studies in all areas. Then from the U.K. he travels to Scandinavia before going on to other areas of Europe.

A Voice Cries Out: Hostages, Arab Oil, Israel and the U.S.

-The Real Origin of Ancient Hatreds, and Way to Solution

THE WORLD NEWS spotlight has focused heavily on the Middle East, the hostage crisis and the Camp David conferences for Middle East peace.

But few know the real origin of this boiling caldron of historic hatreds. Few know that this on-and-off continuing emotional conflict stemmed from a rivalry between two women over *one man*. It is significant in a manner little realized that present peace efforts involve the United States and the Camp David talks.

Very recently I have had personal conferences with the two Middle East leaders—Prime Minister Menachem Begin in Jerusalem, and President Anwar el-Sadat in Cairo. The vision, courage and willingness of these two leaders to "give" instead of "get" is a hopeful start in the way toward Middle East and even world peace.

Israel has been willing to "give" back to Egypt the Sinai Peninsula. And President Sadat showed me the architect's rendering of the new \$70 million peace center he plans to build at the base of Mt. Sinai. He invited my participation in this project, symbolic of the way to world peace between nations and religions.

The project at Mt. Sinai is significant, because some 3,500 years ago there was an "eruption" on Mt. Sinai. What "erupted" was the one and only practical and workable formula for world peace!

That formula is simple. It is a way of life. It is the way of "give" as opposed to "get." And the proposed peace center there epitomizes the way of "give"—cooperate, mutual help, serve, share. "GET" is the way of self-centered covet-

ing, envy, jealousy and hostile competition leading to strife, violence, war, destruction.

But actually Middle East antagonisms had been implanted in Arab and Israel peoples more than 400 years before the Mt. Sinai "eruption." It's an intriguing story, leading to present activities of concern to us all.

On Mt. Sinai, some 3,500 years ago, the prophet Moses received the tables of stone on which were written the peace formula—the way of life productive of peace—the Ten Commandments. They summarize the principle of outflowing love, the way of "give."

Involved in the Camp David peace talks were heads of three nations, predominant in which are three major religions, Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Religion has been a prime factor in wars throughout history. These three nations have a common ancestor, Abraham. All three religions regard Abraham and Moses as prophets. And therein lies a history of today's vital concern to the lives of us all!

Abraham's wife, Sarah, was barren and childless, considered in those days a severe reproach. Sarah, the biblical narrative states, asked Abraham to give her a son by her maid Hagar. When Hagar became pregnant she despised Sarah. When Sarah treated her harshly she fled. Her son, Ishmael, became the father of 12 "dukes," who were the progenitors of the Arab world of today! Later, the narrative continues, Sarah became the mother of Isaac, progenitor of the 12 tribes of Israel. A jealous

hostility has continued to our day between the Arab world and Israel.

But where does the United States come into the picture? The answer to that question is one of the most exciting, eye-opening revelations of buried and "lost" factual history ever told!

Today the United States and Britain are both deeply involved in this whole controversy. It was the British Balfour Declaration that opened a national home for Jews in Palestine. Now the United States is trying to bring peace to the Middle East. The United States is deeply involved also through the hostage crisis in Islamic Iran.

But where are we, or the British, referred to in the historical narratives or the prophecies of the world's best seller? Theologians do not know. Approximately a third of the entire Bible is prophecy, focusing primarily on events of now—and the very near future. Yet these prophecies have not been understood. They have remained a mystery, or source of wild speculation. The vital key to unlock their clear understanding has been missing.

That vital key is the identity of the United States and British nations in biblical prophecy. Such small nations as Ethiopia, Libya and Egypt are mentioned. How could the United States be overlooked? ON THE WORLD SCENE

INTERNATIONAL NEWS CENSORSHIP LOOMS ON THE HORIZON The stage is now being set for a marked restriction, in the years ahead, of the free flow of vital news from around the world. Even the spreading of the Gospel could be affected.

A few weeks ago, the 21st annual conference of the United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) ended in Belgrade, Yugoslavia. The result was a pronounced victory for Third World and Communist Bloc nations--the majority of UNESCO members. UNESCO adopted by consensus a resolution calling for "a new world information order"--lofty words for global news censorship. Specifically, the resolution called on the world's mass media "to contribute to strengthening peace and international understanding, to the promotion of human rights and to countering racialism, apartheid and incitement to war." (Poor South Africa and Israel--they get kicked in the shins by every U.N.-related agency.)

To further indicate the political thrust of the UNESCO program, the delegates also voted to seat the Palestine Liberation Organization as a UNESCO observer. (One wonders if the P.L.O. has enough "observers" left for all the forums it's invited to observe). Predictably, Yasser Arafat made his UNESCO debut, delivering a 90-minute speech.

The issue of establishing international press controls has been smoldering for some time. The developing countries have long resented the fact that most of the world's influential news media are based in the industrialized "First World" countries. These media, they charge, operate "news monopolies" and present a biased view of Third World events.

However, what really disturbs the communists and the Third World countries --an overwhelmingly undemocratic bunch--is that Western news agencies such as AP, UPI, Reuters, Agence-France Press, Deutsche Press Agentur, as well as major newspapers with foreign correspondents such as the Times of London, Daily Telegraph, the New York Times and Christian Science Monitor, are generally free to report to their readers what is happening inside the developing countries. Such reporting often gives an unfavorable--albeit realistic--view of events inside those totalitarian states.

Editorialized the Los Angeles Times in angry reaction to the UNESCO resolution: "The undemocratic countries already control what their people read and hear. What they want is a mechanism, created and subsidized by UNESCO, to enable them to extend that control to international news. They are well on their way to achieving that goal."

Exactly what the Western news media might be up against was dramatically revealed--albeit coincidentally--during the UNESCO fiasco. A French journalist working for Agence-France Press was arrested and jailed in the Zambian capital of Lusaka for having reported accurately the attempted coup that threatened the government of President Kenneth Kaunda. Yet remarkably the French delegate to UNESCO went along with the consensus proposal and most of the other issues brought to vote.

Although not specifically mentioned in news reports from Belgrade, UNESCO proscriptions are undoubtedly directed at radio and television coverage as well. In many countries, it is only reporting by the BBC World Service and other Western radio services that gives people living in Third World countries an accurate account of conditions inside their own borders. The Third World countries would like to restrict the movement of, say, BBC reporters or stringers operating overseas, calling in reports to London, and having their dispatches received back in the home country via short-wave.

Collapse of Western Will

Champions of the ideal of a free and unfettered press were greatly outnumbered in Belgrade, reports L.A. Times' Don Cook, who covered the UNESCO meeting. He quoted Elie Abel, a U.S. delegate, as saying, "We and the people who share our views are in a very small minority in UNESCO. We don't have a lot of friends and we'd better face it. I think we have to ask ourselves why we are seeing this steady, steady erosion of American influence."

At the Foreign Office in London, the British were indignantly outspoken about the results of the Belgrade meeting. At one point, British delegate Lord Gordon-Lennox was preparing to vote against the "world information" resolution, but then the U.S. delegation got instructions from Washington to go along with a consensus approval rather than force a vote. Britain, "with the greatest reluctance," decided it had no alternative but to go along too. Nevertheless, Foreign Office Minister Peter Blaker made it clear that Britain regards the whole exercise as a growing threat to the free flow of news and ideas and a curb on freedom of the press in the guise of trying to define how journalists are supposed to report and behave around the world.

In general, the Western countries caved in to the pressure exerted by the opposition. Reported Cook: "The British were blunt and outspoken in debate and committee work, and the Swiss refused even to go along with a consensus. But otherwise, only Canada, Australia and West Germany were ready to line up on most of the votes. France and the rest of the European allies, and countries like Japan, Sweden, and Austria seemed more concerned not to oppose the Third World."

The Western countries were also swamped by the Third World/Communist bloc when UNESCO voted itself a hefty 34% increase in its operating budget, up to \$725 million over the next three years. Of course, most of this money comes from the Western world, specifically good ol' "Uncle Sap."

Impede The Gospel?

UNESCO's Director-General Mahtar m'Bow of Senegal pledged at the closing session that "this is only the first stage in creating a new information order in the world." And before the delegates adjourned, the Soviet Union

sponsored a resolution--overwhelmingly approved, of course--to call a special UNESCO-sponsored international conference in 1983 to assess how the international press has been living up to the new UNESCO standards. Noted Cook: "The prospects for turning such a conference into a Soviet and Third World propaganda forum against the Western Press are self-evident."

It should be obvious that if the Western countries succumb supinely to UNESCO's demands, it will make the job of watching world events in the light of Bible prophecy all the harder. And one wonders, too, if Satan is not manipulating UNESCO affairs in an attempt to curtail the future dissemination of the Good News of the Kingdom of God in many parts of the world.
